## HAWKEYES / 1st \& 10

- The Hawkeyes clinched the outright Big Ten West Division title with its 15-13 victory over Illinois on Senior Day on Nov. 18. Iowa will play the winner of Saturday's Ohio State/Michigan game in the Big Ten Championship Game on Dec. 3 in Indianapolis.
- Iowa has won three Big Ten West Division crowns under head coach Kirk Ferentz (2015, 2021, 2023).
-The Hawkeyes are 9-2 overall and 6-2 in Big Ten play. It is the ninth time lowa has won nine games under Ferentz. lowa has won 10 or more games seven times under Ferentz.
- Sweet November. Iowa has won 17 of its last 18 games in the month of November, dating back to 2019.
- Woody, Amos \& Kirk. . . Ferentz's win over Illinois was the 195th of his career, moving him past Michigan's Bo

Schembechler for third place in career wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz only trails Woody Hayes
(205) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (199).

- Iowa defensive coordinator Phil Parker is one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach. It is the second straight year Parker is a semifinalist.
- P Tory Taylor is the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time this season after averaging 51.6 yards on eight punts in the win over Illinois. Five Hawkeyes have earned seven Big Ten weekly honors this season -- DB Sebastian Castro, DB Cooper DeJean, LB Nick Jackson, Taylor (3) and K Drew Stevens. Iowa has had the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week five times in 2023.
- Iowa's defense ranks third nationally, giving up 12.4 points per game. The Hawkeyes have allowed two touchdowns over their last 20 quarters, four touchdowns over the past 28 periods and 12 total touchdowns in 2023.
-The Hawkeyes' rushing defense has allowed just two rushing touchdowns in 2023, which are the fewest in the nation. The Hawkeyes are the only team nationally to surrender two rushing touchdowns.
- SHUTOUT! lowa shut out Rutgers, winning 22-0 on Nov. 11. It is team's first Big Ten shutout since 2019 and the 16th of the Ferentz era.
- SAFETY! The Hawkeye defense recorded its third safety on a Joe Evans forced fumble against Illinois. It is the first time since 2018 lowa has had three safeties in a single season. lowa's defense has scored 12 points in 2023.
- lowa $>400$. lowa's defense has allowed fewer than 400 yards in 25 consecutive games -- the longest active streak nationally. lowa gave up 280 yards against Illinois and the 127 yards surrendered against Rutgers were the fewest against a Big The opponent since 2019.
-The Hawkeyes have allowed 14 or fewer points in 17 of their last 24 games and the defense has held nine teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season. The unit has allowed one touchdown or less in nine of the 11 games in 2023 and in 18 of the last 24 games.
-The Hawkeye offense had a season-high 402 yards ( 179 on the ground, 223 through the air) against Rutgers. It is the highest total for the program in a span of 32 games (at Maryland, 2021).
- QB Deacon Hill has completed 39-of-60 attempts (.650) for 390 yards and two touchdowns over lowa's last two games, including a career-high 223 yards against Rutgers. Hill is $5-1$ as lowa's starting quarterback.
- Junior DB Cooper DeJean, who suffered a season-ending injury in practice on Nov. 15, is a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy. Iowa has semifinalists in DeJean (Thorpe, Lott Impact), Jay Higgins (Butkus), Drew Stevens (Groza) and Tory Taylor (Ray Guy). Joe Evans was also a semifinalist for the Burlsworth Trophy.
- Four Hawkeyes -- Cooper DeJean, Tory Taylor, Jay Higgins and Sebastian Castro -- were selected midseason All-Americans by various outlets. DeJean, Taylor and Higgins were first team honorees.
- lowa is bowl eligible for the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is $70-2$ when leading by eight points at any point in a game.

The Hawkeyes notched their ninth victory in the 15-13 Senior Day triumph over Illinois on Nov. 18. It is the 10th time under head coach Kirk Ferentz that lowa has won at least nine games.

- lowa has won at least eight games in eight of the last nine years (the team went $6-2$ during the COVID season in 2020).
- The Hawkeyes have posted seven $10+$ win seasons under Ferentz.


## THE SERIES

- Friday's game is the 54th meeting in the all-time series with Nebraska holding a 30-20-3 advantage. The series began with a 22-0 lowa victory in 1891.
- The Hawkeyes have won seven of the last eight and eight of the last 10 meetings. lowa's 56 points in 2017 are the most in the series' 54 -game history.
-The last five meetings have all been decided by seven points or less.
- The Hawkeyes have won the last five meetings in Lincoln, but the Huskers lead 15-7-1 all-time in games played in Lincoln. lowa's $38-17$ win in 2013 was its first win at Nebraska since 1943.
- The 1999 lowa-Nebraska game in Kinnick Stadium marked Kirk Ferentz's first game as lowa's head coach. -The first 10 games in the series were played in either Omaha (eight games) or Council Bluffs (two games). The series was even at 4-4-2 in those 10 meetings.

## BATTLE FOR HEROES TROPHY

lowa and Nebraska are playing "The Heroes Game" Friday, with the winner claiming the Heroes Trophy. The trophy game between the Hawkeyes and Cornhuskers was established in 2011. Since its inception, lowa leads the series, 8-4. lowa gained possession of the trophy for the first time with a $38-17$ win at Nebraska in 2013. The Hawkeyes reclaimed it in 2015 with a $28-20$ win in Lincoln, their first of seven straight wins in the series.

## BLACK FRIDAY

lowa and Nebraska meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the 13th consecutive season. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference in 2011. Iowa is 8 -4 in the previous 12 Black Friday meetings, winning seven of the last eight games.

## THE HEROES

The Heroes Game, presented by Pioneer, was created to honor the rich football traditions of the University of lowa and the University of Nebraska football programs while also annually honoring community heroes in both states. The 2023 citizen heroes have positively impacted the community and stand as an inspiration to others. Josh Hicks is Nebraska's hero, while Eric Kumm is lowa's hero.

