FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Coming off the team's bye week, Minnesota (3-3, 1-2 B1G) is back in action this week with a road trip to No. 24/23 Iowa (6-1, 3-1 B1G). Kickoff at Kinnick Stadium is set for 2:30 p.m. on NBC.

2 Saturday marks the 117th all-time matchup between Minnesota and Iowa, and it's also the 89th battle for Floyd of Rosedale, a 15.5-inch high, 21-inch long bronze statue of a prized hog (a full history of which can be found on Page 43). First played for in 1935, the all-time series record for Floyd of Rosedale could not be much closer as the Hawkeyes hold a slight lead at 44-42-2.

3 With Iowa ranked 24th in the AP Poll, Saturday marks the third contest against a ranked opponent for Minnesota this season. Previously the Gophers lost at then-No. 20 North Carolina on Sept. 16 and last time out vs. No. 2 Michigan on Oct. 7. The Gophers are looking to snap a five-game losing streak to ranked opponents, last defeating then-No. 18 Wisconsin in 2021. Minnesota is also aiming to end a 13-game losing skid to ranked opponents on the road, with its most recent victory coming at then-No. 21 Nebraska in 2014. The Golden Gophers are 4-10 all-time against ranked Iowa squads and 1-5 when taking on the No. 24 team in the AP Poll.

4 Minnesota enters Saturday's game coming off a bye. Excluding the 2020 season that was disrupted due to COVID, the Golden Gophers are 3-3 under **P.J. Fleck** when coming off a regular season bye. The Golden Gophers lost to Maryland in 2017 (31-24) and Iowa in 2018 (48-31) but then won three in a row by posting wins in 2019 at Purdue (38-31) and Penn State (31-26), and against Nebraska in 2021 (30-23). Last season, the Gophers fell at Illinois, 26-14. Minnesota is 6-1 all-time against Iowa after having the prior week off from play. The most recent matchup was a loss in 2018, but before that the Gophers won the meetings in 2014, 2010, 2000, 1931, 1923 and 1901 when they were coming off a bye week.

5 The 2023 campaign is the seventh for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, where his record is 47-30. He is fifth in program history for overall wins and Big Ten wins (27) and sixth in games coached (77). Fleck's .610 win percentage is third best among the Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 11th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 77-52 (.597).



Tyler Nubin is Minnesota's highest-graded defender this year, earning an 82.2 mark from Pro Football Focus. With 11 career interceptions, including a team-high three this year, he is one away from tying the Gophers' school record.

Minnesota is 6-1 all-time against Iowa when it is coming off a bye. Below is a list of those games.

A WIN WOULD...

- Snap a seven-game losing streak to Iowa and bring Floyd of Rosedale back to Minnesota for the first time since 2014
- End a streak of 10 consecutive road losses to Iowa and be the first win in Iowa City since 1999
- Move Minnesota to 63-52-2 all-time against Iowa, including 43-44-2 when playing for Floyd of Rosedale
- Be the first for Minnesota over a ranked opponent since beating No. 18 Wisconsin in 2021, a span of five games
- Bring to an end a 13-game road losing streak to ranked teams with the last victory coming at No. 21 Nebraska in 2014
- Keep the Gophers with a .500 or better winning percentage following a game for the 32nd straight contest
- Enhance Fleck's record to 48-30 at Minnesota and 78-52 overall

FACING IOWA

- Minnesota and Iowa meet for the 117th time on Saturday, and the Gophers lead the all-time series, 62-52-2. The teams have met every year since 1931.
- The Golden Gophers' 62 wins against the Hawkeyes are tied for their most against any one program, also beating Wisconsin 62 times. The 116 matchups with the Hawkeyes are second after 132 games with the Badgers.
- Minnesota is looking to snap an eight-game losing streak in the series, last winning in 2014. The games have mostly been close, however, as six of the eight losses have been by seven points or less.
- The current stretch is the Gophers' longest losing streak all-time in the series and their second-longest active losing streak behind a 12-game mark against Ohio State.
- In Iowa City, Minnesota trails 23-32-1 record in the series. The Golden Gophers have not won at Kinnick Stadium since 1999, a streak of 10 games, which is their longest active winless stretch away from home.
- The 56 games played at Iowa are their second most at any school after 65 games played at Wisconsin, while the 23 wins are Minnesota's third most at a single one team behind Northwestern (25) and Wisconsin (24).
- With the game taking place on Oct. 21, this is the earliest in the season that the two teams are meeting since 2018 when they played on Oct. 6.
- P.J. Fleck is looking for his first win against Iowa as a head coach. He's 0-6 at Minnesota and 0-7 overall.

- Minnesota has one Iowa native on its roster in redshirt junior TE **Frank Bierman**, who hails from Tipton (about 35 minutes northeast of Iowa City) and Tipton HS. Bierman also attended Iowa Western CC for two seasons.
- The Hawkeyes have one Minnesotan on their roster in junior DL **Yahya Black** (Marshall, Marshall HS).
- Iowa enters the game with a 6-1 record overall and a 3-1 mark in the Big Ten, putting itself in first place in the B1G West. The Hawkeyes opened the season with three straight wins, suffered a 31-0 shutout at Penn State, and have since won three in a row.
- Deacon Hill has started the past two contests for Iowa at quarterback after starter Cade McNamara suffered a season-ending injury against Michigan State. Hill has completed 27-of-70 passes for 311 yards and two touchdowns against two interceptions for a rating of 79.6.
- Leshon Williams is the top Iowa running back with 459 yards (65.6 yards per game) and a touchdown on 75 carries, while Kaleb Johnson is behind him at 65.0 yards per game with 260 yards and two touchdowns on 68 carries in four games. Kamari Moulton is tied with Johnson for the team lead with two rushing touchdowns.
- Iowa's leading receiver is tight end **Erick All**, but he was carted off the field last week at Wisconsin, leaving his status in doubt for Saturday. All has team highs in receptions (21), receiving yards (299) and receiving touchdowns (3), while no other player has more than 10 receptions, 131 receiving yards or one touchdown catch.
- Defensively, Jay Higgins leads the team with 87 tackles, while his 12.4 tackles per game is first in the Big Ten and second nationally. He's also tied for the team lead with three pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

