- lowa has won its last five games, outscoring its opponents 186-76 and averaging 37.2 points per game during the winning streak. The Hawkeyes 186 points scored over the last five games represent the best five-game stretch since lowa totaled 207 in the first five games of 2002.
- QB Spencer Petras is 78-131 (59.5) with 877 passing yards (175.4 ypg) during the five-game winning streak. He has thrown six touchdowns and two interceptions over the last five games. Petras has 220 pass attempts through seven weeks, tied for the most by any Big Ten quarterback. He entered the season with 11 career pass attempts.
- The Hawkeyes are 18-4 in their last 22 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all four losses coming to Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defended Floyd of Rosedale at Minnesota on Nov. 13 (W, 35-7). Iowa defended the Heroes Trophy with a 26-20 win on Nov. 27 against Nebraska.
- RB Mekhi Sargent ranks fifth in the Big with 6.1 yards per carry, and third in the conference with seven rushing touchdowns. Sargent has 20 career rushing touchdowns, 11th most in school history. He has 1,689 career rushing yards, 21st all-time in program history. He needs 21 yards to tie Ed Podalak (1,710) for 20th all-time.
- RB Tyler Goodson leads the Hawkeyes and ranks third in the Big Ten with 656 rushing yards. Goodson has started the last 11 games at running back and has 10 rushing touchdowns during that stretch. He has 1,294 career rushing yards.
- The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten with 10 interceptions (Indiana 17; Northwestern 12). Iowa has 63 interceptions since 2017, the most by any team in the country. DE Zach VanValkenburg has four fumble recoveries this season, tied for the most in the country.
- 22 senior members of the lowa football program will be recognized Saturday. The senior class has an overall record of 32-14, including a 18-6 mark at home, a 20-14 record in Big Ten games, and a 13-3 record in trophy games (10-3 in rivalry games, 3-0 in bowl games).
- lowa has played 21 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams. DT Daviyon Nixon leads an lowa defensive front that ranks second in the Big Ten in sacks (20.0) and tackles for loss (46.0). Nixon leads the Big Ten with 5.5 sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss.
- Keith Duncan is Iowa's all-time career leader in field goal percentage (82.0). He has made 50-of-61 career field goal attempts. His 50 career field goals made rank fifth in program history. He is 20-of-20 in his career inside 30 yards, has 19 field goals made of 40 or more yards (tying Nate Kaeding for most in program history) and has made 60 consecutive PATs.
- LB Nick Niemann leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 69 tackles. He entered the season with 80 career tackles, including a season-high 43 as a sophomore in 2018. He recorded a career-best 17 tackles Week 5 at Penn State, the most by a Hawkeye since LB Anthony Hitchens made 19 stops against lowa State in 2012.

22 SENIORS PLAY FINAL HOME GAME

Twenty-two senior members of the lowa football program will be recognized during pregame ceremonies Saturday.

Senior members of the Iowa football program include Nick Anderson, Cole Banwart, Shaun Beyer, Max Cooper, Coy Cronk, Colton Dinsdale, Keith Duncan, Chauncey Golston, Matt Hankins, Jack Heflin, Alaric Jackson, Dalles Jacobus, Matt Lorbeck, Nick Niemann, Mekhi Sargent, Austin Schulte, Caleb Shudak, Brandon Smith, Ihmir Smith-Marsette, Austin Spiewak, Zach VanValkenburg, and Barington Wade.

Since the start of the 2017 season the Hawkeyes have won 32 games and qualified for a bowl game every year. The senior class has an overall record of 32-14, including a 18-6 mark at home, a 20-14 record in Big Ten games, and a 13-3 record in trophy games (10-3 in rivalry games, 3-0 in bowl games).

WARMING UP THE ARM

lowa has won its last five games, outscoring its opponents 186-76 and averaging 37.2 points per game during the winning streak. The Hawkeyes 186 points scored over the last five games represent the best five-game stretch since lowa totaled 207 in the first five games of 2002.

QB Spencer Petras is 78-131 (59.5) with 877 passing yards (175.4 ypg) during the five-game winning streak. He has thrown six touchdowns and two interceptions over the last five games. Petras has 220 pass attempts through seven weeks, tied for the most by any Big Ten quarterback. He entered the season with 11 career pass attempts.