## NOTEWORTHY...

- Head coach Kirk Ferentz is one of 20 coaches named to the 2023 Dodd Trophy Midseason Watch List. Ferentz was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2015.
- Tory Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Oct. 24. The Australian has been named to the Ray's 8 five times and he has twice been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week in 2023. Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally with a 48.2-yard punting average in 2023.
- Block Thompson. Iowa DL Anterio Thompson had his second punt block of the season to set up lowa's first touchdown in the road win at Northwestern. He is one of 18 players nationally with at least two blocks this season.
- RB Leshon Williams became the 52nd player in program history to surpass the 1,000 career rushing yards mark in lowa's road win at Northwestern. Williams has a team-high 668 yards this season and 1,149 yards for his career.
-WR Nico Ragaini eclipsed the 1,500 career receiving yards mark against Rutgers. He is seventh in career receptions (149) and 21st in career yardage (1,567).
-Walking wounded. Four of lowa's most prominent players -- QB Cade McNamara, TE Luke Lachey, TE Erick All and DB Cooper DeJean -- are sidelined with season-ending injuries.
- LB Jay Higgins and LB Nick Jackson have combined for 220 tackles this season -- the highest by a Power 5 tandem in the nation. Higgins leads the Big Ten and ranks third nationally (the most by a Power 5 player) with 12.1 tackles per game. He has two $15+$ and eight $10+$ tackle games this season. Jackson has two 10+ tackle games this season and 22 for his career.
- Higgins has 101 tackles in eight Big Ten games, averaging 12.6 tackles per contest -- 21 more than Northwestern's Bryce Gallagher. Higgins had 18 tackles at Penn State, tied for the eighth-most in a game this season and the most by a Hawkeye since Jack Campbell in 2021.
- The Hawkeyes have nine interceptions through 11 games (to rank 55th nationally), including Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six in the road win at lowa State. The interception return for a touchdown extended lowa's streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years). It is the second-longest active streak nationally.
-The Hawkeyes played in front of eight straight sellouts and 10 overall sellouts in 11 games. The only game that hasn't been a sellout was the road game at Northwestern at Wrigley Field.
- Iowa is 156-8-1 when allowing 10 points or less since 1970 and 389-59-19 when allowing 10 points or less all-time.
- The Hawkeye defense has scored 12 points during the 2023 season and 52 points since the start of the 2022 season.
- Iowa has blocked three kicks during the 2023 season - lowa State, Western Michigan and Northwestern. DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession and DL Anterio Thompson blocked a punt that resulted in a safety against Western Michigan and a second punt at Northwestern. lowa has blocked a kick/ punt in each of the past three seasons.
- The Hawkeyes are 3-0 this season and 9-1 dating back to the start of the 2022 season when not committing a turnover. The team is $11-1$ in the same span when winning the turnover battle.


## WOODY, AMOS \& KIRK

Kirk Ferentz, in his 25th season as lowa's head football coach and the longest tenured active head coach in college football, won his 195th career game as a member of the Big Ten Conference on Nov. 18 against Illinois. The victory moved Ferentz past Bo Schembechler for third in Big Ten history; he trails only Ohio State's Woody Hayes (205) and Chicago's Amos Alonzo Stagg (199).

- Ferentz has 121 Big Ten wins, which also rank third all-time, trailing Hayes (153) and Schembechler (143).
- Ferentz won his 200th career game on Sept. 11 at lowa State. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.


## PBU

In their first game without all-everything DB Cooper DeJean's season-ending injury, the Hawkeye defense finished with a season-high 13 pass breakups against Illinois, the most PBUs by lowa since amassing 14 in a win over Indiana in 2002.

- Seven different Hawkeyes had at least one pass breakup against an Illini offense that threw the ball 47 times. Junior DB Jermari Harris had a career-high eight tackles and four pass breakups in the game -- the most since Quinn Schulte in 2022 against South Dakota State.


## O COMES THROUGH

- The Hawkeyes had their longest scoring drive in both plays (14) and time of possession (7:59) in the second quarter in the 15-13 victory over Illinois on Nov. 18.
- lowa outgained Illinois, 281-280, in the game with 54 yards coming when it counted most on a four-play, 54-yard touchdown drive in the fourth quarter. Sophomore RB Kaleb Johnson's 30 -yard touchdown run propelled lowa to its ninth win.

## STIFLING SHUTOUT!

The Hawkeyes notched their first shutout of the season in its $22-0$ victory over Rutgers on Nov. 11. It was the team's first Big Ten shutout since 2019 (Rutgers) and third since the start of the 2022 season. lowa has 16 shutouts during the Kirk Ferentz era.

- Iowa limited the Scarlet Knights to 127 yards -- the fewest in a league game since 2019. The rushing defense held Rutgers 150 yards below its season average ( 34 yards) and bottled up the Big Ten's leading rusher, limiting Kyle Monangai to 39 yards on 13 carries.
- The 127 yards are the seventh fewest allowed in the Ferentz era, while the seven first downs allowed are tied for the sixth fewest and the seven pass completions allowed are tied for the fifth fewest.


## OFFENSE BREAKS THROUGH

After averaging 225.3 yards over its first nine games, lowa's offense erupted for 402 yards against the nation's 10thranked Rutgers defense on Nov. 11. It was the first 400 -yard game in the last 32 contests (Maryland, 2021).
-The Hawkeyes had 223 passing and 173 rushing yards -- the first 200+ passing and $100+$ rushing game since Northwestern in 2022.

- QB Deacon Hill passed for a career-high 223 yards, completing a season-high 20 passes.
- Seven different receivers caught at least one pass and three running backs had 53 or more yards.
- lowa didn't have a three-and-out in the game, had a season-high 21 first downs and punter Tory Taylor had just three punts -- a season low.
- The offensive unit was 9 -of-18 on third downs and 2-of-2 on fourth downs in the game and controlled the time of possession to the tune of 38:22-- the seventh-best all-time under Kirk Ferentz.


## ROCK STAR TORY

- Senior punter Tory Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on 0 ct .24 after punting nine times for 444 yards, averaging 49.3 yards, against Minnesota. Four of his kicks traveled over 50 yards and four were downed inside the 20. Taylor has also been named to the Ray's 8 list five times in 2023.
- Taylor earned his third Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honor on Nov. 20 after punting eight times for a 51.6 yard average in lowa's 15-13 victory over Illinois. In his final home game, Taylor had six punts of $50+$ yards and two punts downed inside the 20 . His eight punts pushed him past Jason Baker for the most career punts in school history. - Taylor was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on 0 ct. 9 after punting six times for 284 yards ( 47.3 average) in lowa's $20-14$ win over Purdue. Two of his six punts went over 50 yards ( 61 and 57 ) and two were downed inside the 20 -yard line.
- Taylor earned his second straight weekly honor on Oct. 14 after putting on a punting display in the road win at Wisconsin. He had a career-high 506 combined punting yards ( 50.6 average) with half of his 10 punts going over 50 yards (two 60+) and six punts were downed inside the 20.
- Taylor has six career Big Ten weekly honors (2021 at lowa State; 2022 vs. South Dakota State; 2022 at Rutgers, 2023 vs. Purdue; 2023 at Wisconsin, 2023 vs. Illinois). He is a midseason first-team All-American by the AP, ESPN, Sporting News, CBS, The Athletic and FOX and is a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.


## STEVENS EARNS B1G SPECIAL TEAMS HONOR

Sophomore Drew Stevens was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week -- the third Hawkeye special teamer to be honored -- after drilling a game-winning 53 -yard field goal with 14 seconds remaining in lowa's 10-7 road win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field. It is Stevens' second career game-winner (at Minnesota, 2022) and tied for the second-longest field goal of his career.

- It is Stevens' second career weekly honor as he was the Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2022.


