HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten Conference play on Saturday at Penn State. Iowa is 8-3 in its last 11 league openers and 13-11 all-time under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened Big Ten play six previous times (three in Happy Valley) against Penn State in the Ferentz era, winning four of the six meetings.
- lowa will be playing in its second White Out in Happy Valley. The unranked Hawkeyes won in the White Out in 2009 courtesy of Adrian Clayborn's blocked punt and return for a touchdown in lowa's 21-10 win over the fifth-ranked Nittany Lions.
- lowa is 3-0 for the 11th time under Ferentz (2023, 2021, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2015, 2009, 2008, 2006, 2003, 2001). The Hawkeyes have started 4-0 six times under Ferentz (2021, 2019, 2015, 2009, 2006, 2003).
- Ferentz the dean of coaches in college football won his 200th career game on Sept. 9 when the Hawkeyes won a 20-13 lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at lowa State. Ferentz, who has 201 career victories, is the 27th head coach to reach the milestone at an FBS institution and just the 99th college coach across all divisions since 1890.
- lowa remains in the national polls for a second straight week, coming in at No. 22 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and No. 24 in the AP Poll up one spot from Week 3. The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in the FWAA-NFF Super 16 Poll.
- Hello CBS! lowa will be making its first television appearance on CBS in 26 years on Saturday in Happy Valley. The Hawkeyes' last appearance on the network came in the 1997 Sun Bowl vs. Arizona State a 17-7 loss (lowa's last regular season game on CBS came in 1986 against Michigan). Saturday is lowa's 17th game on CBS; the program is 11-4-1 all-time on the network.
- lowa will be playing on a grass playing surface for the second time this season Saturday at Beaver Stadium. The Hawkeyes have won their last six games on grass, including a 20-13 win at lowa State in Week 2.
- RB Leshon Williams recorded his first career 100-yard game against Western Michigan, finishing with 145 rushing yards on 12 attempts. The Illinois native also had a 25-yard touchdown reception -- the first of his career -- en route to finishing with 172 all-purpose yards on 14 touches
- lowa rushed for 254 yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 16 -- the most for the program since 2019 against Middle Tennessee State (351 yards).
- The Hawkeyes put up a season-high 41 points -- the highest point total in a 25-game stretch. lowa scored 51 points in the road win at Maryland in 2021. The team's five touchdowns were the most since that 2021 game in College Park and lowa finished with 387 yards of total offense, topping the 300-yard mark for the first time in its last seven games.
- lowa's defense has allowed one touchdown to each of its first three opponents. The unit, which ranks 18th in scoring defense at 12.3 points per game, has allowed one touchdown or less in 12 of its last 16 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Western Michigan to 35 yards and one first down in the second half. The Broncos had 239 yards of total offense, the fewest allowed by the Hawkeye defense in 2023.
- lowa's defense hasn't allowed 400 or more yards in 16 consecutive games (since the Big Ten Championship Game against Michigan in 2021). The Hawkeyes have allowed 350 yards or fewer in 13 of the 16 games.
- lowa has allowed 14 or fewer points in 11 of its last 16 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season.
- QB Cade McNamara is 16-3 as a starter in 19 career collegiate starts.
- The Hawkeyes have two interceptions through three weeks of the season, including Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six in the road win at lowa State. The interception return for a touchdown extended lowa's streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years). It is the second-longest active streak nationally.
- The Hawkeye defense has scored eight points during the 2023 season and 48 points since the start of the 2022 season.
- LB Jay Higgins is third in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally, averaging 10.7 tackles per game. The Indianapolis native had a career-high 16 tackles in the season opener against Utah State.
- LB Nick Jackson has tallied nine tackles in each of lowa's last two games against lowa State and Western Michigan. The Virginia transfer has 377 career tackles.

