STORYLINES

- ➔ Chuck Martin begins his sixth year as head coach of the football program. In his last 22 conference games he is 16-6, best in the MAC.
- ➔ Miami last beat a team from the Big Ten in 2003 - a 44-14 win over Northwestern.
- ➔ The RedHawks return 12 starters from last season's 6-6 (6-2 MAC) squad.

NEED TO KNOW

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (690), MAC Championships (15) and bowl wins (7).

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 17 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 96-46.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

RECAPPING THE 2018 SEASON

- Miami opened the year 0-3 with losses to Marshall, Cincinnati and Minnesota, ranking last in the country at 10.3 points per game and had gone two straight games without scoring a touchdown.
- Miami closed the season going 6-3 overall, including a 6-2 conference record as its offense began to find its form.
- In its final nine games the RedHawks averaged 34.0 points, 402.6 yards and 186.7 rushing yards per game.
- Two of Miami's losses during that nine-game stretch included one-point defeats. Miami missed a 50-yard field goal as time expired in a 40-39 loss to Western Michigan. The RedHawks fell 31-30 at Army in double overtime as the RedHawks two-point conversion fell just short on the last play of the game.
- Following the Army loss, Miami rallied to win its final three games including a pair of victories over bowl teams in Ohio (30-28) and NIU (13-7). Miami finished the regular season with a dominating 42-21 win over Ball State.

ABOUT IOWA

Iowa is coming off of a 9-4 season, including a 27-22 Outback Bowl win over Mississippi State. Quarterback Nate Stanley returns after throwing for 2,852 yards and 26 touchdowns. Iowa's top running back, Mekhi Sargent, also returns after rushing for a team-high 786 yards and nine touchdowns in 2018.

The Miami University football team impressed on offense, outgaining the 17th-ranked Iowa Hawkeyes with 424 yards in a 45-21 loss back in the season opener in 2016.

The RedHawks held possession for over 36 minutes and gained 25 first downs, but the Hawkeyes scored three touchdowns off of Miami turnovers and converted on all six red zone opportunities.

Quarterback Billy Bahl was strong in his 2016 debut, going 19-of-29 with 266 yards and a pair of touchdown passes to sophomore wide receiver James Gardner. Both Gardner and senior wide receiver Rokeem Williams pulled in six catches, with Williams racking up 113 yards. Five Miami rushers combined to post 158 yards on the ground, led by Maurice Thomas with 60 yards on nine carries.

SERIES VS. IOWA

Iowa leads the all-time series 4-0, including a 45-21 victory back in 2016.

OFFENSIVE SWITCH

The Miami offense hit a rough patch in three straight non-conference games to open the season, but exploded on offense the final nine contests.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Miami scored 30-plus points in eight of its last nine games last season, scoring 306 points in that span. The last time Miami scored anything close to that was back in 2005 when the RedHawks posted 320 points in a nine-game span. Miami's seven-game scoring streak of at least 30 points had not occurred since Ben Roethlisberger was the quarterback in 2003.

PRESEASON POLL

Miami was picked to finish second in the MAC East 2019 Media Preseason Poll. Ohio was picked to win the East with 144 points, recording all 24 first-place votes. The RedHawks were second with 107 points, followed by Buffalo (100 points), Kent State (62 points), Akron (54 points) and Bowling Green (37 points). Toledo was picked to win the West Division.

RED MEANS GO

Last season, Miami was 42-for-43 in the red zone with 35 (81.4%) touchdowns. Miami was also 33-for-33 in the red zone during MAC play with 27 touchdowns.

MARTIN VS. THE MAC SINCE 2016

Miami is 16-6 in MAC play over its last 22 games, tied for the best conference record in that span. NIU and Toledo are also 16-6, followed by WMU (15-7) and Ohio (15-7).

WHAT RETURNS?

Miami returns 12 starters (5 off./7 def.) from last season's squad. On offense, Miami returns three starters along the offensive line, including All-MAC performer Danny Godlevske (Rimington Trophy Watch List). Wide receiver Jack Sorenson leads all returning offensive players with 52 catches for 742 yards as well.