The Hawkeyes are averaging 32.2 points per game this season, their highest total since 2002 (36.5).

Petras threw for 481 yards in Weeks 1-2, the most by an Iowa quarterback since Jake Rudock passed for 572 yards in the first two games of 2014. His 265 passing yards Week 1 were the most by a Hawkeye quarterback making his first career start since Jon Beutjer in 2000 (380 yards). Petras was the fifth Hawkeye quarterback under Ferentz to make his first career start on opening day. He led the Iowa offense to 460 total yards, its highest total in a Big Ten game since 2018 against Indiana (479).

Petras threw 50 times Week 2 in his Kinnick Stadium debut. The last Iowa quarterback to throw the ball 50 or more times in a game was Jake Rudock, who attempted 56 passes against Maryland in 2014.

ABOUT THE FIVE

- Iowa has won five straight Big Ten games since opening the season with losses to Purdue (24-20) and Northwestern (21-20).
- The Hawkeyes 186 points scored over the last five games represent the best five-game stretch since lowa totaled 207 in the first five games of 2002.
- QB Spencer Petras is 78-131 (59.5) with 877 passing yards (175.4 ypg) during the fivegame winning streak. He has thrown six touchdowns and two interceptions over the last five games
- lowa has won five straight Big Ten games for the eighth time in the last 61 years (2020, 2015, 2009, 2004, 2002, 1991, 1990, 1987).
- Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each of its five wins. It is the third time in school
 history Iowa has scored 25 points or more in five straight wins (1987, five games; 2015,
 seven games).
- Iowa won eight straight conference games in 2015 and 2008, and seven straight in 2004 and 1991).

SARGENT HITS PAY DIRT

RB Mekhi Sargent ranks third in the Big Ten with seven rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10, 2). His two-yard rushing score against Nebraska was the 20th rushing touchdown of his career. He is the 11th player in school history to have 20 career rushing touchdowns. He also has one career receiving touchdown. Sargent ranks fifth in the Big Ten averaging 6.1 yards per carry.

Sargent rushed 15 times for 101 yards against Penn State, his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and the third of his career. He has 1,689 career rushing yards, 21st all-time in program history. He needs 21 yards to tie Ed Podalak (1,710) for 20th all-time.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 22nd season as head coach at lowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
 Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 167 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 102 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 158-85 (.650) overall mark and an 98-63 (.609)
 Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 167-106 (.611) and a 102-77 (.570) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 167 wins. In 25 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 179-127 (.585).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
 Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
 Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 102 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 167 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (167) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (167-106) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 22nd season in 2020.

Both Ferentz (167,102) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top five in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 22nd season as lowa's head football coach in 2020. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named lowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 22nd season on Iowa's staff, his ninth as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his eighth season on lowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. This year's show is held virtually and streamed live from 6:30-8 p.m. (CT) on the Hawkeye Radio Network, KCRG 9.2 and the Hawkeye Radio Network YouTube channel.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

With a three-game road winning streak, lowa has won three straight Big Ten road games in a single season for the first time since 2016 (at Rutgers, at Minnesota, at Purdue). Iowa will post a .500 or above road record for all games played for the eighth straight season.

THE LAST MEETING -- TYRONE TRACY (Nov. 9, 2019 at Wisconsin)

WR Tyrone Tracy's 75-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was lowa's longest play from scrimmage of the season, and the longest reception of Tracy's career.

Tracy recorded a career-high 130 receiving yards, the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye since Jake Duzey had 138 yards against Ohio State in 2013, and the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye wide receiver since Marvin McNutt had 130 receiving yards against Michigan State in 2011.

THE LAST MEETING -- GAME OF FIRSTS (Nov. 9, 2019 at Wisconsin)

Freshman TE Sam LaPorta became the first true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at tight end, and LB Jack Campbell became the fourth true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at linebacker (James Morris, 2010; A.J. Edds, 2006; Fred Barr, 1999).

LB Barrington Wade made his first career start.

CB Matt Hankins' interception in the fourth quarter was the first of his career. Hankins had a game-high eight tackles.

WR Nico Ragaini caught a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the first touchdown of his career.

RETURN TO SENDER

lowa has two of the country's top returners. Junior Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth in the country averaging 11.8 yards per punt return. He has one punt return for a touchdown (54 yards vs. Michigan State). Senior WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette averages 21.0 yards per kickoff return in 2020, No. 3 in the Big Ten.