THE SERIES

- Saturday will be the 32nd meeting in the all-time series. The Hawkeyes have won the last two meetings, including a 23-20 victory over the fourth-ranked Nittany Lions in 2021 on Nico Ragaini's 44-yard fourth-quarter touchdown reception from Spencer Petras with 6:26 to play.
- lowa is 8-7 all-time in Happy Valley, including a 41-21 victory in the last meeting in 2020. It was the Hawkeyes' largest margin of victory in the series. Prior to the win, Penn State had won six straight games.
- Penn State holds a 17-14 advantage overall in the series. Since the Nittany Lions joined the Big Ten in 1993, the series is tied, 11-11.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz is 10-8 against the Nittany Lions, including 4-4 in University Park.
- Four of the last five games in the series have been decided by six points or less.

MORE QUICK HITTERS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is 66-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- lowa is 153-8-1 when allowing 10 points or less since 1970 and 386-59-19 when allowing 10 points or less all-time.
- lowa has blocked a kick in consecutive games. DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession and DL Anterio Thompson blocked a punt that resulted in a safety against Western Michigan. lowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the past three seasons.
- The Hawkeyes are 1-0 this season and 7-1 dating back to the start of the 2022 season when not committing a turnover. The team is 8-1 in the same span when winning the turnover battle.
- Special special teams... P Tory Taylor is averaging 46.1 yards on 16 punts this season with four being fair caught, five being down inside the 20 and six traveling 50+ yards. K Drew Stevens is 4-for-5 in field goal attempts and all 17 of his kickoffs have resulted in touchbacks.

AT THE TOP

Kirk Ferentz is in his 25th season as lowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz has 115 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach, tied for the third most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history.

- Ferentz's 189 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Ferentz won his 200th career game on Sept. 11 at lowa State. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

lowa is one of just seven programs from across the country that has retained all 10 of its assistant coaches from the 2022 season. Five of the Hawkeye assistants are in at least their eighth season on the lowa coaching staff -- the second-highest total nationally.

- Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and special teams coordinator LeVar Woods were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches first team this summer. Woods' 95.80 score on the Coach Rating Index is second highest in the Big Ten. Parker also had the highest CRI amongst defensive back coaches (81.74).
- Defensive line coach Kelvin Bell and linebackers coach Seth Wallace were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches second team.

ALUMS ON STAFF

The Hawkeyes have five University of Iowa alums on the coaching staff -- Brian Ferentz, Abdul Hodge, LeVar Woods, Kelvin Bell and Ladell Betts. The five alums are tied for the second most nationally (trailing only Air Force, 8).

SHANNON SLIDES INTO COACHING ROLE

After losing an appeal over his year-long suspension, sixth-year senior DL Noah Shannon will transition into a coaching position as a student assistant on the lowa coaching staff. This move will allow Shannon to travel with the team on road trips and continue in his leadership position on the 2023 roster.

CASTRO EARNS B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Senior DB Sebastian Castro was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11. The Illinois native have a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter, had four tackles and added a pass breakup in lowa's 20-13 road victory at lowa State. Castro's pick-six extended lowa's active streak to 16 consecutive seasons — the second-longest streak nationally.

A STABLE OF RUNNING BACKS

Junior RB Leshon Williams became the Hawkeyes' first 100-yard rusher in 2023 when he finished with a career-high 145 yards on 12 attempts in lowa's 41-10 victory over Western Michigan on Sept. 16. The Illinois native had a career-long 53-yard rush in the second quarter to set up lowa's first touchdown. It was lowa's second rush of 50+ yards this season (the Hawkeyes had two 50+ yard runs in 13 games in 2022).

- Williams also had two receptions for 27 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown. It was Williams' first career receiving touchdown and third career score overall. He finished the game with a career-high 172 all-purpose yards on 14 touches (12.3 yards per touch).
- Two true freshmen RB Kamari Moulton and RB T.J. Washington, Jr. -- saw their first career action. Moulton rushed for 50 yards on eight attempts and scored two touchdowns, while Washington had six carries for 31 yards. It is the second straight year a Hawkeye freshman had two scores in a game (Kaleb Johnson, vs. Nevada) and Moulton is the first freshman since Jewell Hampton in 2008 to score two touchdowns in his collegiate debut.
- Redshirt freshman Jaziun Patterson rushed for a career-high 86 yards on 10 attempts -- both career highs -- and he scored his first career touchdown in lowa's 20-13 road win at lowa State in Week 2. On the Hawkeyes' opening possession of the game, Patterson had a 59-yard rush on third-and-1 to set up lowa's opening field goal. The rush is the second-longest by a Hawkeye dating back to the start of the 2022 season (Kaleb Johnson, 75 yards at Purdue).
- RB Kaleb Johnson, lowa's starter, missed the Week 3 game vs. Western Michigan because of injury. Johnson has a team-high 34 carries for 91 yards in two games in 2023

