The Hawkeyes are 23-4 in their last 27 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 20-4 in their last 24 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

lowa has three wins over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (9) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

Iowa ranks second in the Big Ten and ties for third in the country in scoring defense (14.6). Iowa's total defense (301.3) ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 13th in the country. Iowa's rush defense ranks third in the Big Ten and seventh in the country (89.9).

lowa leads the country in interceptions (16) and takeaways (21) and ranks third in turnover margin (+15). The Hawkeyes have 80 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Nine different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season.

C Tyler Linderbaum was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linerbaum has made 28 consecutive starts at center. Iowa is 22-6 during that span.

P Tory Taylor ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 46.2 yards per punt. Taylor has 12 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Twentyone of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic.

QB Spencer Petras owns a 13-2 as Iowa's starting quarterback, the second best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846). Petras' 31.6 points per game (2020-21) is the highest average by a Hawkeye starting quarterback since Banks (36.6, 2002).

K Caleb Shudak has connected on 11-of-13 field goal attempts and is good on all 23 PAT tries. He connected on career highs in field goals (3) against Maryland and Penn State. He has a team-high 56 points, eighth in the Big Ten. Shudak has 23 touchbacks on 39 kickoffs.



LB Jack Campbell is tied for third in the Big Ten with 67 tackles and was named a secondteam midseason All-American by The Athletic. He had a career-high 18 tackles in Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, earning B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors.

University of Iowa Moon Family head football coach Kirk Ferentz is one 16 head coaches named to the Dodd Trophy Midseason Watch List. Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). He was named the Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2015.

Iowa and Wisconsin will battle for the Heartland Trophy Saturday in Madison, as Iowa earned possession of the trophy with a 28-7 win last November in Iowa City. Iowa has four rivalry games on it schedule in 2021. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series on Sept. 11.

Iowa will also defend Floyd of Rosedale Nov. 13 against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium, and the Heroes Trophy Nov. 26 at Nebraska. Iowa has won six straight against The Cyclones, Gophers and Huskers.

The Hawkeyes are 23-4 in their last 27 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 20-4 in their last 24 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

THE LAST TRIP TO MADISON (Nov. 9, 2019)

Iowa scored a late touchdown in Madison, but a failed two-point conversion proved to be the difference as Wisconsin won, 24-22. WR Tyrone Tracy's 75-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was Iowa's longest play from scrimmage of the season, and the longest reception of Tracy's career. Tracy finished the game with a career-high 130 receiving yards.

TE Sam LaPorta became the first true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at tight end, and LB Jack Campbell became the fourth true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at linebacker (James Morris, 2010; A.J. Edds, 2006; Fred Barr, 1999).

CB Matt Hankins' interception in the fourth quarter was the first of his five career interceptions. Hankins had a game-high eight tackles.

WR Nico Ragaini caught a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the first touchdown of his career.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

lowa leads the country with 16 interceptions. The school record for interceptions in a season is 23 (1986, 1987, 2008). The Hawkeyes have 80 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Nine Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. DB Riley Moss has four interceptions, a Big Ten best. He leads the nation in interceptions per game, having missed the Purdue game due to injury. Moss has two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1.

lowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

lowa has turned 21 turnovers into 78 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 20 points (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21. The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten with 11 interceptions in eight games in 2020.

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 174 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 106 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 165-86 (.657) overall mark and a 102-64 (.614) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 174-107 (.619) and a 106-78 (.576) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 174 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 186-128 (.592).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 106 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 174 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (174) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (174-107) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (174, 106) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on Iowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's guarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

JUST WIN BABY

QB Spencer Petras owns a 13-2 as Iowa's starting quarterback, the second best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846). Petras' 31.6 points per game (2020-21) is the highest average by a Hawkeye starting quarterback since Banks (36.6, 2002).

Petras led lowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during lowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the Coaches poll.

Iowa reached as high at No. 2 in the AP and Coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

Iowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (9) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

The Hawkeyes' six straight wins against ranked opponents dates back to 2019. The last time lowa won six straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

Iowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season Iowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

lowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the Coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 46.2 yards per punt. Taylor has 12 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Twenty-one of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic.

Iowa has owned the field position battle in each of its six wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State). Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era and its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 in the Ferentz era.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

In 2020, Taylor was named Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Punter of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches, media and Associated Press. He ranked third in the Big Ten and 19th in the country averaging 44.1 yards per punt. The freshman downed 18 of his 40 punts inside the 20. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts were returned (31 yards). Iowa ranked fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (42.9).

Taylor is on the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and is a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads lowa's rushing attack with 586 yards on 136 attempts. His five rushing touchdowns rank seventh in the Big Ten. He has 1,986 career rushing yards (16th all-time). He is 14 yards shy of becoming the 16th player in program history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.

He rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns Week 3 against Kent State. It was the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. The 100-yard rushing game was the sixth of his career. Against Kent State, Goodson became the fifth Iowa player (sixth instance as Akrum Wadley did it twice) in the Ferentz era to rush for 150-plus yards and 3-plus touchdowns in a game (LeShun Daniels 2015, Shonn Greene 2008, Akrum Wadley 2015, 2017, Mark Weisman 2012). His third touchdown rush against Kent State pushed him over 100 career points scored (104). He now has 110 points.

Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. He had seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fourth in the Big Ten. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press in 2020.

Goodson led Iowa in rushing attempts (143) and rushing yards (762) in 2020. He tied for the team lead with seven rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10, 80).

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

FRESH LEGS

Two true freshmen made their first career starts Week 4 against Colorado State. OL Connor Colby started at RG. WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby was the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson was the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,274 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 672-563-39 (.543). That includes a 418-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 253-339-23 (.428) record in games away from Iowa City, a 344-384-25 (.473) mark in Big Ten games and a 302-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

5 HAWKEYES NAMED TO MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAMS

Five members of the University of Iowa football team have been recognized on college football's midseason All-America football teams. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum, previously named to the Associated Press team, is also listed as first-team center by Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic.

Senior defensive back Matt Hankins, also named first-team by the Associated Press, is named first team by CBS Sports and second team by The Athletic. Senior defensive back Riley Moss is a first team selection by Sporting News.

Sophomore punter Tory Taylor is recognized as a first-team selection by the Athletic, while junior linebacker Jack Campbell is a second-team choice by The Athletic.

Linderbaum is one of 12 semifinalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award. He was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and preseason first-team All-America by five media outlets, including Associated Press, The Athletic, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and Sporting News. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week and the Bronko Nagurski and Thorpe Award national Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State.

Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in the win over Penn State. He had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Moss leads the country in interceptions per game, with four interceptions. Moss had two interception returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Taylor has been at his best in the biggest games. Six of nine punts against No. 4 Penn State were inside the 20, including four inside the five-yard line. In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor dropped three of his punts inside the 10-yard line.

Campbell earned national Player of the Week honors when he recorded 18 tackles in lowa's win over Colorado State. Campbell leads the Hawkeyes with 67 tackles. He returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown at Iowa State and his fumble recovery against Colorado State led directly to a Hawkeye touchdown.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give Iowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among lowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klinkenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive back Josh Jackson (2017) and quarterback Nate Stanley (2018).

The weekly conference honor is the second of his career. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2018 following a pair of interceptions at Minnesota.

TAYLOR NAMED B1G CO-SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

P Tory Taylor was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following No. 10 Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State on Sept. 11 in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He was also named to the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list following Iowa's Week 2 win and following Iowa's win over Penn State.

Taylor earned the Big Ten honors after playing a key role in Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downing inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

The Big Ten Player of the Week honor is a career first for Taylor. He was named to the Ray Guy Award preseason Watch List in July after being named a semifinalist for the award in 2020. Taylor was the Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Conference Punter of the Year in 2020 while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by the FWAA and second-team All-America by The Athletic.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 199 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (79 draft picks/120 free agents).
- Iowa football is tied for sixth in the nation with 34 active players on NFL rosters to start the 2021 season.
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson was named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) and TE George Kittle (San Francisco) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 20 years, 163-of-188 (87 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had seven first round picks in the last 11 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 10th year on staff and fifth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.

- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2021 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (16) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 18 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

CAMPBELL NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LB Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 Iowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week. Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the six-yard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14.

Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

HANKINS NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Matt Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week following No. 3 Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State on Oct. 9.

Hankins was credited with five tackles in Iowa's win over Penn State, including three solo stops and two assists, along with Iowa's fourth and final interception of the day. Hankins was credited with a solo tackle on a Penn State fourth-and-three attempt with 3:39 remaining, stopping a PSU drive that reached the Iowa 45-yardline.

Hankins then stopped Penn State's next possession with an interception on fourth down, his third of the season. Hankins had two interceptions earlier this season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12

Iowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was Iowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

Iowa's 12-game streak including nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.

lowa has won 15 straight non-conference games, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. The nonconference win streak is the longest in the country. Iowa's last nonconference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl (Florida, 30-3).

IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council includes 16 student-athlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 2021 group consists of seniors Matt Hankins, Ivory Kelly-Martin, Jack Koerner, Kyler Schott, Caleb Shudak and Zach VanValkenburg, and juniors Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Tyler Goodson, Sam LaPorta, Tyler Linderbaum, Kaevon Merriweather, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Iowa defeated Maryland on Oct. 1 in its first of two Friday games in 2021. In addition to the Hawkeyes trip to College Park, Maryland, Iowa faces Nebraska on Friday, Nov. 26 (12:30 p.m., BTN). Iowa has won eight straight games played on a Friday.