Smith-Marsette ranks No. 2 in Big Ten history in kickoff return average. Smith-Marsette averages 28.7 yards on 52 career kickoff returns. Smith-Marsette has 1,491 kickoff return yards, fourth all-time in program history (Douthitt 1,762; Johnson-Koulianos 1,575; Hill 1,509).

Smith-Marsette has 1,475 career receiving yards, 22nd all-time in program history. He has 3,242 all-purpose yards, 14th all-time.

In 2019, Smith-Marsette became the first player in school history to return two kickoffs for a touchdown in the same season. He did it in consecutive games to end the season. He had a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Nebraska, tying for the 10th longest in school history, and a 98-yard return against USC at the Holiday Bowl, the seventh longest in school history, an lowa bowl record, and tying a Holiday Bowl record.

Smith-Marsette had a team-high 10 touchdowns in 2019; five receiving, three rushing, and two kickoff returns.

Smith-Marsette scored three touchdowns at the 2019 Holiday Bowl (all in the first half), tying Shonn Greene's lowa bowl record. He is the second Hawkeye in program history to score a touchdown via rush, reception, and kickoff return, in a single game (George Rice, vs. Purdue in 1951). He is the first college player since 1998 (Deuce McAllister, Independence Bowl) to score a touchdown via rush, reception, kickoff return in a bowl game.

IN THE RANKINGS

lowa finished the 2019 season ranked No. 15 in both the AP poll and the coaches poll. It marked the 25th time in program history that lowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 21 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

The Hawkeyes are 18-4 in their last 22 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all four losses coming to Wisconsin.

The Hawkeyes defended Floyd of Rosedale at Minnesota on Nov. 13 (W, 35-7) in their first of three trophy games in 2020. Iowa defended the Heroes Trophy with a 26-20 win on Nov. 27 against Nebraska. The Hawkeyes try to reclaim the Heartland Trophy on Saturday vs. Wisconsin. Iowa will maintain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy vs. Iowa State due to the Big Ten's decision to play a conference-only schedule.

DUNCAN GETTING HIS KICKS

Senior K Keith Duncan is lowa's all-time career leader in field goal percentage (82.0). He has made 50-of-61 career field goal attempts. His 50 career field goals made rank fifth in program history. He is 20-of-20 in his career inside 30 yards, has 19 field goals made of 40 or more yards (tying Nate Kaeding for most in program history) and has made 60 consecutive PATs.

Duncan is 12-of-16 on field goal attempts this season. He kicked four field goals, including two in the fourth quarter against Nebraska. He first fourth-quarter field goal against the Huskers (48 yards) broke a 20-20 tie, and helped him earn Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors. Duncan has 244 career points, sixth most in program history.

Duncan led the country with a Big Ten single-season record 29 field goals made in 2019, and was a consensus first-team All-American, the 26th in program history. Duncan was named the Bakken-Anderson Kicker of the Year in the Big Ten Conference in 2019, and was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award.

Duncan has two game-winning field goals in his career. He kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to defeat No. 2 Michigan, 14-13, at home in 2016. He connected on a 48-yard attempt to give Iowa a 27-24 lead with one second left at Nebraska in 2019.

D-LINE EMERGES AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

lowa has played 21 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.

Junior DT Daviyon Nixon leads an Iowa defensive front that ranks second in the Big Ten in sacks (20.0) and tackles for loss (46.0). Nixon leads the Big Ten with 5.5 sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss. DE Zach VanValkenburg ranks third with 8.5 tackles for loss, and DE Chauncey Golston ranks seventh with 7.5 tackles for loss. Golston's 4.5 sacks rank fourth in the conference.

lowa ranks No. 3 in the conference in scoring defense (17.3), rush defense (115.0) and total defense (326.4). The Hawkeyes are ranked fourth in pass defense (211.4)

Nixon has two games this season (Northwestern, Nebraska) with three tackles for loss. He set career highs in tackles in Week 1 and Week 2, registering seven stops in the season opener at Purdue, and besting that with 11 tackles in the home opener against Northwestern. He recorded his first career interception Week 5 at Penn State, returning in 71 yards for a touchdown. It was his first touchdown scored at any level in his playing career. The 71-yard return ties for the 14th longest interception return in program history.

