- 1** The Hawkeyes have 13 sacks, third most in the Big Ten and tied for 10th in the country. DE A.J. Epenesa leads the team with four sacks. He is tied for the Big Ten lead and tied for fourth in the NCAA. Epenesa is one of eight Hawkeyes with sacks.
- 2** TE Noah Fant has 16 career TDs receptions, more than any other tight end in program history and tying Ed Hinkel and Robert Smith for seventh all-time in program history. He has four TDs in 2018, tied for fourth in the B1G and tied for the most among all tight ends in FBS.
- 3** The Hawkeyes lead the B1G and rank sixth in the country in scoring defense (13.0). Iowa ranks second in the B1G in total defense (260.5) and rushing defense (84.0). The Hawkeyes have allowed 260.5 ypg, fifth in the country. The 84 rushing ypg ranks sixth in the country.
- 4** QB Nate Stanley has five touchdown passes this season, raising his career total to 31. Stanley ranks 10th all-time in program history. He is three shy of tying Jake Rudock for ninth all-time. He has 3,338 career passing yards, 12th all-time.
- 5** Senior C Keegan Render leads an OL that has allowed 4 QB sacks, fewest in the B1G. The Hawkeyes start two sophomore tackles (LT Alaric Jackson and RT Tristan Wirfs) and rotate guards who have a combined 10 career starts (RG Cole Banwart, RG Dalton Ferguson and LG Ross Reynolds).
- 6** In the first 4 games of the season, 5 different Hawkeye LBs have made their first career starts. The five LBs entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than Iowa's three starting LBs in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).
- 7** For the 10th time in the last 11 seasons, Iowa has won at least three of its first four games. The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in each of the nine previous seasons.
- 8** The Hawkeyes do not have a junior or senior at the running back position group. Sophomores Ivory Kelly-Martin, Mekhi Sargent, and Toren Young are the elder statesmen of the group. The trio has combined for 553 yards and six rushing touchdowns.
- 9** FB Brady Ross has seven touches this season, and each has resulted in a first down (4 carries, 3 receptions).
- 10** Three of Iowa's first five games of the season are trophy games. The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 13-3, to win the Cy-Hawk trophy in Week 2, and lost to No. 18 Wisconsin, 28-17, in a battle for the Heartland Trophy in Week 4. The Hawkeyes travel to Minnesota on Oct. 6 to defend Floyd of Rosedale. Iowa is 11-3 in its last 14 trophy games.

TROPHY GAMES

Three of Iowa's first five games of the season are trophy games. The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 13-3, to win the Cy-Hawk trophy in Week 2, and lost to No. 18 Wisconsin, 28-17, in a battle for the Heartland Trophy in Week 4. The Hawkeyes travel to Minnesota on Oct. 6 to defend Floyd of Rosedale. Iowa is 11-3 in its last 14 trophy games, with all three losses coming to Wisconsin.

The Hawkeyes defend the Heroes Trophy, their fourth of four trophy games, on Nov. 23 against Nebraska at Kinnick Stadium.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa's schedule includes two schools ranked in the AP top 25. The Hawkeyes fell to No. 18 Wisconsin, 27-17, on Sept. 22, and travel to No. 9 Penn State Oct. 27.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,237 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 644-554-39 (.537). That includes a 403-220-16 (.643) record in home games, a 241-334-23 (.421) record in games away from Iowa City, a 324-375-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 287-185-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

6 THROUGH THE AIR

QB Nate Stanley has five touchdown passes this season, raising his career total to 31. Stanley ranks 10th all-time in program history. He is three shy of tying Jake Rudock for ninth all-time. Four of Stanley's five touchdown passes this season have gone to TE Noah Fant. He and Fant have connected for touchdowns 15 times over the last 17 games.

Stanley threw 26 touchdowns last year, one shy of tying the single-season record held by Chuck Long (27, 1985). Of those 26 touchdown passes, Fant caught a team-high 11 touchdown passes, followed by Nick Easley (4). In total, 20 of Stanley's 26 touchdown targets return in 2018. TE T.J. Hockenson caught three touchdowns from Stanley in 2017, and WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette pulled in two touchdown receptions.

Stanley threw for a season-high 309 yards (second career 300-yard game) in Week 3's win against Northern Iowa. He became the 13th player in program history to pass for at least 3,000 yards. His 3,338 career passing yards rank 12th all-time.

DOWN, DOWN, DOWN IN FRONT

The Hawkeyes have 13 sacks, third most in the Big Ten and tied for 10th in the country.