## DEJEAN/JACKSON EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY ACCOLADES

- DB Cooper DeJean was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after leading the Hawkeyes to a 26-16 win over Michigan State on Sept. 30. The Odebolt, lowa, native had a 70 -yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to break a 16-all tie. It was the 15th longest punt return in school history, the first of his career and the first by a Hawkeye since 2020. DeJean also had six tackles and an interception in the game.
- LB Nick Jackson was selected as the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after recording 10 tackles -- his second straight $10+$ tackle game -- a tackle for loss and a key fourth quarter forced fumble that led to a game-sealing Hawkeye field goal.
-The honors are the first of DeJean and Jackson's careers.


## CASTRO EARNS B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Senior DB Sebastian Castro was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11. The Illinois native have a 30 -yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter, had four tackles and added a pass breakup in lowa's 20-13 road victory at lowa State. Castro's pick-six extended lowa's active streak to 16 consecutive seasons -- the second-longest streak nationally.

## BROWN EMERGES

The Hawkeyes have an emerging weapon in the wide receiving corps in sophomore Kaleb Brown. The Illinois native has 11 catches for 121 yards and a touchdown over lowa's last three games.

- Brown had a key 23-yard completion on lowa's eventual game-winning scoring drive in the road win at Northwestern before recording three catches for 27 yards and his first career touchdown -- a 10 -yarder -- against Rutgers.
- Brown's ascension continued against Illinois when he had career-highs in receptions (7), receiving yards (71), while tallying his longest career reception (31). ## MORE BIG TIME TIGHT ENDS?

Sophomore Addison Ostrenga has been one of lowa's top receiving weapons the last two weeks, pulling in 13 receptions for 71 yards and one touchdown. He had a career-high eight receptions for 47 yards against Rutgers before making five catches for 24 yards and his second career touchdown against Illinois in Week 12.

- His eight receptions are the most by a Hawkeye since Sam LaPorta had nine receptions last season at Illinois.
- Ostrenga wasn't the only Hawkeye tight end who made a big contribution against Rutgers. Freshman Zach Ortwerth had a 54 -yard reception to set up an lowa field goal. It was the longest reception of the season by a Hawkeye.


## WHAT A STAND!

After a pass interference penalty gave Northwestern a first-and-goal from the 2 on Nov. 4 in Wrigley Field, lowa's defense conjured up memories of Syracuse in 2005. The Hawkeyes stopped the Wildcats on four consecutive rushing attempts -three from the 1 -- for a turnover on downs.

## HEAT SEEKING CASTRO

Senior DB Sebastian Castro has been a like a heat seeking missile for the Hawkeye defense, piling up 48 tackles, including six tackles for loss out of the CASH position, while intercepting a team-high three passes and recording seven pass break-ups. His three picks are seventh in the Big Ten and 48th nationally.

- Castro earned midseason second-team All-America honors by the Associated Press.
- The Illinois native, who was a high school teammate of RB Leshon Williams, had seven solo tackles, including two TFL and a fourth quarter interception that sealed lowa's road win in Madison.
- Castro also came on a blitz in the fourth quarter against the Badgers in their own end zone. He flushed QB Braedyn Locke from the pocket to allow DL Yahya Black to record a sack and forced fumble, which ultimately resulted in a safety.


## LESHON TO THE HOUSE

RB Leshon Williams had an 82-yard touchdown run in the second quarter of lowa's road win at Wisconsin. His rush was tied for the ninth longest in program history, the longest by a Hawkeye since 1997 (Tavian Banks) and the longest all-time by a Hawkeye against Wisconsin. It is tied for the seventh longest run in the nation this season.

- Williams finished the game a career-high 174 rushing yards -- the most by a Hawkeye this season -- on 25 attempts for his second 100 -yard rushing game of the season. The Illinois native had his first career 100-yard game, rushing for 145 yards on 12 carries against Western Michigan (and he had two receptions for 27 yards, including a 25 -yard touchdown).
-Williams has a team-high 668 yards on 139 carries, averaging 4.8 yards per attempt. He finished with 79 yards on 24 attempts to eclipse the 1,000 -yard mark for his career on Nov. 4 at Northwestern. He is the 52nd player in program history to reach 1,000 career yards; he has 1,149 yards.
- He has four "explosive" runs this season, including two runs of $53+$ yards $(82,53)$.


## KJ GOES OVER 1K

In his first game since Week 2 at lowa State, sophomore RB Kaleb Johnson returned to record his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and fourth of his career in lowa's Homecoming victory over Purdue. The Ohio native rushed for 134 yards -- the second-highest total of his career -- on 17 attempts and scored a touchdown, a 67 -yarder in the opening quarter. It was lowa's longest offensive play of the season and the second-longest run of Johnson's career.

- Johnson's 134-yard performance pushed him over the 1,000-yard mark for his career. He is the 51 st player in program history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark.
- Against Illinois, Johnson carried the ball 10 times for 53 yards and hit paydirt, scoring on a 30 -yard touchdown run -- the game-winning score -- in the fourth quarter.
- Johnson is second on the team with 385 rushing yards on 94 carries with three touchdowns.
- Last season, Johnson rushed for an lowa freshman record 779 yards on 151 carries, which included three 100 -yard games and a team-high six touchdowns.
- Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown -- his fourth of the season -- in the road win at Purdue. The yardage and attempts were both career highs. - The 200 rushing yards were the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl). He was the first Hawkeye to rush for 200 yards in a game since 2015.


## ROAD GRINDERS

The Hawkeye rushing attack churned out 381 yards in consecutive victories over Purdue and Wisconsin -- the most in a twogame stretch since 2020 (226 vs. Michigan State, 235 vs. Minnesota).

- Iowa finished with 179 yards against Rutgers on Nov. 11 against the nation's 10th-ranked defense.
- Iowa's 200 yards against the Badgers are the most since 2008.
- The Hawkeyes rushed for 254 yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 16 -- the most for the program since 2019 against Middle Tennessee State (351 yards).


## D CREATES HAVOC

After combining for three sacks and 24 tackles for loss in lowa's first five games, the Hawkeye defense created havoc in Week 6 against Purdue. Iowa finished with a season-high six sacks (by five different players) and had a season-high 12 tackles for loss, matching the defense's performance in the Music City Bowl victory over Kentucky.

- DL Logan Lee had career highs across the board, finishing with 10 tackles, 2.5 TFL and two sacks. It was his first career game with 10+ tackles.
- DE Joe Evans finished with seven tackles, including a career-best 4.5 TFL and one sack. The 4.5 TFL are tied for the fourth most in a game nationally this season.


## 1-2 PUNCH

lowa linebackers Jay Higgins and Nick Jackson have been the definition of productive for the Hawkeyes in 2023. The duo have combined for 220 tackles this season, the most by a Power 5 tandem nationally.