VanValkenburg had a career-high three sacks Week 4 at Minnesota, the most by a Hawkeye since A.J. Epenesa had 4.5 against Nebraska in 2019. He has four fumble recoveries this season, tied for the most in the country. His 3.5 sacks tie for eighth in the Big Ten.

Golston has 4.5 sacks, fourth in the Big Ten. He is the lone returning frontline starter on a defense that ranked in the top 20 in scoring, rushing, passing, and total defense in 2019. He intercepted a pass at Penn State, his third career interception, and forced a fumble on Nebraska's final play to help lowa defeat the Huskers, 26-20. The forced fumble was the first of his career.

LAPORTA LEADS ALL PASS CATCHERS

TE Sam LaPorta leads lowa in receptions (26) and receiving yards (260). Only two times since 1992 has a tight end led lowa in season receiving yards. Alan Cross in 1992 (55-640) and T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (49-760).

lowa wide receivers account for 69 of the team's 127 receptions (54.3 percent). WR Nico Ragaini, WR Brandon Smith, WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette and WR Tyrone Tracy combine for 69 receptions and 749 receiving yards. The receivers have five of lowa's seven touchdown receptions (Smith 7 yards, 14 yards; Smith-Marsette 8, 4; Tracy 6), and two of lowa's rushing touchdowns (Ragaini 1; Smith Marsette 13).

THAT'S NOT A PUNT, THIS IS A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks third in the Big Ten and 18th in the country averaging 44.6 yards per punt. The freshman has downed 17 of his 32 punts inside the 20. He has nine punts of 50-plus yards, with a career-high 61 yard punt Week 3 vs. Michigan State. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts have been returned (31 yards). Iowa is fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (43.7).

Taylor is one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads the Hawkeyes and ranks third in the Big Ten with 656 rushing yards. Goodson has started the last 11 games at running back and has 10 rushing touchdowns during that stretch. He has 1,294 career rushing yards.

Goodson has three 100-yard rushing games this season. He rushed for 113 yards against Michigan State and a career-high 142 yards against Minnesota. He set a career high with 30 carries against Nebraska, rushing for 111 yards. Goodson leads Iowa in rushing attempts (132) and rushing yards (656). He has six rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10).

Goodson has two multi-touchdown games this season. He had two rushing touchdowns (3, 9) Week 3 vs. Michigan State, and two more Week 4 at Minnesota (7, 1).

lowa is tied for first in the Big Ten with 17 rushing touchdowns: RB Mekhi Sargent (7), Goodson (6), QB Spencer Petras (2), WR Nico Ragaini (1), Ihmir Smith-Marsette (1). The Hawkeyes have scored 71 percent of their offensive touchdowns on the ground (17 rushing, 7 passing, 2 interception return, 1 punt return).

Goodson started the final four games of 2020 and became the first true freshman in program history to lead the team in single-season rushing yards (638). The last redshirt freshman to lead Iowa in single-season rushing yards was Ladell Betts in 1998 (679 yards). Goodson led the team with five rushing touchdowns (1, 10, 2, 55, 1), and had 24 receptions for 166 yards. His 158 combined touches led the team.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon).

BIG NIEMANN ON CAMPUS

Senior LB Nick Niemann leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 69 tackles. He entered the season with 80 career tackles, including a season-high 43 as a sophomore in 2018. He recorded a career-best 17 tackles Week 5 at Penn State, the most by a Hawkeye since LB Anthony Hitchens made 19 stops against lowa State in 2012. Niemann is the third Hawkeye this season to register 13 or more tackles in a single game (FS Jack Koerner 13 vs. Purdue; LB Seth Benson 13 vs. Northwestern).

BENSON STARTS AND FINISHES

Sophomore LB Seth Benson made his first five career starts Weeks 2-7. He was lowa's leading tackler in weeks 2-3 and tied for the team lead in Week 4. He recorded a career-high 13 tackles in his first career start Week 2 against Northwestern. It was Benson's first appearance of the season after missing the opener with an injury. He had a team-high eight tackles Week 3 vs. Michigan State, and tied for the team lead with seven stops at Minnesota. His 43 tackles rank second on the team. Benson appeared in all 13 games as a redshirt freshman in 2019, and saw limited action in three games as a true freshman in 2018. He entered his first career start with 11 career tackles.