Iowa and Nebraska meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the 11th consecutive season. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference in 2011. Iowa is 7-3 in the previous 10 Black Friday meetings, including winners of six straight.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2021. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 10th year on staff, his fifth as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 14th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Ladell Betts joined the Iowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in Iowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.

Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead Iowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 Iowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-2018.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from VUE Rooftop at the Hilton Garden Inn in Iowa City.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (173-106) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today Coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 348 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.

- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.



lowa has scored at least 25 points in each of its wins during its winning streak. It is the second time in school history lowa has scored 25 points or more in seven straight wins (2015, seven games).

Iowa and Indiana met as AP ranked opponents for the second time ever and the first time since 1991, when No. 10 Iowa defeated No. 25 Indiana, 38-21, at Kinnick Stadium.

lowa has won its last nine games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last eight opponents, 305-113, averaging 33.9 points per game offensively and allowing 12.6 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each win.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to nine consecutive wins. He was 25-36 for 209 yards passing today. The 25 completions are one shy of matching a career-high. Petras is 141-240 with 1,548 passing yards during Iowa's nine-game winning streak. He has thrown 10 touch-downs and two interceptions over the last nine games.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. The last Hawkeye to rush for three touchdowns in a single game was Akrum Wadley in 2017 vs. Nebraska. Goodson recorded his sixth career 100-yard rushing yard game, his first this season.

Two true freshmen made their first career starts today. OL Connor Colby started at RG. WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby is the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson is the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

WR Keagan Johnson's first career reception was a 43-yard touchdown from QB Spencer Petras. Johnson finished the game with two receptions for 92 yards and a touchdown.

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as Iowa head coach, 30 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

lowa outscored Colorado State, 14-0, in the third quarter and has outscored its four opponents, 31-3, this season in the third quarter.

lowa scored a touchdown off of one takeaway today and has scored 51 points on nine takeaways this season.

lowa has won 15 straight nonconference games, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. Iowa's last non-conference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl. The 15-game nonconference win streak is the longest in the nation.

Iowa has played 26 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.

lowa has won 11 consecutive games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last 11 opponents, 380-141, averaging 34.5 points per game offensively and allowing 12.8 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has won 11 straight for the first time since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Spencer Petras improved to 11-2 as Iowa's starting quarterback, matching the best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846).

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 11 consecutive wins. He was 21-30 for 259 yards passing Friday. He matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two touchdown rushes. Petras is 177-293 with 2,031 passing yards during Iowa's 11-game winning streak. He has thrown 15 touchdowns and three interceptions over the last 11 games.

QB Spencer Petras had two 1-yard touchdown rushes in the second quarter. He has three rushing touchdowns this season, five in his career (1, 3, 9, 1, 1). Friday was his first career multi-touchdown game. Petras is the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a single same game since Brad Banks in 2002 at Minnesota.

QB Spencer Petras connected with RB Tyler Goodson for a 67-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was a career-long pass for Petras and a career-long reception for Goodson.

lowa scored 31 points in the second quarter, the most points scored in a single quarter since scoring 37 in the first quarter against Akron on Aug. 31, 2002. The 31 points scored in a Big Ten game are the most by a Hawkeye team since putting up 35 points on Illinois in the first quarter in 1985.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass Friday, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982. Iowa leads the Big Ten with 12 interceptions. Iowa has 76 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country.

Iowa had seven takeaways, its most in a single game single game since 1987 against Northwestern (8). The Hawkeye defense has scored 20 points this season (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa scored points following its first four takeaways, turning the four takeaways into 24 points. The Hawkeyes have scored 75 points on 16 takeaways this season.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 12 consecutive wins. He was 17-31 for 195 yards passing Saturday. Petras is 194-324 with 2,226 passing yards during Iowa's 12-game winning streak. He has thrown 17 touchdowns and four interceptions over the last 12 games.

LB/SS Jestin Jacobs's first-quarter interception was the first of his career. He is the ninth Hawkeye this season to record an interception.

FS Jack Koerner's first-quarter interception was his second in as many weeks, the sixth of his career.

DB Riley Moss had an interception in the second quarter, his fourth of the season. Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history.

DB Matt Hankins fourth-quarter interception was his third of the season, sixth of his career.

WR Nico Ragaini's fourth-quarter touchdown (44 yards) was his first of the season and third of his career. Ragaini's team-high 73 yards receiving are a career best.