GROUND GRIND

The Hawkeyes' rushing attack churned out a season-high 254 yards on 43 attempts against Western Michigan in Week 3. They are the most rushing yards for the program since 2019 against Middle Tennessee State (351 yards).

• lowa scored three rushing touchdowns and five total touchdowns in the game en route to scoring 41 points -- the most in a 25-game span dating back to the 2021 season (51 points at Maryland).

TIGHT END U!!

lowa's top four tight ends have accounted for 21 catches for 260 yards and one touchdown in the first three games of the 2023 season. Junior Luke Lachey has a team-high 10 catches for 131 yards, but the Ohio native left the Week 3 game against Western Michigan in the first quarter with a lower leg injury and did not return.

• Graduate transfer Erick All (seven catches, 81 yards, one TD) will step into a larger role in the Hawkeye offense in Lachey's absence. As will Steven Stillianos (two catches, 29 yards) and Addison Ostrenga (two catches, 19 yards), who both made their first receptions of the season against Western Michigan.

KING OF RETURNS

- lowa's kickoff return unit ranks second in the Big Ten and 14th nationally, averaging 30 yards per return this season. Junior Kaden Wetjen, who had 88 yards on three returns against Western Michigan, is leading the league and ranks 19th in the country with a 25.8 return average. Sophomore Kaleb Johnson is averaging 38.5 yards on two returns, including a 54-yard return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
- Junior Cooper DeJean had 77 punt return yards in lowa's Week 3 victory over Western Michigan. The Odebolt, lowa, native is averaging 9.4 yards on nine returns this season to rank second in the league and 25th nationally.

STINGY D

The Hawkeyes' defense has given up one touchdown to each of its first three opponents to open the 2023 season. The unit has allowed one touchdown or less in 12 of its last 16 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season.

- lowa allowed a late touchdown (against the second team defense) in the season opener against Utah State, lowa State scored late in Week 2 in Ames and Western Michigan connected on a 64-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter in Week 3.
- lowa's defense, which ranks 18th national in scoring defense (12.3 points per game), allowed just 35 yards of total offense and one first down against Western Michigan in the second half in Week 3. The Broncos had 239 yards of total offense a season low by a Hawkeye opponent.
- lowa's defense held five teams without a touchdown during the 2022 season.

D DAZZLES IN NONCON

lowa's defense has held their last seven nonconference opponents to 14 or fewer points dating back to last season, the longest active streak by any FBS team. It is the longest streak by lowa in the Kirk Ferentz era (since 1999).

AIR RAID

lowa went to the air to score its first two touchdowns of the 2023 season in the season-opening 24-14 victory over Utah State. QB Cade McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass to WR Seth Anderson on his first attempt as a Hawkeye (and the second play of the game) and McNamara connected with fellow Michigan transfer Erick All for a 3-yard touchdown on lowa's second possession.

- lowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawai'i (Matt Rodgers to Danan Hughes) and it was the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that lowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- lowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and the unit had two first-quarter touchdown passes first the first time since 2018 (T.J. Hockenson, Noah Fant) against Indiana.
- McNamara has completed 38-of-71 attempts for 417 yards and has four touchdowns (to three interceptions) in three games. He has two games where he has thrown two touchdown passes. His four touchdown passes rank fifth in the Big Ten.

MCNAMARA FOLLOWS CHUCK LONG

QB Cade McNamara's first passing attempt as a Hawkeye went for a touchdown when he connected with WR Seth Anderson for a 36-yard score on the second play of lowa's 24-14 win over Utah State.

• McNamara is the first lowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against lowa State).

