Hawkeyes – Huskers Prognostications



The Hawkeyes Mic picks are in for the Iowa – Nebraska "Heroes Trophy" B1G West Contest on Black Friday — it's almost (but not quite) this week for Game 12 of the 2023 Season.

The Game: Iowa (9-2, 6-2) travels to Nebraska (5-6, 3-5) at Memorial Stadium on Black Friday - 11:09 AM kickoff on CBS | Hawkeye Radio Network with the Heroes Trophy at stake. The Hawkeyes clinched the B1G West Title last Saturday on Senior Day, defeating Illinois 15-13 at Kinnick Stadium - and will face the winner of Saturday's Michigan - Ohio State Game on December 2 in Indianapolis. Nebraska, under first-year Head Coach Matt Rhule has struggled again this season, losing last Saturday at Wisconsin 24-17 in overtime. The Huskers Defense is very good but like the rest of the Big Ten West they struggle on Offense. Iowa's Offense averages kist 18.5 points per game - the Huskers 18.7. This is Nebraska's Senior Day and it needs to win this game just to become bowl-eligible. Iowa trails the alltime series 30-20-3 but the Hawkeyes have been victorious in 7 of the last 8 and 8 of the last 10 games. Last season lowa was upset by Nebraska 24-7 in Iowa City. The last 5 games have been decided by a touchdown or less. The Hawkeyes have won the last 5 games played in Lincoln. (See the Team Stats Comparisons on the last page.)

Expect another close game this week - like the last five these two teams have played. Iowa is looking to add to its season resume while the Huskers are desperately trying to get to a bowl game. The Hawkeyes are also looking to reclaim the Heroes Trophy and would like to go into the Big Ten Championship Game on a three-game win streak.

Both of these Defenses are legit - among the best in the B1G and FBS — slight edge to lowa here. Their respective Offenses are mediocre at best and struggle to put points on the board. Iowa's Special Teams have been terrific all season - especially the punting - and the Hawkeyes should also have the edge in this phase. Turnovers will be crucial - especially for Iowa playing on the road in sold-out Memorial Stadium - and a big play or two for either team could mean the difference (neither of the defenses surrender many of those). Building an early lead will likely be an indicator of which team can snag the win.

I think - as in last Saturday's victory over Illinois - the Hawkeyes will do just enough to pull out their 10th win of the season — although I won't be shocked either if Nebraska manages to get the victory — just don't expect a lot of points. The Heroes Trophy returns to Iowa City to hang out with the B1G West Championship, Cy-Hawk, and Heartland Trophies.
