lowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (10) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

lowa is playing for a trophy this week for the fifth time this season. The Hawkeyes are 3-1 in trophy games this season and 22-5 in their last 27 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). The Hawkeyes are 25-5 in their last 30 trophy games (includes bowl games).

Iowa leads the country in interceptions (22) and ranks third nationally in takeaways (28). The school record for interceptions in a season is 23 (1986, 1987, 2008). The Hawkeyes have 86 interceptions since 2017, more than any team in the country.

LB/DB Dane Belton ties for the NCAA lead with five interceptions. DB Riley Moss has four interceptions and DB Matt Hankins has three interceptions. Eleven different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. Iowa is plus-19 in turnover margin in its 10 wins and minus-six in its two losses.

C Tyler Linderbaum is one of four finalists for the Rotary Lombardi Award and one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy. He was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum has made 33 consecutive starts at center. Iowa is 26-7 during that span.

QB Alex Padilla has started the last three games, all Iowa wins. QB Spencer Petras had started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes before missing the Nov. 13 contest against Minnesota. Petras relieved Padilla to start the second half Week 12 at Nebraska and rallied lowa to a 28-21 victory.

WR Charlie Jones ranks second in the Big Ten averaging 8.5 yards on a league-high 34 punt returns. He has returned 23 kickoffs for an average of 26.3 yards per return, No. 2 in the Big Ten. He returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown Week 11 against Illinois.

RB Tyler Goodson leads Iowa's rushing attack with 1,101 yards on 238 attempts, both single-season career highs. He rushed for a career-high 156 yards in Iowa's Week 12 win at NEB. It was his 9th career 100-yard rushing game and his 4th this season. In his last 4 games, Goodson is averaging 5.5 ypc and 123.0 ypg (89 attempts, 492 yards).

LB Jack Campbell leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 124 tackles. He is the first Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season since Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136). Campbell has four double-digit tackle performances (11, 18, 17, 16) this season.

IOWA IS BOOKED FOR INDY

Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title with a 7-2 mark in conference play and will play Michigan on Saturday, Dec. 4, in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. Kickoff is at 7:17 p.m. (CT) at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. The game is televised nationally on FOX. Iowa is the home team and will wear black jerseys.

The West Division title is Iowa's second in program history. Iowa won the West Division in 2015 (8-0) and played Michigan State in the championship game. Michigan shared the Big Ten East Division title with an 8-1 conference record and is making its first appearance in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The winner earns the Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Trophy and a chance to play in one of the six bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff, including the Rose Bowl Game.

The four teams in the College Football Playoffs, along with the participants in the other New Year's Six bowl games, will be announced at 11 a.m. (CT) on Sunday, Dec. 5.

TROPHY COLLECTION

Iowa is playing for a trophy this week for the fifth time this season. The Hawkeyes are 3-1 in trophy games this season and 22-5 in their last 27 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

The Hawkeyes defeated Nebraska 28-21 to capture the Heroes Trophy for the seventh straight year. Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30, at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game on Sept. 11.

The Hawkeyes are 25-5 in their last 30 trophy games (includes bowl games). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

PADILLA LEADS IOWA TO WIN IN FIRST CAREER STARTS

QB Alex Padilla led Iowa to two wins in his first two career starts (27-22 vs. Minnesota in Week 10; 33-23 vs. Illinois in Week 11). Padilla started Week 12 at Nebraska but was relieved at halftime with Iowa trailing 14-6. QB Spencer Petras started the second half and led Iowa to a 28-21 win.

Padilla made his first career start Nov. 13 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 passing yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts.

Padilla started Week 12 at Nebraska but was relieved at halftime with Iowa trailing 14-6. QB Spencer Petras started the second half and led Iowa to a 28-21 win.

Padilla entered the game at Northwestern on Iowa's fourth drive, substituting for the injured Petras. Padilla finished the game with a then-career high 172 passing yards. He set career best in completions (18) and attempts (28).

