There are plenty of question marks surrounding the matchup between Iowa and Utah State on Saturday, headlined by Cade McNamara's uncertain status. But it's the Aggies who have more unknowns to juggle, having lost their leading rusher, leading receiver and five of their six leading tacklers from last season, in addition to welcoming over 60 new players to their roster this year.

With so much still up in the air on both sides, it's tough to confidently predict what will happen once the ball is kicked. Given the uncertain circumstances, I will default to what figures to be a safe pick – a low-scoring Iowa win. Look for two stalwarts from last season – Kaleb Johnson and Luke Lachey – to carry the load offensively, while Iowa's defense shuts down an inexperienced Utah State offense.