On defense, defensive tackle Doug Costin returns for his senior year after earning second-team All-MAC honors a year ago. Safety Mike Brown is Miami's top returning tackler, finishing 2018 with 58 stops.

WHAT IS GONE

Replacing three-year starting quarterback Gus Ragland will be one of the bigger question marks for the RedHawks as 2019 begins. Ragland finished his career with 6,306 passing yards and 56 touchdowns in 28 career starts. He added 882 rushing yards and 14 scores on the ground.

Miami also has to find a way to replace a pair of running backs in Kenny Young and Alonzo Smith. The duo combined for 4,602 rushing yards and 31 touchdowns in their career, while adding 1,211 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns through the air.

On defense, gone is linebacker Brad Koenig, who led the team with 101 tackles, 10

OFFENSIVE LINE A STRENGTH

Miami returns three starters from an offensive line that had its best year since Martin's arrival. Last season the RedHawks rushed for 159.8 yards per game and allowed just 20 sacks in 376 pass attempts. Danny Godlevske leads the group with 23 career starts and is followed by Jarrett LaRubbio (19) and Tommy Doyle (14). While, technically not a returning starter, Matt Skibinski also has 11 career starts along the offensive line.

RUSH OFFENSE KEEPS GETTING BETTER

Since his arrival, Coach Martin has talked about the importance of a strong rushing attack, an attack that has continued to get better under his watch. In fact, Miami is one of just two schools (Wake Forrest) to improve its rushing attack in each of the last five years.

NEW SIGNAL CALLER IN TOWN

With the graduation of Gus Ragland the RedHawks will have a new starting quarterback in 2019. The problem is, there is not a quarterback on the roster that has ever attempted a collegiate football pass. Below is a breakdown of the three possible starting quarterbacks to begin 2019.

Jackson Williamson: Saw action in wins over Kent State and Bowling Green last season. In high school, Williamson threw for 2,750 yards and 28 touchdowns his senior year, earning all-state honors.

AJ Mayer: Redshirted last season. Was the 5A District Player of the Year as a junior in high school, throwing for 2,974 yards and 31 touchdowns. A year later he led his team to the state title and was named the MVP of the state championship game. He threw for 337 yards, rushed for another 71 and combined for six touchdowns in the state title game.

Brett Gabbert: Younger brother of NFL quarterback Blaine Gabbert. Attended Christian Brothers High School last season, completing 191-of-274 passes for 3,047 yards and 42 touchdowns. He was named the 2018 6A Missouri Offensive Player of the Year and also earned first team all-state. He was 36-4 as a starter in high school, leading his team to back-to-back state titles as a junior and senior.

I AM YOUR NEPHEW

Mayock, the nephew of Oakland Raiders General Manager Mike Mayock, is coming off a career year in 2018. The 6-foot-5 wide receiver posted 22 catches for 319 yards

Sorenson exploded onto the scene in 2018. After not recording a single catch in 2016 (redshirted) or 2017, Sorenson earned third team All-MAC honors in 2018 after recording 53 catches for 742 yards and two touchdowns.

LAST CHANCE U

The hit documentary show on Netflix, Last Chance U, featured Independence Community College. Junior defensive back Zedrick Raymond, now a member of the Miami University football team, was part of that show. During the 2017 season he led the team with four interceptions.

KEEPS GETTING BETTER

Doug Costin has played 36 games for the RedHawks, all along the defensive line, and each year he gets better. After recording just 1.5 sacks in 2016, Costin had 5.0 in 2017 and 6.0 in 2018, earning second team All-MAC accolades. In his career, the defensive tackle has posted 119 tackles, 20.5 tackles for loss and 12.5 sacks.

TWO HANDS ARE BETTER THAN ONE

When 2018 began, not many people would have known who Bart Baratti was. Baratti was previously used on special teams exclusively, but due to numerous injuries Baratti started several games down the stretch. His highlight game was a nine-tackle performance at Army (Oct. 20). Against the Knights, Baratti broke his hand and missed little to no action. He played the remainder of the season in a cast.

RedHawks in the NFL

There are currently two Miami RedHawks on rosters in the National Football League and two Miami graduates coaching teams in the NFL.

