- Saturday's game is lowa's first on a grass playing surface this season. The team's last game on grass was in Evanston during the 2021 season a 17-12 Hawkeye victory. Iowa has won its last three games on grass with its last loss coming at Purdue in the 2020 season opener (L, 24-20).
- lowa's defense is allowing 3.91 per play, which is No. 1 in the FBS. The Hawkeyes have held three opponents under 200 yards of total offense this season.
- Sack you very much. The Hawkeyes registered a season-high seven sacks (by seven different players) in the win over Northwestern. It is the most sacks against a Big Ten opponent since 2000 against the Wildcats.
- K Drew Stevens made a career-high four field goals (in four attempts) in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern, connecting from 29, 24, 54 and 25 yards en route to being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week and a Lou Groza Star of the Week. His 54-yarder is tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest since 2015 (Marshall Koehn, 57).
- Freshman RB Kaleb Johnson started his second straight game against Northwestern, where he rushed for 94 yards on 14 attempts, narrowly missing his second career 100-yard game. Through eight games, Johnson has a team-best 353 yards with three touchdowns. His 18 points are second on the team.
- 10 X 9 LB Jay Higgins had a career-high 11 tackles in Iowa's win over Northwestern. Higgins is the fourth player to tally 10+ tackles this season. The four players Jack Campbell, Seth Benson and Cooper DeJean have nine 10+ tackle games in 2022. Campbell, Benson and Higgins combined for 31 tackles against Northwestern.
- lowa scored a season-high 33 points and finished with a season-high 398 yards total offense in its 33-13 win over Northwestern on Oct. 29. The Hawkeyes scored on seven of their eight possessions and finished with the most yards in 17 games (428 at Maryland, 2021).
- QB Spencer Petras completed 21-of-30 passes to eight different receivers -- for 220 yards and one touchdown in the win over Northwestern. He completed 70 percent of his passes for the second time in his 27 career starts. The 220 yards are his second-most this season. Petras made his first career start in West Lafayette in 2020.
- lowa is fourth in the nation in scoring defense and total defense, surrendering 15.8 points and 265.6 yards per game. The Hawkeyes have allowed 13 or fewer points in six games. lowa has held all eight opponents under their season average in total offense.
- LB Jack Campbell, who is a finalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, is leading the Big Ten and ranks 14th nationally with 10.3 tackles per game. Campbell has 82 tackles this season, giving him 259 career stops, which ranks 31st all-time in program history.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 24th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 182 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He
 has 112 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004
 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange
 Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 173-93 (.650) overall mark and a 108-68 (.614) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 15 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 182-114 (.615) and a 112-82 (.577) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 182 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 194-135 (.590), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an
 assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line
 before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 112 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz' 100th conference win.

- Ferentz' 182 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (182) and Joe Paterno (162).
- Ferentz (182-114) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98).
- Both Ferentz (182, 112) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).
- Ferentz is fourth among active coaches with 194 career victories.
- lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 24th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more.

- Defensive coordinator Phil Parker has been with Ferentz throughout his tenure, as he is in his 24th season on lowa's staff, including his 11th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.
- Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 11th season on lowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016. James Ferentz is currently a member of the NFL's New England Patriots, while Steven Ferentz is on the coaching staff of the NFL's Miami Dolphins.

LONGTIME ASSISTANTS

lowa's coaching staff boasts some of the top longevity in the nation with its assistant coaches. The Hawkeyes are one of five schools nationally with a minimum of five assistants that are entering their seventh-plus year of full-time coaching at the school in 2022.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,289 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 680-570-39 (.544). That includes a 423-226-16 (.649) record in home games, a 257-344-23 (.432) record in games away from lowa City, a 350-388-25 (.476) mark in Big Ten games and a 307-191-15 (.623) record in Kinnick Stadium.

THE LAST MEETING - Purdue 24, No. 2 Iowa 7 (Oct. 16, 2021 - Iowa City, Iowa)

Purdue piled up 464 yards of total offense (and limited Iowa to 271) and its defense had four interceptions to upset the second-ranked Hawkeyes, 24-7, in Kinnick Stadium. The Boilermaker win snapped Iowa's 12-game winning streak that spanned nearly a calendar year. Iowa didn't have an answer for Purdue WR David Bell as he finished with 11 receptions for 240 yards and one touchdown. QB Spencer Petras was 17-of-32 for 195 yards with five passes going to TE Sam LaPorta (61 yards). Tyler Goodson ran for 68 yards on 12 attempts.