- In all games, Higgins has 132 tackles -- the most by a Power 5 player. The 132 tackles are tied for the 17th-most in a single season in program history (Chad Greenway, 2003). Higgins is 12 tackles shy of reaching the top five in program history.
- Higgins has led or tied for the team lead in tackles in 10 of lowa's 11 games.
- In Big Ten contests, Higgins has a league-best 101 tackles -- 21 more than Northwestern's Bryce Gallagher. Higgins averages 12.6 tackles per game in eight league games.
- Both Higgins and Jackson were named to the Lombardi Award Midseason Watch List; Higgins is a semifinalist for the Butkus Award.


## IOWA'S DEFENSE...

- has allowed just two touchdowns in their last 20 quarters and four touchdowns over their last 28 quarters (seven games). - has given up 12 touchdowns in 11 games -- third fewest in the nation (Ohio State, Michigan).
- is giving up 4.00 yards per play -- the second-lowest figure in the nation (Ohio State).
- has given up one touchdown or less in nine of 11 games this season. The unit has allowed one touchdown or less in 18 of the last 24 contests and has held nine teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.
- posted its third shutout since the start of the 2022 season on Nov. 11 against Rutgers.
- allowed six points in the road win at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes shut out the Badgers in the first half and it marked just the fourth time in the last 20 years for Wisconsin to be shutout in the first half at home.
- has allowed two rushing touchdowns in 11 games, which is the fewest in the nation.
- has held two straight opponents under 100 yards passing (Northwestern 81, Rutgers 93). It was the first time this has happened in consecutive games since 1995.
- has held five of its last six opponents under 100 yards rushing, including Rutgers to a season-low 37 yards. Iowa has held six opponents under 100 yards this season.
- is third nationally in scoring defense, surrendering 12.4 points per game.
- fourth in team passing efficiency defense (98.36), sixth in red zone defense (.708), seventh in total defense (281.4), 10th in passing yards allowed (173.0), 16th in first down defense (182), 18th in rushing defense (108.4) and third down conversion percentage defense (.311).


## DYNAMIC DREW

Kicker Drew Stevens' sophomore season has made 17-of-23 field goal attempts this season. The 17 field goals are sec-ond-most in the Big Ten and tied for 17th nationally.

- In Week 10 against Northwestern, Stevens made a game-winning 53-yard field goal with 14 seconds remaining to give lowa a 10-7 win at Wrigley Field. He was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 6.
- In Week 5 against Michigan State, Stevens tied a career high with four field goals, including a make from 53 yards -- the second-longest of his career. The 53 -yarder is tied for the ninth-longest in program history. Stevens made three field goals in the win over Rutgers, his third career game with three or more makes. He has 10 games with two or more field goals in his career.
- He has made 33-of-41 field goal attempts ( 80.5 percent) in his career and is 38 -of-39 on PATs. He is 4-of-6 from 50-59 yards in his Hawkeye career.
- Stevens has two career game-winning field goals. He made a 21 -yarder with 28 seconds remaining in a road win at Minnesota in 2022 and a 53 -yarder in the road win over Northwestern on Nov. 4 at Wrigley Field.
- This season, Stevens has a team-high 69 points ( $17 \mathrm{FG}, 18$ PAT) to rank eighth in the Big Ten and he has had a touchback on 38 of his 49 kickoffs.
- As a freshman, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors during the 2022 season after making 16 -of 18 field goals -- the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding). In the offseason, Stevens added 20 pounds to his $6^{\prime} 1$ "frame.
-The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3 -for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from $50+$ in 2022. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an 889 field goal percentage and he was sixth in the Big Ten in field goals per game (1.23).
- Stevens is a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award for a second straight season $(2022,2023)$.

- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in lowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern in 2022. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza Stars of the Week honors on 0ct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57 -yarder in 2015.


## THE MOST FAMOUS PUNTER IN AMERICA

Punter Tory Taylor's senior season -- his fourth as the Hawkeyes' starting punter -- has 72 punts for a 48.2yard average through the first 12 weeks of the 2023 season with 31 punts of $50+$ yards (five punts of $60+$ ), 25 being fair caught and 27 being downed inside the 20, 11 inside the 10 and six inside the 5 . Taylor only has five touchbacks and opponents average just 6.2 yards per return.

- Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally with his 48.2 -yard average. He is a midseason firstteam All-American by the AP, ESPN, CBS, The Athletic and FOX and is a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.
- Taylor broke the lowa career record for most punts against Illinois in Week 12. He has 274 punts for 12,647 yards -- both lowa career records (passing Jason Baker).
-This season, Taylor has punted at least seven times in five games and six times in nine of 11 games. He has punted 10 times in a game twice in his career.
-The Australia native was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 9 after averaging 47.3 yards on six punts with two $50+$ punts ( 61 and 57 ) and two punts downed inside the 20 . He earned a second straight weekly honor after punting 10 times for a career-high 506 yards with five punts of $50+$ yards (two $60+$ ) and six being downed inside the 20 in the road win at Wisconsin.
- Taylor earned his third Big Ten honor after punting eight times for a 51.6 average with six 50 -yard punts in the 15-13 win over Illinois.
- Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on 0ct. 24 after punting nine times for 444 yards against Minnesota. Four punts went over 50 yards and four were downed inside the 20 . He was also named to the Ray's 8 for his efforts in Weeks 1, 2,4 and 5. In Week 4 at Penn State, Taylor punted seven times for 366 yards with a season-long punt of 62 yards. His 52.3 per punt average was a career best.
- Taylor has a 46.2 career average over 274 punts with 125 -- 45.6 percent -- landing inside the 20 -yard line. - Taylor set the school record for punt yardage in consecutive years. He had 80 punts for 3,688 yards in 2022 and 82 punts for 3,725 yards in 2023.
- Taylor has been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week six times in his career (2021 at lowa State, 2022 vs. South Dakota State, 2022 at Rutgers, 2023 vs. Purdue, 2023 at Wisconsin, 2023 vs. Illinois).
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15 . He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.


## EVANS - A SACK TOP 10'ER

Sixth-year DL Joe Evans, who began his career as a walk-on linebacker, moved into a tie for sixth place on lowa's career sacks list against Illinois. The Ames, lowa, native has 24 career sacks, which are tied with Bill Ennis-Inge.

- With 3.5 more sacks, Evans would move into the top five in program history (1. Jared Devries (43.0), 2. Mike Wells (33.0), 3. Matt Roth (30.0), t4. Larry Blue (26.5), t4. A.J. Epenesa (26.5).


## QB DEAC

Wisconsin transfer Deacon Hill took the reins of the lowa quarterback position when Cade McNamara departed with a lower body injury in the first quarter of the Week 5 game against Michigan State. Hill completed 11-of-27 passes for 115 yards and his first career touchdown -- a 13 yarder to Erick All.

