But with Kyler Schott back along the OL, I expect both Tyler Goodson and Ivory Kelly-Martin to have big afternoons for the Hawkeyes to help them move to 3-0.

John Patchett - Iowa 45-17:

lowa (2-0, 1-0) has won eight straight games. Iowa has won 13 straight non-conference games. The Hawkeyes are 23-4 in their last 27 trophy games (including bowl games) and 20-4 in their last 24 rivalry trophy games. Iowa now comes into this contest ranked #5 (AP) and #7 (Coaches). Kent State (1-1) is not ranked. One more stat: over its last eight games — Iowa's point differential is a whopping +169. Those are all overwhelming trends in Iowa's favor. Oh, yeah - and the game will be played on Slater Field at Kinnick Stadium in front of a slew of raucous fans. The Hawks are 2-0 all-time vs. the Golden Flashes — and KSU 80-7 in those two games. Shall I continue? Oh, why not. In its eight straight wins the Hawkeyes have scored at least 25 points — the first time in school history that's happened.

lowa's Defense has been terrific through its first two games this season — and has already racked up six interceptions which ranks second in the nation (70 total since 2017 which is the most in major college football). Sitting at #1 in that category is Kent

State with eight picks in its two games. Iowa's Offense has done enough to win the first two games — but it's the Defense that has made those victory margins what they are. Kent State's Offense is waaay up-tempo and has put up some big numbers. But it hasn't faced a defense of Iowa's calibre so far this year. While KSU's secondary are ball hawks, the Golden Flashes Defense has struggled to stop the run. Look for the Hawkeyes to get their running game rolling, which in turn is likely to lead to some key pass completions. And Special Teams remain crucial game-changers for Iowa.

Given all of that, the obvious pick in this B1G-MAC matchup is lowa - and somewhat comfortably one would think. The Hawkeyes should notch their 300th Kinnick Stadium victory (since it opened in 1929). Iowa improves to 3-0, 1-1 — and at worst retains its Top-10 rankings. No letdown for the Hawkeyes in this one.

Don't feel too badly for the Golden Flashes though - they will pocket \$1.85 million lowa Athletics dollars for making the trip to lowa City.
