FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Minnesota plays its second home game of the season on Saturday when it faces lowa. The game will be the 114th meeting between the border rivals and Minnesota leads the series 62-49-2 and is 39-18-1 at home. Since 1935, the schools have played for the coveted Floyd of Rosedale, which is a 98-pound bronze pig trophy.

Mohamed Ibrahim leads the nation in rushing yards per game with an average of 190.3. He ranks 24th in the nation in rushing yards (571) despite playing in only three games. The 23 people above him have all played in six or more games and the next closest individual who has played in only three games is Xazavian Valladay of Wyoming, who ranks 61st with 397 yards. Ibrahim ranks tied for fifth nationally in rushing touchdowns (10) and everyone ahead of him or tied with him has played in at least six games.

Mohamed Ibrahim leads the Big Ten in rushing attempts (97), rushing yards (571), rushing touchdowns (10) and scoring (60). Ibrahim's 10 touchdowns have covered a collective 34 yards (16 and 5 yards against Michigan; 1, 2, 1 and 1 vards at Maryland and 1, 2, 1 and 4 at Illinois). His 26 career touchdowns (9 in 2018, 7 in 2019 and 10 in 2020) rank seventh in school history and his nine career 100-yard rushing games ranks tied for ninth. Ibrahim's three career 200-yard games tie him with Laurence Maroney, Chris Darkins, Darrell Thompson and Garry White for the most in school history.

Mohamed Ibrahim rushed a career high 41 times (most for a Gopher since Laurence Maroney rushed 43 times against Wisconsin in 2005) for 207 yards and four touchdowns at Maryland. He rushed 30 times for 224 yards (tied

his career high) and four touchdowns at Illinois. Ibrahim became the first Big Ten back to rush for 200 yards and four touchdowns in consecutive games since Larry Johnson did so for Penn State in 2002. Ibrahim is only the second Gopher ever to record two consecutive 200-yard rushing games (Terry Jackson II in 2002 vs. Northwestern and Michigan State) and his eight touchdowns in two consecutive games is a school record. At Maryland, Ibrahim's four touchdowns all came in the first half, making him the second Gopher ever to rush for four touchdowns in one half. Minnesota's all-time rushing leader (and radio analyst) Darrell Thomson rushed for four second-half scores against Bowling Green in 1986.

Rashod Bateman, Mohamed Ibrahim and Tanner Morgan all hit significant milestones this year. Bateman (receiving) and Ibrahim (rushing) eclipsed 2,000 career yards this year. Bateman has 302 receiving yards this year and now has 2,225 career receiving yards, which ranks seventh all-time in school history. Ibrahim has 571 rushing yards this year and now has 2,335 career rushing yards, which ranks 12th alltime in school history. Morgan has thrown for 602 yards this season and now has 5,256 career passing yards, which ranks seventh all-time in school history.

TCF BANK STADIUM

Minnesota is 47-31 at TCF Bank Stadium. The Gophers opened TCF with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009, but then dropped to 7-13. Since Nov. 26, 2011, Minnesota is 40-18 at home (68.9% win percentage) in its last 58 games.

TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.



HEAD COACH // FOURTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 39, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 54-39 and is 24-17 at Minnesota.

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to unprecedented heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. This was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

Minnesota was led on offense by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was paced by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. He ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

Off the field, Minnesota had 53 players named Academic All-Big Ten and Blaise Andries and Sam Renner were named Academic All-Americans.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats om the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 under-classmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week, and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indian 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same Indian fame.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.21 in the 2019 fall semester.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Browl

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team

to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association. Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well. In 2016, the Broncos had Willie Beavers (121st overall to the Minnesota Vikings) and Daniel Braverman (230th overall to the Chicago Bears) taken in the NFL Draft.

In the 2017, Fleck saw three of his former players selected from Western Michigan in Corey Davis (fifth overall to the Tennessee Titans), Taylor

Moton (64th overall to the Carolina Panthers) and Keion Adams (248th overall to the Pittsburgh Steelers). Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which makes him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving vards (2.162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return vards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

MORGAN'S MOMENT

▶ Tanner Morgan has thrown a touchdown pass in a school-record 17 straight games (last game without a passing touchdown was Minnesota's 2018 victory at Wisconsin) and the Gophers are 13-4 in those games. Morgan was named All-Big Ten Second Team last year after setting Minnesota single-season records for passing yards (3,253), passing touchdowns (30), completion percentage (66.0%), passing yards per game (250.2), touchdown-interception ratio (4.28) and pass efficiency rating (178.7).