TACKLING LINEBACKERS

- Senior LB Jay Higgins ranks third in the Big Ten and is tied for 13th nationally in tackles, averaging 10.7 tackles per game through the first three weeks of the season. The Indianapolis native had a career-high 16 tackles, including a career-best 12 solo stops, and one pass breakup in lowa's 24-14 victory over Utah State in Week 1. They were the most by a Hawkeye since Butkus Award-winning linebacker Jack Campbell had 16 tackles in the regular season finale against Nebraska in 2022.
- It was Higgins second career game with 10 or more tackles. He had 11 stops last season against Northwestern.
- LB Nick Jackson has made nine tackles in consecutive games against lowa State and Western Michigan, giving him 23 tackles through the first three weeks of 2023. The Virginia transfer, who has 377 career tackles, ranks ninth in the Big Ten in tackles (7.7 per game).
- Both linebackers forced fumbles in lowa's 41–10 victory over Western Michigan.

BLOCK-R-US

- The Hawkeyes have blocked a kick/punt in consecutive games, giving the lowa special teams' unit five blocks since the start of the 2022 season. Iowa has blocked at least one block in each of the last three seasons.
- Senior DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the Cyclones' opening possession of the game in lowa's 20-13 road win in Ames. It was Lee's second career blocked kick. He also blocked a field goal attempt versus Minnesota in 2021.

HAWKEYES RETURN 3 ALL-AMERICANS

lowa returns three players who garnered All-America recognition in 2022 in P Tory Taylor, K Drew Stevens and RB Kaleb Johnson.

- Taylor was named first-team All-America by the FWAA, Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus. The Australian averaged 45.4 yards on 82 punts and opponents averaged just 4.4 yards on 21 returns.
- Stevens was named second-team Freshman All-America by College Football News, while Johnson earned honorable mention honors. Stevens had an lowa freshman record 16 field goals and a team-best 72 points in 2022, while Johnson had a freshman record 779 rushing yards and six touchdowns, including three 100-yard games.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

The Hawkeyes return six starters from a defense that was amongst the nation's best in 2022. Iowa held nine opponents to 10 or fewer points — a first for the program since 1903 — and posted two shutouts, including the first in Music City Bowl history.

• The 2022 defense limited opponents to 270.8 yards and 13.3 points, ranking second nationally in both statistical categories. The 270.8 yards were the lowest by a Hawkeye defense since 1981 (253.6) and the 13.3 points allowed were the fewest since 2008 (13.0).

BALL HAWKS

- lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 16 seasons and 21 of the last 23 seasons.
- lowa is 39-8 all-time when recording a pick six, 30-5 under Kirk Ferentz and 18-4 with Phil Parker as the DC.
- DB Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six at lowa State in Week 2 extended the streak to 16 straight seasons, which is the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Utah (19). Iowa is one of four teams nationally to have a picksix streak of 10-plus years.
- lowa has two interceptions and one defensive touchdown in 2023. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four interceptions, two fumble returns) during the 2022 season.
- lowa forced 23 turnovers (eight fumble recoveries, 15 interceptions) and scored 66 points off the miscues a season ago.

NICO'S SIXTH YEAR

Sixth-year senior Nico Ragaini returns as the veteran of Iowa's wide receiver room. The Connecticut native has 130 career receptions for 1,402 yards with five touchdowns.

• Ragaini's 130 career receptions rank ninth all-time in program history and his 1,402 receiving yards rank 27th in the record books.

lowa's offensive line is more experienced in 2023 with upperclassmen starting in four of the five positions.

- lowa's returning offensive linemen have played in 229 games with 136 career starts amongst the group. Entering the season, lowa's offensive line played in 209 games, which were tied for the ninth-most in the nation and their 126 starts ranked 10th.
- Transfer Rusty Feth is the most experienced lineman on the lowa roster, as he started 34 games and played in 38 contests at Miami (Ohio) prior to joining the Hawkeyes.
- OT Gennings Dunker -- a sophomore -- is the youngest starter on lowa's offensive line.

