John Patchett – Iowa 23-10:

Iowa's Offense continues to be the focal point when it comes to discussing shortcomings in the Hawkeyes Football Program - and for good reason. It's - once again - lurking near the bottom of the FBS stats rankings (like it was last season) with no real sign that it's capable of clawing its way out of that abyss. I'm not saying it's impossible to do so - nor is it necessarily incapable of doing so. I am skeptical the offensive scheme (Kirk Ferentz) and/or the play-calling (Brian Ferentz) will actually allow that "transformation" to occur.

There has been a lot of media focus this week on the fact that there is an overwhelming tight end bias in the play-calling — with Iowa's wide receivers a mere passing afterthought. Targeting of WRs is literally last in the nation. Iowa may (rightfully) claim to be "Tight End U" but it cannot afford to blatantly ignore its wideouts. No wonder most of the their opponents claim it's easy to know what offensive plays the Hawkeyes will run and when. As long as that remains the case expect the offense to continue its struggles.

Also not good - Iowa is minus-four on the season in turnovers — that's not only uncharacteristic, based on recent history, but it's REALLY, REALLY bad. That needs to get turned around fast (beginning Saturday), as the Hawkeyes look ahead to the rest of the Big Ten Season.

The other two-thirds of the team - defense and special teams - remain its core strength. (Despite the fact that the defense has allowed a few too many long drives this season something Phil Parker addressed this week.) These two phases are the reason lowa has 3 wins so far - and they were not the significant contributors to its debacle last Saturday night at Penn State.

Meantime, in East Lansing, Michigan State is FUBAR. No head coach now that Mel Tucker has been officially fired — and under current rules facing a scenario where <u>every single</u> <u>player</u> with eligibility remaining has <u>the right</u> to enter the transfer portal. The Spartans may be 2-2 but they lost their last two games by a combined score of 72-16. The Iowa game may be one of their last realistic chances for a win the rest of the entire season given their schedule.

But even the *HWO* (*Hawkeyes Woeful Offense*) can't screw this up. Right? However, once again, they won't hit the magic number of "25" — UNLESS they rediscover how to effectively incorporate wide receivers into their game plan.
