THE LEAD

No. 7 Iowa State (1-0, 0-0 Big 12) will play host to No. 18 Iowa (1-0, 1-0 Big Ten) in the annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. It marks the first time in the series (this is the 68th meeting) that both teams are ranked at kickoff. This weekend's game, along with ISU's home-opener vs. UNI, is a sellout. ISU is riding a six-game homefield winning streak, tying for the fourth-best string in school history. ISU is 9-9 vs. ranked opponents since 2017, the ninth-most nationally in that span.

KEY STORYLINES

- Iowa State won its season-opener vs. UNI last weekend, 16-10. It was the sixth-straight victory at Jack Trice Stadium, one shy from the school record.
- The ISU defense continued to be stingy, holding UNI to 275 yards of offense while pitching a shutout in the second half for the third time in its last six games.
- In its last six games dating back to 2020, ISU has given up just 16 points in the second half, averaging 2.6 points after intermission.
- During this six-game stretch, ISU opponents are averaging just 13.3 points and 306.5 yards of total offense overall.
- All-American Breece Hall tallied a rushing TD vs. UNI, increasing his school-record and nation-leading streak to 13 consecutive games with a rush TD. The Big 12 record is 15 by Corby Smith (MU, 1998).
- For the second-straight time in the series, ESPN College GameDay will be in Ames to showcase the annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series.

- Owns best career winning pct. in ISU history at .563 (modern era; since 1928).
- Led ISU to a first-place finish in the final regular-season league standings (2020, 8-1) for the first time in school history.
- Only coach in school history to defeat every league team in his career.
- Set school record for conference wins (8-1) and tied school record for overall wins (9-3) in 2020.
- Owns 34.6 pct. of ISU's all-time wins over ranked opponents. Campbell has nine wins vs. rated foes at Iowa State.
- Led ISU to first-ever New Year's Six Bowl win over Oregon in Fiesta Bowl.
- Only coach in school history with four-straight winning seasons (2017-20).
- Owns four of ISU's five winning conference seasons in Big 12 history.
- His 26 wins vs. Big 12 teams is No. 2 all-time in ISU history for victories vs. league opponents.

MIDAMERICAN ENERGY FIELD AT JACK TRICE STADIUM/STARK PERFORMANCE CENTER



MIDAMERICAN ENERGY FIELD AT JACK TRICE STADIUM

MidAmerican Energy Field at Jack Trice Stadium has proven to be one of the most outstanding football structures in the country in its 47-year existence. With its remarkable sight lines and numerous renovations throughout the years to enhance the game day atmosphere, the stadium ranks as one of the nation's best football venues.

The 61,500-seat stadium is the third-largest in the Big 12 Conference. Construction on the stadium started on Oct. 26, 1973 with the first game in the facility played on Sept. 20, 1975. It was officially dedicated as Jack Trice Stadium in 1997 in honor of Jack Trice, Iowa State's first African-American student-athlete who died tragically from injuries in a football game in 1923. Iowa State is the nation's only FBS school to have a stadium name dedicated to an African-American.



WHO WAS JACK TRICE?

Jack Trice was born in Hiram, Ohio, in 1902. Trice attended East Tech High School in Cleveland, where he was a star athlete. When his football coach, Sam Willaman, was named head coach at Iowa State, Trice and six other athletes followed him west, as Trice became the first African-American student-athlete in Iowa State history. Trice majored in animal husbandry and his goal was to settle in the South after his graduation and help the black farmers of that area. He was a very studious young man and despite his participation in intercollegiate athletics, Trice managed to pass 45 college credits with a 90 percent average. Because there were no athletic

scholarships granted in those days, he worked odd jobs to finance his education and support his wife and mother.

On the gridiron, Trice was a stellar performer in the interior line in 1923. His promising career abruptly ended, however. Trice played in the season-opener, a 14-6 win over Simpson in Ames. He traveled to Minneapolis the following weekend to face a strong Gopher squad. It was during intermission that Trice began to complain of a sore left shoulder, but nevertheless, returned to action in the second half. Midway through the third quarter, a frustrated Minnesota team ran a play off left tackle. Trice immediately saw that he wouldn't be able to reach the ball carrier, so he threw himself in front of the Minnesota interference in a roll block. He was toppled over on his back and trampled on.

