FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO ROW

Minnesota heads to lowa for a Saturday evening matchup with the Hawkeyes. The game will be the 111th all-time 1 Minnesota heads to lowa for a Saturday evening matching with the Francisco. ... generally meeting between the border rivals. Minnesota leads the series 62-46-2, but is 23-29-1 in lowa City. Since 1935, the schools have played for the coveted Floyd of Rosedale trophy. This game will be Minnesota's first of three trophy games this year. The Gophers last beat the Hawkeyes in 2014 when they won 51-14 at home. Minnesota dropped a 40-35 decision on the road in 2015 and a 14-7 contest at home in 2016. Minnesota has lost seven straight games at lowa, with its last win being a 25-21 triumph in 1999. The Gophers are 28-7-1 all-time against the Hawkeyes in October and are 3-0 on Oct. 28 (wins in 1911, 1916 and 1933).

Forty-nine of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) are freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) are underclassmen. Minnesota's lack of depth is perhaps most evident on the offensive line. Minnesota started the same line against Buffalo and Oregon State but had to mix things up the past five games because of injuries. Donnell Greene is the only lineman who has started at the same position all seven games although Conner Olson and Garrison Wright have played in all seven games. Wright has started 20 career games, while Greene has started 15 and Jared Weyler 12. Redshirt freshman Conner Olson and Sam Schlueter both saw the first action of their career this year. Greene and Wright joined the team last year after junior college, so the line has not been together long. Minnesota often practiced with only four linemen in the spring because of injuries. However, the line has allowed only four sacks this year (fifth in nation, first in B1G) and 20 tackles for loss (first in nation and B1G).

Tyler Johnson is having one of the best seasons ever for a sophomore receiver at Minnesota. Johnson has seven touchdowns and one more will tie him with former tight end Maxx Williams (2014) for the school record for touchdown receptions for a sophomore. Through seven games, Johnson has 27 receptions this year for 499 yards. He needs 14 catches to break into the top five for receptions by a sophomore, as Aaron Osterman (1992) and Dwayne McMullen (1982) are fifth in program receptions for a sophomore with 41 (Eric Decker is first with 67 in 2007). Johnson needs 141 yards to tie McMullen (1982) for fifth in yards by a sophomore with 640 (Decker, 2007 and Jared Ellerson, 2003 are tied for first with 909 yards).

Minnesota is one of the most disciplined teams in the nation, as it ranks second in fewest penalties per game and fewest penalty yards per game. Minnesota is also fifth in fewest penalty yards and seventh in fewest penalties. Through seven games last year, Minnesota was 94th in fewest penalty yards, 103rd in fewest penalties, 104th in fewest penalty yards per game and 105th in fewest penalties per game.

Minnesota has played 66 players this year and 21 of those players have missed at least one game because of an injury or suspension this season.

ABOUT THE HAWKEYES

lowa (4-3, 1-3), like Minnesota, has one Big Ten win this year and it also came against Illinois. The Hawkeyes were seconds away from an upset of Penn State earlier this year, but gave up a touchdown on the final play.

lowa's top playmaker is senior linebacker Josey Jewell. He missed last week with an injury but previously led the Big Ten and ranked seventh in the nation with 70 tackles. He also has 9.5 tackles-for-loss.

In the secondary, lowa is led by junior defensive back Joshua Jackson who leads the country with 11 pass breakups. Two weeks ago lowa saw the return of junior safety Brandon Snyder six months after suffering an ACL injury during spring ball. Snyder started against Illinois and contributed with three tackles, two pass breakups, and an 89-yard interception return for a touchdown.

On offense, lowa has outscored its opponents 73-23 in the fourth quarter. The Hawkeyes are led by sophomore quarterback Nate Stanley. He is 116-of-201 for 1,513 yards and 16 touchdowns. The Hawkeyes also have a potent runnin gback in Akrum Wadley, who is fourth in the Big Ten and 20th in the NCAA with 133.71 all-purpose yards per game. He has rushed for 573 yards and four touchdowns, caught 18 passes for 263 yards and three touchdowns and has returned four kicks for 100 yards.