Brandon Brooks - Guard, Philadelphia Eagles

- 76th overall selection of the 2012 NFL draft.
- Won a Super Bowl with the Eagles

Ben Roethlisberger - Quarterback, Pittsburgh Steelers

- Selected 11th overall in the 2004 NFL Draft
- Has won a pair of Super Bowls as the starting quarterback of the Steelers

John Harbaugh - Baltimore Ravens Head Coach

- Named head coach of the Ravens in 2008.
- Graduated from Miami in 1984

Sean McVay - LA Rams Head Coach

- Was named the youngest head coach in NFL history prior to the start of the 2017 season.
- Graduated from Miami in 2008.

Nate Becker - Tight End, Buffalo Bills

- Graduated from Miami in 2018
- Signed a free agent contract with Buffalo prior to the start of the 2019 season.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007, becoming just the third in program history to have his number retired. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR

Miami has a pair of Iowa transfers on their roster in defensive backs Emmanuel Rugamba and Cedric Boswell. Rugamba played for the Hawkeyes in 2016 and 2017. In fact, when Miami traveled to face Iowa back in the 2016 opener, Rugamba saw action in that contest ... for Iowa. Boswell saw action for the Hawkeyes in 2017.

CHASING HISTORY

Maurice Thomas, a local product from Talawanda High School, ranks third all-time in the record books with 1,788 kick return yards. Jamal Rogers (1,950) and Milt Bowen (1,826) are the lone two that stand in his way from claiming the top spot in Miami history. Thomas has also added 735 rushing yards on the ground and 227 yards through the air for a total of 2,750 yards in his career. Talawanda High School is 2,816 yards away from Yager Stadium, meaning Thomas is 66 yards shy of the distance between the two schools.

SAM SLOMAN

Senior Sam Sloman can be found throughout the Miami record books.

- Is 10th all-time in field goals made (23)
- Is fifth in field goal percentage (.718)
- Is seventh in extra points made (78), 8th in extra points attempted (80) and fourth in extra point percentage (.975).

IF YOU BUILD IT...

Miami's Athletic Director, David Sayler continues to add facilities for the department. The two newest football installments can be seen just north of Yager Stadium. The new David and Anita Dauch Indoor Sports Center (DISC) opened in February of 2015 and features a full length 120-yard field and four sprint lanes.

Between Yager Stadium and the DISC is the Athletic Performance Center. The APC provides much-needed upgrades to Miami Football's locker room and offices while also hosting a state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility that serves all Miami's student-athletes.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

As in years past under Martin, Miami will not have season long captains. Captains will be selected for each game.

Miami University, known world-wide as the "Cradle of Coaches," contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine's* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN ('30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON ('35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER ('51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN ('49) was selected as sports' 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN's list. Hayes served as Miami's football coach from 1949-50.

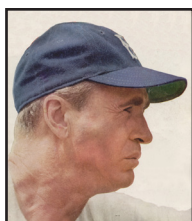
The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami's four alumni topped Alabama (Paul "Bear" Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed "Wizard of Westwood", was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



PAUL BROWN

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967, and the current home stadium of the Bengals bears his name.



WALTER ALSTON

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a "Dodger Way," which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



BO SCHEMBECHLER

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



ARA PARSEGHIAN

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami's head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led the RedHawks to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 20 years in college coaching experience, including 10 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games in the past 16 seasons. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

The one thing missing from Martin's resume, was a program builder. Martin may have answered that question. Martin, who was named the 36th head football coach in Miami history on Dec. 3, 2013, had his hands full when he took over the helm of the RedHawks program.

Miami had just gone 0-12 the year prior to Martin's arrival and many believed the roster was one of the worst in the Mid-American Conference. In three years, Martin's vision of returning Miami football to greatness is in full swing and many believe the RedHawks have already arrived.

While rebuilding the roster from the ground up, Miami took its lumps in 2014 and 2015, going just 2-10 and 3-9. 2016 did not start out much better as Miami lost its first six games of the season, but that is when things changed.

Martin would orchestrate something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek

from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