Trice wanted to continue playing but never returned to the game. Doctors at a Minneapolis hospital allowed Trice to return to Ames with the team, which lost the game 20-17. They declared his condition not so serious. Trice rode back on a pullman coach. He rested his body on a straw mattress and was immediately taken to the university hospital upon his arrival in Ames. There, doctors discovered a broken collarbone Trice had sustained during the first half of the contest. His condition worsened as he developed respiratory problems Sunday afternoon, and a stomach specialist from Des Moines was summoned. Dr. Oliver Fay decided that surgery would be too risky, so no operation was performed.

At 3 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 8, 1923, Jack Trice died of hemorrhaged lungs and internal bleeding throughout the abdomen. The following Tuesday, classes were postponed and a funeral service was held before 4,000 students and faculty members on the central grounds of campus.

A letter written by Jack Trice to himself on the eve of the Minnesota game was found in his coat pocket the day of his funeral. The contents of that letter were divulged before the 4,000 mourners. It read:

"My thoughts just before the first real college game of my life: The honor of my race, family and self is at stake. Everyone is expecting me to do big things. I will. My whole body and soul are to be thrown recklessly about the field. Every time the ball is snapped, I will be trying to do more than my part. Fight low, with your eyes open and toward the play. Watch out for crossbucks and reverse end runs. Be on your toes every minute if you expect to make good. Jack."

A memorial scholarship was created, and a memorial to Trice is located on the east concourse of the football stadium as you enter the Jack Trice Club. A statue in his honor was unveiled in 1987 and currently resides on central campus.

Iowa State unveiled its new stadium in 1975 and it was originally named Cyclone Stadium. Gradually, the Trice story started to become more prevalent.

A strong push from students and alumni to dedicate the stadium in honor of Trice gained traction in the early 1980s. Iowa State President Dr. Robert Parks announced the facility name would change to Cyclone Stadium at Jack Trice Field prior to the 1984 season.

A groundswell of support for Trice continued, however. Supporters felt Trice's name should be the primary focus of the stadium. Finally, in 1997, President Dr. Martin Jischke officially dedicated Iowa State's football venue as Jack Trice Stadium.

STARK PERFORMANCE CENTER/BERGSTROM FB COMPLEX

The visual landscape surrounding Jack Trice Stadium was amplified with the addition of the Stark Performance Center, a \$90 million project connecting the existing Bergstrom Football Complex debuting in 2021. This massive upgrade created multiple spaces for use by all student-athletes, as well as the addition of the Albaugh Family Plaza north of Jack Trice Stadium for all Cyclones to enjoy.

New or upgraded amenities include: football locker room, football player's lounge, nutrition center, sports medicine center, football offices, student-athlete life skills center, student-athlete academic center and student-athlete dining hall.

IOWA CORN CY-HAWK SERIES

- Iowa won 15-straight games in the series from 1983-1997. The Cyclones ended the streak in 1998 and the series is slightly in favor of Iowa (12-10) since. Iowa has won five-straight games in the series.
- Iowa State's last win in the series was in 2014 when Cole Netten kicked the game-winning FG with 0:02 seconds left for a 20-17 Cyclone win in Iowa City.
- Iowa State assistant director of player personnel Colby Kratch is the son of former Iowa OL Bob Kratch, who was a two-time All-Big Ten selection (1986 and 1988) and an eight-year NFL veteran.
- Iowa PK Caleb Shudak's father, Jeff, was an All-Big Eight PK for Iowa State from 1987-90.
- Iowa State freshman QB Ashton Cook is the son of former Iowa All-American tight end Marv Cook, was a two-time Pro-Bowler in a seven-year NFL career.

seventh time in his career. He finished the game with 199 yards.