Nick Easley leads the team with 31 receptions for 326 yards and four touchdowns. Matt VandeBerg has a reception in 26 consecutive games played and has 18 grabs for 276 yards and two touchdowns this year.

Miguel Recinos has made 6-of-8 field goals this season and booted the Hawkeyes into overtime by drilling a game-tying kick against Northwestern. Iowa has used two punters in Ryan Gersonde and Colten Rastetter. They combined to average for 53 yards per punt against the Wildcats.

lowa is led by head coach Kirk Ferentz who shares the distinction of being the longest tenured head coach in the nation. He is in his 19th season as head football coach and 28th season overall at the University of Iowa.



HEAD COACH I FIRST SEASON

P.J. (Phillip John) Fleck was named head football coach at the University of Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He is 4-3 at Minnesota and his career record is 34-25.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended last season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck, 36, is one the youngest and brightest minds in the game and is the second youngest coach in the Power 5. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and last season he led the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well. In 2016, the Broncos had Willie Beavers (121st overall to the Minnesota Vikings) and Daniel Braverman (230th overall to the Chicago Bears) taken in the NFL Draft.

In the 2017, Fleck saw three of his former players selected from Western Michigan in Corey Davis (fifth overall to the Tennessee Titans), Taylor Moton (64th overall to the Carolina Panthers) and Keion Adams (248th overall to the Pittsburgh Steelers). Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which makes him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in its most recent semester.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the San Francisco 49ers in the NFL. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

UNDER CENTER

Minnesota has used two quarterbacks this year in Conor Rhoda and Demry Croft. Rhoda is a fifth-year senior who has played in 11 career games (six in 2017, three in 2016 and two in 2014). He is 4-3 as a starter and Minnesota is 8-3 in games he has played in. He started the first six games of the season for Minnesota and completed 59-of-109 passes for

COACHED UP

Coach Fleck wasted little time in assembling an elite staff when he was hired at Minnesota. Fleck has worked with six (Ciarrocca, Smith, Burns, Callahan, Simon and Wenger) of his assistant coaches before. Fleck's other three hires were 33-year old Maurice Linguist, former NFL Defensive Player of the Year Bryce Paup and offensive line guru Ed Warinner.

Kirk Ciarrocca: Offensive Coord. / Quarterbacks

Brings 25 years of coaching experience to Minnesota. Was instrumental in the development of Super Bowl winning quarterback Joe Flacco. Worked with Fleck during his time at Rutgers when he was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach and again as Fleck's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Western Michigan.

Robb Smith: Defensive Coord. / Linebackers

Has coached collegiately at lowa, Maine, Rutgers and at Arkansas and in the NFL for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In 2014, his defense at Arkansas finished No. 10 in the nation in both scoring defense (19.2 points per game) and total defense (323.4 yards per game).

Kenni Burns: Running Backs

Was a running back at Indiana from 2003-06 and has coached at Millersville (Pa.), Southern Illinois, North Dakota State, Wyoming and Western Michigan. Helped lead North Dakota State to three consecutive FCS National Championships in 2011, 2012 and 2013 and coached with Fleck at Western Michigan in 2016.

Brian Callahan: Tight Ends

Has been coaching since 1992. Coached offensive line under Fleck at Western Michigan where he coached All-MAC First Team honorees Taylor Moton and Chukwuma Okorafor and All-MAC Second Team player John Keenoy. FootballScoop named Callahan its 2016 Offensive Line Coach of the Year.

Maurice Linguist: Defensive Backs

Played safety at Baylor from 2003-06 and has spent time coaching with Baylor, Valdosta State, James Madison, Buffalo, Iowa State and Mississippi State. In 2016, he coached a quartet of talented, play-making safeties that combined to make seven of Mississippi State's 14 interceptions.