HEY. I KNOW YOU

The Hawkeyes will square off against two familiar faces when they travel to West Lafayette on Saturday to face Purdue. WR Charlie Jones and WR Tyrone Tracy, Jr., transferred to the Boilermakers following the 2021 season.

- In 2021, Jones was the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year and a first-team All-Big Ten return specialist after averaging 25.4 yards on 25 kick returns with one touchdown and having 285 punt return yards. Jones had 21 receptions for 323 yards and three touchdowns.
- Tracy, Jr., caught 15 passes for 106 yards and one touchdown in 2021. In four years in lowa City, Tracy, Jr., had 66 receptions for 871 yards and five touchdowns.

LAPORTA BREAKS TIGHT END MARK

Senior TE Sam LaPorta became Iowa's career receptions leader amongst tight ends during the road game at No. 2 Ohio State when he totaled six catches for 55 yards. The Illinois native moved past the 1,500 career receiving yards mark against Northwestern; he has 136 receptions for 1,516 yards. LaPorta is 20th in program history in receiving yards and ranks second all-time amongst Hawkeye tight ends.

- LaPorta was targeted 16 times at Illinois on Oct. 8 and finished with a career-high nine receptions for 101 yards. It was his second career 100 yard receiving game as he had seven catches for 122 yards and one touchdown against Kentucky in the Citrus Bowl.
- LaPorta is leading the Big Ten in both receptions and receiving yards this season, as he has 41 receptions for 387 yards. His 41 receptions are tied for fourth most amongst tight ends nationally.
- 1. Marv Cook 126-1,825
- 2. Sam LaPorta 136-1,516
- LaPorta led the team in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns (tied) in 2021 when he had 53 catches for 670 yards and three touchdowns. He led Big Ten tight ends in receptions, yards, yards after catch (299), yards after contact (206) and catches of 15+ yards (18) in 2021.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

The Hawkeyes had their best offensive game of the season against Northwestern on Oct. 29, scoring a season-high 33 points and racking up 398 yards total offense. Iowa rushed for a season-high 178 yards.

- The 398 yards were the most for the team since gaining 428 yards at Maryland (W, 51-14) in 2021.
- The 178 rushing yards were the most since gaining 186 yards in last season's regular season finale at Nebraska.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their first four offensive possessions to start the game (FG, TD, FG, TD) and on seven of their eight offensive possessions. (Iowa scored on nine straight offensive possessions at Maryland in 2021).

WELCOMED REINFORCEMENT

A week after making his 2022 season debut at Ohio State, sophomore WR Diante Vines made his first career start against Northwestern. The Connecticut native was targeted five times in the game, where he made a pair of catches for 22 yards. Vines missed the first six games with a wrist injury.

TURNOVER FREE

The Hawkeyes did not commit a turnover offensively for the fourth game this season against Northwestern. Iowa is 3-1 this season when it doesn't commit a turnover. The lone loss was the 27-14 home loss to No. 4 Michigan on Oct. 1.

IOWA'S DEFENSE..

- is No. 1 in FBS, averaging 3.91 yards per play.
- has given up 200 or fewer yards in four games this season.
- has held its opponents to 13 or fewer points in six of eight games.
- has held five of eight opponents under 100 yards rushing. Iowa limited Northwestern to 18 yards on Oct. 29 the sixth-fewest in the Kirk Ferentz era and the fewest since holding UNI to six yards in 2018. They were the fewest rushing yards allowed against a Big Ten foe since limiting Minnesota to seven yards in 2008.
- has held seven of its eight opponents below their season scoring average and all eight opponents below their season total offense average.
- is No. 5 nationally in scoring defense (15.8) and total defense (265.6). The Hawkeyes are fourth in defensive touchdowns (4), 10th in passing yards allowed (172.1), 11th in rushing defense (93.5)1 and 12th in passing efficiency defense (112.16).

