Saturday will be the 77th meeting between Iowa and Illinois. Iowa has won seven in a row and six straight at home. Illinois' last win at Kinnick Stadium was in 1999 (40-24), Kirk Ferentz's first year as Iowa's head coach. Illinois' last win in the series was a 27-24 victory in Champaign in 2008.

lowa leads the country in interceptions (19) and ranks third nationally in takeaways (24). The Hawkeyes have 83 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Ten different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. Iowa is plus-17 in turnover margin in its eight wins and minus-six in its two losses.

DB Riley Moss and LB/DB Dave Belton tie for the conference lead with four interceptions. DB Matt Hankins ranks seventh with three interceptions. Iowa is the only team in the country with two players with four or more interceptions. All three players have recorded two interceptions in a single game this season.

lowa ranks third the Big Ten and seventh in the country in scoring defense (16.3). Iowa's total defense (315.1) ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 12th in the country.

C Tyler Linderbaum is one of four finalists for the Rotary Lombardi Award. He was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum has made 31 consecutive starts at center. Iowa is 24-7 during that span.

QB Alex Padilla made his first career start Nov. 13 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 passing yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts. QB Spencer Petras missed that game, snapping his streak of 17 straight starts at quarterback.

WR Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten averaging 10.4 yards on a league-high 26 punt returns. He has returned 19 kickoffs for an average of 22.9 yards per return, No. 4 in the Big Ten. Iowa has won the field position battle in each of its eight wins.

P Tory Taylor ranks 4th in the B1G averaging 45.8 yards per punt. Taylor leads the B1G and ranks third nationally with 63 punts. He has 19 punts of 50 or more yards. Thirty of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic and is a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award. RB Tyler Goodson leads lowa's rushing attack with 813 yards on 188 attempts, both single-season career highs. His six rushing touchdowns rank seventh in the Big Ten. Goodson is 187 yards shy of 1,000. The last time a Hawkeye rushed for 1,000 yards in a single season was 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

LB Jack Campbell recorded 17 tackles Week 10 against Minnesota to raise his season total to 100, second in the Big Ten. The last Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season was Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136).

Seventeen senior members of the Iowa football program will be recognized during pregame ceremonies Saturday.

Senior members of the Iowa football program include WR Max Cooper, OL Luke Empen, P Ryan Gersonde, CB Matt Hankins, WR Charlie Jones, RB Ivory Kelly-Martin, FS Jack Koerner, TE Tommy Kujawa, DB Henry Marchase, CB Riley Moss, OL Kyler Schott, TE Bryce Schulte, K Caleb Shudak, LS Austin Spiewak, DE Zach VanValkenburg, DB Xavior Williams.

Since the start of the 2018 season the Hawkeyes have won 33 games and qualified for a bowl game every year. The senior class has an overall record of 33-11, including a 19-5 mark at home, a 22-11 record in Big Ten games, and a 13-3 record in trophy games (11-3 in rivalry games, 2-0 in bowl games).

PADILLA LEADS IOWA TO WIN IN FIRST CAREER START

QB Alex Padilla made his first career start Nov. 13 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 passing yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts.

Padilla entered the game on week earlier at Northwestern on Iowa's fourth drive, substituting for an injured QB Spencer Petras. Padilla finished the game with a then-career high 172 passing yards. He set career best in completions (18) and attempts (28).

QB Spencer Petras had started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes before missing the Nov. 13 contest against Minnesota.

IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked 18th in the AP poll and 14th in the Coaches poll.

lowa reached as high at No. 2 in the AP and Coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

lowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (9) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

The Hawkeyes' six straight wins against ranked opponents dates back to 2019. The last time lowa won six straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

lowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season lowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

Iowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 176 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 108 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 167-87 (.657) overall mark and a 104-65 (.615) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 176-108 (.619) and a 108-79 (.577) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 174 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 188-129 (.593).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 108 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 176 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (176) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (176-108) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (176, 108) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on lowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

HAWKEYES OPENED 6-FOR-6

lowa opened the season with six straight wins for the third time in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa started 9-0 in 2009 and 12-0 in 2015.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,277 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 674-564-39 (.543). That includes a 419-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 255-340-23 (.431) record in games away from lowa City, a 346-385-25 (.474) mark in Big Ten games and a 303-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

4 yards to WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette, 16 yards to TE Shaun Beyer). LaPorta's touchdown reception was the first of his career.