DE A.J. Epenesa leads the team with four sacks. He is tied for the Big Ten lead and tied for fourth in the NCAA. Epenesa is one of eight Hawkeyes with sacks. DE Parker Hesse and DE Anthony Nelson have two, and DT Cedrick Lattimore, DT Brady Reiff, DT Matt Nelson, LB Nick Niemann, and LB Kristian Welch each have one.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 20th season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 146 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 86 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 137-77 (.640) overall mark and a 82-55 (.599) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 12 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 146-98 (.598) and an 86-69 (.555) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 146 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 158-119 (.570).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ BECOMES IOWA'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH, MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz (146-98) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 20th season.

Ferentz's 146 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. Iowa has at least eight wins in three straight seasons and owns a 31-13 mark since 2015.

Ferentz has 86 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 86 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Both Ferentz (146, 86) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 20th seasons on Iowa's staff. Defensive line coach Reese Morgan joined the staff in 1999 and is in his 19th season. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his seventh season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

EPENESA NAMED BIG CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DE A.J. Epenesa was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series on Sept. 8.

The Big Ten honor was the first of Epenesa's career. The native of Glen Carbon, Illinois (Edwardsville HS), recorded a career-best two sacks against Iowa State, causing a fourth quarter fumble that was recovered by teammate Chauncey Golston.

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten and rank sixth in the country in scoring defense (13.0). The Hawkeyes allowed 24 points through the first three games before surrendering 28 points to No. 18 Wisconsin in Week 4.

Iowa ranks second in the Big Ten in total defense (260.5) and rushing defense (84.0). The Hawkeyes have allowed 260.5 yards per game, fifth in the country. The 84 rushing yards allowed per game ranks sixth in the country.

The Hawkeyes limited Iowa State to just 19 yards rushing in Week 2, and held Northern Iowa to six rushing yards in Week 3 - a total ranks second all-time in the Ferentz era (20 years).

Iowa's pass defense (176.5) ranks sixth in the Big Ten.

Iowa has allowed just 59 first downs, second in the Big Ten and tied for eighth fewest in the country.

POCKET PROTECTION

Senior C Keegan Render leads an offensive line that has allowed four quarterback sacks, fewest in the Big Ten.

The Hawkeyes start two sophomore offensive tackles (LT Alaric Jackson and RT Tristan Wirfs) and rotate starting guards who have a combined 10 career starts (RG Cole Banwart, RG Dalton Ferguson, and LG Ross Reynolds).

YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE

TE Noah Fant has 16 career touchdown receptions, more than any other tight end in program history and tying Ed Hinkel and Robert Smith for seventh all-time in program history. He has four touchdowns in 2018, tied for fourth in the Big Ten and tied for the most among all tight ends in FBS (Jace Sternberger, Texas A&M).

Fant had two touchdown receptions against No. 18 Wisconsin in Week 4. It was the fourth multi-touchdown game of his career. Since 2000, the only Big Ten tight ends with four multi-touchdown games are Fant (4) and former Penn State TE Mike Gesicki (4). Fifteen of Fant's touchdown receptions have come from QB Nate Stanley over the Hawkeyes' last 17 games.

His 16 career touchdowns have come from near and far, listed in chronological order: 5, 2, 27, 23, 7, 45, 25, 3, 6, 4, 69, 8, 1, 5, 20, 1.

Fant was one of 10 conference players named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. He had 30 receptions last season, including a team-high 11 touchdowns, tied for most in the country among FBS tight ends and the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012.

FOSTER INHERITS FRESH LEGS

Running backs coach Derrick Foster is in his first season on Iowa's staff in charge of a position group that graduated 75 percent of its rushing yards in 2017, and entered 2018 with one combined career start (Toren Young).

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin made his first career-start and had a team and career-high 16 carries for 62 yards and one touchdown in Week 1. He missed Weeks 2-3 with an injury, but returned to the starting lineup and led Iowa with 72 yards on 14 carries in Week 4.

Young got the start in Weeks 2 and 3 rushed for a team-high both games. He is Iowa's top rusher with 49 carries for 268 yards.

RB Mehki Sargent set career highs in rushing attempts (15), rushing yards (72), rushing touchdowns (2), and receiving yards (48) in Week 3. The junior college transfer ranks second on the team in rushes (44) and rushing yards (151).

The committee has combined for six rushing touchdowns, three by Sargent, two by Young and one by Kelly-Martin.

