

Iowa Football — Offense Trends + Notes — 2021-2023

Trends:

The Hawkeyes are now 70-8 when rushing for 100 yards or more in a game over the past 8 seasons - and 11-24 when failing to do that (163 net rush yards vs. Illinois). The Hawkeyes are also 50-5 when scoring 20 or more points in a game since the start of the 2017 Season - and just 10-21 when scoring less than 20 points (13 points vs. Nebraska).

Points:

The season total increases to 201 points and the average decreased to 16.75 points per game — the team has failed to reach or surpass the 25 point mark 10 times in its 12 games (Iowa 13 - Nebraska 10). The 2023 “Drive to 25” (not that it matters anymore) came up short again in Game 12 by 12 points (13).

The Hawkeyes Points Differential increased by 3 to +317 over the last 45 games.

Notes:

In the 12th game of the 2023 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 1 touchdown (0 pass + 1 rush) — season total is now 20 Offensive Touchdowns and the average has decreased to 1.67 Offensive Touchdowns per game.

In the 13 games of the 2022-23 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 19 touchdowns, averaging 1.46 Offensive Touchdowns per game. In the last 8 games of the 2021-22 Season, Iowa’s Offense scored 11 touchdowns, averaging 1.38 Offensive Touchdowns per game. That is an average of 1.43 Offensive touchdowns per game over those 21 games. Including the 12 games so far in the 2023 Season, Iowa’s Offense has scored a total of 50 touchdowns, and the average over those 33 games is only 1.5 touchdowns per game.