- Joe Evans has team highs in tackles for loss (6.5), sacks (2.5) and quarterback hurries (7). Sebastian Castro's three interceptions are most on the team, and he is tied with Higgins and Cooper DeJean with a team-best three PBUs.
- Tory Taylor is averaging a Big Ten-best 48.3 yards per punt (fourth best nationally) with 19 kicks of 50+ yards and 17 downed inside the 20. Drew Stevens is 12-of-15 on field goals with all three misses coming from 41 yards and beyond. His 1.71 field goals made per game leads the Big Ten and ranks 17th nationally. DeJean has a punt return for a touchdown and is averaging 13.0 yards per return.

LAST TIME VS. THE HAWKEYES

- *With assistance from the AP:* Drew Stevens made a 21-yard field goal with 28 seconds left to lift Iowa over Minnesota for a 13-10 victory last season in Minneapolis.
- Jack Campbell caused a fumble and came up with an interception off a tipped pass to thwart Minnesota drives in the closing minutes for Iowa.
- **Mohamed Ibrahim** trampled a dominant Hawkeyes defense by rushing for a career-high 263 yards and a touchdown on 39 carries, but the sixth-year star lost just his second fumble of the season with 5:07 remaining on a third-and-4 run that would've given the Gophers a first down at the 9. Campbell knocked the ball out, and Deontae Craig recovered it.
- Minnesota forced a three-and-out and took over at its 45 with 4:11 to go, when Ibrahim ripped a 19-yard run off the right side to put the Gophers right back in scoring range.
- But on third-and-7 from the 33, **Athan Kaliakmanis** — making his third career start — threw a slant to fellow redshirt freshman **La'Meke Brockington** that Riley Moss reached to deflect. Campbell snagged it in the air, returned it 30 yards and almost scored; but his right foot was ruled out at the 45.
- Spencer Petras, who scored on a first-quarter quarterback sneak and went 15 for 24 for 221 yards, hit Luke Lachey for 33 yards on the next play. That put the Hawkeyes well within range for their freshman kicker, who made a 38-yarder in the first quarter.
- **Matthew Trickett** hit a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter for Minnesota, but he pulled a 34-yard try wide right with 38 seconds left before halftime. On the previous play, Kaliakmanis rolled left on third-and-1 and, under pressure by Campbell, missed a wide-open **Brevyn Spann-Ford** at the sideline. Moss almost intercepted the throw that went near the goal line.

PREVIOUSLY IN IOWA CITY

- *With assistance from the AP:* Alex Padilla threw for two touchdowns and ran for another, and No. 19 Iowa withstood three fourth-quarter comeback attempts to beat Minnesota 27-22 in 2021 in Iowa City.
- Padilla completed 11 of 24 passes for 206 yards. He had a 1-yard touchdown dive in the second quarter, then had touchdown passes of 72 yards to Charlie Jones in the third quarter and 27 yards to Keagan Johnson in the fourth.
- The Hawkeyes led 24-16 before Minnesota's **Tanner Morgan** threw a 68-yard touchdown pass to **Chris Autman-Bell** with 5:28 to play. The Gophers went for the two-point conversion, but Morgan's pass was tipped by Iowa safety Dane Belton and fell incomplete.
- The Gophers got the ball back at their own 10-yard line with 3:08 left. Morgan was sacked for a 7-yard loss on second down, and his fourth-down pass was broken up by Iowa's Matt Hankins. Caleb Shudak's 29-yard field goal provided the final margin, and then the Hawkeyes' defense bowed up one more time when Minnesota drove to the Iowa 39. The game ended with Joe Evans sacking Morgan.

► Minnesota had a chance to take the lead down 17-16 to start the fourth quarter, but **Dragan Kesich's** 53-yard field-goal attempt was blocked by Logan Lee. Five plays later, Johnson took a short pass from Padilla and turned it into a 27-yard touchdown.

► The Gophers, who had the ball for 40 minutes, had 189 rushing yards against a Hawkeyes defense that came into the game ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense at 98.6 yards per game. **Ky Thomas** rushed for 126 yards to lead the Gophers.

► **Matthew Trickett** had three field goals for the Gophers. Minnesota's other touchdown came in the second quarter on backup quarterback **Cole Kramer's** 37-yard pass to tight end **Ko Kieft**.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. IOWA

► Nov. 8, 2014: **Maxx Williams** caught three of **Mitch Leidner's** four touchdown passes, and Minnesota ran for 291 yards in a romp past Iowa 51-14 in their last victory in the series. The Minnesota defense forced three turnovers, including an interception and a fumble, and had four sacks.