The Hawkeye do not have a junior or senior among the position group. Sophomores Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young are the elder statesmen of the group. Henry Geil is a true freshman (15 carries, 37 yards).

Iowa graduated running backs Akrum Wadley (1,109 yards) and James Butler (396 yards) in 2017. The duo combined for 1,505 rushing yards in 2017.

NEW FACES IN THE CROWD

Five different Hawkeye linebackers have made their first career starts in 2018. Iowa has used three different starting linebacker combinations through the first four weeks.

Week 1 starting linebackers Amani Jones, Kristian Welch, and Nick Niemann started for the first time in their careers in Iowa's 33-7 win over Northern Illinois.

Niemann started Week 2 alongside Jack Hockaday and Djimon Colbert in Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State.

Welch returned to the lineup in Week 3, starting alongside Niemann and Hockaday. The same trio started Week 4.

Niemann is the only linebacker to start each game. Hockaday (28) and Welch (26) lead the team in tackles.

The 2018 season is the first in Kirk Ferentz's 20 years that the Hawkeyes opened the season without a linebacker with a single career start.

The five linebackers entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than Iowa's three starting linebackers in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).

The last time Ferentz had this little starting experience at the linebacker position was in 2014. That year, Quinton Alston, Bo Bower, and Reggie Spearman were Iowa's starting linebackers in the season opener. Only Alston had a previous career start (2012 at Michigan).

In Ferentz's first season in 1999, the opening day starting linebackers -- LeVar Woods, Aaron Kampman, and Derrick Davison had two career starts combined. Both starts belonged to Kampman, who started the final two games in 1998.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

TIGERHAWK ADDED TO WATER TOWER

For the second time in as many years, a Tigerhawk has found a home at Kinnick Stadium. In June 2018, a Tigerhawk logo and block IOWA lettering were added to the water tower that sits outside the northeast corner of Kinnick Stadium.

The Tigerhawk faces southwest, overlooking Kinnick Stadium, and stretches 24 feet wide and measures 15 feet, 5.75 inches in height. The block IOWA lettering is on the northwest side of the water tower and measures 24 feet by 9 1/8 feet. The height of the water tower tank is 70 feet.

The images were added one year after a Tigerhawk logo was placed at midfield at Kinnick Stadium.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 16 times in the last 17 seasons. Iowa has posted a 7-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz, most recently defeating Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. FILLING HOLES IN TAKEAWAYS

Iowa had one interception in its 33-7 win against Northern Illinois Week 1 (Amani Hooker) and one by Michael Ojemudia in its 38-14 win against Northern Iowa in Week 3. The Hawkeyes led the nation with 21 interceptions in 2017. The Hawkeyes return nine of the 21 thefts, led by safeties Jake Gervase (3) and Hooker (2). Returners DE Parker Hesse, S Geno Stone, LB Kristian Welch, and DL Brady Reiff also recorded interceptions last season. Iowa lost the nation's leader in interceptions, Josh Jackson (8), and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Josey Jewell (2), to the NFL. Both players were consensus All-Americans.

Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 10 seasons, and 15 of the last 17 seasons.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 12 players among its 2018 Leadership Group. The group includes six seniors, five juniors, and one sophomore. The Leadership Group votes on the weekly game day captains, is involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provides feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors WR Nick Easley, DB Jake Gervase, DE Parker Hesse, LB Aaron Mends, DL Matt Nelson, and OL Keegan Renders, juniors DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DL Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nate Stanley, and sophomore RB Toren Young.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2018. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his seventh year on staff, his second as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 11th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13, before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

IOWA IN OVERTIME

Iowa holds a 7-5 record in overtime games. Iowa won its first overtime contest, defeating Penn State 26-23 on Nov. 4, 2000, in State College, Pa. The Hawkeyes are 3-4 in single overtime, 3-0 in double overtime and 1-1 in triple overtime. Iowa is 2-2 in overtime in Kinnick Stadium and 5-3 in overtime road games. HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has six players on its roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: TE Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa in 1997), WR Henry Marchese (John in 1985), DE Anthony Nelson and DE Nathan Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

Iowa has four sets of the brothers on the team: DL Jack Kallenberger and OL Mark Kallenberger, DL Anthony Nelson and DL Nathan Nelson, OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, and TE Ben Subbert and LS Jackson Subbert.

Iowa has two players whose brothers played at Iowa: LB Nick Niemann (Ben in 2014-17) and DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11). Both older brothers are currently playing in the NFL.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkler, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl Games.