SACK YOU VERY MUCH

lowa registered a season-high seven sacks against Northwestern, with all seven sacks coming from different Hawkeyes – DL Lukas Van Ness, DL Deontae Craig, DL Ethan Hurkett, DL Logan Lee, DL Noah Shannon, LB Seth Benson and DL Joe Evans. The seven sacks are the most for the program against a Big Ten team since tallying seven sacks against Northwestern in 2000. (Iowa has seven sacks last season against Kent State.)

• Iowa also had 10 tackles for loss against Northwestern – its second game with 10+ TFL this season. Van Ness is leading the team with 7.5 TFL and is tied with Evans for the team lead with four sacks.

MIDSEASON HONORS

LB Jack Campbell and P Tory Taylor earned multiple midseason All-America honors for their play during the first half of the 2022 season.

• Campbell was on the All-America teams selected by The Athletic, ESPN.com, SportingNews. com, CBSSports.com and Pro Football Focus, while Taylor was included on both The Athletic and CBSSports.com teams.

THE ACADEMIC HEISMAN

Senior LB Jack Campbell is a finalist for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy and a member of the National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete class. He is one of 15 players included on the list for the premier scholar-athlete award that annually recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the nation for their combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

• Campbell is the seventh Iowa football student-athlete to be named a NFF National Scholar-Athlete. He is the first since LB James Morris in 2013.

DYNAMO DREW

True freshman walk-on K Drew Stevens is 11-for-12 on field goal attempts this season – the most field goals by a Hawkeye freshman since Mike Meyer (14 FG) in 2010. The South Carolina native is 5-for-5 from 20-29 yards, 2-for-2 from 30-39 yards, 2-of-3 from 40-49 and 2-2 from 50+.

- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Lou Groza Award Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder is tied for the seventh-longest in program history and it is the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.
- Stevens also drilled a 51-yarder on the road at Rutgers, which was tied for the 11th-longest all-time, and he had a make from 49 yards at Ohio State.
- He is leading the team with 45 points via 11 field goals and 12 extra points. Stevens is lowa's first true freshman kicker since Keith Duncan in 2016.
- On the year, lowa's placekickers have made 12-for-15 field goals. Sophomore Aaron Blom made 1-of-3 attempts in the first two games with a make from 46 yards.
- Stevens also handles kickoff duties, where he has 23 touchbacks in 33 kickoffs.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTER

RB Kaleb Johnson became the 32nd freshman of the Kirk Ferentz era to start a game when he was in the starting lineup at No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22. Johnson, who has started the last two games, is the sixth Hawkeye running back to start as a freshman under Ferentz, joining Brandon Wegher (2009), Marcus Coker (2010), Jordan Canzeri (2011), Greg Garmon (2012) and Tyler Goodson (2019).

FORCING TOS

The Hawkeyes have forced two or more turnovers in four games this season, including three against Iowa State, Rutgers and Illinois.

 lowa has forced 13 turnovers in eight games (five fumble recoveries, eight interceptions), and has scored 31 points off the miscues.

NICO REACHES 100

WR Nico Ragaini made his 100th career reception during Iowa's Oct. 8 road game at Illinois. The Connecticut native has 109 career receptions for 1,193 yards.

LACHEY STEPS UP

Junior TE Luke Lachey is emerging as Iowa's second tight end weapon. The Columbus, Ohio native had a career-high four receptions for 84 yards against Michigan on Oct. 1, which included a 5-yard touchdown catch for his first career score. In consecutive games against Rutgers and Michigan, Lachey had six catches for 121 yards and one touchdown. He had a career-long 37yard reception against the Scarlet Knights on Sept. 24.

• Lachey caught his second career touchdown in Iowa's win over Northwestern. He is fourth on the team with 11 receptions for 169 yards and two touchdowns.

DEFENSIVE SCORING

2022 Kaleb Johnson, RB (2 games)

lowa's defense extended its pick six streak to 15 consecutive years at Rutgers when sophomore DB Cooper DeJean made an over the shoulder catch and returned the interception 45 yards for his first career touchdown. It was the 30th longest interception return for a touchdown in school history and the 50th all-time.

- · lowa is leading the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally with three defensive touchdowns (one interception, two fumble returns).
- lowa's defense found the end zone a second time in Piscataway when DB Kaevon Merriweather scooped up a Rutgers fumble (forced on a hit by DB Sebastian Castro) and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown. It was the eighth fumble return for a touchdown in school history and the fifth longest in the record books.