► Nov. 20, 1999: Trailing 21-10 at halftime, Minnesota outscored Iowa 15-0 in the second half for a 25-21 victory, its last in Iowa City. **Billy Cockerham** ran for 122 yards and threw for 175 more with one touchdown. **Arland Bruce's** 73-yard touchdown run with just over 9:00 remaining proved to be the winning score. **Tyrone Carter** had 16 tackles in the win and the defense forced an interception, a lost fumble and had four sacks.

► Oct. 21, 1972: **John King** ran for 173 yards and tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns in a 43-14 win in Minneapolis. **Doug Beaudoin** added 135 yards on the ground as the Gophers had their biggest win over the Hawkeyes since a 55-7 victory in 1949.

RECAPPING MICHIGAN

► *With assistance from the AP:* Will Johnson returned an interception 36 yards for a Michigan score on Minnesota's second snap, a spark the second-ranked Wolverines maintained from start to finish in a 52-10 victory over the Gophers on Saturday night.

► J.J. McCarthy completed 14 of 20 passes for 219 yards and had a career-high two rushing touchdowns to help Michigan stretch its conference winning streak to 17 for the second-longest run in program history.

► Keon Sabb had a 28-yard touchdown return of an interception in the third quarter, giving the Wolverines a pair of pick-sixes in a game for the first time since Sept. 9, 2017, against Cincinnati. Sabb's leaping grab of a third down throw by **Athan Kaliakmanis** gave Michigan a 45-10 lead that earned McCarthy the rest of the game off while Jack Tuttle and Jayden Denegal split the fourth quarter.

► Kaliakmanis went 5 for 16 for 52 yards and a 35-yard touchdown pass to **Daniel Jackson** late in the second quarter. Kaliakmanis took two sacks and was overwhelmed by Michigan's deep, fast and punishing defense, starting on the second play from scrimmage when he dropped back and tried to throw to Jackson near the sideline. The ball sailed high enough for Johnson to break on it and race untouched into the end zone.

► Blake Corum had 69 rushing yards and a score on a season-low nine carries. Leon Franklin added a late rushing touchdown and Michigan outgained Minnesota 432-169 in total yards. The Wolverines topped the 30-point mark for a program-record ninth straight game.

► Though the Wolverines let an opponent hit double digits for the first time this year, their defense — which leads the FBS with an average of 6.7 points allowed per game — again had plenty to be proud of. Defensive tackle Mason Graham returned from a two-game injury absence with a heavily wrapped left hand and had a team-high six tackles.

► Minnesota got on the board in the first quarter with a 54-yard field goal from **Dragan Kesich**, tying for the fifth longest in program history.

MILESTONE WATCH

► With 11 career interceptions, **Tyler Nubin** needs one more to tie the school record shared by **Sean Lumpkin** and **Jeff Wright**.

► With 96 career receptions, **Daniel Jackson** is 4 away from becoming the 18th Gopher to reach 100 for his career. If he hits the mark Saturday, he would do it in the 36th game of his career, tying him for the ninth fewest games needed to reach 100 career receptions in Gophers history.

► Sitting at 1,993 career receiving yards, including 1,761 from his time at Western Michigan, **Corey Crooms Jr.** is 7 away from 2,000 for his career.

► **Chris Autman-Bell** needs 30 receiving yards to get to 2,000 for his career, which would make him the ninth player at Minnesota to reach the milestone. He also needs five receptions to tie **Drew Wolitarsky** and **Omar Douglas** for 10th all-time.

► Holding 1,351 career receiving yards, including 1,324 recorded at Charlotte, **Elijah Spencer** needs 149 to hit 1,500 for his career.

► **Brevyn Spann-Ford** needs one reception to pass **Ben Utecht** (83) for sole possession of second place all-time among Minnesota tight ends. Spann-Ford also needs 31 receiving yards to tie **Doug Kingsriter** (919) for fourth among Gopher TEs and 112 to reach 1,000 for his career.

IN THE POLLS

► Minnesota is not receiving votes in either the AP Poll or Coaches Poll for the fifth straight week. The Gophers had been receiving votes heading into each of its first three games this year.

► Four Gophers opponents appear in the Oct. 15 polls. Michigan was No. 2 in both polls, while Ohio State was ranked third in each. Meanwhile, North Carolina was 10th in both polls, while Iowa was No. 24 according to the AP and 23rd as voted on by the coaches.

ATTENDANCE SOARING

► Through four home games, Minnesota's attendance figures this year are among the best in the young history of Huntington Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009.

► With two sellouts in the books, the Golden Gophers now have five during **P.J. Fleck's** tenure, and 21 in the stadium's history.

► Minnesota played its season opener in front of a sold-out, gold-out crowd of 53,629. It was the fifth largest crowd in Huntington Bank Stadium history and the first sellout since the 2021 season opener.

► Minnesota followed that up in their second and third home games with crowds of 48,101 and 46,843, respectively. Those figures marked the largest attendance figures for the second and third home games of a season since 2015.

► Against No. 2 Michigan, the Gophers announced another sellout crowd at 52,719, the ninth largest attendance in stadium annals. Like the prior two games, it was the most people to see the fourth home game since 2015.

► The attendance of 200,752 is the best four-game stretch at Minnesota since the final four games of the 2015 season (205,597).

► It's the third best start to a season attendance-wise in stadium history with only 2015 (214,949) and 2009 (203,220) having more fans through four home games.

OPPORTUNISTIC SCHEDULE

► Minnesota faces one of the most difficult, or opportunistic, schedules in the FBS this year. On3.com ranked it in the preseason as the second toughest slate, while Phil Steele had it seventh.

