IOWA NOTES

- The Hawkeyes' seven points are the fewest for a Big Ten team in a win since Iowa's 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- LB Jack Campbell had a team high 12 tackles (4 solo, 8 assists). It is his sixth career game with 10 or more tackles, which are tied for the most on the team. Campbell now has 189 career tackles.
- Iowa finished with four sacks in the game. DE Joe Evans tied a career high with two sacks and DT Logan Lee had a career-best 1.5 sacks.
- DB Cooper DeJean finished with a career high four tackles in his first career start; DB Quinn Schulte had a career-high four pass breakups in his first career start.
- RB Leshun Williams had career-highs in carries (24) and yards (72).
- WR Arland Bruce VI had five catches for a career-high 68 yards. Bruce had a team-high 96 all-purpose yards.
- P Tory Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12 yard lines. Taylor had a career-high 10 punts for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per punt. Seven of his 10 punts were downed inside the 20-yard line and three went 50 or more yards.
- K Aaron Blom connected on 1-of-2 field goal attempts (good from 46, miss from 40) for his first career points.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's defense scored four points on two safeties – Jack Campbell had a 1-yard tackle for loss on Isaiah Davis in the third quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for the game's final points on a safety in the fourth quarter.
- The Hawkeyes have three safeties in their last two regular season games -- (Lukas Van Ness sack on an intentional grounding at Nebraska, 11/26/21).
- Iowa's defense allowed 120 total yards, which are the fewest in a season-opening game since 2004 (110 vs. Kent State). The 120 yards are the fewest surrendered by the Hawkeye defense since 2018 against Maryland (115 yards).
- Iowa is the first Big Ten team to win a game without scoring a touchdown since Nebraska in 2018 (beat Michigan State, 9-6). The Hawkeyes' last such win? The 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.
- Iowa had seven first-time starters in the game: Offense: Logan Jones (OL), Beau Stephens (OL), Alec Wick (WR), Leshun Williams (RB); Defense: Cooper DeJean (DB), Joe Evans (DL), Quinn Schulte (DB).
- Five true freshmen saw the first action of their careers. They include: T.J. Hall (DB), Kaleb Johnson (RB), Xavier Nwankpa (DB), Addison Ostrenga (TE) and Drew Stevens (K).
- Iowa is 99-33-2 in season-opening games, including an 20-4 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa won the toss and elected to receive. The Hawkeyes have played 289 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 215 times (137-78). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 74 times (42-32).

IOWA NOTES

- The Hawkeyes attempted a game-tying field goal as time expired, but the kick hooked left, giving Iowa State its first win in the series since 2015. Iowa had won six straight in the series; Iowa State's last three wins over the Hawkeyes have all come by a field goal.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- DE Lukas Van Ness blocked two Iowa State punts, tying a school record. It is the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat. Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.
- Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside Iowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- His first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' first touchdown. It was Iowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving Iowa possession at the Iowa State 20. The possession ended with an Iowa turnover at the goal line.
- RB Leshon Williams had a 9-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for his first career touchdown. Williams led the Hawkeye rushing attack with 34 yards on 14 attempts.
- DB Cooper DeJean had his first career interception in the second quarter. The interception occurred in the end zone and was downed for a touchback. DeJean had a career high 11 tackles (six solo), one interception and two pass break-ups.
- DB Terry Roberts had his first interception of the season (second of his career) on Iowa State's opening drive of the second half.
- LB Seth Benson finished with 10 tackles – second most on the team. It was his seventh career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Quinn Schulte (9), DT Logan Lee (8) and DB Terry Roberts (6) each tallied career highs in tackles. DB Riley Moss tied a career high with nine tackles. LB Jack Campbell also had nine tackles, moving his career total to 198.
- TE Sam LaPorta's 2-yard catch in the second quarter was the 100th of his career. He had a career-high eight receptions for 55 yards.
- WR Alec Wick had his first career reception for 14 yards on the game's final drive.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa scored on its first offensive possession, going 16 yards on two plays following the first blocked punt. It was the first game since last season against Minnesota (10 plays, 39 yards, FG) that the Hawkeyes scored on their first possession of the game.
- Iowa's defense forced three turnovers – two interceptions, one forced fumble.
- The defense notched its first turnover of the season in the second quarter with a forced fumble at its own goal line. DB Kaevon Merriweather had his first career forced fumble, jarring the ball loose from ISU RB Jirehl Brock. LB Logan Klemp recovered in the end zone for the touchback.
- Iowa had interceptions on consecutive possessions in the second and third quarter. Cooper DeJean had an interception in the end zone with 57 seconds left in the first half. Terry Roberts intercepted Dekkers at midfield on the first possession of the second half.
- Iowa State had three possessions in the red zone (0, 4, 12) in the first half, but came away with just a field goal. The Hawkeye defense did not allow a touchdown in the first seven quarters of the season.
- Freshman Aaron Graves became the sixth Hawkeye freshman to see action this season. He joins a list that includes: T.J. Hall (DB), Kaleb Johnson (RB), Xavier Nwankpa (DB), Addison Ostrenga (TE) and Drew Stevens (K).
- Iowa won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 290 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 215 times (137-78). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 75 times (42-33).