- The Hawkeye defense scored its third touchdown at No. 2 Ohio State when DL Joe Evans sacked C.J. Stroud to force a fumble, recovered and returned it 11 yards for his first career touchdown. The score gave Iowa a 7-3 lead in Columbus.
- lowa's defense has scored 22 points this season via three touchdowns and two safeties.

MIGHTY D

- The Hawkeyes gave up 59 points (9.8 per game) in the first six games. It was the lowest point total for the program through six games since 1956.
- The unit gave up just 20 points in the first four games -- the fewest points allowed for the program in 66 years.
- The Hawkeyes gave up 360 yards and 66 rushing yards to No. 2 Ohio State, an offense that was averaging 543.7 yards and 228.0 rushing yards per game.
- Iowa gave up 151 yards of total offense to a Nevada offense that was averaging 336.3 yards per game. It was the second time this season lowa allowed 151 yards or fewer (120 vs. South Dakota State). It was the first time since 1986 that Iowa's defense has given up 160 or fewer (125 at Iowa State, 159 vs. NIU, 150 vs. UTEP) in the team's first three games.
- Iowa's passing defense held the Wolfpack to 82 yards, tied for the 13th fewest in a game in the Kirk Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes have held two of their eight opponents under 100 yards passing (87 vs. South Dakota State).

HEY, COOP

Sophomore DB Cooper DeJean has started all eight games – three at the CASH position and five at defensive back. DeJean recorded an interception in three consecutive games (vs. lowa State, vs. Nevada, at Rutgers) – a first by a Hawkeye since junior DB Jermari Harris in 2021 season (at Nebraska, vs. Michigan, vs. Kentucky).

- DeJean had a career-high 11 tackles, recorded his first career interception and had two pass breakups against lowa State on Sept. 10.
- In eight games, the Odebolt, Iowa, native is third on the team with 46 tackles, has a team-high three interceptions and has six pass breakups. He is fourth in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in interceptions.

JACK ATTACK

Senior linebacker Jack Campbell has a team-high 82 tackles – 10.3 per game – in Iowa's first eight games, which leads the Big Ten and ranks 14th nationally. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native has had eight or more tackles in all eight of Iowa's games (12, 9, 10, 8, 11, 13, 9, 11) and he had 10+ stops in five contests, including a season-high 13 tackles at Illinois.

- Campbell had his first interception of the season (and fourth of his career) against No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22. He became the fifth Hawkeye to record an interception this season.
- Campbell has 10 career games with 10 or more tackles, which are the most on the team. His 10 double-digit tackle games came against: vs. Kent State (11), vs. Colorado State (18), vs. Minnesota (17), at Nebraska (16), vs. Kentucky (14), South Dakota State (12), Nevada (10), Michigan (11), at Illinois (13) and vs. Northwestern (11).
- Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada on Sept. 17. He currently has 259 career tackles, which is 31st all-time. Campbell is one tackle shy of the top 30 in program history.

KJ LEADS IN RUSHING ATTACK

True freshman RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for his first 100-yard game in his third career contest, finishing with 103 yards on seven carries and scoring two touchdowns against Nevada on Sept. 17. The Ohio native had touchdown runs of 40 and 55 yards to become the first Hawkeye in at least the last 20 years to have two rushing touchdowns of 40+ yards in a single game.

- Johnson is the first lowa freshman to eclipse 100 yards since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019. Johnson is also the first lowa freshman with 100+ yards and two touchdowns since Marcus Coker in the 2010 Insight Bowl.
- Johnson narrowly missed his second career 100-yard game, finishing with 93 yards on 14 carries in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. Through eight games, Johnson has a team-best 353 yards with three touchdowns. His 18 points are second on the team.
- Johnson has a team-high 631 all-purpose yards, averaging 78.9 yards per game. He is averaging 24.6 yards per kickoff return.

A MARATHON W

Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada kicked off at 6:40 p.m. (CT) on Sept. 17 inside Kinnick Stadium and ended at 1:39 a.m. early Sunday morning. There were three weather delays lasting 236 minutes and the game spanned 6:59 minutes from start to finish.

• It was the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium history. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes in 2011. Iowa's last game affected by a delay came at Iowa State in 2019. Iowa won both of those contests.

