#### **Brendan Stiles - Iowa 23-13:**

In what is the biggest game at Kinnick Stadium in 36 years, I believe this game will be a back-and-forth slugfest that goes down to the wire before the Hawkeyes ultimately pull away with the win. This game comes down to three things for me - which team gets better QB play, which team does better on 3rd down, and how each team fares in the red zone. I lean toward Iowa because I believe the Hawkeyes will be able to force turnovers and take advantage of short fields to work with, but, make no mistake, this is easily the toughest game to date and might be the toughest game this season.

#### John Patchett - Iowa 24-17:

Here's how I got there for what is certainly one of the biggest games played in Iowa City in years if not decades - and one of the biggest games in the Big Ten this season. The Hawkeyes will score two offensive TDs, one FG, and one defensive TD (or at least seven points off a turnover). That would be enough to snag the B1G win over the fourth-ranked Nittany Lions and might be slightly more points than many are expecting to see on Slater Field this Saturday. PSU has twice as many TDs this season via the pass (12) as it does by rushing (6) — and I think the Nitts will probably be able to get two more passing TDs in this game given their skill players.

Iowa's Defense is only surrendering 11.6 points per game — slightly less than Penn State's 12.0. Iowa's Offense is now averaging 33.2 ppg (thanks in significant part to the 51 points the Hawks put up last week at Maryland) — compared to PSU's 30.0. Both teams are getting very good play out of their special teams, including excellent punters. One marked difference in the two

teams season stats: Iowa has scored 68 points off opponents' turnovers compared to the Nittany Lion's 17. You have to think turnovers (or lack thereof) will be HUGE in this game — and ultimately the difference.

Kinnick Stadium is going to be nut-so Saturday afternoon - and that's a big plus for Iowa, too. I think this game will live up to the hype and be another thriller in what has become a very compelling series between these two programs. The #3/3 Hawkeyes win their 12th straight game, and improve to 6-0, 3-0, heading into their Big Ten Homecoming Game next Saturday at Kinnick Stadium vs. Purdue.