OL Trey Winters is the son of James Winters, a former All-Big Ten basketball player who led the Hawkeyes in scoring in 1994.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

SEEING DOUBLE

Junior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The last twins to start for the Hawkeyes were SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 15th season in 2018.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

The University of Iowa football program received the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching a heart-warming tradition at its home games last season that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the University's Stead Family Children's Hospital.

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchange waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season, with the exception of Wednesday in advance of Iowa's bye week. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes sold out Kinnick Stadium in three of its first four games in 2018.
- Iowa is 9-0 since the start of the 2017 season when scoring 20 points or more.
- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is in his 20th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa is one of 19 teams to have played in at least 15 bowl games since 2001.
- Iowa has appeared in 15 bowl games since 2001. Among Big Ten schools, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have appeared in more (16).
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 313 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had nine individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 65-43 (.607) since 2010.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 170 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz’s first year as head coach (66 draft picks/104 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa’s streak of 41 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- DB Micah Hyde (Buffalo), DL Mike Daniels (Green Bay), and OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2018 NFL Pro Bowl.
- Over the past 16 years, 143-of-165 (89 percent) of Iowa’s senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 11 years, Iowa has had 40 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (41), and Michigan (40). Since 2010, Iowa has had 33 players drafted in the NFL, tied for second most in the Big Ten – Ohio State (53), Penn State (33), and Wisconsin (33).
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa’s offensive coordinator, was New England’s tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Entering the 2018 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 14 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (9 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa’s starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

Iowa scored the game's first 33 points en route to a 33-7 season opening victory over Northern Illinois inside Kinnick Stadium. The win was a historic one for Kirk Ferentz as the head coach, as he surpassed Hayden Fry as the program's all-time winningest coach with 144 career wins.

The Hawkeyes, leading 3-0 at halftime, broke the game open in the second half, scoring touchdowns on four of their six drives while also registering a defensive safety in the fourth quarter.

Three of Iowa's four touchdowns came on the ground, while QB Nate Stanley connected with TE Noah Fant for a 1-yard score for the game's first touchdown midway through the third quarter. Running backs Ivory Kelly-Martin (two yards) and Toren Young (six yards), and QB Peyton Mansell (one yard) accounted for Iowa's rushing touchdowns.

Young (84 yards), Kelly-Martin (62 yards), and Mekhi Sargent (40 yards) combined for 186 rushing yards. Stanley and Mansell combined to complete 13-of-25 passes for 143 yards, with eight of the 13 targets (104 yards) going to tight ends. T.J. Hockenson caught a team-best four balls for 64 yards, Fant had three receptions for 10 yards, while Nate Wieting had one catch for 30 yards.

Iowa's defense amassed eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, and two takeaways (one interception and one fumble recovery). Defensive end Parker Hesse equaled a career best with two sacks. All three Iowa linebackers started their first game, with each registering career bests in tackles: Kristian Welch (11), Amani Jones (6), and Nick Niemann (4). The Hawkeyes limited the Huskies to 65 second-half yards, with 64 of the yards gained coming on NIU's final drive of the game.

On special teams, punter Colten Rastetter averaged 53.8 yards on four punts, including a personal-best 69-yard punt, and Miguel Recinos made all four PAT's and his only field goal attempt (33 yards).

Iowa started an all-Iowa native offensive and defensive line (nine players), marking the first time under Ferentz that four Iowa natives started on the defensive line and the first time since 2016 (week 3) that five Iowa natives started on the offensive line.

GAME RECAP

Iowa retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy as a result of a 13-3 win over Iowa State at a sold out Kinnick Stadium. The victory was the Hawkeyes' fourth straight in the series, their longest streak over their in-state rivals since winning 15 in a row from 1983-87.

After allowing a field goal on Iowa State's opening drive, Iowa's defense yielded only 122 total yards and no points on the Cyclones' remaining 10 possessions.

Iowa placekicker Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 31 and 48 yards in the second and third quarters, respectively, to give the Hawkeyes a narrow 6-3 margin going into the fourth quarter. The 48-yard kick matched a career long for Recinos.

In the Hawkeyes' first possession of the fourth quarter, Iowa QB Nate Stanley threw a strike to WR Brandon Smith for 30 yards to the Iowa State 2-yard line, which led to a Mekhi Sargent 2-yard touchdown on the next play. It was the game's only touchdown. The scoring drive covered 83 yards in 13 plays, with Iowa converting three third downs on the touchdown drive.