► Minnesota's 2023 opponents combined to go 89-67 in 2022. Seven teams won at least eight games last year, four won at least nine and Michigan (13) and Ohio State (11) each reached double digits.

► Gopher opponents in 2023 posted a .571 win percentage last year, that ranks third in the Big Ten behind Michigan State (.627) and Ohio State (.610). However, both of those teams do face one FCS opponent this year.

► Nine of the Gophers' 2023 opponents played in a bowl game last year, including Michigan, which reached the College Football Playoff. No Big Ten team faces more teams that made a bowl game last year than the Gophers.

► Four of Minnesota's 2023 opponents were ranked in both preseason polls, while two appeared in one each.

► The five opponents in the preseason AP Poll were tied for the most in the country along with 11 other teams.

► This will be the first time since 2015 that the Gophers face Michigan and Ohio State in the same season.

KALIAKMANIS' TURN AT QB

► With **Tanner Morgan** departing the program after six seasons, redshirt sophomore **Athan Kaliakmanis** is the starting quarterback for Minnesota in 2023.

► In six games this year, Kaliakmanis has completed 76-of-136 passes for 797 yards with six touchdowns and six interceptions. Of his 60 incompletions, 10 have been deemed "drops" by Pro Football Focus. The drop percentage of 11.6 ranks 22nd in the FBS.

► The Antioch, Ill., native has had an up-and-down season to date. Through three games, Kaliakmanis was 45-of-88 (51.1%) for 446 yards and one touchdown against three interceptions, resulting in a passer rating of 90.6. But over the next two contests, he was 26-of-33 (78.8%) for 299 yards, four touchdowns and one interception, tallying a rating of 266.60. His most recent stat line against Michigan saw him complete 5-of-15 passes for 52 yards and a touchdown against two interceptions.

► He has had two of his three highest career passer ratings as a starter this season. At Northwestern, Kaliakmanis completed 14-of-19 passes for 153 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions for a rating of 176.1, which at the time was the second highest passer rating of his career. He followed that against Louisiana by going 12-of-14 for 146 yards, two touchdowns and a pick for a career-best 206.2 rating. His completion percentage of .857 was the fourth best at Minnesota since 1979 (min. 10 completions).

► In the 2023 opener, Kaliakmanis was 24-of-44 for 196 yards and a touchdown with one interception against Nebraska. His completion total was a career high and the most for a Gopher since Morgan completed 25 passes at Iowa in 2019. Kaliakmanis' 44 attempts were also a career best and the most at Minnesota since **Mitch Leidner** attempted 44 passes at Ohio State in 2015.

► Kaliakmanis played in 11 games with five starts last year as Morgan missed time due to injury. Kaliakmanis was 60-of-111 (54.1%) for 846 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions for a rating of 127.4.

► Looking just at his five starts last year, Kaliakmanis' numbers improved to 49-of-88 (55.7%) for 725 yards with three touchdowns and two picks for a rating of 131.6.

► In the final game of the regular season against Wisconsin and bowl game against Syracuse (which he left in the second quarter due to injury), he was even better. He completed 26 of 38 passes (68.4%) for 399 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 173.99 rating.

► Kaliakmanis made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards. Over the last 45 seasons, 31 QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.

► The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was **Conor Rhoda** at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was **MarQueis Gray** at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first start since **Andy Persby** started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.

► Kaliakmanis replaced an injured Morgan in the second half at Nebraska, completing 6-of-12 passes for 137 yards and rushing three times for 27 yards. Minnesota was down 10-0 when Kaliakmanis entered the game and he helped led the Gophers to a 20-13 victory.

► Kaliakmanis then started the final four games of the season, including a masterful performance in the regular season finale against Wisconsin that saw him win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.

► In a 23-16 comeback win in Madison, Kaliakmanis set career highs in completions (19 - since been passed), attempts (29 - since been passed), passing yards (319) and touchdowns (2). He completed nine passes of 15 yards or more and averaged 16.8 yards per completion, as Minnesota rallied from a 16-13 fourth-quarter deficit to retain Paul Bunyan's Axe.

TAYLOR TAKES RB REINS

► True freshman running back **Darius Taylor** has missed the Gophers' last two contests, which seems to be the only way to slow him down this season.

► Despite missing two games and receiving just one carry for three yards in the season opener, Taylor has rushed 87 times for 532 yards (6.11 per carry) and four touchdowns. He's also caught six passes for 56 yards.

► His 133.0 rushing yards per game would lead the Big Ten and rank second in the country if he played enough games to qualify (75% needed), while his 147.00 all-purpose yards per game would also lead the conference and be fifth nationally. He also remains fourth in the Big Ten in rushing yards and seventh in rushing touchdowns.

► Prior to his injury, Taylor was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week for the third straight week after a standout performance at Northwestern. Taylor had 216 all-purpose yards at Northwestern as he rushed for 198 yards and had 18 yards receiving. His 216 all-purpose yards came in his fourth career game and ranked 44th in school history. It was his second game this season with more than 200 all-purpose yards as he also had 206 against Eastern Michigan.

► He was the first Gopher ever to receive Big Ten Freshman of the Week three straight weeks and the second ever to be honored three times in a season, joining **Shannon Brooks**, who did it in 2015. Taylor is the first Big Ten player to receive the honor three straight weeks since Wisconsin's running back Jonathan Taylor in 2017.