- In his first six career starts, Hill has posted a 5-1 record. He is 86 -of- 173 for 882 yards with five touchdowns and five interceptions. Four of Hill's five touchdowns have gone to Hawkeye tight ends.
-The California native had his best game as a Hawkeye, completing a career-high 20-of-31 passes for 223 yards on Nov. 11 against Rutgers. He had a 10-yard touchdown pass to WR Kaleb Brown -- his fourth touchdown pass of the season and second in as many games. Against Illinois, Hill completed 19-of-29 attempts for 167 yards and one touchdown.
- Hill was recruited to Wisconsin by lowa senior special assistant to the head coach Jon Budmayr. As a prep, Hill threw for 3,102 yards and 33 touchdowns and ran for 461 yards and 13 touchdowns as a junior. He played in only three games during his COVID-shortened senior season.


## TIGHT END U!!

lowa's tight end room has accounted for 43.2 percent of the team's receptions in 2023 as five Hawkeyes have 57 receptions for 655 yards and five touchdowns.

- Graduate transfer Erick All has a team-high 21 catches for 299 yards and three touchdowns, while junior Luke Lachey has 10 catches for 131 yards. Lachey and All are both out for the season.


## HAWKEYES IN THE NFI

lowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 50 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 39 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

-TE Addison Ostrenga had a career-high eight receptions for 47 yards against Rutgers. He is third on the team with 19 catches for 116 yards and two touchdowns. -TE Steven Stilianos ( 5 catches, 54 yards), TE Zach Ortwerth ( 1 catch, 54 yards) and TE Johnny Pascuzzi ( 1 catch, 1 yard) are lowa's "next man up." Stilianos was an all-conference player at Lafayette before transferring to lowa in 2022. Ortwerth had a 54 -yard reception -- the first of his career against Rutgers -- which is the longest reception by a Hawkeye receiver this season.

## KING OF RETURNS

- lowa's kickoff return unit ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally, averaging 22.8 yards per return this season. Junior Kaden Wetjen, who has 233 yards on 10 returns, has a 23.3 return average.
- Junior Cooper DeJean had 241 punt return yards on 21 returns, averaging 11.5 yards per return, before going down with a season-ending injury. DeJean had a 70 -yard punt return for a touchdown against Michigan State to break a 16 -all tie in the fourth quarter. It was the 15th longest return in school history, the first of his career and the first by a Hawkeye since 2020. The Odebolt, lowa, native was leading the Big Ten and ranked 10th nationally with a 11.5 average and he was second nationally in punt return touchdowns. - DeJean returned a punt 54 yards for a potential game-winning touchdowns on Oct. 21 against Minnesota, but it was taken off the scoreboard following instant replay after officials deemed DeJean used an invalid fair catch signal.


## T.O. CENTRAL

- Iowa's defense forced multiple turnovers in three consecutive games in wins over Michigan State, Purdue and Wisconsin. For the season, the Hawkeyes are -3 in the turnover battle this season (15-12). lowa forced three turnovers in Weeks 1-3, eight from Weeks 5-7 and one in Weeks 8-12.
-The Hawkeyes forced a season-high four turnovers in Week 5 against Michigan State and followed with two more interceptions in Week 6 against Purdue. The four takeaways versus the Spartans were the most forced since 2021 against Penn State.
- Iowa picked off three Spartan passes on interceptions from Cooper DeJean, Sebastian Castro and Jermari Harris. They were the most turnovers by the unit since 2021 against Northwestern.
- DeJean and LB Jay Higgins both had interceptions against Purdue and the Hawkeyes forced a fumble and Castro had his third interception to seal the road win at Wisconsin. lowa also had a safety on a Yahya Black sack against the Badgers -- its second of the season.
- lowa has turned 12 turnovers into 36 points this season. The Hawkeyes have a 36-20 advantage in points off turnovers in 2023.
- Under head coach Kirk Ferentz, lowa is 121-25 when winning the turnover battle.


## SAFETY X 3

Iowa recorded its third safety of the season in the first quarter against Illinois when DL Joe Evans sacked Illini quarter John Paddock in the end zone to give the Hawkeyes a 2-0 lead. It is the first time since 2018 that lowa has had three safeties in a single season. - The team's second safety of the season came in the road win at Wisconsin when DB Sebastian Castro came on a blitz and DL Yahya Black's sack forced a fumble in the end zone (that was recovered by the Badgers).

- lowa's defense has scored 12 points in 2023 via one pick-six and the three safeties.


## TACKLING LINEBACKERS

- Senior LB Jay Higgins leads the Big Ten and is third nationally in tackles, averaging 12.1 tackles per game. The 12.1 tackles per game are the most by a Power 5 student-athlete. The Indianapolis native has two games with 16 or more tackles ( 16 vs. Utah State, 18 at Penn State) and eight games with $10+$ tackles. His 18 stops in Happy Valley were the most by a Hawkeye since Jack Campbell had 18 tackles against Colorado State in 2021 and they are tied for the eighth-most nationally in a game this season.
- Higgins has nine career games with 10 or more tackles and he has led the Hawkeyes in tackles in 10 of the 11 games in 2023.
- LB Nick Jackson has 87 tackles this season, including a season-high 13 stops at Penn State in Week 4. Jackson has two $10+$ tackle games as a Hawkeye and 22 such games in his career. The Virginia transfer, who has 441 career tackles, ranks eighth in the Big Ten in tackles (7.9 per game). Jackson was named the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2.


## BLOCK-R-US

-The Hawkeyes have blocked three kicks this season -- two punts, one field goal -- to rank seventh nationally. lowa's special teams' unit has six blocks since the start of the 2022 season and it has at least one block in each of the last three seasons.

- Senior DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the Cyclones' opening possession of the game in lowa's 20-13 road win in Ames. It was Lee's second career blocked kick. He also blocked a field goal attempt versus Minnesota in 2021. - Sophomore DL Anterio Thompson blocked a WMU punt in the third quarter -- his first career punt block -- that resulted in a safety. The block came in Thompson's first career game as a Hawkeye. Thompson had a second punt block in the road win at Northwestern to set up lowa's first touchdown.
-Thompson is one of 18 players nationally with two blocks this season. The two blocks are tied for second nationally.


## A CLEAN NOTE PAD

The Hawkeyes have two games this season where they did not commit a penalty -Week 2 at lowa State and Week 11 vs. Rutgers. lowa has played penalty free football three times in its last 12 games (at Minnesota, 2022).

- Since 1970, lowa has nine games where it hasn't committed a penalty.
- Iowa is fourth in the nation in fewest penalties (37) and fewest penalties per game (3.36) and fifth in fewest penalty yards (336) and fewest penalty yards per game (30.55).

## FRESHMEN TRACKER

Eight true freshmen -- DB John Nestor (7), TE Zach Ortwerth (5), RB Kamari Moulton (3), RB Terrell Washington, Jr. (3), WR Jarriett Buie (3), LB Nolan DeLong (1), DB Zach Lutmer (1) and OL Kade Pieper (1) -- have seen the field during the 2023 season.