Petras had started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes before missing the Nov. 13 contest against Minnesota.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 178 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 110 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 169-87 (.660) overall mark and a 106-65 (.620) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 15 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 178-108 (.622) and a 110-79 (.582) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 178 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 190-129 (.596).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

Jones is one of three players in school history to score touchdowns on both kickoff and punt returns. (Jones returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown vs. Michigan State in 2020). The others include C.J. Jones (100-yard kickoff, 65-yard punt) and Kahlil Hill (two kickoffs: 90, 88; two punts: 62, 57).

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 110 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 178 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (178) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (178-108) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (178, 110) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on lowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked 15th in the AP poll and 12th in the Coaches poll.

Iowa reached as high at No. 2 in the AP and Coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

Iowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (10) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

The Hawkeyes' six straight wins against ranked opponents dates back to 2019. The last time lowa won six straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

Iowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season Iowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

lowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the Coaches Poll and 16th in the AP Poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP Poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

CAMPBELL HITS 100

LB Jack Campbell leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 124 tackles. He is the first Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season since Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136). Campbell has four double-digit tackle performances (11, 18, 17, 16) this season.

Campbell earned national Player of the Week honors when he recorded 18 tackles in Iowa's win over Colorado State. He is a semifinalist for the Dick Butkus Award. He returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown at Iowa State and his fumble recovery against Colorado State led directly to a Hawkeye touchdown.

Campbell recorded his first interception of the season Week 11 against Illinois, returning it 32 yards for a touchdown.

FRESH LEGS

Three true freshmen have started at least one game this season. Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first season at Iowa, only 31 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

In Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, OL Connor Colby started at RG and WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby was the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson was the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

WR Arland Bruce IV made his first career start Week 11 against Illinois. He had a careerlong 28-yard reception to set up a 2-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter. Johnson started the same game, marking the first time two true freshmen wide receivers started a game in the Ferentz era.

Colby and DL Lukas Van Ness are on the Shawn Alexander Freshman of the Year watch list. Van Ness ties for the team lead with 6.0 sacks and ranks second with 7.5 tackles-for-loss.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads lowa's rushing attack with 1,101 yards on 238 attempts, both single-season career highs. His six rushing touchdowns rank ninth in the Big Ten. He is the first Hawkeye to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season since 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

Goodson rushed for a career-high 156 yards in Iowa's Week 12 win at Nebraska. It was his ninth career 100-yard rushing game and his fourth this season. He's had three 100-yard games in the last four weeks. In his last four games, Goodson is averaging 5.5 yards per carry and 123.0 yards per game (89 attempts, 492 yards).

Goodson has been Iowa's leading rusher in 15 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Ladell Betts was Iowa's top rusher for 37 straight games from 1998-2001. Betts is now Iowa's running backs coach.

Goodson has 2,501 career rushing yards, 10th all-time in program history.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

GOING THE OTHER WAY

lowa leads the country with 22 interceptions. The school record for interceptions in a season is 23 (1986, 1987, 2008). The Hawkeyes have 86 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Eleven Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. The last time lowa had 11 players with an interception in a single season was 1997 (14).

LB/DB Dane Belton ties for the NCAA lead with five interceptions. DB Riley Moss has four interceptions and DB Matt Hankins has three interceptions. All three players have recorded two interceptions in a single game this season.

Moss has two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1.

lowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

lowa has turned 28 turnovers into 92 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 28 points (4 TDs and 2 safeties). Iowa's special teams have two touchdowns (one kickoff return, one blocked punt).

Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT ... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks fifth in the Big Ten averaging 45.8 yards per punt. Taylor ranks second in the Big Ten and eighth nationally with 69 punts. He has 21 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Thirty-three of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic and was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.

Iowa owned the field position battle in each of its 10 wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State).

This season, Taylor has recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 ties for ninth.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

Taylor was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

PETRAS AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

QB Spencer Petras started 17 consecutive games from the 2020 season opener through Week 9 of 2021. Petras' streak of consecutive starts was snapped when he did not play Nov. 13 against Minnesota due to injury. He did not see action Week 11 against Illinois. Petras did not start at Nebraska, but he did start the second half and led Iowa to a 28-21 win. The Hawkeyes trailed 14-6 at halftime.