THE SHUUUUUUUUUUUUUUU

Iowa's defense recorded its first shutout since 2019 with its 27-0 victory over Nevada on Sept. 17. Iowa posted two shutouts in 2019, a road win at Northwestern (20-0) and a home win over Rutgers (30-0). The shutout of Nevada was Iowa's 13th under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

• Iowa has six shutouts since 2016, which are tied with Penn State, UAB and Virginia Tech for fourth most in the country over that span.

DON'T BEAT YOURSELF

Iowa ranks in the top 10 in the nation as one of the least penalized teams. The Hawkeyes haven't been penalized for more than 50 yards in six of their eight games.

- The team is fourth in fewest penalty yards (270) and fewest penalty yards per game (33.75), ninth in fewest penalties (35) and 10th in fewest penalties per game (4.38).
- Iowa had just two penalties for 15 yards in the season-opening win over South Dakota State and had two penalties for 18 yards against Northwestern. Iowa has had three or fewer penalties in three games.

SCORING EARLY

The Hawkeyes allowed their first points in the first guarter of the season when Rutgers drove for a game-opening field goal on Sept. 24. lowa is outscoring its opponents, 51-29, in the opening guarter this season.

BLOCK THAT PUNT

DL Lukas Van Ness tied a single-game school record, blocking a pair of punts against Iowa State on Sept. 10. It is the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.

- · Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside Iowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- Van Ness' first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' touchdown. It was Iowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving Iowa possession at the Iowa State 20. The possession ended with an lowa turnover at the goal line.
- lowa is third in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally in blocked kicks, while Van Ness is leading the Big Ten and second nationally behind Temple's De'Von Fox's three blocks.

CREATIVE SCORING

Senior LB Jack Campbell has found ways to put points on the scoreboard for the lowa football team. In his Hawkeye career, Campbell has scored via a safety (vs. South Dakota State, 2022), interception return for a touchdown (vs. Illinois, 2021) and a fumble return for a touchdown (at Iowa State, 2021).

lowa took the unconventional path to seven points via a field goal and two second-half safeties during the 7-3 victory over South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Following Tory Taylor's punt that pinned the Jacks at the 1, Jack Campbell's tackle for loss gave the Hawkeyes a 5-3 third-quarter lead. Taylor pinned SD State deep again in the fourth quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for lowa's final two points.

• It was the first time since 2018 at Penn State that the Hawkeyes had two safeties in the same game.

Iowa fell 10-7 to Iowa State in its first trophy game of the 2022 season. It was the Hawkeyes' first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa is 25-8 in its last 33 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships).

- Iowa is 22-7 in its last 29 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).
- Last season, the Hawkeyes defeated Nebraska, 28-21, to capture the Heroes Trophy for the seventh straight year. Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, on Sept. 11, 2021, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game for the sixth consecutive time.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-9 bowl record. His nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.
- Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (17), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than lowa. Iowa is 17-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

BACK ON CAMPUS

Seven former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2022.

- Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 11th year on staff, his sixth as offensive coordinator and first as quarterbacks coach.
- LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 15th season on the lowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.
- Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016 and was named defensive line coach in 2019.
- Ladell Betts joined the lowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in Iowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.
- Abdul Hodge joined the staff as tight end/fullback coach in 2022. The three-time All-Big Ten linebacker lettered for the Hawkeyes from 2002-05, leading the team to 38 wins, two Big Ten titles and four straight January bowl games. Hodge ranks third all-time in career tackles (453).
- Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead lowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 lowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-18.

HAWKEYE GRADUATES

Iowa has six student-athletes on its current roster that have earned their degrees. The graduates include: Matt Fagan (Public Health), Riley Moss (Sport and Recreation Management), Turner Pallissard (Business), Spencer Petras (Interdepartmental Studies), Nico Ragaini (Sport and Recreation Management) and Steven Stilianos (Lafayette, Engineering).