Bryce Paup: Defensive Line

Former NFL Defensive Player of the Year for the Buffalo Bills. Spent the last four seasons coaching the defensive line at his alma mater Northern Iowa and led the unit to new heights. UNI finished each year ranked in the top-40 nationally in rushing defense, total defense and sacks under Paup.

Matt Simon: Wide Receivers

The Farmington, Minn. native was coached by Fleck as a receiver at Northern Illinois and went on to play for the New Orleans Saints from 2009-10. Coached Consensus All-American Corey Davis at Western Michigan who ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons making him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis went on to be selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL draft.

Ed Warinner: Offensive Line / Run Game Coord.

Began coaching career in 1984 and brings more than 20 years of experience coaching the offensive line to Minnesota including stops at Notre Dame, Ohio State and Illinois. First coach to earn offensive line coach of the year honors from FootballScoop twice.

Rob Wenger - Special Teams Coordinator

Played linebacker and fullback at Colgate from 2004-06. Worked with Fleck at Western Michigan for four seasons. In 2016, he coached Darius Phillips who was named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year.

839 yards and five touchdowns. Prior to this season, he had completed 8-of-17 passes for 88 yards and one touchdown. In 2016, he started and played the entire game at Maryland (completed 7-of-15 passes for 82 yards and one touchdown) and led Minnesota to a 31-10 victory. He also saw action in a blowout wins against Indiana State and Illinois. In 2014, he played against San Jose State and Iowa.

- Conor Rhoda walked on at Minnesota in 2013. He earned a scholarship prior to the 2016 season, but was told by the previous coaching staff that he would not be on scholarship in 2017. Rhoda thought his collegiate career was over and even participated in senior day activities last season. Minnesota hired coach P.J. Fleck on Jan. 6 and early on Jan. 7, he called Rhoda and told him he would have a scholarship this season. Rhoda, who was a few weeks away from job hunting, returned to the Gophers and is one of the leaders of the inexperienced squad.
- ▶ Demry Croft was named Minnesota's starter prior to the Illinois game and led the Gophers to a 24-17 win against the Illini. Croft also saw significant playing time against Michigan State, as he entered the game late in the second quarter and played the entire second half. Minnesota ran only four offensive plays in the third quarter against the Spartans, but then Croft led the Gophers to three fourth-quarter touchdowns as he found Tyler Johnson for three touchdowns (touchdowns were first passing scores of Croft's career). Croft ended the Michigan State game with 163 passing yards and three touchdowns and also rushed seven times for 31 yards. For the year, Croft has passed for 273 yards and four touchdowns and rushed for 159 yards and one score.
- Four of Minnesota's touchdowns this year have covered more than 60 yards (two receptions, one rush and one interception return). The last season that Minnesota scored three or more offensive touchdowns of 60 yards or more was 2006 when quarterback Bryan Cupito threw touchdown passes of 67, 64 and 64 yards. Minnesota's fourth 60-plus score this year was a 67-yard interception return by Jacob Huff (10th longest INT return in school history) against Middle Tennessee. The last time Minnesota scored four touchdowns that covered 60 yards or more was also 2006 (Gophers also had 99 yard kick return).
- ▶ Minnesota beat Oregon State 48-14 on the road this year. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980. Minnesota's 34-point margin of victory at Oregon State was its largest road margin since it beat Kent State 44-0 in 2006. Minnesota's 48 points were the most it had scored against an FBS opponent since a 51-14 home win against lowa in 2014.
- Minnesota has two 30-plus wins this year, as it beat Oregon State by 34 points (48-14) and Middle Tennessee by 31 points (34-3). The last time Minnesota had two 30-point wins was 2006 when it had three. That year, Minnesota beat Indiana by 37 points, Temple by 62 points and Kent State by 44 points. The last time Minnesota had consecutive 30-point wins was 2005 when it opened the season with three straight 30-point wins.

