Offensively, Iowa just needs Alex Padilla to keep playing clean like he has since being inserted in at quarterback. Defensively, Iowa just needs to stop the run and force Illinois into becoming one-dimensional, and the Hawkeyes should be fine as far as winning this game is concerned.

John Patchett - Iowa 20-10:

The Hawkeyes have won six in a row over Illinois and eight straight at Kinnick Stadium.

Saturday is "Senior Day" for the Iowa Football Team - 16 seniors will be honored in the traditional pre-game ceremony. What's different this year is that, under the special COVID rules, any or all of those 16 players can come back and play again next year. What actually happens, of course, remains to be seen. Nevertheless, former players I've talked with said it is always an emotional day for them and their families — which can cut a bit both ways but on the whole I think is a positive for the home team.

Then you have, statistically, two of the worst offenses in the B1G (and the FBS for that matter). The Illini have had some success rushing the ball but almost none in the passing game. Iowa has been inconsistent at best — but seems to have something going with Alex Padilla under the center. So I'm giving the Hawkeyes a very slight edge here.

Illinois has a defense that can create issues for opponents, but statistically Iowa's defense is much stronger across the board. And the Hawkeyes have an especially large advantage when it comes to interceptions and turnovers. Iowa's turnover voodoo doll reemerged last week vs. Minnesota so look for that to be a factor in this game.

The Hawkeyes also appear to have an advantage on special teams, especially on kick and punt returns. That equates to better starting field position for your offense - as has often been the case this season.

The weather is actually supposed to be pretty decent in Iowa City - with temps in the low 50s and slight winds. So that shouldn't be a major factor either way.

Illinois will also be playing this game without its Head Coach Bret Bielema who is out with COVID. On the other hand, the Illini still have a shot at a bowl-eligible season but to achieve that they must win this game (then defeat Northwestern next week). Illinois is also coming off its bye week - which might be a slight plus in its favor.

Iowa still has a shot at the B1G West Title and a chance to play in the conference championship game — for that to happen the Hawkeyes must win this game and beat Nebraska on Black Friday. And even that won't be enough unless Wisconsin gets upset in one of its two last regular season contests (Nebraska Saturday and at Minnesota next week).

Given all of this, I'm sticking with the Hawkeyes again this Saturday but would feel much better about my pick if Iowa had even just an "average" offense. If you like low-scoring, likely ugly, college football games, then this one should be right up your alley.