► Taylor made his Gopher debut with one carry for three yards against Nebraska and followed that with a monster performance against Eastern Michigan, rushing for 193 yards and a touchdown on 33 carries. His numbers in a 25-6 win netted him Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. His 193 yards were second most in school history for a true freshman, behind only **Darrell Thompson's** 205 yards against Bowling Green in 1986. Taylor rushed eight times for 44 yards in the first half before logging 25 carries for 149 yards in the second half. He added 13 receiving yards to finish the game with 206 all-purpose yards.

► Taylor followed that Eastern Michigan performance by gaining 138 yards and scoring one touchdown on 22 carries at No. 20 North Carolina to earn his second straight Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He also caught one pass for 25 yards. He was the first Minnesota true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in consecutive games since the 2021 season and just the second to do so since 2003.

► The 198 yards at Northwestern currently ranks as the 14th highest rushing total in the FBS this season and the best by a freshman, while the 193 yards versus EMU stands as the 19th-best overall. Taylor is one of three players in the country to have multiple games this year against FBS foes with at least 190 yards rushing along with North Carolina's Omarion Hampton and Boise State's Ashton Jeanty.

► With his three straight 100-yard rushing games, Taylor became the first Minnesota true freshman to accomplish the feat since **Laurence Maroney** in 2003.

► Taylor's offensive grade of 86.1 from Pro Football Focus is best on the team, is second among Big Ten running backs this year and ranks 12th nationally.

► Taylor has tallied 346 yards after contact this year according to PFF, which ranks third in the Big Ten and is 25th in the nation. He's also forced 24 missed tackles, tied for 36th in the country and is fourth most in the conference.

► High school teammates with fellow freshman QB **Drew Viotto** at Lake Western High School in Walled Lake, Mich., Taylor was ranked by Rivals as a four-star prospect, the No. 6 player in Michigan and the No. 12 running back in the nation. A January enrollee, Taylor rushed 268 times for 2,450 yards and 36 touchdowns a senior.

JACKSON STEPS UP

► The team's top receiver last year, **Daniel Jackson** is continuing his stellar play in 2023 with team highs in targets (43), targets per game (7.2), receptions (22), receiving yards (286), receiving yards per game (47.7) and touchdown catches (5). He's also the team leader in yards after catch (81) and YAC per game (13.5) and is second in yards per catch (13.0).

► Jackson has been Minnesota's top receiver in four of six games this season and has the three longest receptions on the year, as well.

► In the season opener against Nebraska, Jackson posted career highs in targets (16) and receptions (9) and led the team in receiving yards (68) and touchdown receptions (1). Most of his production came in the second half against the Huskers where he turned 12 targets, including nine in the fourth quarter alone, into six catches for 41 yards and a highlight-reel 13-yard touchdown catch on fourth down to tie the game with 2:32 to play.

► After two catches for 42 yards total against Eastern Michigan and North Carolina, he bounced back at Northwestern with four receptions for 53 yards and his second TD of the season.

► He followed that up against Louisiana with five catches for 89 yards (most by a Gopher this year) and two TDs. It was the third multi-touchdown game of his career, and his first since having two in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl.

► He added his fifth TD of the season, matching his total from last season, with a 35-yard score against Michigan.

► He now has 11 career TD receptions, one of 19 in Gopher history to reach that number. He's also 20th all-time at Minnesota with 1,243 career receiving yards.

► Last year Jackson led the team with 5.5 targets per game, 557 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions. It was the most yards for a Gopher since 2019. Jackson was the team's leading receiver six times last season, most on the squad.

► He was also second in overall targets (60), receptions (37), receiving yards per game (50.6) and yards after catch (187), and third in YAC per game (17.0).

► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.

CROOMS JR. FITTING RIGHT IN

► Six games into his Gopher career, **Corey Crooms Jr.** has emerged as a top target on offense. He is second on the team in receptions (19), receiving yards (227), receiving yards per game (37.8), targets (34), targets per game 5.7, yards after catch (69) and YAC per game (11.5).

► He began the season as the only Gopher to have at least 30 receiving yards and two catches in each of the first five contests.

► Against Nebraska, Crooms Jr. was second on the team in targets (13), receptions (7) and receiving yards (63). He was then the top receiver against both Eastern Michigan (3-45) and North Carolina (4-46) before finishing second in yards at Northwestern (42) and versus Louisiana (31).

► According to PFF, his receiving grade is 72.4 and offensive grade is 70.8. The former is best on the team and 15th among Big Ten wide receivers, while the latter is best among the Minnesota wide receivers and fourth among the skill players.

► Crooms Jr., who has one year of eligibility left, spent the past four seasons at Western Michigan. He made 115 catches for 1,766 yards and 12 touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos.

► He had 57 catches for 814 yards and five touchdowns last season, including five 100-yard receiving games as he was named Second Team All-MAC. He ranked fifth in 2022 in the MAC with a receiving grade of 75.8 from PFF.

TOP TIGHT END TARGET

► A preseason All-American by PFF and a member of the Mackey Award Watch List, **Brevyn Spann-Ford** entered the season as one of the top tight end prospects in the country.

► The only Gopher to have a catch in every game this season, Spann-Ford currently ranks third on the team in total targets (23), targets per contest (3.8), receptions (13) and receiving yards (66).

► In the season opener, Spann-Ford tied a career high with eight targets and posted five catches for 45 yards.

► Last year he led the team in targets (61), receptions (42), yards after catch (245) and YAC per game (18.8), and he was second in receiving yards (497) and touchdown receptions (2).