PAIR AND A SPARE

- The Gophers are paced by running backs Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks. When they score, Minnesota usually ends up winning. In 2016, Minnesota was 9-1 when Smith scored and 6-1 when Brooks scored. Minnesota is 6-1 all-time when Smith and Brooks score in the same game (5-0 in 2016 and 1-1 in 2017). Last year, Smith rushed 240 times (tenth most in school history in a single season) for 1,158 yards (16th most in school history in a single season) and 16 touchdowns (third most in school history in a single season) to become the 20th Gopher ever to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season. In 2016, Brooks missed the first three games with an injury, but rushed 138 times for 650 yards and five touchdowns and added two receiving scores.
- Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks have the potential to be two of the most elite running backs in school history. In 32 career games, Smith he has rushed 535 times (10th all-time in school history) for 2,373 yards (10th all-time in school history). In 27 games, Brooks has rushed 328 times for 1,681 yards, which ranks 27th in program history. Brooks and Smith can strike at any moment. Brooks' career long touchdown run is 75 yards and came against Illinois in 2015. Smith ripped off a 70-yard touchdown at Maryland in 2016.
- Rodney Smith has rushed for 20 career touchdowns, which ranks tied for 11th in school history. Darrell Thompson (1986-89) is Minnesota's all-time leader with 40. Shannon Brooks has rushed for 17 career touchdowns (five are 37 yards or longer), which includes five this season (all two yards or less). Brooks has also caught two career touchdowns and passed for one (42 yards to Drew Wolitarsky at lowa in 2015). He is the first Gopher running back since Duane Bennett (2007-11) to rush, pass and throw for a touchdown.
- Rodney Smith has nine career 100-yard games (two this year), which ranks tied for eighth in program history. Last year, he had 257 all-purpose yards against Rutgers, which was the 12th most in school history.
- Kobe McCrary (Gophers 4-0 when he scores) came to Minnesota after two seasons in junior college. He saw limited action last season behind Smith and Brooks, but at 240 pounds is a bigger option for the Gophers. McCrary has made the most of his opportunities this year, as he has rushed 51 times for 268 yards and four touchdowns. His 5.3 yards per carry average is actually better than Smith and Brooks. McCrary has done most of his damage in two games this year. With Brooks and Smith dinged up against Middle Tennessee, he rushed 23 times for 107 yards and three touchdowns. Brooks missed the Illinois game with an injury, so McCrary split time with Smith. Against the Illini he rumbled 24 times for 153 yards and one touchdown. In 2016, he rushed 39 times for 246 yards and three touchdowns, including 17 carries for 176 yards and two scores against Indiana State.