Petras owns a 13-4 record (.765) as Iowa's starting quarterback, the fourth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. Iowa has scored 27.9 points per game in 17 Petras starts. He has 3,126 career passing yards, 14th all-time in program history.

Petras led lowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during lowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

TRUE FRESHMEN STARTERS SINCE 1999

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as Iowa head coach, 31 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,279 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 676-564-39 (.544). That includes a 420-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 256-340-23 (.432) record in games away from lowa City, a 348-385-25 (.476) mark in Big Ten games and a 304-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

5 HAWKEYES NAMED TO MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAMS

Five members of the University of Iowa football team were recognized on college football's midseason All-America football teams. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum was named first-team center by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic.

Senior defensive back Matt Hankins, also named first-team by the Associated Press, was named first team by CBS Sports and second team by The Athletic. Senior defensive back Riley Moss was a first team selection by Sporting News.

Sophomore punter Tory Taylor was recognized as a first-team selection by the Athletic, while junior linebacker Jack Campbell was a second-team choice by The Athletic.

Linderbaum is one of four finalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award and one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy. He was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and preseason first-team All-America by five media outlets, including Associated Press, The Athletic, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and Sporting News. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week and the Bronko Nagurski and Thorpe Award national Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in the win over Penn State. He had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Moss has four interceptions this season, including two returns for a touchdown. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns. Both Moss and Hankins were Jim Thorpe Award semifinalists.

Taylor was one of 10 punters named a semifinalist for the 2021 Ray Guy Award. Taylor has been at his best in the biggest games. Six of nine punts against No. 4 Penn State were inside the 20, including four inside the five-yard line. In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor dropped three of his punts inside the 10-yard line.

Campbell earned national Player of the Week honors when he recorded 18 tackles in Iowa's win over Colorado State. He leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 124 tackles and was a semifinalist for the Dick Butkus Award. He returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown at Iowa State and returned an interception 32 yards for a touchdown against Illinois. His fumble recovery against Colorado State led directly to a Hawkeye touchdown.

LINDERBAUM NAMED NATIONAL AWARD FINALIST

C Tyler Linderbaum was named one of four finalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award and one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy.

Linderbaum has started 33 consecutive games at center for the Hawkeyes after playing as a defensive lineman as a true freshman. Iowa has posted a 26-7 record during that span. Iowa's 6-0 record to start the 2021 season included wins over three ranked opponents.

Linderbaum was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and was named a midseason firstteam All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

The Rotary Lombardi Award goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman, who in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi.

The 2021 Lombardi Award winner will be announced Dec. 8 in Houston. Five Hawkeyes have previously been named semifinalists for the Lombardi Award, while defensive end Adrian Clayborn was a finalist in 2010.

The Iowa football program has had four Outland Trophy winners, fourth among all college programs behind Nebraska, Alabama, and Oklahoma. Previous Hawkeye award winners

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-8 bowl record and has led lowa to three straight bowl wins, tying its longest such streak in program history. Ferentz's nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.

Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (16), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (10) and Dabo Swinney (10) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-15-1 alltime in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

THE SERIES

Michigan holds a 42-15-4 advantage in the series that began with a 28-5 lowa win in 1900. The first meeting between the two teams was played in Detroit and the second in Chicago.

Saturday will mark the fourth time the teams have met with Michigan ranked No. 2 in the nation. Iowa beat the Wolverines twice on last-second field goals in 1985 and 2016. The Hawkeyes, ranked first at the time, defeated Michigan to win 12-10 in 1985 in Iowa City. Unranked Iowa edged the Wolverines, 14-13, in 2016 in Iowa City. Michigan won 20-6 in 2006 in Ann Arbor when the Wolverines were ranked second and Iowa was unranked.

lowa has won five of the last seven meetings against Michigan. The teams were scheduled to play Dec. 19, 2020, but the game was canceled due to COVID.

- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson was named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) and TE George Kittle (San Francisco) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.

- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 10th year on staff and fifth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.

CAMPBELL NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

LB Jack Campbell was named one of 16 semifinalists for the Dick Butkus Award. The announcement was made Nov. 1 by the Butkus Foundation.

Campbell leads lowa with 124 tackles, including 51 solo tackles and 73 assists. He ranks second in the Big Ten and seventh in the country in tackles.

Campbell recorded his first interception of the season Week 11 against Illinois and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown. He also has six pass break-ups, two recovered fumbles, one caused fumble and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Campbell was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Bronko Nagurski national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Colorado State. He recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

Former Iowa linebacker Josey Jewell was a finalist for the Butkus Award in 2016 and a semifinalist in 2017.

HANKINS, MOSS NAMED THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

DB Matt Hankins and DB Riley Moss were semifinalists for the 2021 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, awarded to the best defensive back in college football. The announcement was made Oct. 25 by the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame.

Hankins started 37 straight games in the Iowa secondary from 2018-21. Hankins did not play against Illinois or at Nebraska due to an injury. He has four interceptions this season.

Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week, and the Thorpe Award Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in Iowa's win over Penn State. He had two interceptions in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Hankins was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press and CBSSports.com, and a second team selection by The Athletic. He was also recognized by the Thorpe Award following his play in Iowa's win at Iowa State.

Moss is tied for 11th in the country and third in the Big Ten with four interceptions. He missed Weeks 8-10 due to injury. Moss had two interceptions returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Moss was named a first-team midseason All-American by Sporting News.

SHUDAK NAMED GROZA AWARD SEMIFINALIST

K Caleb Shudak was one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Orange Bowl. Shudak joined the Iowa program as a walk-on. He is in his third season handling all kickoff duties for the Hawkeyes, and his first season handling field goal duties.

Shudak leads the Hawkeyes in scoring with 100 points. He has been successful on 22-25 field goal attempts, with one miss attributed to a high snap from center. He has connected

on all 34 PAT attempts and totaled 39 touchbacks on 67 kickoffs.

Shudak has connected on four field goals of 50-plus yards, including career long of 51 yards in wins at lowa State, against Illinois and at Nebraska. He connected on a career-high four field goals against the Illini and matched his career-high one week later at Nebraska. He was a perfect 3-3 in field goal attempts in wins against Maryland and Penn State. Eleven of his 18 field goals have covered over 40 yards. Off the field, Shudak has earned Academic All-Big Ten honors the last four years. He has earned Dean's List recognition during seven semesters and President's List honors.

TAYLOR NAMED RAY GUY AWARD SEMIFINALIST

P Tory Taylor was one of 10 punters named a semifinalist for the 2021 Ray Guy Award. Taylor has been recognized on the Ray's 8 list following three games, including contests versus Iowa State, Penn State, and Wisconsin.

Through 12 games Taylor is averaging 45.8 yards per punt, with a long of 69 yards. He has 21 punts of at least 50 yards and has placed 33 punts inside the opponent 20. Hawkeye opponents have just 16 returns for 52 yards, while 20 have resulted in a fair catch. Just 11 Taylor punts have been touchbacks.

In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return. In the win over Penn State, he averaged 44.2 yards per punt, with six punts inside the 20 and five inside the 10. He averaged 49 yards on seven punts at Wisconsin, with a long of 61 yards. Three of his punts were downed inside the Wisconsin 20, including the 11, 14, and 13-yard lines. The Badgers had just one return for six yards.

Taylor was named a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give Iowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among Iowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klinkenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive

SHUDAK NAMED B1G SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

K Caleb Shudak was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his play in the Hawkeyes' 28-21 win at Nebraska on Nov. 26.

Shudak connected on all four field goal attempts against Nebraska, connecting from 51, 48, 36, and 44 yards. The four made field goals matches a career high, set the previous week in Iowa's 33-23 win over Illinois.