KJ2 -- SUPERMAN -- RETURNS

- Freshman RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for a team-high 63 yards on 19 attempts and found the end zone for the seventh time in his career in the opening win over Utah State. Johnson has rushed for 91 yards on 34 attempts through the first three weeks of the 2023 season. (He missed the Western Michigan game because of injury.)
- Johnson rushed for an lowa freshman record 779 yards on 151 carries in 2022, which included three 100-yard games and a team-high six touchdowns.
- He has rushed for 870 career yards, 130 shy of reaching 1,000 for his career.
- Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown -- his fourth of the season -- in the road win at Purdue. The yardage and attempts were both career highs.
- The 200 rushing yards were the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl). He was the first Hawkeye to rush for 200 yards in a game since 2015.

EXPERIENCE ON DL

The Hawkeyes return two starters on the defensive line in 2023 in Joe Evans and Logan Lee. The duo started all 13 games for during the 2022 season and they have a combined 44 career starts.

- Evans tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks last season and he finished with 41 tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss. The Ames, lowa, has nine tackles and one sack in 2023, giving him 19.5 sacks for his
- Lee has started 30 consecutive games. The Illinois, native had 54 tackles, including eight tackles for loss and three sacks a season ago.
- DE Deontae Craig tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks and had 10 TFL in a reserve role in 2022. He also forced three fumbles and had 31 tackles a season ago.

DEJEAN'S PICK 6s

Junior DB Cooper DeJean had a school record three interception returns for a touchdown during the 2022 season. The three pick-sixes are tied for the most career interceptions returned for a touchdown in lowa history.

DYNAMIC DREW

Kicker Drew Stevens' sophomore season has mad 4-of-5 field goal attempts through the first three weeks of the 2023 season. He went 1-for-2 against Western Michigan, missing his first kick of 2023 — a 41-yarder. Stevens made two field goals at lowa State in Week 2 — his sixth career game with two or more field goals.

- Stevens has made 20-of-23 field goal attempts in his career and he hasn't missed an extra point. This season, Stevens has had a touchback in each of his 17 kickoffs.
- As a freshman, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors during the 2022 season after making 16-of 18 field goals -- the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding). In the offseason, Stevens added 20 pounds to his 6'1" frame.
- The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from 50+ in 2022. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an .889 field goal percentage and he was sixth in the Big Ten in field goals per game (1.23).
- Stevens is listed on the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List. Last season, he was one of 20 semifinalists for the honor.
- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in lowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.
- He made two field goals at Minnesota -- from 38 and 21 yards. The 21-yard field goal was a game-winner with 28 seconds remaining in the game.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

lowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 50 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 39 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

THE MOST FAMOUS PUNTER IN AMERICA

Punter Tory Taylor's senior season -- his fourth as the Hawkeyes' starting punter -- has 16 punts for a 46.1 yard average through the first three weeks of the 2023 season with six punts of 50+ yards, four being fair caught and five being downed inside the 20-yard line.

- He ranks second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally with his 46.1 average.
- Taylor was named to the Ray's 8 for his efforts in Week 1 and Week 2.
- Taylor has a 45.5 career average over 218 punts with 103 -- 47.2 percent -- landing inside the 20-yardline.
- Taylor set the school record for punt yardage in consecutive years. He had 80 punts for 3,688 yards in 2022 and 82 punts for 3,725 yards in 2023.
- His 45.4 average in 2022 was second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- He punted a career-high 10 times for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per attempt, against South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12-yard lines and seven of his punts were inside the 20.
- Taylor has been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week three times in his career (2021 at Iowa State, 2022 vs. South Dakota State and 2022 at Rutgers).
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15. He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.

STUDENT-ATHLETES = GRADUATES

Ten lowa football student-athletes enter the season having already earned their undergraduate degrees: Nick DeJong, Joe Evans, Rusty Feth, Cade McNamara, Daijon Parker, Tanner Pollock, Nico Ragaini, Chris Reames, Quinn Schulte and Noah Shannon.

WORLD CHAMPION; DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Freshman LB Ben Kueter is a world champion wrestler, winning the U20 World Wrestling Championship in July, 2022. The lowa City, Iowa, native was named the USA Today Boys Wrestler of the Year for 2022-23 and he was one of five finalists for the high school Butkus Award.

• Kueter will be a dual-sport athlete for the Hawkeyes, as he will also compete on the lowa wrestling team.