CATCHING ON

- ▶ The Gophers have 17 wide receivers on their roster, but prior to this season, only six of those players had seen game action and only three had ever started. Five of Minnesota's 17 receivers have battled injuries this year in Phillip Howard, Melvin Holland Jr., Harry Van Dyne, Demetrius Douglas and Chris Autman-Bell. Two others − Yale Van Dyne and Paul Gossage − transferred into the program this fall and are not eligible to play yet. Of the 10 receivers available to the Gophers, four are freshmen, three are sophomores, two are juniors and one is a senior. In addition, four of the 10 are walk-ons.
- ▶ Sophomore Tyler Johnson has been Minnesota's breakout star. He has caught 27 passes for 499 yards and seven touchdowns (tied for seventh in the nation, tied for first in the B1G) this year. Last season, he made 14 catches for 141 yards and one score in 13 games. Johnson played quarterback at Minneapolis North high school, but moved to receiver once he joined the Gophers. As a senior in high school (passed for 2,606 yards and 36 touchdowns and rushed for more than 1,100 yards and 20 touchdowns) he led the Polars to a berth in the state championship game in football at TCF Bank Stadium and a state championship in basketball.
- ➤ Tyler Johnson has three 100-yard games this season (141 vs. Buffalo, 127 at Oregon State and 106 vs. Michigan State), as he became the first Gopher since A.J. Barker in 2012 to record at least three 100-yard receiving games in a season (last to have four 100-yard games in a season was Eric Decker in 2009).
- ► Tyler Johnson started the season with consecutive 100-yard games against Buffalo and Oregon State to become the first Gopher to record back-to-back 100yard games since KJ Maye in 2015. His 141 yards against Buffalo were the second most ever for a Gopher at TCF Bank Stadium and his 127 at Oregon State were the most for a Gopher on the road since Da'Jon McKnight had 173 at Michigan State in 2011.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson has seven receiving touchdowns this season (three from Rhoda and four Demry Croft) and his scores have covered 67, 61, 18, 17, 9, 8 and 3 yards. Johnson's 67-yarder at Oregon State from Rhoda is Minnesota's longest passing touchdown since 2007 when Adam Weber connected with Ralph Spry on 71-yard score (span of 117 games). Minnesota's longest touchdown pass last season was 22 yards and its longest passing play was 62 yards.
- Tyler Johnson has seven touchdowns this year for 42 points, which ranks him second on the team behind kicker Emmit Carpenter (53 points) and ahead of running back Shannon Brooks (30 points). The last Gopher to catch more than seven touchdowns in a season was tight end Maxx Williams (eight TDs) in 2014 and the last receiver to do it was Da'Jon McNight in 2010 (10 TDs).
- ► Tyler Johnson caught three touchdowns all from Demry Croft – against Michigan State. Johnson is the 13th Gopher to catch three or more touchdowns in one game and is the first since tight end Maxx Williams did so against lowa in 2014. All three of Johnson's scores against the Spartans came in the

- fourth quarter, making him the first Gopher to catch three touchdowns in one quarter since 2006 when Logan Payne caught three (had four in the game) in the first quarter against Temple. Johnson is the first to catch three touchdowns in one quarter in a Big Ten game since Omar Douglas (father of freshman receiver Demetrius Douglas) did so in the third quarter against Purdue in 1993 (Douglas caught a school record five touchdowns in that game).
- Tyler Johnson is averaging 18.48 yards per reception this year (27 catches for 499 yards), which ranks 27th in the nation and first in the Big Ten (minimum 15 catches). The Minnesota record for yards per reception (minimum 20 catches) is 24.30 yards and is held by Jared Ellerson who made 21 receptions in 2005.
- ▶ One reason for Tyler Johnson's breakout season is receiver coach Matt Simon (Simon played collegiate football at Northern Illinois, where Fleck was his position coach). The Farmington, Minn., native came with Fleck from Western Michigan where he tutored consensus All-American Corey Davis. Davis ended his career with 5,212 yards, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving leader. Davis joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round, as he was selected fifth overall by the Tennessee Titans.
- ► The Gophers had eight players and four receivers catch a pass against Buffalo. Minnesota reached those numbers only once in 13 games last season and it was at Nebraska when eight players and four receivers caught a ball. Against Buffalo, Minnesota's receivers combined to make 14 catches. Last season, the most number of catches that Minnesota's receivers combined to make in a game was 16, which happened in an overtime game at Penn State.
- Tyler Johnson and Demetrius Douglas each caught six passes against Buffalo. The last time a Minnesota receiver caught six or more passes in a season-opening game was 2009 when Eric Decker made nine catches in an overtime win at Syracuse. Johnson also tallied 141 receiving yards against Buffalo, which were the most in a season-opening game since Decker notched 183 against Syracuse. It is not known if Douglas' six catches against Buffalo were a record for a true freshman making his debut for the Gophers, but it is the most since at least 1978. Minnesota's records prior to 1978 are not complete.
- Demetrius Douglas impressed in fall camp and caught 11 balls for 83 yards this year. However, the freshman will miss the rest of the season with an injury. Douglas is the son of Minnesota great Omar Douglas (1990-93), who was inducted into the "M" Club Hall of Fame on Thursday, Oct. 12, 2017. Omar ranks tied for eighth in receptions (130), tied for ninth in receiving touchdowns (14) and tenth in school history in yards (1,681). His five touchdowns (one in first quarter, one in second quarter and three in third quarter) against Purdue in 1993 is a school record.
- With Demetrius Douglas out, redshirt freshman Phillip Howard stepped up against Maryland, as he caught four balls for 46 yards in his first career start. Howard had previously caught two passes for 16 yards in three games this year. Howard started at Purdue, but had to leave the game early in the first quarter with an