► His 42 receptions were second most in Gophers history for a tight end, while his 497 receiving yards were fifth best. He became the first tight end to lead the team in receptions since **Maxx Williams** in 2014, while the reception total was the highest for a Gopher since 2019.

► Spann-Ford was targeted at least two times in every game last year, the only Gopher to make that claim. He was also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game in 2022.

► At Wisconsin, he set career highs in receptions and receiving yards as he had seven catches for 95 yards.

► According to PFF, Spann-Ford ranked as the No. 3 tight end in the country last year with an overall grade of 90.0, and he was the No. 5 run-blocking tight end at 82.5.

YEAR 7 FOR NO. 7

► Seventh-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury last year against Colorado, missing the final 10 games of 2022.

► After being back in the starting lineup for the season opener against Nebraska, he missed the Eastern Michigan game but came back to play at North Carolina. He's since missed the last three contests. On the year, he's played eight snaps according to PFF with two targets his way and is looking for his first reception.

► Autman-Bell played just one snap against the Huskers and saw his streak of games with at least one catch end at 41. It was the third longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

► Through three games last year (before his injury) Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and was tied for the lead in touchdown catches (1).

► Autman-Bell has played in 50 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

NEW FACES BOOST SKILL GROUPS

► Of the 11 transfers Minnesota brought in this offseason, three are on offense and they're aiming to boost the skill positions.

► Like the aforementioned Crooms Jr., running back **Sean Tyler** came in from Western Michigan with one year of eligibility left, while wideout **Elijah Spencer** joined the Gophers from Charlotte with two to play. All three were early enrollees in January.

► Tyler has played in five games this year with starts in the first two contests. He is second on the team in rushing attempts (46) and rushing yards (199), and is third in yards per rush (4.3) and rushing yards per game (39.8).

► Against Eastern Michigan, Tyler rushed for a season-high 93 yards on 17 carries. Against Louisiana, he went over the 3,000 career rushing yard mark, making him one of four active players in the FBS to reach that number at the time.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 18-8 (.692) away from home, including three bowl wins. Five of the eight losses came against ranked teams and the other three went to overtime. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the only Big Ten team with more wins or a higher win percentage away from home is Ohio State at 23-4 (.882). ► Tyler was Crooms Jr.'s teammate the last four years at WMU, rushing 495 times for 2,820 yards (5.7 avg.) and 23 touchdowns, catching 43 passes for 338 yards and three scores, and averaging 23.9 yards on 40 kickoff returns with three touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos. He also had 10 100-yard rushing games.

► In 2022, Tyler was named Second Team All-MAC as he led the conference and ranked ninth nationally with 146.83 all-purpose yards per game. He rushed 209 times for 1,097 yards and seven touchdowns and caught 12 passes for 111 yards and another score.

► Crooms Jr., and Tyler both have familiarity with Gophers co-OC and quarterbacks coach **Greg Harbaugh**, who was WMU's wide receivers coach from 2021-22.

► Spencer has played in all six games and recorded three receptions for 27 yards.

► He played the last two seasons at Charlotte where he made 85 catches for 1,324 yards and 15 touchdowns. Last season he hauled in 57 catches for 943 yards and nine touchdowns and was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. He was the fifth-ranked WR in Conference USA with a grade of 81.0 from PFF.

► In 2021, Spencer recorded 28 receptions for 381 yards and six touchdowns en route to being named Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a member of the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

EVANS THE LATEST BIG FOTW

► Freshman running back **Zach Evans** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after rushing 15 times for 85 yards and one touchdown in Minnesota's Homecoming win against Louisiana.

► Evans saw his first action of the season on Sept. 30 and averaged 5.7 yards per carry with his longest rush of the day being an 18-yard touchdown run. It was the second career game for Evans, who made his Minnesota debut last season against Northwestern where he rushed six times for 29 yards and one score.

► It was the fourth straight week that a Gopher earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors as Evans followed true freshman running back **Darius Taylor**, who received the honor the previous three weeks. The last Big Ten team to accomplish the feat was Ohio State in 2021 when it won the honor six times in a row.

► This is the first time that Minnesota has had two different running backs named Big Ten Freshman of the Week in the same season, the first season that Minnesota has had two different Big Ten Freshman of the Week winners since 2021 (**Justin Walley** and **Bucky Irving**), and it is the first time that Minnesota has had multiple offensive student-athletes earn the honor since 2018 (**Rashod Bateman**, **Mohamed Ibrahim** and **Tanner Morgan**).

► Evans has played in two games this year and has 130 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries. He's also got one reception for 13 yards. His 65.0 rushing yards per game and 6.5 yards per carry rank second on the team

ROUNDING OUT THE RB ROOM

► After **Darius Taylor**, **Sean Tyler** and **Zach Evans**, Minnesota has a mix of older and newer faces in the running backs room.

► The most veteran presence is **Bryce Williams**, a sixth-year back who has played in 43 career games. He's played in four games this year (missed two due to injury) and rushed 36 times for 123 yards and a TD.

► At Northwestern, Williams became the 48th player in Minnesota history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards. His career total now stands at 1,097.

► Other returners from last year include redshirt sophomore **Jordan Nubin** and redshirt freshman **Max Grand**. The two combined for 15 carries for 38 yards last season, while Nubin is the only one of the two to get a carry this year with six attempts for 25 yards.

► An additional back is true freshman **Marquese Williams**, who has not played yet this year. He was rated a consensus three-star prospect out of Bishop McDevitt High School in Harrisburg, Pa. He was ranked as the No. 29 running back in the country and the 12th-ranked player in the state of Pennsylvania by Rivals. Williams ran for 4,465 yards and 71 touchdowns on 545 carries (8.2 yards per carry, and caught 47 passes for 655 yards and 10 more touchdowns in his career.