Junior defensive lineman Logan Lee proposed to longtime girlfriend Tori Verbeck on Dec. 30 at a Citrus Bowl event in Orlando, Florida. The couple were married on July 3 in Geneseo, Illinois.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- Iowa has five players on its 2022 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), (John, 1985), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-02) and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).
- Epenesa is one of two players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19) and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

2022 PLAYER COUNCIL

- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- lowa has had 11 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 199-of-238 (84 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had eight first round picks in the last 12 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons. Iowa is 9-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-16-1 in 34 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (182-114) replaced Fry and is in his 24th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 11 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

• The Hawkeyes' seven points are the fewest for a Big Ten team in a win since lowa's 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- LB Jack Campbell had a team high 12 tackles (4 solo, 8 assists). It is his sixth career game with 10 or more tackles, which are tied for the most on the team. Campbell now has 189 career tackles.
- Iowa finished with four sacks in the game. DE Joe Evans tied a career high with two sacks and DT Logan Lee had a career-best 1.5 sacks.
- DB Cooper DeJean finished with a career high four tackles in his first career start; DB Quinn Schulte had a career-high four pass breakups in his first career start.
- RB Leshun Williams had career-highs in carries (24) and yards (72).
- WR Arland Bruce VI had five catches for a career-high 68 yards. Bruce had a team-high 96 all-purpose yards.
- P Tory Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12 yard lines. Taylor had a career-high 10 punts for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per punt. Seven of his 10 punts were downed inside the 20-yard line and three went 50 or more yards.
- K Aaron Blom connected on 1-of-2 field goal attempts (good from 46, miss from 40) for his first career points.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's defense scored four points on two safeties Jack Campbell had a 1-yard tackle for loss on Isaiah Davis in the third quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for the game's final points on a safety in the fourth quarter.
- The Hawkeyes have three safeties in their last two regular season games -- (Lukas Van Ness sack on an intentional grounding at Nebraska, 11/26/21).
- lowa's defense allowed 120 total yards, which are the fewest in a season-opening game since 2004 (110 vs. Kent State). The 120 yards are the fewest surrendered by the Hawkeye defense since 2018 against Maryland (115 yards).
- Iowa is the first Big Ten team to win a game without scoring a touchdown since Nebraska in 2018 (beat Michigan State, 9-6). The Hawkeyes' last such win? The 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.
- Iowa had seven first-time starters in the game: Offense: Logan Jones (OL), Beau Stephens (OL), Alec Wick (WR), Leshun Williams (RB); Defense: Cooper DeJean (DB), Joe Evans (DL), Quinn Schulte (DB).
- Five true freshmen saw the first action of their careers. They include: T.J. Hall (DB), Kaleb Johnson (RB), Xavier Nwankpa (DB), Addison Ostrenga (TE) and Drew Stevens (K).
- lowa is 99-33-2 in season-opening games, including an 20-4 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa won the toss and elected to receive. The Hawkeyes have played 289 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 215 times (137-78). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 74 times (42-32).

• The Hawkeyes attempted a game-tying field goal as time expired, but the kick hooked left, giving Iowa State its first win in the series since 2015. Iowa had won six straight in the series; Iowa State's last three wins over the Hawkeyes have all come by a field goal.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

• DE Lukas Van Ness blocked two lowa State punts, tying a school record. It is the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.

- Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside lowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- His first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' first touchdown. It was lowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving lowa possession at the lowa State 20. The possession ended with an lowa turnover at the goal line.
- RB Leshon Williams had a 9-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for his first career touchdown. Williams led the Hawkeye rushing attack with 34 yards on 14 attempts.
- DB Cooper DeJean had his first career interception in the second quarter. The interception occurred in the end zone and was downed for a touchback. DeJean had a career high 11 tackles (six solo), one interception and two pass break-ups.
- DB Terry Roberts had his first interception of the season (second of his career) on Iowa State's opening drive of the second half.
- \bullet LB Seth Benson finished with 10 tackles second most on the team. It was his seventh career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Quinn Schulte (9), DT Logan Lee (8) and DB Terry Roberts (6) each tallied career highs in tackles. DB Riley Moss tied a career high with nine tackles. LB Jack Campbell also had nine tackles, moving his career total to 198.
- TE Sam LaPorta's 2-yard catch in the second quarter was the 100th of his career. He had a career-high eight receptions for 55 yards.
- WR Alec Wick had his first career reception for 14 yards on the game's final drive.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa scored on its first offensive possession, going 16 yards on two plays following the first blocked punt. It was the first game since last season against Minnesota (10 plays, 39 yards, FG) that the Hawkeyes scored on their first possession of the game.
- Iowa's defense forced three turnovers two interceptions, one forced fumble.
- The defense notched its first turnover of the season in the second quarter with a forced fumble at its own goal line. DB Kaevon Merriweather had his first career forced fumble, jarring the ball loose from ISU RB Jirehl Brock. LB Logan Klemp recovered in the end zone for the touchback.
- Iowa had interceptions on consecutive possessions in the second and third quarter. Cooper DeJean had an interception in the end zone with 57 seconds left in the first half. Terry Roberts intercepted Dekkers at midfield on the first possession of the second half.
- Iowa State had three possessions in the red zone (0, 4, 12) in the first half, but came away with just a field goal. The Hawkeye defense did not allow a touchdown in the first seven quarters of the season.