IT'S A START

Tanner Morgan is 16-6 as a starter and he ranks fourth in school history in touchdown passes (42), seventh in passing yards (5,256), eighth in completions (344) and 11th in passing attempts (543).

NEAR PERFECTION

▶ Tanner Morgan played two of the best games in Big Ten history last year, as he completed 21-of-22 passes (95.45%) for 396 yards and four touchdowns at Purdue and 18-of-20 passes (90%) for 339 yards and three touchdowns against Penn State. Florida State's Jameis Winston was the only other quarterback to have two games with 90% completion percentage, doing so during his Heisman Trophy-winning campaign in 2013. Morgan's 95.45 completion percentage at Purdue is the best ever in Big Ten history for any quarterback who attempted 15 or more passes.

BATEMAN'S BACK

Rashod Bateman announced on Aug. 4 that he was forgoing his remaining eligibility at Minnesota because of personal health concerns surrounding COVID-19. However, he opted back in after the Big Ten announced its safety guidelines for the 2020 season and on Sept. 30 his eligibility was restored by the NCAA.

AGENT ZERO

Rashod Bateman set Minnesota freshman and sophomore receiving records wearing No. 13, but is wearing No. 0 during his junior campaign. Bateman is the first Gopher ever to wear No. 0 and switched from No. 13 to No. 0 because there is zero tolerance for racism in Minnesota's culture and it is a call to action to end racism in our society.

ALL-AMERICAN RECEIVER

Rashod Bateman has played in 29 games for Minnesota and has already established himself as one of the best receivers ever to wear the Maroon and Gold. He has 135 career catches (7th in school history) for 2,225 yards (seventh in school history) and 18 touchdowns (fifth in school history). Bateman was named Third-Team All-American last season, All-Big Ten First Team and was the Big Ten Receiver of the Year as a sophomore. The Georgia native, who was also one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award in 2019, caught 60 passes for 1,219 yards (second most in a single season) and 11 touchdowns (tied for second most in a single season) last year.

RECORD SETTER

Rashod Bateman has caught at least one pass in all 29 games (tied for fifth in school history) he has played in and has nine 100-yard receiving games (tied for fourth in school history). He set school sophomore records for receiving yards (1,219) and touchdowns (11) and set school freshman records for receptions (51) and receiving yards (704).

BATEMAN'S BANK

Rashod Bateman has totaled 451 receiving yards in his last three home games at TCF Bank Stadium. He opened this year with nine catches against Michigan for 101 yards. He ended last season with 147 yards against Wisconsin and 203 yards against Penn State. His 203 yards against Penn State is a stadium record, while his 147 yards against Wisconsin is the second most ever for a Gopher at TCF Bank Stadium. He also notched 132 yards against South Dakota State last season, which ranks as the ninth-most receiving yards at TCF Bank Stadium for a Gopher.

MIGHTY MO

Mohamed Ibrahim ranks 12th on Minnesota's career rushing list with 2,335 yards despite playing in only 24 games. Forced into a starting role because of injuries to Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks in 2018, Ibrahim rushed 217 times for 1,160 yards (second most ever for a Gopher freshman) and nine touchdowns. He rushed for more than 100 yards in five games in 2018 to become the first Gopher freshman to do so since Laurence Maroney (five 100-yard games) in 2003 and set a freshman single-game record with 224 yards against Georgia Tech.

LAST FOUR GAMES

Mohamed Ibrahim has rushed 117 times for 711 yards (6.07 average) and 11 touchdowns in his last four games. He ended last season with 140 yards and one touchdown against Auburn and then opened this season with 140 yards and two scores versus Michigan. Ibrahim then churned out 207 yards and four scores at Maryland and 224 yards and four touchdowns at Illinois.

ALL-PURPOSE MO

▶ Mohamed Ibrahim set a career high with 282 all-purpose yards (224 rush, 31 receiving, 27 kick return) at Illinois. His 282 all-purpose yards ranks as the seventh most productive game in school history and are the most for a Gopher since Troy Stoudermire had 290 versus Iowa in 2008. They are the most all-purpose yards by a running back since Laurence Maroney had 333 versus Purdue in 2005.