injury. He then missed the Michigan State game with an injury before returning against Illinois. In Howard's absence, redshirt freshman Mark Williams saw extensive action. Williams made his first career start against Michigan State and caught two balls for 43 yards.

TIGHT END PRODUCTION

- Minnesota's tight ends have seen an increased role in the passing game as injuries have plagued the receiving corps. Seniors Nate Wozniak and Brandon Lingen have combined for 10 starts this season and redshirt freshman Ko Kieft has seen additional playing time as well. Lingen (24 yards) and Wozniak (23 yards) had the first two catches for Minnesota against Maryland.
- Nate Wozniak started all 13 games in 2016, and after starting against Illinois he has now made 31 career starts. At 6-10, Wozniak is the tallest skill player in college football. He gets down and opens up holes and can be a threat downfield. This year, he has six receptions for 94 yards, which includes a career long 50yard catch. He has caught 27 career balls for 304 vards.
- Brandon Lingen made three catches for 28 yards last year as he battled injuries. He showed big game potential in 2015 with 33 receptions for 428 yards and three touchdowns. He had two 100-yard receiving games, earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors and was named CoSIDA Academic All-America second team. Lingen has nine catches this year for 84 yards and two touchdowns, but left the Michigan State game with an injury and also missed the Illinois game.
- Ko Kieft has stepped up to replace Lingen. Kieft, who saw most of his action on special teams early this season, has caught a pass in each of his last two games. He snagged a five-yard reception (first of his career) against Michigan State and added a 12-yard catch against Illinois.

POINT TAKEN

Minnesota returns two of the top point producers in the Big Ten from a year ago in kicker Emmit Carpenter and running back Rodney Smith. Carpenter finished fifth in the league in scoring with 109 points and Smith was sixth with 102. Carpenter's 109 points are tied for second most ever for a Gopher, while Smith's 102 points ranks tied for fourth in school history. Carpenter and Smith combined to score 211 points, which are the most ever for two Gophers. The only other Gopher teammates to each notch 100 points in a season were Marion Barber III (102 points) and Rhys Lloyd (101 points) in 2003.

SPECIAL GROUP

- ▶ Emmit Carpenter made 22-of-24 field goals (91.6%) last season en route to being named the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (first Gopher to win the award). He started 2017 missing his first two attempts, but then made his next six. Carpenter has made 10-of-14 field goals this year and statistically is the most accurate field goal kicker in school history (minimum 25 attempts), as he has made 32-of-38 tries (84.2%). Chip Lohmiller, who made 57-of-75 from 1984-87, is second at 76%.
- In 2016, Emmit Carpenter made his first nine field goals (tied for sixth longest streak in school history) to start the year and his streak of 12 straight made field

goals (fourth longest streak in school history) ended when his 50-yard attempt in the second quarter against Buffalo came up short. Last season, Carpenter was 8-of-8 from 40-49 yards and 2-of-2 from 50-plus (career long was 53 yards vs. Purdue).

- ► For his career, Emmit Carpenter is 20-of-25 at home, 11-of-12 on the road and 1-of-1 in neutral-site games. He is 26-of-32 on FieldTurf and is 6-of-6 on grass.
- ▶ Ryan Santoso moved from kicker to punter prior to the 2016 season. He has punted 110 times in his career and averages 42.0 yards, which ranks fourth in school history. Santoso has placed 39 punts inside the 20 and his career long of 68 yards came against Michigan State this year. He is first in the Big Ten (14th in NCAA) with a 45.0 average on 32 punts. The Minnesota record for a senior is 43.4 yards per punt and was set by Santoso's predecessor Peter Mortell.