- QB Spencer Petras completed 14-of-26 attempts for a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown. Petras moved into 12th place on the lowa career passing yards list with 3,850 yards.
- WR Arland Bruce IV caught a 21-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter for his second career receiving touchdown (fifth TD overall). Bruce IV had a team-high three catches for 50 yards.
- WR Nico Ragaini and WR Keagan Johnson made their season debuts after missing the first two games because of injury. Ragaini had two catches for 56 yards, including a 46-yarder in the third quarter. Johnson had one catch for seven yards and was targeted five times.
- RB Jaziun Patterson became the seventh true freshman to see action this season. He rushed six times for 20 yards.
- DB Cooper DeJean intercepted a pass in the first quarter for his second interception in as many games and second of his career. DeJean also had two tackles and two pass breakins.
- LB Jack Campbell had a game high 10 tackles. It is his second game this season and seventh career contest with 10 or more tackles. Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in the game; he now has 208 tackles, which puts him in 68th in program history. He moved past the likes of Leroy Smith, Ben Niemann and Ed Miles.
- DL Lukas Van Ness had a career-high eight tackles and DL John Waggoner had a career-high six tackles. Van Ness also had 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks, giving him nine career sacks.
- DL Aaron Graves had his first career sack in the third quarter. Graves finished with a career-high four tackles and 1.5 TFL in the game.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first two attempts of his career. He made a 43-yard field goal on his first attempt in the second quarter and connected on a 32-yarder in the third quarter.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Saturday's game included three weather delays -- 80-minutes (8:36 p.m. to 9:56 p.m.), 110 minutes (10:05 p.m. to 11:55 p.m.) and 46 minutes (11:57 p.m. to 12:43 a.m.) for a total of 3:56.
- It is the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium tory. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Iowa's last game that included a weather delate came on Sept. 14, 2019, at Iowa State. There was a 2:55 delay at Jack Trice Stadium in Ames, Iowa.
- lowa had a season-high 337 yards of total offense, rushing for a season-high 162 yards on 35 attempts, averaging 4.6 yards per carry. Seven different receivers caught a pass in the game and the passing attack had a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown.
- lowa's defense posted its first shutout since 2019 a 20-0 win at Northwestern (10/26/19). It was the Hawkeyes' first shutout in Kinnick Stadium since defeating Rutgers, 30-0, on Sept. 7, 2019.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Nevada to 151 yards of total offense. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 336.3 yards.
- lowa has limited two of its first three opponents to 151 yards or less. (South Dakota State, 120 yards; Nevada, 151 yards). It is the first time since 1986 that the Hawkeye defense has held two of the first three opponents to 160 yards or fewer (125 at Iowa State; 159 vs. NIU; 150 at UTEP).
- Iowa improves to 14-7 all-time in night games at Kinnick Stadium.