The game started at 6:40 p.m. (CT) on Saturday and ended at 1:39 a.m. Sunday. There were three weather delays lasting 236 minutes in the contest that spanned 6:59 minutes from start to finish.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Kaleb Johnson tallied his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 103 yards and two touchdowns on seven attempts for a 14.7 yard average. He scored his first career touchdown from 40 yards out on his first carry of the game and he had a 55-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- Johnson is the first Hawkeye freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019.
- QB Spencer Petras completed 14-of-26 attempts for a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown. Petras moved into 12th place on the Iowa career passing yards list with 3,850 yards.
- WR Arland Bruce IV caught a 21-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter for his second career receiving touchdown (fifth TD overall). Bruce IV had a team-high three catches for 50 yards.
- WR Nico Ragaini and WR Keagan Johnson made their season debuts after missing the first two games because of injury. Ragaini had two catches for 56 yards, including a 46-yarder in the third quarter. Johnson had one catch for seven yards and was targeted five times.
- RB Jaziun Patterson became the seventh true freshman to see action this season. He rushed six times for 20 yards.
- DB Cooper DeJean intercepted a pass in the first quarter for his second interception in as many games and second of his career. DeJean also had two tackles and two pass breakups.
- LB Jack Campbell had a game high 10 tackles. It is his second game this season and seventh career contest with 10 or more tackles. Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in the game; he now has 208 tackles, which puts him in 68th in program history. He moved past the likes of Leroy Smith, Ben Niemann and Ed Miles.
- DL Lukas Van Ness had a career-high eight tackles and DL John Waggoner had a career-high six tackles. Van Ness also had 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks, giving him nine career sacks.
- DL Aaron Graves had his first career sack in the third quarter. Graves finished with a career-high four tackles and 1.5 TFL in the game.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first two attempts of his career. He made a 43-yard field goal on his first attempt in the second quarter and connected on a 32-yarder in the third quarter.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Saturday's game included three weather delays -- 80-minutes (8:36 p.m. to 9:56 p.m.), 110 minutes (10:05 p.m. to 11:55 p.m.) and 46 minutes (11:57 p.m. to 12:43 a.m.) -- for a total of 3:56.
- It is the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium tory. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Iowa's last game that included a weather delay came on Sept. 14, 2019, at Iowa State. There was a 2:55 delay at Jack Trice Stadium in Ames, Iowa.
- Iowa had a season-high 337 yards of total offense, rushing for a season-high 162 yards on 35 attempts, averaging 4.6 yards per carry. Seven different receivers caught a pass in the game and the passing attack had a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown.
- Iowa's defense posted its first shutout since 2019 -- a 20-0 win at Northwestern (10/26/19). It was the Hawkeyes' first shutout in Kinnick Stadium since defeating Rutgers, 30-0, on Sept. 7, 2019.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Nevada to 151 yards of total offense. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 336.3 yards.
- Iowa has limited two of its first three opponents to 151 yards or less. (South Dakota State, 120 yards; Nevada, 151 yards). It is the first time since 1986 that the Hawkeye defense has held two of the first three opponents to 160 yards or fewer (125 at Iowa State; 159 vs. NIU; 150 at UTEP).
- Iowa improves to 14-7 all-time in night games at Kinnick Stadium.