THE BALL!

- ► THE BALL IS THE PROGRAM. Those words are prominently displayed in Minnesota's team meeting room and the Gophers have done a good job of forcing turnovers this season. Minnesota is plus-4 in turnover margin, which is fourth in the Big Ten. Minnesota has scored 65 points off turnovers this year and has allowed only 38.
- ► The Gophers are 25th in the nation and fourth in the Big Ten in time of possession at 32:00. This has become a hallmark of Fleck's staff as Western Michigan was second in the nation last year at 34:03.
- ► The Gophers are tied for first in the Big Ten (6th in NCAA) with nine recovered fumbles. Thomas Barber has two while Jon Celestin, Kamal Martin, Kiondre Thomas, Steve Richardson, Andrew Stelter and Jaylen Waters have one. The Gophers end each practice with drills on how to recover and keep the ball.

STINGY DEFENSE

- ▶ Minnesota allows 19.0 points per game, which is down from a 22.8 average last season through seven games. The 19.0 average is the fewest Minnesota has allowed through seven games since it allowed 18.7 in 2008. The Gophers have the No. 25 scoring defense in the nation and the No. 19 total defense, despite starting five underclassmen against Illinois.
- ▶ The Gophers allowed only seven points in their win against Buffalo, which was the lowest amount of points Minnesota allowed to open a season since 2006 (beat Kent State 44-0). Minnesota allowed only three points to Middle Tennessee at home, which was the fewest points it has ever allowed at TCF Bank Stadium. It was also the fewest amount of points allowed at home since 2008 (37-3 win vs. FAU).
- Twelve players have combined to deflect 24 passes this year. Defensive lineman Winston DeLattiboudere, corner Antonio Shenault and defensive back Adekunle Ayinde lead the team with three. Lineman Gary Moore and linebackers Jon Celestin, Thomas Barber, Kamal Martin and Blake Cashman also have broken up a pass this season. Minnesota had six non secondary players break up a pass in 13 games in 2016.

FOR POPS

Senior linebacker Jon Celestin has dedicated this sea-

son to his late father, Frederick Celestin, who died in April. Celestin had a special moment at the end of the Illinois game when he took his first career interception to the house for a pick-six that secured a win. He crossed the end zone and pointed toward the sky later saying the gesture was for his pops. Celestin has persevered this season, as he played through an injury the past two games. He is second on the team with 52 tackles (38 solo) including 4.5 for a loss.

FAMILIAR NAME, RESULTS

Minnesota is no stranger to the Barber name. Marion Barber played running back at Minnesota from 1977-80 and ranks sixth all-time in program history with 3,094 rushing yards. Marion Barber III played running back at Minnesota from 2001-04 and ranks fourth all-time in program history with 3,276 rushing yards. Dom Barber lettered at Minnesota as a defensive back from 2004-07 and notched 187 career tackles. Now. Thomas Barber is etching his name into Gopher history with a breakout sophomore season. Barber leads the Gophers with 63 tackles (44 solo) including 7.5 for a loss and also has one interception, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He leads the Big Ten and is sixth in the country in solo tackles. He has had double-figure tackles in all four Big Ten games.

SPEAKING OF TACKLES...

Prior to this season the Gophers did not have a player with 15 or more tackles in a game since Damien Wilson had 15 on Oct. 11, 2014 against Northwestern. This season both Thomas Barber and Jon Celestin have accomplished the feat. Celestin notched 15 tackles against Maryland while Barber had 16 against Michigan State. The most tackles in TCF Bank Stadium history by a Gopher is 17 by Nate Triplett in 2009. Barber has had double-digit tackles in four straight games this season. He is the first Gopher since Kim Royston in 2011 to have four straight games with double-digit tackles. Barber is the first Gopher to have four straight Big Ten games with double digit tackles since Lee Campbell did so in the 2009 (13 against Wisconsin, 11 against Purdue, 13 against Penn State, 13 against Ohio State).