PETRAS AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

QB Spencer Petras started 17 consecutive games from the 2020 season opener through Week 9 of 2021. Petras's streak of consecutive starts was snapped when he did not play Nov. 13 against Minnesota due to injury. He owns a 13-4 record (.765) as Iowa's starting quarterback, the fourth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. Iowa has scored 27.9 points per game in 17 Petras starts. He has 3,024 career passing yards, 14th all-time in program history.

Petras led lowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during lowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first lowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

lowa leads the country with 19 interceptions. The school record for interceptions in a season is 23 (1986, 1987, 2008). The Hawkeyes have 83 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Ten Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. The last time lowa had 10 players with an interception in a single season was 2017.

DB Riley Moss and LB/DB Dave Belton tie for the conference lead with four interceptions. DB Matt Hankins ranks seventh with three interceptions. Iowa is the only team in the country with two players with four or more interceptions. All three players have recorded two interceptions in a single game this season.

Moss has two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1.

lowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

lowa has turned 24 turnovers into 84 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 20 points (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 45.8 yards per punt. Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks third nationally with 63 punts. He has 19 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Thirty of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic and is a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.

Iowa owned the field position battle in each of its eight wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State).

This season, Taylor has recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 ties for ninth.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

In 2020, Taylor was named Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Punter of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches, media and Associated Press. He ranked third in the Big Ten and 19th in the country averaging 44.1 yards per punt. The freshman downed 18 of his 40 punts inside the 20. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts were returned (31 yards). Iowa ranked fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (42.9).

Taylor was on the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and was a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

RETURN TO SENDER

WR Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten averaging 10.4 yards on a league-high 26 punt returns. He has returned 19 kickoffs for an average of 22.9 yards per return, No. 4 in the Big Ten. Iowa owned the field position battle in each of its eight wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State).

CAMPBELL HITS 100

LB Jack Campbell recorded 17 tackles Week 10 against Minnesota to raise his season total to 100, second in the Big Ten. The last Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season was Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136).

Campbell earned national Player of the Week honors when he recorded 18 tackles in lowa's win over Colorado State. He leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 100 tackles and is a semifinalist for the Dick Butkus Award. He returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown at Iowa State and his fumble recovery against Colorado State led directly to a Hawkeye touchdown.

RB Tyler Goodson leads Iowa's rushing attack with 813 yards on 188 attempts, both single-season career highs. His six rushing touchdowns rank seventh in the Big Ten.

Goodson is 187 yards shy of 1,000. The last time a Hawkeye rushed for 1,000 yards in a single season was 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

Goodson has been lowa's leading rusher in 13 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Ladell Betts was lowa's top rusher for 37 straight games from 1998-2001. Betts is now Iowa's running backs coach.

Goodson has 2,213 career rushing yards, 12th all-time in program history.

Goodson rushed for 141 yards Week 9 at Northwestern. It was his seventh-career 100yard game, his second this season. He rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns Week 3 against Kent State. It was the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. Against Kent State, Goodson became the fifth Iowa player (sixth instance as Akrum Wadley did it twice) in the Ferentz era to rush for 150-plus yards and 3-plus touchdowns in a game (LeShun Daniels 2015, Shonn Greene 2008, Akrum Wadley 2015, 2017, Mark Weisman 2012). His third touchdown rush against Kent State pushed him over 100 career points scored (104). He now has 110 points.

Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. He had seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fourth in the Big Ten. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press in 2020.

Goodson led Iowa in rushing attempts (143) and rushing yards (762) in 2020. He tied for the team lead with seven rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10, 80).

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

TROPHY COLLECTION

Iowa has four trophy games on its 2021 schedule. The Hawkeyes are 2-1 in trophy games this season and 21-5 in their last 26 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game on Sept. 11.

The Hawkeyes are 24-5 in their last 29 trophy games (includes bowl games). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

Iowa has one rivalry game remaining on its schedule, a Nov. 26 date at Nebraska. The Hawkeyes have won six straight against the Huskers.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-8 bowl record and has led Iowa to three straight bowl wins, tying its longest such streak in program history. Ferentz's nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.

Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (16), Mack Brown (14), Gary Patterson (11), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (10) and Dabo Swinney (10) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-15-1 alltime in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

NONCONFERENCE, NO PROBLEM

lowa has won 15 straight non-conference games, including 12 regular season nonconference victories and three bowl wins. The nonconference win streak is the longest in the country. Iowa's last nonconference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl (Florida, 30-3).