- RB Breece Hall rushed for 69 yards and tallied a rushing TD, the 13th-straight game he's tallied a TD by rush. That streak is the nation's best and second all-time in Big 12 history.
- WR Xavier Hutchinson grabbed seven catches for 88 yards as Purdy's top target.

ISU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Iowa State is 9-9 vs. ranked opponents since 2017 and finished 3-2 vs. ranked opponents in 2020, tying the school record for wins over ranked teams in a season.
- ISU head coach Matt Campbell is 11-17 vs. ranked opponents in his head coaching career, including a 9-13 mark with the Cyclones.

- A Cyclone player was represented on 16 of the major award watch lists in the preseason.
- Six Cyclones (Breece Hall, Mike Rose, Charlie Kolar, Colin Newell, Greg Eisworth II and Will McDonald IV) were named to various preseason All-America teams.
- The Walter Camp Award, given annually to the nation's best player, had four Cyclones on its watch list (Mike Rose, Brock Purdy, Breece Hall, Charlie Kolar), the most nationally.

CAMPBELL IS ISU'S GREATEST COACH

- Head coach Matt Campbell, a three-time winner of Big 12 Coach of the Year (2017, 2018, 2020), has turned Iowa State into a winner in his tenure with the Cyclones.
- Campbell has a 36-28 overall record for a .563 winning percentage, the best winning percentage by a Cyclone coach in the modern era (1928-present).
- Campbell began his ISU career with a 1-8 mark and is 35-20 since.
- Campbell is the only coach in school history to defeat every team in the league during their tenure and is 26-13 in regular-season conference games in the last 39 games.
- Campbell's 26 league victories ranks No. 2 in school history among Cyclone coaches.
- Campbell is 13-8 coaching the Cyclones as a ranked team. The 21 games coached as a ranked team is the most in school history.

- First coach in school history to defeat Oklahoma and Texas in the same season.
- Led the Cyclones to a first-place finish in the regular-season Big 12 standings in 2020 at 8-1. It marks the first time in school history ISU ended the conference regular-season in sole possession of first place.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Cyclone defense has improved dramatically since 2017.
- For the fourth-straight season in 2020, ISU ranked among the Big 12's top-three in scoring defense (2nd at 21.4).
- ISU was also second in the league in total defense in 2020 at 340.4 (No. 21 in NCAA).
- The Cyclones have limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 16 times since 2017, including 10 vs. Big 12 teams.
- Since 2017, ISU has tallied six or more sacks in a game five times.
- In the second half of its last six games, ISU has given up just 16 points, holding all five opponents to under 10 points and averaging 2.6 points after intermission in that stretch.
- ISU opponent second-half scoring in the last six games: Kansas State- 0, Texas- 7, West Virginia- 6, Oklahoma- 3, Oregon- 0, UNI- 0.
- ISU has allowed just one second-half touchdown in its last six games.
- In its last six games overall, the Cyclones are allowing 13.3 points and just 306.5 yards of total offense.
- ISU held UNI in its season-opener to 275 yards of total offense and 10 points, ranking in the top-35 nationally in both total defense.
- UNI never got inside the red zone and crossed mid-field just three times.
- Will McDonald IV registered a sack to give him 18.5 in his career, tying for second in school history.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Iowa State's offense returns 16 players who have a combined 230 career starts.
- Seven players are back who earned first- or second-team All-Big 12 recognition in their respective careers, including 2020 first-teamers Xavier Hutchinson (WR), Brock Purdy (QB), Breece Hall (RB), Charlie Kolar (TE) and Colin Newell (OL).
- Kolar and Hall were 2020 All-Americans, with Hall becoming ISU's first-ever unanimous All-American after leading the nation in rushing (1,527).
- Kolar, who is a two-time All-American, joins Hall and Newell as preseason All-Americans by Walter Camp.
- Kolar sat out the UNI game with a lower body injury.
- Purdy is in his fourth season as ISU's starting QB, owning 25 school records and becoming the first Cyclone signal-caller to earn first-team all-conference recognition since 1981 a year ago.