- The Hawkeyes have won eight of their last 11 Big Ten openers. Iowa is now 3-0 all-time against Rutgers.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- DB Cooper DeJean intercepted a pass for a third straight game and returned it 45 yards for his first career touchdown. The 45-yard touchdown return is the 30th longest in school history and it is the 50th pick six in school history.
- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 15 seasons and 20 of the last 22.
- The last Hawkeye to have an interception in three straight games was Jermari Harris in 2021 (at Nebraska, vs. Michigan, vs. Kentucky).

- TE Sam LaPorta had a career long 42-yard reception on Iowa's final drive of the first half. He finished with a team-high four catches for 77 yards.
- K Drew Stevens converted a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter and a career-long 51 yarder in the fourth quarter. The 51-yarder is tied for the 11th longest in school history. Stevens is now 4-for-4 on field goal attempts this season.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Iowa's defense has allowed 23 points in the first four games of the season, the fewest points allowed in the last 66 years. The Hawkeyes gave up 20 points in the first four games in 1956.
- Iowa's defense scored two touchdowns against Rutgers via a Cooper DeJean pick six in the first quarter and a Kaevon Merriweather scoop and score in the second quarter. It is the first time since the 2021 season opener against Indiana that Iowa's defense has scored two touchdowns in the same game (Riley Moss, two INTs for TDs).
- With the two defensive touchdowns, the Hawkeye defense has now scored 16 points this season via two touchdowns and two safeties.
- Iowa didn't commit a turnover for a second straight game. The Hawkeyes were +3 in the turnover battle, converting the Rutgers miscues into 14 points. For the season, the Hawkeyes are +2 in turnover margin and they have a 21-10 advantage in points off turnovers.
- The Hawkeyes have two games with multiple interceptions and have all five picks have come in the last three games.
- Iowa led 7-3 at the end of the first quarters. Rutgers field goal was the first points allowed in the first quarter this season by the Iowa defense. The Hawkeyes are outscoring their opponents, 31-3, in the opening quarter and 12-0 in the third quarter.

IOWA NOTES

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for a team-high 93 yards on 14 attempts, averaging 7.2 yards per carry. It is the second time Johnson has led the team in rushing this season.
- QB Spencer Petras completed 21-of-30 passes for 220 yards and one touchdown – his third of the season. The 220 yards are his second-most this season.
- Petras also had a 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter – his first of the season and ninth of his career.
- TE Sam LaPorta had a team-high five receptions for 53 yards, moving him past the 1,500-yard mark into the top 20 in program history in career receiving yards. He has 136 receptions for 1,516 yards.
- TE Luke Lachey had a 6-yard touchdown reception late in the second quarter. It was his second career touchdown catch.
- WR Arland Bruce IV had a career-high 27 rushing yards, including a 23-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It was a career-long rush and his fourth career rushing touchdown.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career-high 11 tackles, including six solo stops (also a career-high). Higgins is the fourth player this season to have 10 or more tackles (Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Cooper DeJean). The four players have nine 10+ tackle games.
- LB Jack Campbell finished with 11 tackles, his fifth game with 10+ tackles this season (10th of his career). He has had eight or more tackles in all eight games. He is now 31st in program history with 259 career tackles.
- DB Kaevon Merriweather had his second interception of the season (third of his career) on the final play of the first half. It was Iowa's eighth interception this season.
- K Drew Stevens made a career-high four field goals, connecting from 29, 24, 54 and 25 yards. The 54-yarder is tied for the seventh-longest in program history and is the longest by a Hawkeye since 2015 (Marshall Koehn, 57 yards).
- Stevens is 11-of-12 on field goal attempts this season, the most field goals by a true freshman kicker since Mike Meyer in 2010 (14 FG).