LEE NOMINATED FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior defensive lineman Logan Lee has been nominated for the AFCA Good Works Team. The award recognizes the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field.

HAWKEYE FREAKS

Two Hawkeyes -- DB Cooper DeJean and C Logan Jones -- are on listed on Bruce Feldman's college football Freaks List. DeJean comes in at No. 14 after clocking a 0.92 score in his flying 10s and a 2.39 in his 20-yard spring out of a two-point stance. Jones is ranked No. 52 after being second in lowa history in hang-clean and setting a record with a 700-pound squat, while vertical jumping 36 inches.

HALE BAY CHAMP

For a second straight year, sophomore OL Gennings Dunker prevailed as the Solon Beef Days hale bay champion. Dunker finished with a record toss of 14'6" to beat fellow Hawkeye OL Logan Jones. (Hay bales weigh approximately 60 pounds.)

2023 PLAYER COUNCIL

Fifteen players -- three sixth-year players, six seniors and six juniors -- are on the 2023 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The group consists of sixth-year student-athletes Joe Evans, Nico Ragaini and Noah Shannon, seniors Kyler Fisher, Jay Higgins, Logan Lee, Cade McNamara, Quinn Schulte and Tory Taylor and juniors Deontae Craig, Cooper DeJean, Jermari Harris, Luke Lachey and Mason Richman.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- Iowa has seven players on its 2023 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: DB Amare Bickham (Lloyd, 1993-95), LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), LB Jackson Filer (Rodney, 1993-96), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-02), QB Tommy Poholsky (Tom, 1986-89) and LS Liam Reardon (Bill, 1993-96).
- Epenesa's brother, A.J., played at lowa from 2017-19.
- WR Alex Eichmann's grandfather, Richard "Dick" Gibbs, played at Iowa from 1965-66.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.
- Four Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes OL Griffin Liddle's father, Josh, wrestled at Iowa, DL Andrew Kraus' father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at Iowa and TE Jalyn Thompson's father, Rod, played basketball.

KINNICK: SOLD OUT

All seven University of Iowa home football games are sold out for the 2023 season. It is the second consecutive season that the Hawkeyes have sold out the stadium for the entire season.

IN THE RANKINGS

- lowa is in the national rankings for a second straight week in both major polls. The Hawkeyes are No. 22 (up two spots) in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and are 24th (up one spot) in the AP Top 25 poll. The program is also receiving votes in the FWAA-NFF Super 16 Poll.
- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 25 in the preseason AP Poll for the fourth time in the last five years and the 10th time in the Kirk Ferentz era (27th time overall).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2022 season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches polls. lowa was 33rd in the coaches' poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP Poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, Iowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

That includes a 426-227-16 (.648) record in home games, a 261-344-23 (.433) record in games away from lowa City, a 353-389-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 310-192-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- The Hawkeyes won their first trophy game of the 2023 season, winning 20-13 in an lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at lowa State. lowa has won seven of the last eight meetings against the Cyclones.
- lowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to lowa State in their first trophy game the team's first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. lowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed lowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
- The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- Iowa is 29-9 in its last 38 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 25-8 in their last 33 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 21 times in the last 22 seasons. lowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than lowa. lowa is 18-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

3 HAWKEYES NAMED FINALSTS FOR SENIOR BOWL 75TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM BALLOT

Former University of Iowa football players Nate Kaeding, Bob Sanders and Marshal Yanda have been named finalists on the Senior Bowl 75th Anniversary Team ballot.

The inaugural Senior Bowl was played in Jacksonville, Florida, in 1950 and moved to Mobile, Alabama, the following year, where it has become an annual tradition for over seven decades. Players who were on NFL rosters between 1998-2023 are eligible for selection to the 75th Anniversary Team.

The 75th Anniversary Team selection process will include fan participation, as well as input from current NFL executives and the Senior Bowl's executive committee. Fans can vote at seniorbowl.com.

PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as lowa's defensive coordinator, lowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.75), first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in total offense (326.04) and the unit ranks third in the nation in interceptions (170).
- lowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.
- The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- lowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- lowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered was the fewest by an lowa defense since 1981.
- The defense had a 79 percent stop rate -- drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on downs -- to lead the country.
- lowa has 220 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season tied for the second-most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. lowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- Iowa has had five players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021).