Iowa allowed only 19 rushing yards on 25 attempts, which ties for the fifth fewest single-game total allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa State's 188 total yards are its fewest in 52 games, since totaling 174 yards versus Baylor in 2013. Iowa's defense totaled four sacks, forced and recovered a fumble, and forced five three-and-outs.

Five Hawkeyes recorded career bests in tackles: DB Matt Hankins (8), LB Jack Hockaday (8), LB Nick Niemann (7), LB Djimon Colbert (5), and DE A.J. Epenesa (5). Two of Epenesa's tackles were sacks. He also forced a fumble and had one pass breakup. Epenesa's efforts earned the sophomore Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

Stanley finished the contest completing 16-of-28 passes for 166 yards. RB Toren Young amassed a game-high 68 yards on a career-high 21 carries. TE T.J. Hockenson caught a game and career-best six passes for 33 yards.

Iowa State has managed just six points in its last two trips to Kinnick Stadium (one field goal in 2016 and one field goal in 2018).

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 38 points and cruised to a 38-14 victory over Northern Iowa in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 for the eighth time under Kirk Ferentz, including the third time in four years.

Iowa's offense totaled 545 yards while its defense held the Panthers to 228, including six yards rushing.

TE Noah Fant's 5-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter was the 14th of his career. He has more touchdown receptions than any other Hawkeye tight end in program history.

RB Mekhi Sargent scored two second-quarter touchdowns, scoring on two and 10-yard runs to give Iowa a 21-0 advantage at halftime.

The Hawkeyes posted 17 points in the third period on their first three possessions. Miguel Recinos converted a 42-yard field goal to become the 40th Hawkeye to score 100 or more points in a career. WR Nick Easley caught a 14-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley and RB Toren Young crossed the goal line on a 15-yard run.

Sargent and Young combined for 154 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Easley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, hauling in 10 catches for 103 yards. Fant had five receptions for 99 yards. Easley's 10 receptions are the most by a Hawkeye since WR Kennan Davis had 10 catches for 129 yards and a touchdown against Pitt in 2011. Stanley finished the contest completing 23-of-28 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, marking the second time in his career that the junior signal caller has topped 300 yards passing.

The six rushing yards allowed are the second fewest by a Hawkeye defense in the Ferentz era. Iowa's defense collected three sacks, two takeaways (one interception, one fumble). The Hawkeyes held the Panthers to 20 yards on 20 plays in the first half and did not allow Northern Iowa into Iowa territory until 5:53 of the third quarter. LB Kristian Welch led the Iowa defense with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. Michael Ojemudia recorded his first career interception.

Northern Iowa scored two passing touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Its first score with 11:12 remaining was the first touchdown allowed by Iowa's defense in 111:00 of game time, dating back to the season opener against Northern Illinois.

The win was Iowa's 17th straight over Northern Iowa.

GAME RECAP

Nationally-ranked Wisconsin scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to rally past Iowa in the Big Ten opener, 28-17, inside a sold out Kinnick Stadium to retain possession of the Heartland Trophy.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first half. After a Wisconsin touchdown early in the second quarter, Iowa answered with a TE Noah Fant 20-yard touchdown catch, his first of two scores on the night. The Wisconsin score marked the first time in the first four games of the season that Iowa's defense surrendered a first-half touchdown.

K Miguel Recinos converted a 24-yard field goal to give the Hawkeyes a 10-7 advantage with 10:12 remaining in the third quarter. The two teams then traded touchdowns later in the third period. Alex Hornibrook completed a 12-yard TD pass to Danny Davis with 5:12 left in the third quarter, one of three touchdown passes for the Wisconsin quarterback. Fant caught his second touchdown on a 1-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley to give Iowa a narrow 17-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

WR A.J. Taylor caught a 17-yard touchdown pass and FB Alec Ingold scored on a 33-yard run in the fourth quarter to seal the win for the Badgers.

Wisconsin capitalized on three Iowa turnovers (two fumbles, one interception), scoring 14 points off Hawkeye miscues.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin returned to action after missing the previous two games due to injury. He led the Hawkeye running attack, carrying the ball 14 times for 72 yards.

Iowa tight ends combined for six catches and 154 yards receiving. T.J. Hockenson had three receptions for a career-best 125 yards, while Fant had 29 yards receiving and two touchdowns on three catches. Fant now has 16 career touchdowns and four multi-touchdown games.

Stanley completed 14-of-23 passes for 256 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception.

Defensively, safety Amani Hooker had a game-high 11 tackles. LB Nick Niemann (10), LB Jack Hockaday (9), and DE Anthony Nelson (7) had personal bests in tackles.