MISCELLANEOUS

- The Hawkeyes scored a season-high 33 points and finished with a season-high 398 yards of total offense. Iowa had a season-high 178 rushing yards and 220 passing yards – second-most this season.
 - The 398 yards of total offense are the most since gaining 428 yards at Maryland (W, 51-14) in 2021.
- Iowa scored on its opening drive for the third time this season, going 63 yards over nine plays to start the game. K Drew Stevens connected on a 29-yard field goal, giving Iowa a 3-0 lead.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their first four possessions to start the game (FG, TD, FG, TD). It is the first time since the game at Maryland during the 2021 season that Iowa has scored on four straight possessions. (Iowa scored on nine straight possessions in College Park.)
 - Iowa drove 85 yards on 15 plays before Stevens made a 24-yard field goal to make the score 13-0. The 15-play drive was the longest of the season, while the 85 yards were second-most.
- Iowa did not commit a turnover for the fourth game this season. The Hawkeyes are 3-1 when they don't commit a turnover.
- The Hawkeyes limited Northwestern to 177 yards of total offense. Iowa's defense has held three opponents under 200 yards this season.
- Iowa's defense allowed 13 points. The Hawkeyes have allowed 13 or fewer points in six games.
- Iowa registered a season-high seven sacks (by Lukas Van Ness, Deontae Craig, Ethan Hurkett, Logan Lee, Noah Shannon, Seth Benson and Joe Evans.)
 - The seven sacks are the most against a Big Ten team since tallying seven sacks against Northwestern in 2000. Iowa also had seven sacks last season against Kent State.
- The Hawkeyes finished with 10 tackles for loss – its second game with 10+ TFL (11 vs. Nevada). Craig led the team with 2.0 TFL.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Kaleb Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown – his fourth of the season. The yardage and attempts were both career highs.
 - The 200 rushing yards are the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl).
 - It was Iowa's first 200-yard game since Akrum Wadley (26-204) at Northwestern in 2015.
 - Johnson is the first Hawkeye freshman since Coker in 2010 to have two 100-yard rushing games (129 vs. Indiana; 219 vs. Missouri).
 - Johnson had a career-long 75-yard touchdown run on the second play of the second half. It is Iowa's longest rush since Tyler Goodson's 80-yard touchdown run against Wisconsin in 2020.
- QB Spencer Petras completed 13-of-23 passes for 192 yards and a season-high two touchdowns. It was his sixth career game with two or more touchdown passes.
- TE Sam LaPorta had a 16-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter – his first TD reception of the season and fifth of his career – to give the Hawkeyes a 7-0 lead. LaPorta had 71 yards receiving (on three receptions) during Iowa's nine-play, 91-yard scoring drive.
- WR Nico Ragaini had a 29-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter to give Iowa a 14-0 lead. It was his first touchdown of the season and fifth receiving touchdown of his career. He finished with three receptions for 56 yards.
- DB Kaevon Merriweather had his third interception of the season (and second in as many games) in the second quarter. It was Merriweather's fourth career pick. He also had four tackles in the game.
- LB Seth Benson had his first interception of the season (second of his career) in the second quarter.
- K Drew Stevens was 1-for-2 on field goal attempts with a make from 26 yards. He is 12-of-14 this season with the 12 makes being the most by a Hawkeye freshman since Mike Meyer in 2010 (14).
- P Tory Taylor had a career-long 70-yard punt in the fourth quarter. Taylor had eight punts for 414 yards (51.8 avg.) in the game. Three punts were downed inside the 20 and five went 50+ yards.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's 91-yard (nine-play) scoring drive spanning the first and second quarters was a season long.
- Iowa had a season-high 184 rushing yards – the most since the regular season finale at Nebraska in 2021.
- The Hawkeyes had their ninth and 10th interceptions of the season in the second quarter. Iowa turned the turnovers into 10 points, giving them a 41-27 advantage in points off turnovers this season.
 - It is Iowa's third game this season with two interceptions in 2022.
- Iowa's defense held Purdue to season lows in points (3) and total yards (255), 189.6 below its season average (444.6).
 - The Boilermakers finished 2-of-16 on third down.
 - The Hawkeyes held Purdue QB Aidan O'Connell to a season-low 168 yards passing (20-of-43). He completed 46.5 percent of his attempts – a season low and it was the first time he didn't hit the 50 percent mark this season.
- The Hawkeyes have held seven of their nine opponents to 13 or fewer points, five at 10 or fewer points and three at three or fewer points.