POTTS, WILEY, WILLIAMS

Treyson Potts has been the perfect compliment to Mohamed Ibrahim, as the redshirt freshman has rushed 11 times for 112 yards and one score this year. Cam Wiley is a bigger back at 6-2, 210 pounds and has 12 carries this year for 67 yards. Bryce Williams rushed 117 times for 502 yards and four touchdowns as a true freshman in 2018 before rehshirting in 2019. Williams has not played this year, but has shown flashes in the Maroon and Gold.

LITTLE, BUT A LOT

Minnesota lost only three seniors (Tyler Johnson, Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks) on offense from last season, but all were significant contributors. Johnson is Minnesota's all-time leading receiver, while Smith is Minnesota's career record-holder for all-purpose yards and Brooks scored 22 career touchdowns.

RING THE BELL

Chris Autman-Bell has been Minnesota's No. 3 receiver each of the past two seasons, but has a larger role this year. He has played in 29 career games and has made 62 catches for 982 yards and six touchdowns. He has caught at least one pass in 28 games and has made one catch in 23 straight games. He made 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and made 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018. He also led the team with a 16.03 yards per catch average in 2018.

THE FIRST 100

Chris Autman-Bell recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game at Maryland when he caught four passes for 112 yards and one touchdown. His previous high was 97 yards (last season at Purdue).

TIGHT END TDS

▶ Minnesota tight ends were not heavily featured in the passing game last season, but have caught touchdowns in two of Minnesota's four most recent games. Bryce Witham caught a 1-yard touchdown from Seth Green in the Outback Bowl and Ko Kieft scored Minnesota's first touchdown of the season this year. The 14-yard pass from Tanner Morgan was the first touchdown of Kieft's career (38 games).

GREEN LINE

▶ Seth Green has played in 29 games, primarily as a Wildcat QB. He has rushed 109 times for 389 yards and 14 TDs. Green has completed 5-of-6 career passes for 37 yards (3 TDs) and has three career receptions (45 yards).

DRAFTED

▶ Minnesota had five players (four defense, one offense) selected in the 2020 NFL Draft. The Buccaneers took Antoine Winfield Jr. and Tyler Johnson, while the Giants picked Carter Coughlin and Chris Williamson. The Packers took Kamal Martin. The five players are the most for the Gophers in the modern-day NFL Draft, which features seven rounds. Minnesota last had five players drafted in 1990, but that is when the draft had 12 rounds.

CONSISTENT VOICE

▶ Joe Rossi took over as Gopher defensive coordinator after Minnesota's 55-31 loss at Illinois in 2018. Since then, the Gophers are 15-5. In 2019, the Gophers ranked tenth in the nation in total defense, allowing only 306.6 yards per game (fewest amount since 1977). Minnesota, which allowed only 22.5 points per game last year, was ninth in the nation in passing yards allowed (184.2) and 23rd in rushing defense (122.4). The Gophers were 17th in interceptions (14) and 24th in first downs defense (229).

FAMILY ROOM DEFENSE

 Minnesota's family room defense is replacing four NFL Draft picks and its top four tacklers from last season. Minnesota's most experienced defensive position is its secondary, despite replacing All-American safety Antoine Winfield Jr. Minnesota returns its top two corners in Coney Durr and Benjamin St-Juste, who each totaled 10 pass breakups last season. Jordan Howden, who made 57 tackles a year ago, returns at one safety spot and lanky sophomore Tyler Nubin (team-leading 21 tackles) fills Winfield's spot. Veterans Justus Harris, Calvin Swenson, Phillip Howard and Terell Smith will also provide depth.

LINED UP

Notre Dame grad transfer and lone returning starter Micah Dew-Treadway (1.0 TFL, 1 FF) anchors the rebuilt defensive line. Redshirt freshman DeAngelo Carter starts as well and has one sack and one interception - off of a Boye Mafe pass breakup - which he returned 21 yards at Maryland. Mafe has 12 tackles, 3.5 sacks and one forced fumble this year, while Esezi Otomewu has seven tackles and one sack.

IN THE MIDDLE

Mariano Sori-Marin leads a young group of linebackers this year. He made 42 tackles last season, as he saw extensive action in relief of an injured Kamal Martin. Sori-Marin has 17 tackles this season and has three pass breakups. Against Michigan, he was joined by first-time starters Josh Aune and true freshman Cody Lindenberg (has started all three games). Aune has played in 16 career games, but mostly on special teams. James Gordon (three tackles at Illinois) and Donald Willis have each played in seven career games.