## BALL HAWKS

- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 16 seasons and 21 of the last 23 seasons.
- DB Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six at lowa State in Week 2 extended the streak to 16 straight seasons, which is the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Utah (19). Iowa is one of four teams nationally to have a pick-six streak of 10 -plus years.
- lowa has nine interceptions and one defensive touchdown in 2023 to rank seventh in the Big Ten and 55th nationally. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four interceptions, two fumble returns) during the 2022 season.


## NICO'S SIXTH YEAR

Sixth-year senior Nico Ragaini returns as the veteran of lowa's wide receiver room. The Connecticut native has 149 career receptions for 1,567 yards with five touchdowns. - Ragaini's 149 career receptions are the seventh-most all-time and his 1,567 receiving yards rank 21st in the record books.

## IN THE SLOW COOKER

lowa's offensive line is more experienced in 2023 with upperclassmen starting in four of the five positions.

- lowa's returning offensive linemen have played in 285 games with 176 career starts amongst the group. Entering the season, lowa's offensive line played in 209 games, which were tied for the ninth-most in the nation and their 126 starts ranked 10th. - Transfer Rusty Feth is the most experienced lineman on the lowa roster, as he started 34 games and played in 38 contests at Miami (Ohio) prior to joining the Hawkeyes. Feth has started six games at left guard.
- OT Gennings Dunker -- a sophomore -- is the youngest starter on lowa's offensive line.


## EXPERIENCE ON DL

The Hawkeyes return two starters on the defensive line in 2023 in Joe Evans and Logan Lee. The duo started all 13 games for during the 2022 season and they have a combined 54 career starts.

- Evans tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks last season and he finished with 41 tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss. The Ames, lowa, has 39 tackles and team-bests in TFL (10) and sacks (5.5) in 2023, giving him 24 sacks for his career. Evans had a career-high seven tackles at Penn State and vs. Purdue and a career-best 4.5 TFL against the Boilermakers. - Lee, who has started 38 consecutive games - the third most by an interior defensive lineman nationally -- had career-highs in tackles (10), TFL (2.5) and sacks (2) in lowa's Homecoming win over Purdue in Week 6.
- DE Deontae Craig tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks and had 10 TFL in a reserve role in 2022. He also forced three fumbles and had 31 tackles a season ago. Craig has 48 tackles - the most by a Hawkeye DL -- two sacks and 4.0 TFL in 2023.


## GONE PORTALING

The Hawkeyes landed eight players from the transfer portal for the 2023 season, including five from Power 5 schools.

QB Cade McNamara (Michigan) - Passed for 2,576 yards and 15 touchdowns in leading the Wolverines to the 2021 Big Ten title . . . he missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.
TE Erick All (Michigan) - Honorable mention All-Big Ten in 2021... has 54 career receptions for 565 yards and two touchdowns. . . missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.
QB Deacon Hill (Wisconsin) -- Redshirted first year... appeared in one game in 2022.
WR Seth Anderson (Charleston Southern) - Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year and Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year finalist. . . second-team All-Big South. . . had 42 receptions for 612 yards and seven touchdowns... son of former NFL WR Flipper Anderson.
LB Nick Jackson (Virginia) - Three-time All-ACC linebacker. . . Butkus Watch Lists. . . posted three straight $100+$ tackle seasons . . . has 354 tackles, 20 TFL and 10.5 sacks. . . started 33 career games.
OL Rusty Feth (Miami (Ohio) - Started 34 career games for Redhawks, including 25 straight over last two seasons at center. . . earned second-team All-MAC honors in 2022.
OL Daijon Parker (Saginaw Valley State) - Appeared in 21 games the last two seasons.
WR Kaleb Brown (Ohio State) - Had one catch for five yards (coincidentally against lowa) as a true freshman. . . has the highest 247 Sports rating coming out of high school for a recruit in lowa history.

## WORLD CHAMPION; DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Freshman LB Ben Kueter is a world champion wrestler, winning the U20 World Wrestling Championship in July, 2022. The lowa City, lowa, native was named the USA Today Boys Wrestler of the Year for 2022-23 and he was one of five finalists for the high school Butkus Award.

- Kueter will be a dual-sport athlete for the Hawkeyes, as he will also compete on the lowa wrestling team.


## HALE BAY CHAMP

For a second straight year, sophomore OL Gennings Dunker prevailed as the Solon Beef Days hale bay champion. Dunker finished with a record toss of $14^{\prime} 6$ " 10 beat fellow Hawkeye OL Logan Jones. (Hay bales weigh approximately 60 pounds.)

## 2023 PLAYER COUNCIL

Fifteen players -- three sixth-year players, six seniors and six juniors -- are on the 2023 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The group consists of sixth-year student-athletes Joe Evans, Nico Ragaini and Noah Shannon, seniors Kyler Fisher, Jay Higgins, Logan Lee, Cade McNamara, Quinn Schulte and Tory Taylor and juniors Deontae Craig, Cooper DeJean, Jermari Harris, Luke Lachey and Mason Richman.

## HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- lowa has seven players on its 2023 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: DB Amare Bickham (Lloyd, 1993-95), LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), LB Jackson Filer (Rodney, 1993-96), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-02), QB Tommy Poholsky (Tom, 1986-89) and LS Liam Reardon (Bill, 1993-96).
- Epenesa's brother, A.J., played at lowa from 2017-19.
-WR Alex Eichmann's grandfather, Richard "Dick" Gibbs, played at lowa from 1965-66.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of lowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included lowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.
- Four Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- OL Griffin Liddle's father, Josh, wrestled at lowa, DL Andrew Kraus' father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at lowa and TE Jalyn Thompson's father, Rod, played basketball.


## KINNICK: SOLD OUT

All seven University of lowa home football games are sold out for the 2023 season. It is the second consecutive season that the Hawkeyes have sold out the stadium for the entire season.

## HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,305 games since beginning football in 1889 . Iowa's overall record is 693-573-39 (.544). That includes a 430-228-16 (.648) record in home games, a 263-345-23 (.433) record in games away from lowa City, a 359-391-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 314-193-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

## IN THE RANKINGS

- lowa was ranked 16th in the Week 12 College Football Playoff rankings, up from No. 22 in Week 11. The latest rankings will be released on Tuesday night.
- The Hawkeyes have a season-best national rankings in both polls, coming in at №. 19 in the Coaches' Poll and 20th in the Associated Press Poll. Iowa has been ranked or receiving votes in one of the polls each week of the season.
-The Hawkeyes were ranked N o. 25 in the preseason AP Poll for the fourth time in the last five years and the 10th time in the Kirk Ferentz era (27th time overall).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2022 season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches polls. lowa was 33rd in the Coaches' Poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP Poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, lowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

## TROPHY COLLECTION

- The Hawkeyes is 2-1 in trophy games in 2023, winning 20-13 in an lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at lowa State. Iowa has won seven of the last eight meetings against the Cyclones. The Hawkeyes won their second game with a 15-6 road win at Wisconsin, the first in Madison since 2015 before falling 12-10 at home against Minnesota. The loss snapped an eight-game winning streak in the series.
- lowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to lowa State in their first trophy game -- the team's first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed lowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
-The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- lowa is $30-10$ in its last 40 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 26-9 in their last 35 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

## BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 22 times in the last 23 seasons, including 2023. lowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than lowa. Iowa is 18-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

## HEAD CDACH KIRK FERENTZ



Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 25th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at lowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is lowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the

Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant
Coach of the Year award

- Ferentz is third all-time with 195 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten, trailing only Woody Hayes (205) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (Chicago). He has 121 Big Ten wins, which are the third-most all-time, trailing only Woody Hayes (153) and Bo Schembechler (143).
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 186-96 (.653) overall mark and a 117-71 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 195-117 (.619) and a 121-85 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 195 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 207-138 (.594), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz is in his eighth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Steve Ferentz is in his first season as a member of coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach).

## PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as lowa's defensive coordinator, lowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.41), first in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in total offense (323.56) and the unit leads the nation in interceptions (177).
- lowa's defense has allowed 400 yards or less in 25 straight games dating back to the 2021 season -- the longest active streak nationally.
- Iowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.
-The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- lowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- Iowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered was the fewest by an lowa defense since 1981.
-The defense had a 79 percent stop rate -- drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on downs -- to lead the country.
- lowa has 227 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- the second-most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. Iowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- Iowa has had five players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 22 of the last 23 seasons. lowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (195-117) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- lowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa ( $8-0,2002 ; 8-0,2015$ ) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). lowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history. - Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey 0'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 DoakWalker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa has six unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010, the third-most in the nation.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. lowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. lowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19. - lowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.


## IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 213 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach ( 85 draft picks/128 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- lowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (45 consecutive years). - Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history lowa has had two players selected in the first round.
- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2023. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
-Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
-TET.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019). - OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
-TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 204-of-245 (83 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 15 years, lowa has had 57 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (89), Michigan (72).
- lowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 13 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former lowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former lowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos. - Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2023 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (17) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 19 lowa tight ends since 1999 ( 12 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

No. 25 lowa (1-0) defeated Utah State (0-1), 24-14, in its season opener on Saturday inside Kinnick Stadium.

- lowa is now 100-33-2 in season opener, including 21-4 all-time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The win is Ferentz's 199th career victory and his 187 th win at lowa.


## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Cade McNamara completed 17-of-30 attempts ( 56.6 percent) for 191 yards and two touchdowns in his lowa debut (17th career start).
- McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass on his first career attempt as a Hawkeye. He is the first lowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against lowa State).
- TE Luke Lachey tied a career-high with seven receptions for 73 yards, including a 31-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- lowa's tight ends (Lachey and Erick All) combined for 10 catches for 88 yards and one touchdown.
- RB Kaleb Johnson led lowa's rushing attack with 63 yards on 19 attempts, including a 3-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It is Johnson's seventh career rushing touchdown.
- Johnson also had a career-long 54-yard kickoff return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
-WR Seth Anderson had a 36-yard touchdown reception and TE Erick All had a 3-yard touchdown reception - both players' first career receptions at lowa.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career high 16 tackles, including 12 solo stops. It was his second career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Xavier Nwankpa had his second career interception in the second quarter.

Nwankpa has two interceptions in two career starts.

## MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawaii (Matt Rodgers-to-Danan Hughes). It is the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that lowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- lowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and it is the first time the unit had two first-quarter touchdowns in the opening quarter since Nevada (9/17/22).
- DL Deontae Craig, DL Yahya Black and DB Deshaun Lee made their first career starts. QB Cade McNamara, TE Erick All and LB Nick Jackson made their first career starts as Hawkeyes.

## IIWA NOTEF

- The win is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 200th career victory and his 188th at lowa. He is the 27th head coach to reach the 200-win milestone at an FBS institution. - lowa has won six straight games over lowa State in Ames and seven of the last eight meetings overall. The Hawkeyes are now 47-23 all-time against lowa State. - Iowa now leads the lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-2, through the first three matchups during the 2023-24 season.
- In three out of the last four meetings, the outcome has been decided by one score.


## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Jaziun Patterson had a career-best 86 rushing yards on 10 attempts, including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown run of his career.
- Patterson had a career-long 59-yard run on third-and-1 on lowa's opening possession. The 59-yard rush is the second-longest rush dating back to the 2022 season.
-TE Luke Lachey had three receptions for a team-high 58 yards and TE Erick All had three catches for 32 yards. In two games, the tight end duo has 16 receptions for 178 yards and one touchdown.
- CASH Sebastian Castro had a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown to give lowa a 17-0 lead. It was Castro's first career interception and his second career defensive touchdown (fumble return at Rutgers).
- DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession of the game. It is the second blocked kick of Lee's career (vs. Minnesota). lowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the last three seasons.
- DB Cooper DeJean had 10 tackles, including six solo stops. It is the third time in his career he has had 10 or more tackles.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts. It is the sixth time in Stevens' career he has made two or more field goals. The North Carolina native is 3 -for- 3 on field goal attempts this season.
- Stevens is $19-0 \mathrm{f}-21$ in field goal attempts for his Hawkeye career.


## MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa extended its pick 6 streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years) with Sebastian Castro's 30 -yard pick 6 in the second quarter. The streak is the second longest nationally.
- lowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes allowed one touchdown (and two field goals) in its season-opening 24-14 triumph over Utah State on Sept. 2 in Kinnick Stadium. Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is now 65-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
-The Hawkeyes scored on their opening possession in back-to-back games (TD vs. Utah State, FG vs. Iowa State).
- lowa had an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive on its second possession - it's longest scoring drive of the season.
- lowa didn't commit a penalty in the game (and there were only two penalties in the game). It is the second time in the last five games that the Hawkeyes didn't commit a penalty (at Minnesota, 2022).

## ITWA NDTP

- It is the 11th time in head coach Kirk Ferentz's lowa tenure that the team has started the season with a 3-0 record (2023, 2021, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2015, 2009, 2008, 2006, 2003, 2001). The Hawkeyes went 3-1 in nonconference play in 2008 and 4-0 in both 2003 and 2006.


## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Leshon Williams recorded his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 145 yards on 12 attempts. Williams also had a 25 -yard touchdown reception in the second quarter - his first career receiving touchdown (and third TD overall). He finished the game with 172 all-purpose yards.
- Williams had a career-long 53-yard run in the second quarter to set up lowa's first touchdown. It is lowa's second rush of $50+$ yards this season. (The Hawkeyes had two $50+$ yard runs in 13 games in 2022.)
- Williams' 25 -yard reception was a career long.
-WR Diante Vines had a 3-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter. It was Vines' first career touchdown.
- True freshman RB Kamari Moulton had two touchdowns - one from 3-yards out and a second from 1-yard out -- in his first collegiate game. Moulton rushed for 50 yards on eight attempts.
- The last Hawkeye freshman to have two rushing touchdowns was Kaleb Johnson vs. Nevada in 2022.
- Moulton is the first Hawkeye with two or more touchdowns in his collegiate debut since Jewell Hampton in the 2008 season opener against Maine.
- RB Max White scored his first collegiate touchdown, scoring from 2 yards out in the fourth quarter.
- QB Cade McNamara completed 9-of-19 attempts for 103 yards and two touchdowns, tying a season high. McNamara has four touchdowns (to three interceptions) this season.
- DT Anterio Thompson blocked a WMU punt in the third quarter - his first career punt block
- that resulted in a safety. It was Thompson's first career game as a Hawkeye.
- It is the first safety of the season and the first for the program since recording two safeties against South Dakota State in the 2022 season opener.
- Iowa has blocked two kicks this season (one punt, one field goal) and the defense/special teams have scored eight points.
- LB Jay Higgins and LB Nick Jackson combined for 18 total tackles.
- Higgins forced a fumble - the first of his career -- in the third quarter and DL Jeremiah

Pittman recovered, giving lowa possession at the WMU 17. It was Pittman's first career fumble recovery.

- Jackson tied for the team high with nine tackles and had a forced fumble.
- RB Jaziun Patterson made his first career start.
- WR Jarriett Buie, RB Kamari Moulton, RB Terrell Washington, Jr., LB Nolan DeLong, DB John Nestor and DB Zach Lutmer became the first Hawkeye freshmen to appear in a game this season.


## MISCELLANEOUS

- The Hawkeyes rushed for 254 yards - a season high - and the most by the offense since 2019 vs. Middle Tennessee State (358 yards).
- lowa scored a season-high 41 points - the most for the program since 2021 at Maryland (51 points).
- lowa's defense surrendered just 35 yards and allowed one first down in the second half. WMU had 239 yards of total offense - the fewest allowed by the Hawkeye defense this season.
- Iowa converted a 2-point conversion (from Cade McNamara to Erick All) in the third quarter to make the score 24-10. It is lowa's first 2-point conversion since 2020 against Wisconsin.

- QB Deacon Hill completed 11-of-27 passes for 115 yards and one touchdown after entering the game in the first quarter following McNamara's injury. The second-quarter touchdown pass was the first of his career.
-TE Erick All had a 13 -yard touchdown reception in the second quarter. During the drive, All had 62 yards on three catches $(32,17,13)$ for his second touchdown of the season. He finished the game with four catches for 67 yards.
- LB Jay Higgins finished with 12 tackles, his third game with 10 or more tackles this season.

## ITWA NDTP

-With the victory (and Nebraska, Minnesota and Wisconsin losses), lowa clinches a share of the Big Ten West Division title.

- It is the third Big Ten West Division title in program history $(2015,2021,2023)$.
- The win is lowa's eighth victory of the season. It is the 15th time the Hawkeyes have reached the eight-win mark under Ferentz. lowa has won eight or more games in eight of the last nine years (the team was 6-2 during COVID year in 2020).
- The victory is the 194th of head coach Kirk Ferentz's career, moving him into a tie with Michigan's Bo Schembechler for third place in career wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Iowa improves to 4-0 all-time against Rutgers.


## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Deacon Hill completed 20-of-31 attempts for a career-high 223 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.
- Had a career-long 54-yard completion to TE Zach Ortwerth in the third quarter. It was Ortwerth's first career reception.
- Hill had a 10-yard touchdown pass to Kaleb Brown in the fourth quarter - his fourth TD pass of the season.
- The 223 yards are the most passing yards for the team this season.
- The 20 completions and attempts were both career-highs for Hill.
-TE Addison Ostrenga had a career high eight receptions for a career-best 47 yards.
- lowa's tight ends accounted for 101 of the team's 223 receiving yards.
-WR Kaleb Brown had a career-high three receptions for 27 yards, including his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter ( 10 yarder). Brown also had two rushes for 20 yards.
- RB Leshon Williams rushed for 63 yards on 13 attempts and RB Jaziun Patterson had 14 attempts for 53 yards, including his second touchdown of the season (and career) -- a 4 -yard score in the fourth quarter.
- RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for 54 yards on 10 carries - he had the longest rush of the day for 27 yards.
- DB Quinn Schulte had a interception in the fourth quarter and returned it 39 yards to the Iowa 9. It Schulte's first interception of the season and third of his career.
- K Drew Stevens went 3-for-4 in field goal attempts, connecting from 32, 43 and 24 yards.
- Stevens is 17-of-22 in field goal attempts this season and leads lowa with 69 points.
- It is Stevens' third career game with three or more field goals.


## MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa's defense shut out Rutgers - its first shutout of the season and the first since last season's Music City Bowl against Kentucky.
- It is the team's first shutout in Big Ten play since 2019 (Northwestern)
- It is the 16th shutout of the Ferentz era.
- The Rutgers offense didn't cross the 50-yard line.
- lowa's run defense limited Rutgers to 34 yards, 150 yards below its season average of 184.7.
- Rutgers' Kyle Monangai - the Big Ten's leading rusher - was limited to 39 yards on 13 attempts.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Rutgers to 127 yards, its 24th consecutive game allowing 400 or fewer yards. It is the longest active streak nationally.
- The 127 yards are the fewest allowed in a Big Ten game since 2019 ( 125 vs. Rutgers).
- They are the fewest yards allowed since giving up 120 against South Dakota State in 2022. - lowa didn't commit a penalty for the second time this season (at lowa State). The Hawkeyes have three such games in its last 11 contests and nine such games since 1970. - lowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in eight of the first 10 games of 2023 and 17 of the last 23 games.
- lowa has allowed 14 or fewer points in 16 of its last 23 games.
- lowa's defense has allowed just one touchdown in the last four games.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is $70-2$ when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- lowa's offense put up 200+ yards passing and 100+ yards rushing for the first time since Northwestern in 2022 (220 passing/173 rushing).
- lowa's offense eclipsed 400 yards for the first time in the last 32 games

- With the victory, the Hawkeyes have clinched the outright Big Ten West Division title for the third time under head coach Kirk Ferentz $(2015,2021,2023)$.
- The Hawkeyes have won nine games 10 times under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The victory is the 195th of Ferentz's career, moving him past Michigan's Bo Schembechler for third place in career wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference.


## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Deacon Hill completed 19-of-29 attempts for 167 yards and one touchdown - a 4 -yarder in the second quarter.
- Hill has thrown a touchdown pass in three straight games and has five TD passes this season.
- Hill also had a career-long 12-yard rush for a first down in the second quarter.
- RB Leshon Williams had 16 carries for 54 yards to lead the team.
- Williams has led the team in rushing six times in 2023.
- RB Kaleb Johnson had the go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter (30 yards) - his third touchdown of the season and ninth of his career.
-TE Addison Ostrenga had a 4-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter - his second career touchdown.
-WR Kaleb Brown posted career-highs in catches (7) and receiving yards (71) and had the longest reception of his career (31).