Shudak has made a career-long 51-yard field goal in three different games this season, including wins over Iowa State, Illinois, and Nebraska. For the season he has made 22-of-25 attempts with just one miss from less than 50 yards.

For the season, Shudak leads the Hawkeyes in scoring with 100 points, adding 34-of-34 PAT attempts to go with his 22 made field goals. Shudak's 100 points rank as the eighth-highest single season total in school history. He also handles kickoff duties, recording 39 touchbacks.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first of Shudak's career.

IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12

lowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was Iowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

Iowa's 12-game streak including nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.

NONCONFERENCE, NO PROBLEM

lowa has won 15 straight non-conference games, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. The nonconference win streak is the longest in the country. Iowa's last nonconference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl (Florida, 30-3).

IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council includes 16 student-athlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 2021 group consists of seniors Matt Hankins, Ivory Kelly-Martin, Jack Koerner, Kyler Schott, Caleb Shudak and Zach VanValkenburg, and juniors Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Tyler Goodson, Sam LaPorta, Tyler Linderbaum, Kaevon Merriweather, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2021. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 10th year on staff, his fifth as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 14th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Ladell Betts joined the Iowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in Iowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.

Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead Iowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 Iowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-2018.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has five players on its 2021 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).

Epenesa is one of two players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19) and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).

Iowa has one set of the brothers on the team: TE Bryce Schulte and DB Quinn Schulte.

RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (178-108) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and will make its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 352 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry

and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.

- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.



Friday was his first career multi-touchdown game. Petras is the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a single same game since Brad Banks in 2002 at Minnesota.

QB Spencer Petras connected with RB Tyler Goodson for a 67-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was a career-long pass for Petras and a career-long reception for Goodson.

lowa scored 31 points in the second quarter, the most points scored in a single quarter since scoring 37 in the first quarter against Akron on Aug. 31, 2002. The 31 points scored in a Big Ten game are the most by a Hawkeye team since putting up 35 points on Illinois in the first quarter in 1985.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass Friday, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982. Iowa leads the Big Ten with 12 interceptions. Iowa has 76 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country.

Iowa had seven takeaways, its most in a single game single game since 1987 against Northwestern (8). The Hawkeye defense has scored 20 points this season (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa scored points following its first four takeaways, turning the four takeaways into 24 points. The Hawkeyes have scored 75 points on 16 takeaways this season.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 27 times for 132 yards, his eighth career 100-yard game. Goodson has been Iowa's leading rusher for 14 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Ladell Betts was Iowa's top rusher for 37 straight games from 1998-2001. Betts is now Iowa's running backs coach.

RB Tyler Goodson has 2,345 career rushing yards, 10th all-time in program history. He passed Shonn Greene (2,228) and Ronnie Harmon (2,271) on Iowa's all-time career rushing list.

WR Arland Bruce made his first career start. He is the 31st true freshman in the Ferentz era to start, and third this season (OL Connor Colby, WR Keagan Johnson). Bruce had a career-long 28-yard reception to set up a 2-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter. The touchdown was the third of his career (second rushing).

Iowa started two true freshman wide receivers in a game for the first time in the Ferentz era. WR Keagan Johnson made his seventh career start. WR Arland Bruce made his first career start.

K Caleb Shudak connected on a career-high four field goals (51, 48, 29, 32). Shudak tied his career-long with a 51-yard field goal in the second quarter. He has three field goals of 50-yards or better this season.

DB Dane Belton had an interception in the second quarter, his fifth of the year, best in the Big Ten.

LB Jack Campbell intercepted a pass and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown, his first of the season and second of his career.

Iowa leads the country in interceptions (21) and ranks third nationally in takeaways (26). The Hawkeyes have 85 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Eleven different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. Iowa is plus-18 in turnover margin in its nine wins and minus-six in its two losses.

DB Matt Hankins did not play. He had started 37 consecutive games.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa clinched a share of the Big Ten West Division title.