The Hawkeyes are 3-4 in single overtime, 3-0 in double overtime and 1-1 in triple overtime. Iowa is 2-2 in overtime in Kinnick Stadium and 5-3 in overtime road games. GOING THE OTHER WAY

The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten with 10 interceptions (Indiana 17; Northwestern 12). Iowa has 63 interceptions since 2017, the most by any team in the country.

The Hawkeyes had at least one interception in 12 straight games before not collecting an interception Week 6 vs. Nebraska. They had 18 total interceptions during that stretch. Iowa intercepted two passes in the season opener, one in Week 2, three in Week 3, two in Week 4, and two in Week 5. The last time lowa had a stretch of at least 12 games with an interception was 2008, when the Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in each of the 13 games.

FS Jack Koerner is tied for fifth in the Big Ten with three interceptions. LB Barrington Wade and DB Riley Moss each have two interceptions. DE Chauncey Golston, DB Matt Hankins and DL Daviyon Nixon each have one.

Moss returned his interception 54 yards Week 3 against Michigan State to extend the Hawkeyes' streak of consecutive seasons with a pick-six to 13. Iowa has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 18 of the last 20 seasons. Nixon returned his interception 71 yards for a pick six Week 5, the 14th longest interception return in program history.

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, players, coaches, and fans inside Kinnick Stadium exchange waves at the end of the first quarter with patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital. The tradition continues in 2020, with limited fans inside Kinnick Stadium.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City. Due to the COVID pandemic, patients and their families must stay in their rooms and wave in 2020.

The University of Iowa football program received the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching the heart-warming tradition that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the University's Stead Family Children's Hospital.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- lowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.
- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 18 of the last 19 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (10) has more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took
 over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record
 of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (164-106) replaced Fry and is in his 22nd season
 in 2020. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 335 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
 They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press
 National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding
 (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene
 (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman),
 Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson
 (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country. The Hawkeyes were named to the Joe Moore Award midseason honor roll in 2020.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 42 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 36 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 188 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (75 draft picks/113 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (43 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became
 the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL
 Draft (2019).
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 19 years, 155-of-180 (88 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 13 years, Iowa has had 49 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (73), Michigan (55), Wisconsin (49).
- lowa has had seven first round picks in the last 10 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Entering the 2020 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (15) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 17 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/6 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa extended its winning streak to five games. Iowa has won five straight in the same season for the first time since 2015, when it opened the season 12-0. Iowa has outscored its last five opponents, 186-76, averaging 37.2 points per game during the winning streak.

The win was Iowa's seventh straight against Illinois.

lowa trailed Illinois, 14-0, in the second quarter. The last time lowa won a game in which it trailed by at least 14 points was Nov. 23, 2013. The Hawkeyes trailed Michigan 21-7 in the second quarter, and scored the final 17 points of the game to win, 24-21. The Hawkeyes scored on four straight possessions after trailing 14-0 (TD, FG, FG, TD).

QB Spencer Petras threw a career-high three touchdowns (24 yards to TE Sam LaPorta, 4 yards to WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette, 16 yards to TE Shaun Beyer).

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette's 9-yard reception in the first quarter was the 100th reception of his career. His is the 24th player in program history to have 100 or more receptions. Smith-Marsette had two touchdowns today, a 4-yard reception and a 13-yard rush.

TE Sam LaPorta scored his first career touchdown, a 22-yard reception from QB Spencer Petras.

TE Shaun Beyer scored his first career touchdown, a 16-yard reception from QB Spencer Petras.

WR Brandon Smith had a season high 5 receptions and a season-high 58 yards. His 7-yard reception in the third quarter put him over 1,000 career receiving yards. He is the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards. Smith has 88 career receptions for 1,016 yards.

DB Matt Hankins had 3 tackles today, including 2 solo stops. He 161 career tackles (100 solo).

DE Chauncy Golston matched a career high with 8 tackles.

DL Daviyon Nixon had 1.5 tackles for loss. He entered the game leading the Big Ten with 11.5 TFL.

K Keith Duncan connected on a 40-yard field goal in the second quarter. It was his 19th career field of 40 yards or more, tying Nate Kaeding for the most in school history. Duncan's 27-yard field goal in the second quarter was No. 50 of his career. Duncan has 50 career field goals, fifth all-time.

Iowa has played 21 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.