IOWA IN OVERTIME

lowa holds a 7-5 record in overtime games. Iowa won its first overtime contest, defeating Penn State 26-23 on Nov. 4, 2000, in State College, Pa. The Hawkeyes are 3-4 in single overtime, 3-0 in double overtime and 1-1 in triple overtime. Iowa is 2-2 in overtime in Kinnick Stadium and 5-3 in overtime road games. IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12

Iowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was lowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

lowa's 12-game streak including nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.

IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council includes 16 studentathlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 2021 group consists of seniors Matt Hankins, Ivory Kelly-Martin, Jack Koerner, Kyler Schott, Caleb Shudak and Zach VanValkenburg, and juniors Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Tyler Goodson, Sam LaPorta, Tyler Linderbaum, Kaevon Merriweather, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2021. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 10th year on staff, his fifth as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 14th year on the lowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Ladell Betts joined the lowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in lowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.

Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead Iowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 Iowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-2018.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has five players on its 2021 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).

Epenesa is one of two players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19) and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).

Iowa has one set of the brothers on the team: TE Bryce Schulte and DB Quinn Schulte. RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.



HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 199 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (79 draft picks/120 free agents).
- Iowa football is tied for sixth in the nation with 34 active players on NFL rosters to start the 2021 season.
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson was named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) and TE George Kittle (San Francisco) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 20 years, 163-of-188 (87 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had seven first round picks in the last 11 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 10th year on staff and fifth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.

- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2021 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (16) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 18 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (173-106) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 351 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.

- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

5 HAWKEYES NAMED TO MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAMS

Five members of the University of Iowa football team have been recognized on college football's midseason All-America football teams. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum was named first-team center by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic.

Senior defensive back Matt Hankins, also named first-team by the Associated Press, is named first team by CBS Sports and second team by The Athletic. Senior defensive back Riley Moss is a first team selection by Sporting News.

Sophomore punter Tory Taylor is recognized as a first-team selection by the Athletic, while junior linebacker Jack Campbell is a second-team choice by The Athletic.

Linderbaum is one of four finalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award. He was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and preseason first-team All-America by five media outlets, including Associated Press, The Athletic, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and Sporting News. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week and the Bronko Nagurski and Thorpe Award national Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in the win over Penn State. He had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Taylor is one of 10 punters named a semifinalist for the 2021 Ray Guy Award. Taylor has been at his best in the biggest games. Six of nine punts against No. 4 Penn State were inside the 20, including four inside the five-yard line. In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor dropped three of his punts inside the 10-yard line.

C Tyler Linderbaum was named one of four finalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award. The announcement was made Nov. 9 by the Rotary Lombardi Award in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Houston.

Linderbaum has started 31 consecutive games at center for the Hawkeyes after playing as a defensive lineman as a true freshman. Iowa has posted a 24-7 record during that span. Iowa's 6-0 record to start the 2021 season included wins over three ranked opponents.

Linderbaum was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Linderbaum was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy a year ago and earned first-team All-America honors from The Athletic and Pro Football Focus. He was a second-team All-America honoree by the Associated Press, FWAA, Phil Steele, and the Walter Camp Foundation. He was a first-team All-Big Ten selection by league media.

The Rotary Lombardi Award goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman, who in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi.

The 2021 Lombardi Award winner will be announced Dec. 8 in Houston. Five Hawkeyes have previously been named semifinalists for the Lombardi Award, while defensive end Adrian Clayborn was a finalist in 2010.

CAMPBELL NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

LB Jack Campbell was named one of 16 semifinalists for the Dick Butkus Award. The announcement was made Nov. 1 by the Butkus Foundation.

Campbell leads lowa with 100 tackles, including 45 solo tackles and 55 assists. He also has six pass break-ups, two recovered fumbles, one caused fumble and 2.5 tackles for loss. He ranks second in the Big Ten and ninth in the country in tackles.

Campbell was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Bronko Nagurski national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Colorado State. He recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

Former Iowa linebacker Josey Jewell was a finalist for the Butkus Award in 2016 and a semifinalist in 2017. Finalists for the 2021 Butkus Award will be announced Nov. 22, with the winner being announced on or before Dec. 7.

HANKINS, MOSS NAMED THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

DB Matt Hankins and DB Riley Moss were named semifinalists for the 2021 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, awarded to the best defensive back in college football. The announcement was made Oct. 25 by the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame.

