Hawkeyes – Volunteers Prognostications



The Hawkeyes Mic picks are in for the Iowa — Tennessee Citrus Bowl Game on New Year's Day — it's almost unanimous for the 2023-24 Season Finale — for the record it's a bit hard to predict given the "missing" players (especially for Tennessee).

The Game: #17 Iowa (10-3, 7-3) faces off against #21 Tennessee (8-4, 4-4) for the 2024 Citrus Bowl Game at Camping World Stadium in Orlando on New Year's Day-Monday, January 1, 2024 - kickoff at 12:06 CT on ABC | Hawkeye Radio Network. The Hawkeyes won the 2023 B1G West Championship but was dominated by Michigan in the conference title game on December 2nd in Indianapolis. Iowa averages 16.6 points per game and surrenders 13.2 — Tennessee averages 31.5 points per game and gives up 22.0 and is slightly favored in this contest. Iowa trails the all-time series 2-1 — the Volunteers won the last game in the series, defeating the the Hawkeyes 45-28 in the Gator Bowl in Jacksonville on January 1, 2015.

It's difficult to project how many bowl games will play out because of the transfer portal and players opting out of the bowl game to get ready for the NFL draft. This is definitely true with this contest. Season-starter Tennessee QB Joe Milton III and 1,000 yard rusher Jaylen Wright opting out. The odds makers have Tennessee as the favorite in this match up, but lowa's defense is as good as they come. Not only do the Hawkeyes have playmakers, but the dominos have already started to fall into place for some positivity within the lowa program. All-American LB Jay Higgins announcing he'll return in 2024 and LB Nick Jackson also earned an NCAA waiver approval to return next year if he would so choose. The matchup will hinge on how true freshman Nico Iamaleava, a five-star recruit who will make his first career start in Milton's absence, manages against Iowa's top tier defense (Talk about an introduction to college football.) My gut still leans to Tennessee's balanced two-way game, but it'll be much closer than the spread suggests.