LB OR DE, DOESN'T MATTER

Carter Coughlin came to Minnesota as a highly recruited linebacker but has switched to more of a standup defensive end role this season. He is finding a groove in the new role and leads the team in tackles for loss (8.5) and sacks (4.5).

THEN THERE'S MARTIN

Besides Thomas Barber and Carter Coughlin, the Gophers also have another elite sophomore linebacker from Minnesota in Kamal Martin. Martin has 27 tackles including 4.5 for a loss and one sack. He also has one interception, one fumble recovery and two forced fumbles. Martin has been a force in the last three games with seven tackles and an interception against Purdue, eight tackles, a forced fumble and pass breakup against Michigan State, and five tackles and a forced fumble against Illinois.

STOVE

Steven Richardson, nicknamed Stove, has an unmovable frame up front. He began his senior season on watch lists for the Bednarik Award (best defensive player), Outland Trophy (standout interior linemen) and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (national defensive

player of the year). He did not record a stat against Buffalo or Middle Tennessee and only notched one tackle against Oregon State but has been double teamed every time he has stepped foot on the field. He made more of an impact against Maryland with four tackles and had two tackles against Purdue. His biggest play of the season came late against Michigan State when he came through the line and forced a fumble. He also recovered a fumble against Illinois.

BIG GUY LEADERSHIP

- Outside of Richardson the Gophers also have veterans Merrick Jackson, Gary Moore and Andrew Stelter on the interior defensive line. Moore made his first career start against Buffalo and has seen an increased role in 2017. Against Oregon State he burst through the line and recorded a strip sack. Moore started against Maryland and notched three tackles and also started against Michigan State and Illinois. Stelter brings 45 games of experience to the Gophers line. He notched a sack against Middle Tennessee and recovered a fumble against Purdue. Jackson has started three games and constantly requires double teams at 6-foot-2 and 316 pounds. He made three tackles against Maryland, forced a fumble against Purdue and made three tackles against Illinois.
- ▶ Winston DeLattiboudere has a nonstop motor at defensive end. After coming to Minnesota as one of the youngest players in college football in 2015 he worked his way into the starting lineup as a redshirt freshman last season. He got loose against Illinois and caused a sack fumble. True Freshman Nate Umlor made his collegiate debut against Oregon State and has started the past two games. He notched three tackles in a start against Illinois.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Minnesota is 23rd in the NCAA in passing yards allowed at 183.1 yards. They have done this despite significant injuries that have left them extremely thin in the secondary. Starters Antonio Shenault (one game), Kiondre Thomas (one game), Duke McGhee (two games) and Antoine Winfield (three games) have all missed time this year, forcing the Gophers to move Adekunle Ayinde from safety to corner and to play true freshmen Ken handy-Holly and Justus Harris.
- ► The Gophers have played 11 defensive backs this year and seven of them (4 freshmen, 3 sophomores) are underclassmen.
- Antonio Shenault, a junior, is the most experienced cornerback on the team with 28 games of experience but missed the Illinois game to injury. He had previously been the only defensive back to start in every game this season seeing action in the first six games of the year. He is third on the team with 41 tackles this season and has three pass breakups.
- Jacob Huff is the only defensive back to play in all seven games. He has 36 tackles (fourth on the team) and two interceptions including a pick-six.
- Redshirt freshman Kiondre Thomas has played a lot this year, but left the Purdue game with an injury. He started against Illinois, but was injured again. He has started six games and has made 18 tackles and one fumble recovery. With Thomas injured, Coney Durr, who is coming off an ACL injury, played at Purdue and Justus Harris had his redshirt pulled against Illinois.