- The Hawkeyes earned their sixth win of the season to become bowl eligible for the 21st time in the last 22 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa's victory is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 114th career Big Ten victory. Ferentz is one victory shy of tying Amos Alonzo Stagg (115) for third place on the league's all-time conference wins list.
- The Hawkeyes have won 13 straight games in November dating back to the 2019 season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Kaleb Johnson had a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter to give Iowa a 7-3 lead. It was Johnson's second straight game with a touchdown run and team-leading fifth of the season.
 - o Johnson had a team-high 57 rushing yards. It is the fourth game this season he has led the team in rushing.
 - QB Spencer Petras had a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter – his second rushing touchdown of the season and 10th of his career. Petras finished 14-of-23 for 94 yards through the air.
 - TE Sam LaPorta had a team-high five catches for 48 yards. LaPorta has had at least one reception in 13 straight games and in 22 of his last 23 contests. He has been Iowa's top receiver in nine of 10 games this season.
 - DB Cooper DeJean had a 32-yard pick six in the second quarter, giving Iowa a 14-3 lead. It was DeJean's fourth interception of the season and second touchdown (45-yard INT at Rutgers).
 - o DeJean also had 10 tackles, his second career game with double-digit tackles.
 - DeJean had a career-long 41-yard punt return in the third quarter that set up the team's third touchdown. DeJean had a career-high four returns for 82 yards in the game.
 - o He had a team-best 114 all-purpose yards in the game.
 - DB Riley Moss had his first interception of the season, corralling a Kaevon Merriweather pass breakup on Wisconsin's first drive of the second half.
 - It is Moss' 11th career interception, 11th-most in school history.
 - Campbell finished with 11 tackles, his sixth 10+ tackle game this season and 11th of his career.
 - Campbell now has 100 tackles this season, moving over the century mark for a second straight season. He is the first Hawkeye since Josey Jewell to have 100 or more tackles in consecutive season (Jewell had three straight from 2015-17).
 - o Campbell moved into 20th place on Iowa's all-time tackles list with 277.
 - DL Deonte Craig blocked a Wisconsin punt in the second quarter – his first career block – and LB Jay Higgins returned it 3 yards to the UW 17 to set up Iowa's first touchdown. It was the team's third block of the season.
 - o Craig tied a career-high with five tackles and had a career-high 1.5 sacks.
 - DL Joe Evans had sack and forced fumble in the fourth quarter. It is his second forced fumble (at Ohio State) of the season.
 - o Evans has had at least one sack in Iowa's last four games. He has six sacks, which are second-most on the team.
 - K Drew Stevens made a 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter – his fifth make from 40 or more yards this season. Stevens is 13-of-15 in field goal attempts this season – the most makes by a freshman since Mike Meyer's 14 in 2010.
 - Freshman Koen Entringer made his season debut. He is the eighth true freshman to play this season.