O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota has used the same starting lineup on the offensive line through four games with **Aireontae Eersery** at left tackle, **Tyler Cooper** at left guard, **Nathan Boe** at center, **Martes Lewis** at right guard and **Quinn Carroll** at right tackle.

► Eersery is the top graded lineman by PFF for the Big Ten at 82.9. That grade also ranks eighth among FBS tackles and 11th for all offensive linemen. Eersery is third in the Big Ten in run blocking grade (81.3) and 21st in pass blocking grade (76.1).

► Cooper has earned the top pass-blocking grade on the team at 84.3, a figure that ranks second among Big Ten guards, is fourth overall in the league and is 21st for FBS guards.

► As a unit, the Gophers are fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 15th in the FBS with 4.00 tackles for loss allowed per game, while the TFL yardage lost of 67 yards is tied with Michigan for fewest in the Big Ten and fourth in the country. Minnesota's O-line is also 24th overall by allowing 1.33 sacks per game. The sack yardage lost is only 37 yards, which ranks 13th in the FBS and third in the B1G.

► In addition to the regular starting five, true freshman **Greg Johnson** has seen 114 snaps after making his collegiate debut at left guard at North Carolina. Johnson is the first true freshman to play on the offensive line for Minnesota since Eersery started against Nebraska in 2020.

► Sixth-year senior **Karter Shaw** has also seen 17 snaps across six games.

► Minnesota, which boasts 79 career starts on the offensive line, has had to replace three of its five starters from a year ago. The Golden Gophers used the same starting five on the offensive line in the first 12 games of last season with Eersery at left tackle, **Axel Ruschmeyer** at left guard, **John Michael Schmitz** at center, **Chuck Filiaga** at right guard and Carroll at right tackle. Boe replaced Schmitz at center for the bowl game.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as in years past, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 20 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, half are entering their third year at least at Minnesota, while 18 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

BROCKINGTON OUT FOR YEAR

► Redshirt sophomore wideout **Le'Meke Brockington** saw his season come to an end after an injury sustained in the Louisiana contest on Sept. 30. He had appeared in all five games with four starts.

► Brockington was targeted nine times on the season and had five catches for 73 yards and a touchdown. His 14.6 yards per catch was leading Minnesota.

► The regular season finale last year at Wisconsin was a breakout game for Brockington. He had his second consecutive multi-reception game as he caught two passes for a career-high 52 yards. His 45-yard touchdown reception with 3:40 to play was the first of his career and turned out to be the game-winner as it broke a 16-16 tie.

► Brockington, who made four starts last year, was targeted just 20 times, but 11 of those came in the last three games. In addition, six of his 11 receptions on the year came in the final three contests.

GOPHERS 'D' CONSISTENTLY AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota has boasted one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi** over the last few seasons.

► The Gophers had one of the top units in the country early in the season but have stumbled since then. Minnesota has dropped from the No. 8 total defense (223.5) through two weeks to No. 63 (373.2 yards per game). In addition, Minnesota has gone from third in pass yards allowed (92.5 ypg) to 82nd (235.3 ypg) and fifth in opponent pass efficiency (79.08) to 87th (139.67).

► Against Nebraska, the Gophers held the Huskers to 295 yards of total offense, including just 114 through the air. In addition, the Golden Gophers forced four Nebraska turnovers (3 INTs, 1 fumble) in the opener. It was the most turnovers forced in a game by the Gophers since forcing Wisconsin into four giveaways in 2018. The three interceptions were the team's most since hitting that same number against Penn State in 2019.

► Minnesota followed that up in Week 2 against Eastern Michigan with just 81 rush yards and 71 pass yards. It was the third time since the start of last season that Minnesota held an opponent under both 100 yards rushing and passing, which ranks second in the FBS behind Penn State in that span.

► Last year, the Golden Gophers ranked eighth in the country by allowing 295.1 total yards per contest. They also had the No. 4 defense in terms of scoring (13.8 ppg), and No. 15 in passing yards allowed (186.1) and rush defense (109.0). Minnesota, Air Force, Illinois, and Iowa were the only teams in the FBS that ranked in the top 20 in each of those categories.

► In fact, over the last two seasons, Minnesota is the only team in the country to finish each season ranked in the top 15 of total, scoring, rush and passing defense.

► Since the start of the 2021 season, Minnesota has held 19 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game, tied for fourth in the FBS behind Georgia (21), Michigan (20) and Wisconsin (20).

► Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing eight times since the start of 2021, the third most in the country in that span after Texas A&M (9) and Toledo (9).

► Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 20 opponents to 16 points or fewer, fourth most in the nation behind only Georgia (25), Iowa (21) and Michigan (21).

► Holding Eastern Michigan to six points on Sept. 9 marked the eighth time since the start of 2022 that Minnesota has held an opponent to 10 points or less. That's tied for fifth in the country in that time behind only Michigan (13), Iowa (11), Georgia (9) and Air Force (9).

FORCING THE ISSUE

► Through six games, the Gophers have forced three fumbles (recovered two of them), and recorded eight interceptions. The 10 turnovers recorded ranks tied for 47th nationally and tied for sixth in the Big Ten.

► The eight interceptions rank even higher as they're tied for 19th in the FBS and for third in the conference. Six of the eight interceptions came in the first three games, the most interceptions in a three-game span for Minnesota since recording eight against Rutgers, Maryland and Penn State in 2019.