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 25th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at lowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is lowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant

Coach of the Year award.

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 189 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 115 Big Ten wins, which ties for third
 all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 180-94 (.653) overall mark and a 111-69 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 189-115 (.619) and a 115-83 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 189 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 201-136 (.594), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz is in his eighth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Steve Ferentz is in his first season as a member of coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach).

A BROAD PERSPECTIVE... IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 21 of the last 22 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (189-115) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- lowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. lowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. lowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- lowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- lowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- lowa has six unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010, the third-most in the nation.
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. lowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. lowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- lowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 213 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (85 draft picks/128 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- lowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- lowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (45 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- lowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history lowa has had two players selected in the first round.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2023. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TET.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- •TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 204-of-245 (83 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 15 years, lowa has had 57 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (89), Michigan (72).
- lowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 13 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former lowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- $\bullet Former \, center \, James \, Ferentz \, was \, a \, member \, of the \, 2016 \, Super \, Bowl \, champion \, Denver \, Broncos.$
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2023 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (17) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 19 lowa tight ends since 1999 (12 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

- lowa is now 100-33-2 in season opener, including 21-4 all-time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The win is Ferentz's 199th career victory and his 187th win at lowa.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Cade McNamara completed 17-of-30 attempts (56.6 percent) for 191 yards and two touchdowns in his lowa debut (17th career start).
- McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass on his first career attempt as a Hawkeye. He is the first lowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against lowa State).
- TE Luke Lachey tied a career-high with seven receptions for 73 yards, including a 31-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- lowa's tight ends (Lachey and Erick All) combined for 10 catches for 88 yards and one touchdown.
- RB Kaleb Johnson led Iowa's rushing attack with 63 yards on 19 attempts, including a 3-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It is Johnson's seventh career rushing touchdown.
- Johnson also had a career-long 54-yard kickoff return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
- WR Seth Anderson had a 36-yard touchdown reception and TE Erick All had a 3-yard touchdown reception both players' first career receptions at Iowa.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career high 16 tackles, including 12 solo stops. It was his second career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Xavier Nwankpa had his second career interception in the second quarter. Nwankpa has two interceptions in two career starts.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawaii (Matt Rodgers-to-Danan Hughes). It is the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that lowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- lowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and it is the first time the unit had two first-quarter touchdowns in the opening quarter since Nevada (9/17/22).
- DL Deontae Craig, DL Yahya Black and DB Deshaun Lee made their first career starts. QB Cade McNamara, TE Erick All and LB Nick Jackson made their first career starts as Hawkeyes.

- lowa now leads the lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-2, through the first three matchups during the 2023-24 season.
- In three out of the last four meetings, the outcome has been decided by one score.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Jaziun Patterson had a career-best 86 rushing yards on 10 attempts, including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown run of his career.
- Patterson had a career-long 59-yard run on third-and-1 on lowa's opening possession. The 59-yard rush is the second-longest rush dating back to the 2022 season
- •TE Luke Lachey had three receptions for a team-high 58 yards and TE Erick All had three catches for 32 yards. In two games, the tight end duo has 16 receptions for 178 yards and one touchdown.
- CASH Sebastian Castro had a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown to give lowa a 17-0 lead. It was Castro's first career interception and his second career defensive touchdown (fumble return at Rutgers).
- DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession of the game. It is the second blocked kick of Lee's career (vs. Minnesota). lowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the last three seasons.
- DB Cooper DeJean had 10 tackles, including six solo stops. It is the third time in his career he has had 10 or more tackles.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts. It is the sixth time in Stevens' career he has made two or more field goals. The North Carolina native is 3-for-3 on field goal attempts this season.
- Stevens is 19-of-21 in field goal attempts for his Hawkeye career.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa extended its pick 6 streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years) with Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick 6 in the second quarter. The streak is the second longest nationally.
- lowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes allowed one touchdown (and two field goals) in its season-opening 24-14 triumph over Utah State on Sept. 2 in Kinnick Stadium. Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is now 65-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