- Iowa scored its fourth defensive touchdown in the second quarter, courtesy of DB Cooper DeJean's 32-yard pick six. The Hawkeyes have scored 28 points via four touchdowns and two safeties.
 - o Iowa entered the game fourth nationally with three defensive touchdowns.
 - Iowa had two interceptions (Cooper DeJean/Riley Moss) for the second straight game and for the third time this season. The Hawkeyes have 12 interceptions this season and have four games with two picks.

- The Hawkeyes have won eight straight over the Gophers and 18 of the last 22 meetings. Six of the last eight games have been decided by a touchdown or less.
- Today's win is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 115th career Big Ten Conference victory, tying him with Amos Alonzo Stagg for the third-most in conference history. Ferentz only trails Michigan's Bo Schembechler (143) and Ohio State's Woody Hayes (153).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- LB Jack Campbell had a fourth-quarter interception following a DB Riley Moss pass break-up and he returned it 30 yards to the Minnesota 45 to set up Iowa's game-winning field goal.
 - The pick is Campbell's second interception of the season and fifth of his career.
- Campbell had his third career forced fumble, jarring the ball loose from Mohamed Ibrahim in the fourth quarter with the Gophers driving in the red zone. DL Deontae Craig recovered at the Iowa 9 for his first career fumble recovery.
- Campbell finished with 10 tackles – his seventh 10+ tackle game this season and 12th of his career.
 - Campbell is now 20th in school history with 287 career tackles.
- QB Spencer Petras had a 1-yard touchdown in the first quarter. It is his second straight game with a touchdown, his third of the season and 12th of his career.
 - Petras finished 15-of-24 for 221 yards, completing 63 percent of his attempts. The 221 yards are his second-most this season (246 vs. Michigan).
- TE Sam LaPorta had a career-long 58-yard reception on Iowa's first offensive play of the game. LaPorta finished the game with four catches for 95 yards before leaving the game with an injury in the first half.
- TE Luke Lachey had a career-high five receptions to finish with 77 yards. His 33-yard reception in the fourth quarter was the second-longest of his career.
 - Iowa's tight ends – LaPorta (4-95), Lachey (5-77) and Addison Ostrenga (1-6) – combined for 10 catches for 178 yards.
- RB Kaleb Johnson had a team-high 43 yards on eight attempts to pass Tyler Goodson for Iowa's freshman rushing record with 653 yards. It is the fifth game this season he has led the team in rushing.
- K Drew Stevens made a 38-yard field goal in the first quarter and the go-ahead 21-yard field goal with 31 seconds remaining. Stevens is 15-of-17 in field goal attempts this season. His 15 field goals are the most by a Hawkeye freshman in program history, moving past Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding.
- Redshirt freshman FB Eli Miller made his Hawkeye debut in the game.

MISCELLANEOUS

- The temperature at kickoff was 17 degrees at Huntington Bank Stadium, which is the second coldest temperature in stadium history.
- Iowa forced two or more turnovers for the third straight game. The defense has forced two or more turnovers in seven games this season. Iowa has scored 51 points off 20 opponent turnovers.
- The Hawkeyes limited Minnesota to 87 passing yards. It is the third time this season an opponent's passing attack hasn't reached 100 yards (South Dakota State, Nevada).
- Iowa has held eight opponents to 10 or fewer points and nine opponents to 13 points or less.
 - It is the first time since 1929 that the defense has allowed 10 or fewer points in eight games. The 1929 team gave up 28 points the entire eight-game season.
- The Hawkeyes have held 10 of their 11 opponents below their season scoring average and all 11 opponents under their season total offense average.

- Iowa limited Nebraska to 51 rushing yards in the game. It was the eighth time this season the team has allowed fewer than 100 yards on the ground.
- The Hawkeyes committed four turnovers, which led to 17 Husker points – tied for the most this season.