Evans recovered the fumble and returned it 13 yards for his first career touchdown, giving lowa a 7-3 lead. It was Evans' third sack of the season and second career forced fumble (vs. Minnesota, 2021).
- LB Jack Campbell had an interception on the first play of the third quarter. It was his first interception of the season and fourth career pick. Campbell has forced a turnover in consecutive games.
- Campbell finished with a team high nine tackles. He has eight or more tackles in all seven games and has 71 tackles this season.
- QB Alex Padilla made his season debut, finishing 5-for-10 for 32 yards and one interception. He played the second half.
- TE Sam LaPorta made six catches for 55 yards to lead the team and become the lowa leader in career receptions amongst Hawkeye tight ends, passing Marv Cook (126). LaPorta has 131 receptions for 1,462 yards. The yardage total ranks 25th all-time -- third-most amongst lowa tight ends.
- WR Diante Vines made his season debut after missing the first six games because of injury. Vines made his first career catch in the second quarter.
- K Drew Stevens connected on a 49-yard field goal in the second quarter. It was the second-longest field goal of his career; he is now 2-of-3 beyond 40 yards this season.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa's defense allowed four first-half field goals after Ohio State started drives in Hawkeye territory (29, 23, 34, 32-yard lines). Ohio State's second touchdown came via a pick six.
- The Hawkeyes limited Ohio State to 360 yards and just 66 on the ground. The Buckeyes entered the game averaging 543.7 yards of total offense and 228.0 rushing yards per game.
- Iowa's defense has now scored three touchdowns (DeJean pick six and Merriweather fumble return at Rutgers) and recorded two safeties this season for 22 total defensive points.

• RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for a team-high 93 yards on 14 attempts, averaging 7.2 yards per carry. It is the second time Johnson has led the team in rushing this season.

IOWA NOTES

- QB Spencer Petras completed 21-of-30 passes for 220 yards and one touchdown his third of the season. The 220 yards are his second-most this season.
- Petras also had a 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter his first of the season and ninth of his career.
- TE Sam LaPorta had a team-high five receptions for 53 yards, moving him past the 1,500-yard mark into the top 20 in program history in career receiving yards. He has 136 receptions for 1,516 yards.
- TE Luke Lachey had a 6-yard touchdown reception late in the second quarter. It was his second career touchdown catch.
- WR Arland Bruce IV had a career-high 27 rushing yards, including a 23-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It was a career-long rush and his fourth career rushing touchdown.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career-high 11 tackles, including six solo stops (also a career-high). Higgins is the fourth player this season to have 10 or more tackles (Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Cooper DeJean). The four players have nine 10+ tackle games.
- LB Jack Campbell finished with 11 tackles, his fifth game with 10+ tackles this season (10th of his career. He has had eight or more tackles in all eight games. He is now 31st in program history with 259 career tackles.
- DB Kaevon Merriweather had his second interception of the season (third of his career) on the final play of the first half. It was Iowa's eighth interception this season.
- K Drew Stevens made a career-high four field goals, connecting from 29, 24, 54 and 25 yards. The 54-yarder is tied for the seventh-longest in program history and is the longest by a Hawkeye since 2015 (Marshall Koehn, 57 yards).
- Stevens is 11-of-12 on field goal attempts this season, the most field goals by a true freshman kicker since Mike Meyer in 2010 (14 FG).

MISCELLANEOUS

- The Hawkeyes scored a season-high 33 points and finished with a season-high 398 yards of total offense. Iowa had a season-high 178 rushing yards and 220 passing yards second-most this season.
- o The 398 yards of total offense are the most since gaining 428 yards at Maryland (W, 51-14) in 2021.
- lowa scored on its opening drive for the third time this season, going 63 yards over nine plays to start the game. K Drew Stevens connected on a 29-yard field goal, giving Iowa a 3-0 lead.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their first four possessions to start the game (FG, TD, FG, TD). It is the first time since the game at Maryland during the 2021 season that lowa has scored on four straight possessions. (lowa scored on nine straight possessions in College Park.)
- o lowa drove 85 yards on 15 plays before Stevens made a 24-yard field goal to make the score 13-0. The 15-play drive was the longest of the season, while the 85 yards were second-most.
- Iowa did not commit a turnover for the fourth game this season. The Hawkeyes are 3-1 when they don't commit a turnover.
- The Hawkeyes limited Northwestern to 177 yards of total offense. Iowa's defense has held three opponents under 200 yards this season.
- lowa's defense allowed 13 points. The Hawkeyes have allowed 13 or fewer points in six games.
- Iowa registered a season-high seven sacks (by Lukas Van Ness, Deontae Craig, Ethan Hurkett, Logan Lee, Noah Shannon, Seth Benson and Joe Evans.)
- o The seven sacks are the most against a Big Ten team since tallying seven sacks against Northwestern in 2000. Iowa also had seven sacks last season against Kent State.