Hankins has started 37 straight games in the Iowa secondary and has recorded four interceptions this season. He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week, and the Thorpe Award Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in Iowa's win over Penn State. He had two interceptions in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Hankins was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press and CBSSports.com, and a second team selection by The Athletic. He was also recognized by the Thorpe Award following his play in Iowa's win at Iowa State.

Moss is tied for sixth in the country and leads the Big Ten with four interceptions, despite missing Weeks 8-10 due to injury. Moss had two interceptions returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Moss collected his fourth interception of the season in Iowa's win over Penn State, before suffering a knee injury just before halftime of that contest. Moss was named a first-team midseason All-American by Sporting News.

Three finalists will be selected on Nov. 23, with the winner being announced Dec. 9 at The Home Depot College Football Awards Show. The official presentation of the Thorpe Award takes place in Oklahoma City on Feb. 8, 2022.

SHUDAK NAMED GROZA AWARD SEMIFINALIST

K Caleb Shudak was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Orange Bowl. The announcement was made Nov. 4 by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 23 and honored at the 30th annual virtual awards celebration Dec. 8. The winner will be announced live on ESPN at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show on Thursday, Dec. 9.

Shudak joined the lowa program as a walk-on. He is in his third season handling all kickoff duties for the Hawkeyes, and his first season handling field goal duties.

Shudak leads the Hawkeyes in scoring with 71 points. He has been successful on 14-16 field goal attempts, with one miss attributed to a high snap from center. He has connected on all 29 PAT attempts and totaled 28 touchbacks on 52 kickoffs.

Shudak's career long of 51 yards came in Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State. He was a perfect 3-3 in field goal attempts in wins against Maryland and Penn State. Five of his 11 field goals have covered over 40 yards.

Off the field, Shudak has earned Academic All-Big Ten honors the last four years. He has earned Dean's List recognition during seven semesters and President's List honors.

Iowa's Keith Duncan was one of three finalists for the Groza Award in 2019. Nate Kaeding earned the award in 2002 and was a finalist for the award in 2003.

FIND THE NFL-ER

The Hawkeyes have had NFL talent on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz's 22 seasons. Eighteen Iowa offensive linemen have been selected in the NFL Draft, including five in the first round. Former Hawkeye linemen under Ferentz have combined for 13 Pro Bowl appearances. Below is a list of players, by year, that played on the Hawkeyes' offensive line prior to joining the NFL.

TAYLOR NAMED RAY GUY AWARD SEMIFINALIST

P Tory Taylor is one of 10 punters named a semifinalist for the 2021 Ray Guy Award. The announcement was made Nov. 10 by the Augusta Sports Council and the Ray Guy Award. Taylor has been recognized on the Ray's 8 list following three games, including contests versus Iowa State, Penn State, and Wisconsin.

Through 10 games Taylor is averaging 45.8 yards per punt, with a long of 69 yards. He has 19 punts of at least 50 yards and has placed 30 punts inside the opponent 20. Hawkeye opponents have just 14 returns for 52 yards, while 18 have resulted in a fair catch. Just nine Taylor punts have been touchbacks.

Taylor is a sophomore and a native of Melbourne, Australia. He averaged 49 yards on seven punts at Wisconsin, with a long of 61 yards. Three of his punts were downed inside the Wisconsin 20, including the 11, 14, and 13-yard lines. The Badgers had just one return for six yards.

In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return. In the win over Penn State, he averaged 44.2 yards per punt, with six punts inside the 20 and five inside the 10.

Taylor was named a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give Iowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among Iowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klinkenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive back Josh Jackson (2017) and quarterback Nate Stanley (2018).

The weekly conference honor is the second of his career. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2018 following a pair of interceptions at Minnesota.

TAYLOR NAMED B1G CO-SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

P Tory Taylor was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following No. 10 Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State on Sept. 11 in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He was also named to the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list following Iowa's Week 2 win, following Iowa's win over Penn State, and after Iowa's game at Wisconsin.

Taylor earned the Big Ten honors after playing a key role in Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downing inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

The Big Ten Player of the Week honor is a career first for Taylor. He was named a Ray Guy Award semifinalist on Nov. 10. He was also a semifinalist for the award in 2020. Taylor was the Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Conference Punter of the Year in 2020 while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by the FWAA and second-team All-America by The Athletic.

CAMPBELL NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LB Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 Iowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week.

Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the six-yard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14.

Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

HANKINS NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Matt Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week following No. 3 Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State on Oct. 9. He was also named Nagurski, Thorpe and Rose Bowl Game National Player of the Week following his Week 6 performance.

Hankins was credited with five tackles in Iowa's win over Penn State, including three solo stops and two assists, along with Iowa's fourth and final interception of the day. Hankins was credited with a solo tackle on a Penn State fourth-and-three attempt with 3:39 remaining, stopping a PSU drive that reached the Iowa 45-yardline.

Hankins then stopped Penn State's next possession with an interception on fourth down, his third of the season. Hankins had two interceptions earlier this season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

lowa extended its winning streak to seven games. Iowa has outscored its last seven opponents, 248-89, averaging 35.4 points per game of-fensively and allowing 12.7 ppg during the winning streak.

The 34 points scored are the most in a Big Ten opener since scoring 42 at Penn State in 2002.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Spencer Petras is 91-158 (59.5) with 1,233 passing yards (176.1 ypg) during Iowa's seven-game winning streak. He has thrown eight touchdowns and two interceptions over the last seven games.

DB Riley Moss returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. Moss returned an interception 55 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. The interceptions were No. 7 and 8 of his career. He has three career pick-sixes. Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

DB Dane Belton recorded his first career interception.

QB Spencer Petras rushed for a touchdown in the second quarter. It was his fourth career rushing touchdown and the longest rushing touchdown of his career (9 yards).

Iowa had three offensive linemen make their first career start: LT Mason Richman, RG Justin Britt and RT Nick DeJong. Iowa DL John Waggoner and DL Logan Lee also made their first career starts. WR Charlie Jones made his first career start.

TE Sam LaPorta had a career-high 83 receiving yards.

Noah Shannon (4), John Waggoner (4), Jestin Jacobs (3), Logan Lee (3) and Ethan Hurkett (3) recorded career highs in tackles.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa has played 23 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.

Iowa has won seven straight Big Ten games for the fifth time in the last 30 years. Iowa won eight straight conference games in 2015 and 2008, and seven straight in 2004 and 1991).

lowa has scored at least 25 points in each of its wins during its winning streak. It is the second time in school history lowa has scored 25 points or more in seven straight wins (2015, seven games).

Iowa and Indiana met as AP ranked opponents for the second time ever and the first time since 1991, when No. 10 Iowa defeated No. 25 Indiana, 38-21, at Kinnick Stadium.

lowa has won its last nine games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last eight opponents, 305-113, averaging 33.9 points per game offensively and allowing 12.6 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each win.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to nine consecutive wins. He was 25-36 for 209 yards passing today. The 25 completions are one shy of matching a career-high. Petras is 141-240 with 1,548 passing yards during Iowa's nine-game winning streak. He has thrown 10 touch-downs and two interceptions over the last nine games.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. IOWA NOTES

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 21 times for 141 yards, his seventh career 100-yard game. Goodson has been Iowa's leading rusher for 12 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Shonn Greene led Iowa in rushing yards in 13 straight games in 2008. Goodson has 2,154 career rushing yards, 13th all-time in program history. He passed Dennis Mosely and Jordan Canzeri on Iowa's all-time career rushing list.

RB Tyler Goodson's 13-yard touchdown rush in the first quarter was his sixth rushing touchdown of the season and first since Week 3 vs. Kent State. Goodson had gone 94 carries without a touchdown, the longest stretch of his career.

WR Arland Bruce's 10-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter was his first career rushing touchdown and second career rushing attempt.

WR Keagan Johnson had a career-high five receptions.

DB Matt Hankins had five tackles, raising his career total to 202. He is the 76th player in program history to reach 200 or more career tackles.

DB Dane Belton's second-quarter interception was his third of the season. His fourth-quarter interception was his fourth of the season.

DB Jermari Harris recorded his first career interception. He is the 10th different Hawkeye this season to record an interception. The last time Iowa had 10 players with an interception in a single season was 2017.

QB Alex Padilla entered the game on Iowa's fourth drive of the game. Padilla finished the game with career highs in yards (172), completions (18) and attempts (28).

QB Spencer Petras made his 17th consecutive start but left the game after three drives.

RB Gavin Williams had a career-high 10 carries for a career-high 41 yards.

Iowa leads the country in interceptions (19). The Hawkeyes have 83 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Ten different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. Iowa is plus-18 in turnover margin in its six wins and minus-six in its two losses.