Iowa scored the final 22 points of the game and outscored the Huskers 19-0 in the fourth quarter. Iowa erased a 12-point fourth quarter deficit (trailed 21-9), its largest fourth-quarter deficit in a win since trailing by 14 points against Pittsburgh in 2011. The last double-digit fourth quarter deficit erased by Iowa in a win was in 2014 (trailed Ball State 13-3 entering the fourth).

Iowa has won 19 conference games over the last three seasons, the most successful three-year stretch since Iowa won 20 conference games from 2002-04. Iowa has won at least six conference games in three straight years for the first time under Kirk Ferentz (19 wins). The last time Iowa won at least six conference games in three straight seasons was 1981-83 (19 wins).

lowa has won 10 games or more for the seventh time under head coach Kirk Ferentz (2002, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2015, 2019, 2021).

DB Jermari Harris intercepted Nebraska on its 2-yard line on the Huskers' final offensive play of the game. The interception is the second of the season for Harris and the 22nd of the season for Iowa. Iowa leads the country in interceptions (22). The Hawkeyes have 86 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Eleven different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. Iowa is plus-19 in turnover margin in its 10 wins and minus-six in its two losses.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 23 times for a career-high 156 yards, his ninth career 100-yard game. Goodson has been Iowa's leading rusher for 15 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Ladell Betts was Iowa's top rusher for 37 straight games from 1998-2001. Betts is now Iowa's running backs coach. Goodson has 2,501 career rushing yards, 10th all-time in program history.

RB Tyler Goodson has 1,101 rushing yards on 238 attempts, both single-season career highs. The last time a Hawkeye rushed for 1,000 yards in a single season was 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

K Caleb Shudak was perfect on four field goals attempts today (51, 48, 36, 44), matching a career high set last week. Shudak connected on a 51-yard field goal in the second quarter, matching his career long. It was this third 51-yard field goal of the season.

K Caleb Shudak was good on both PAT attempts and scored 14 points today, raising his season total to 100, the eighth highest single season point total in school history.

LB Jack Campbell had a game-high 16 tackles, raising his season total to 124 (tied 28th in school history). Campbell has four double-digit tackle performances (11, 18, 17, 16) this season.

GAME RECAP

Michigan State scored on a 1-yard run with 27 seconds remaining to edge undefeated Iowa, 16-13, in the Big Ten Championship Game at Lucas Oil Stadium. The game set a Big Ten Championship Game attendance record of 66,985 fans.

The East and West Division champions traded field goals the first three quarters before each team scored a touchdown in the final quarter.

Iowa's Marshall Koehn converted kicks of 24 and 43 yards, while Michigan State's Michael Geiger was good from 23, 29, and 47 yards. Geiger also missed a pair of 52-yard kicks.

Geiger's 47-yard field goal with 57 seconds remaining in the third period put the Spartans in front 9-6. Michigan State's defense limited the Hawkeyes' offense to three yards on seven plays in the third quarter.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Iowa QB C.J. Beathard connect with WR Tevaun Smith for an 85-yard touchdown pass to give Iowa a 13-9 advantage. The 85-yard scoring strike was Iowa's longest play from scrimmage of the season.

Two possessions later, the Spartans drove 82 yards in 22 plays, draining 9:09 off the game clock. Michigan State converted five third downs and one fourth down on its game-winning drive.

Beathard completed 18-of-26 passes for 216 yards and one touchdown. The junior threw one interception on a ricochet in Iowa's end zone in the second quarter, which was his first interception in 155 pass attempts.

Beathard lost for the first time in 14 starts. Smith led all receivers with five catches for 110 yards and a score.

Michigan State quarterback Connor Cook was named the game's Most Valuable Player, completing 16-of-32 passes for 191 yards. Spartan running back L.J. Scott rushed 22 times for 73 yards and one touchdown.

Iowa's leading rusher, Jordan Canzeri, rushed twice for 12 yards before leaving the game in the first period due to injury.

Defensively, Iowa held the Spartans to their lowest point total of the season. LB Josey Jewell had eight tackles, intercepted his third pass of the season, and was credited with two quarterback hurries. Safety Jordan Lomax had 10 tackles.