JUST THE FACTS ON BROCK PURDY

- Brock Purdy is the winningest QB in Iowa State history, owning a 24-11 record as the Cyclone signal-caller.
- Purdy is 23-11 as ISU's starting QB. In 2018 vs. Oklahoma State, Purdy didn't start the game, but handled all snaps in the victory except for the first series (3 snaps).
- He has a 19-7 mark vs. Big 12 teams and is the only QB in ISU history to own a win over every team in the league.
- Is 12-1 as the starting QB vs. Big 12 teams in Jack Trice Stadium.

- A two-time All-Big 12 selection, earning second-team honors in 2019 and first-team accolades in 2020. Is the first Cyclone QB to earn first-team all-conference honors since John Quinn in 1981 (Big Eight).
- Member of the Maxwell and Walter Camp Award preseason watch lists.
- Currently owns/shares 25 school records (game, season, career).

KOLAR IS A TWO-TIME ALL-AMERICAN

- Senior tight end Charlie Kolar made history in 2020 by becoming the fourth two-time All-American in ISU history.
- Also a two-time Academic All-American (2019, 2020), graduating with a 3.99 GPA in mechanical engineering.
- Was one of three finalists for the 2020 Mackey Award and is a preseason All-American by Walter Camp.
- First two-time AP All-American (2019, 2020) Cyclone since Troy Davis (1995, 1996).

- Preseason first-team All-American by Walter Camp, Sporting News, The Athletic and USA Today Sports.
- Has the most career receptions (106), career receiving yards (1,425) and career touchdowns (17) by a tight end in school history.
- Sat out the UNI game with a lower body injury.
- His 17 career TD catches ranks fourth in school history overall and is the most by an active FBS tight end.

- Since Breece Hall took over as ISU's primary ball-carrier in the sixth game of the 2019 season, he has been one of the nation's most productive running back.
- First-team All-American by FWAA/AP/ Walter Camp/AFCA/Sporting News/ESPN/ The Athletic/CBSSports to become the first unanimous first-team All-American in school history in 2020.
- The 2020 Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, the first Cyclone since Troy Davis (1996) to receive the honor.
- One of three finalists for the Doak Walker Award (Najee Harris, Alabama; Travis Etienne, Clemson) in 2020, finishing runner-up in the balloting.

SMELLING LIKE A ROSE

- Junior Mike Rose is one of the nation's top linebackers, earning preseason All-America honors from Walter Camp, Sporting News, The Athletic, AP, and USA Today.
- Rose was named All-Big 12 first team and Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year in 2020, the first Cyclone to win the award since 2011 (A.J. Klein).
- First-team All-American by The Athletic and second-team All-American by the AP/Sporting News in 2020.

PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT SINCE 2017

- Iowa State has registered four-straight winning seasons and four-straight bowl berths for the first time in school history (modern era, 1928-present).
- Iowa State finished above .500 in conference play in four-straight seasons for the first time in the modern era (1928-present). ISU has just five winning seasons in league play in the Big 12 era (2000, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020).
- Iowa State finished third or better in the Big 12 Conference in the last three seasons, marking the sixth time ISU placed third or better in conference play in the last 61 years (1959, 1977, 1978, 2018, 2019, 2020).

- Since 2017, ISU has been defeated by over 14 points just twice (Notre Dame in 2019, Louisiana in 2020).
- In 8 of ISU's 19 losses since 2017, the Cyclones have led or were tied in the 4th quarter.

- ISU has played in 25 one-score games since 2017.

- Jack Trice, who was Iowa State's first Black student-athlete, died tragically from injuries suffered in his second football game in 1923.
- The patch design is similar to the jersey Trice wore during his time at Iowa State.

A VETERAN TEAM

- Iowa State has seven players who took advantage of the COVID-19 blanket eligibility rule and returned for another

senior season as a "super senior" in Sean Foster (OL), Chase Allen (TE), Connor Assalley (PK), Jake Hummel (LB), Corey Dunn (P), Greg Eisworth II (DB) and Enyi Uwazurike (DL).

- Of the seven "super seniors" all but Hummel are in their sixth season in college.