KICKERS, PUNTERS

The Gophers return their starting long snapper in Brady Weeks and kicker in Michael Lantz. Lantz was second on the team in scoring last season with 71 points as a true freshman. Brock Walker added 15 points (3 FG, 6 PAT) when Lantz was injured and kicked for Minnesota in its first two games while Lantz was not available. Lantz kicked for Minnesota at Illinois and made five point-after attempts. Middle Tennessee State grad transfer Matthew Stephenson punted the first two games for Minnesota, while 26-year old freshman Mark Crawford from Australia was not available. Crawford returned at Illinois and punted once.

SOMETHING SPECIAL

Preston Jelen (5-10, 210) has turned into a special teams standout. He blocked a punt against Michigan and Minnesota scored two plays later (Morgan 14 yards to Kieft). The blocked punt was the first for the Gophers since Justus Harris did so against Indiana in 2018 (U scored a TD three plays later). Jelen also notched three tackles on special teams at Maryland.

LAST 18

Minnesota is 14-4 in its last 18 games (wins against Auburn, Fresno State, Georgia Southern, Georgia Tech, Illinois (2X), Maryland, Nebraska, Northwestern, Penn State, Purdue, Rutgers, South Dakota State and Wisconsin). Minnesota's 14-4 mark is second in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (17-1). Iowa and Wisconsin are both 13-5, while Penn State is 12-6. Indiana is 11-7, Michigan is 10-8 and Michigan State is 9-9. Northwestern is 8-10, while Nebraska and Purdue are both 7-11. Illinois is 6-12, Maryland is 5-13 and Rutgers is 3-15.

11 WINS

▶ Minnesota was one of only three Big Ten teams to win

at least 11 games last season. The Gophers finished 11-2 and were joined in the 11-win category by Ohio State (13-1) and Penn State (11-2). Minnesota beat Penn State 31-26 and did not play Ohio State.

FRIDAY, FRIDAY, FRIDAY

Minnesota is scheduled to play three Friday games – one on the road and two at home – this year. Minnesota's first Friday game was on Oct. 30 and was a 45-44 overtime loss at Maryland. The Gophers host lowa this Friday (Friday the 13th!) and Purdue on Friday, Nov. 20. Minnesota is 6-1 under head coach P.J. Fleck in non-Saturday games. It is 1-1 on Friday (beat Indiana at home in 2018, lost at Maryland in 2020), 2-0 on Wednesday (bowl wins against Auburn and Georgia Tech) and 3-0 on Thursday (beat Buffalo, New Mexico State and South Dakota State).

NEW CAOCHES

 P.J. Fleck hired three new assistants prior to the 2020 season in Mike Sanford Jr. (OC / QBs), Paul Haynes (Cornerbacks) and Chad Wilt (Defensive Line).

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. Mike Sanford Jr. (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while Paul Haynes (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. Joe Harasymiak (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. Clay Patterson (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

SPIRIT AWARD

Multiple-time cancer survivor Casey O'Brien is back for another season. O'Brien gave the keynote address at the Big Ten Football Kickoff Luncheon in July 2019 and then played against Rutgers and Maryland last season. He received the 2019 Disney Spirit Award for being college football's most inspirational figure.

CALLING CARD

Two hallmarks of a P.J. Fleck team have been controlling the clock and playing clean football. Minnesota ended 2019 ranked fourth in the nation in time of possession at 34:12 and tied for fifth in fewest penalties per game at 4.31. Minnesota won the time of possession battle against Michigan and at Maryland and took fewer penalties than both the Wolverines and Terrapins. However, the Gophers lost both games. Minnesota righted the ship against Illinois (37:35 possession time and only two penalties) as it won 41-14.

AWAY FROM HOME

 Minnesota is 8-2 in its last 10 games away from TCF Bank Stadium.

100 YARDS

Minnesota is 15-4 under Coach Fleck when it has a 100-yard rusher. However, it is 1-2 this year.

SCORING FIRST

 Minnesota is 20-3 all-time under Coach Fleck when it scores first.

NONCONFERENCE WINS

 Minnesota has won a nation-leading 19-straight nonconference games. The Gophers last nonconference loss was to No. 2 TCU in 2015.
