

Iowa Football — Offense Trends + Notes — 2021-2023

Trends:

The Hawkeyes are now 68-8 when rushing for 100 yards or more in a game over the past 8 seasons - and 11-24 when failing to do that (179 net rush yards vs. Rutgers). The Hawkeyes are also 50-5 when scoring 20 or more points in a game since the start of the 2017 Season - and just 9-20 when scoring less than 20 points (22 points vs. Rutgers).

Points:

The season total increases to 173 points and the average increased to 17.3 points per game — the team has failed to reach or surpass the 25 point mark 8 times in its 10 games (Iowa 22 - Rutgers 0). The 2023 “Drive to 25” (not that it really matters anymore) came up short again in Game 10 by 3 points (22).

The Hawkeyes Points Differential increased by 22 to +312 over the last 43 games.

Notes:

In the 10th game of the 2023 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 2 touchdowns (1 pass + 1 rush) — season total is now 17 Offensive Touchdowns and the average has increased to 1.7 Offensive Touchdowns per game.

In the 13 games of the 2022-23 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 19 touchdowns, averaging 1.46 Offensive Touchdowns per game. In the last 8 games of the 2021-22 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 11 touchdowns, averaging 1.38 Offensive Touchdowns per game. That is an average of 1.43 Offensive touchdowns per game over those 21 games. Including the 10 games so far in the 2023 Season, Iowa’s Offense has scored a total of 47 touchdowns, and the average over those 31 games is 1.52 touchdowns per game.