► The Gophers have three games this year with at least two interceptions, one back of the seven FBS teams that have four such games this season.

► Tyler Nubin leads the team and is tied for 12th nationally with three interceptions. Jack Henderson has a pair of picks, while **Chris Collins**, **Tre'Von Jones** and **Devon Williams** each have one.

NUBIN BACK FOR ONE MORE

► Coming off a year where he earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors, safety **Tyler Nubin** is back for a fifth season at Minnesota in 2023.

► On the season, Nubin has 27 tackles, three interceptions and a pass breakup. His defensive grade of 82.2 from PFF leads the Gophers, is ninth in the Big Ten overall, third among B1G safeties and 17th among all FBS safeties. Nubin's coverage grade of 89.5 leads the Big Ten and is third nationally.

► All the preseason love that Nubin received, which included watch list appearances for the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy and Thorpe Award, and preseason All-America honors by The Athletic, Sporting News and Phil Steele, was backed up by his performance in the season opener against Nebraska. In addition to his three tackles and two interceptions, Nubin was graded by Pro Football Focus at 91.5 overall on defense.

► He led the team last year with four interceptions, a career high. After tying for the team lead in interceptions in 2020 (1) and 2021 (3), Nubin joined **Keith Edwards** (1977-79) as the only Gophers since 1961 to lead the team in interceptions three years in row. With 11 career interceptions, he needs one more to tie the Gopher school record.

► Nubin, who played in and started 12 of 13 games a year ago, was fourth on the team with 55 tackles, and he had 2.0 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, at Illinois.

► He was ninth last year among Big Ten safeties, and is No. 3 among safeties returning, with an overall defensive grade of 76.4 from PFF. In addition, he ranked second with a rush defense grade of 83.4, ninth with a 76.5 tackling grade and 12th with a coverage grade of 72.6.

► Also according to PFF, he allowed only 7 receptions on 20 targets for a reception percentage of 35.0. That led all Big Ten safeties and was fourth in the FBS.

WALLEY'S WORLD

► Junior cornerback **Justin Walley** has been one of the top corners in the Big Ten ever since he earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team in 2021 and was PFF's highest graded true freshman CB.

► He's got 21 tackles this year, four pass breakups to tie for the team lead, and he has one forced fumble.

► Walley's tackling grade from PFF of 81.5 leads Minnesota and is fifth among Big Ten cornerbacks, while his run defense grade of 82.3 is best on the team and 14th among Big Ten defenders.

► In the opener against Nebraska, he set a career high with eight tackles and forced a crucial fumble in the fourth quarter that led to a game-tying touchdown for Minnesota.

► Last year, he started all 13 games at cornerback and has 39 tackles with three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He was second on the team with three interceptions and one fumble recovery.

► He ranked 11th last year among Big Ten cornerbacks with an overall PFF grade of 77.6. Among returning CBs, he ranked fifth. His coverage grade of 80.1 was eighth-best last year and fourth among returners. He allowed only 9.5 yards per reception, tied for fifth best in 2022 in the Big Ten, while his NFL passer rating mark of 48.6 was also fifth in the conference, according to PFF.

► At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he was just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (**Jalen Myrick** at Purdue in 2015, **Mario Reese** vs. Iowa in 2006).

► His 65 interception yards last year tied for ninth most at Minnesota since 2000.

LINDENBERG SIDELINED

► With the graduation of **Mariano Sori-Marin**, the team's leading tackler, eyes turned to redshirt junior **Cody Lindenberg** to lead the linebacking corps. However, Lindenberg has yet to play this year due to injury.

► Lindenberg was second on the team last season with 71 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He also had 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.

► Lindenberg played in all 13 games with starts in the final six contests. In that stretch, he posted a team-high 45 tackles.

► He led or tied for the team lead in tackles seven times last season, including a career-high 11 tackles in the bowl win over Syracuse.

NEW NAMES AT LB

► As **Cody Lindenberg** has sat out the first six games due to injury, some new names and faces have gotten significant snaps at linebacker.

► Redshirt sophomore **Devon Williams** and redshirt freshman **Maverick Baranowski** have started all six games, while sixth-year transfer **Ryan Selig** (more on him in the note below) has three starts.

► Baranowski leads the team with 42 tackles and also has 4.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and two quarterback hurries. His 7.0 tackles per game ranks ninth in the Big Ten.

► Williams has 19 tackles (including a career-high seven at Northwestern), one interception, 1.0 tackles for loss and a team-high five quarterback hurries. He also is second among Big Ten linebackers, and 10th overall, with a pass rush grade from PFF of 83.2.

► Selig has 22 tackles on the year with one QB hurry.

SEVEN ADDED TO DEFENSE

► Seven of Minnesota's 11 transfers this year come on defense with defensive lineman **Chris Collins**, linebackers **Ryan Selig** and **Rowan Zolman** and defensive backs **Tyler Bride**, **Jack Henderson**, **Tre'Von Jones** and **Craig McDonald**.

► Collins, Jones and Selig each have one year of eligibility left, Bride and Henderson have two, and McDonald and Zolman have three.

► Playing in all six games, including three starts, Henderson is second on Minnesota with two interceptions and third with 32 tackles. He also has 3.0 TFLs, 1.0 sacks and a pass breakup. He broke out at North Carolina, finishing with a game-high 11 tackles, a TFL, his first interception as a Gopher and a PBU. He left the Michigan contest due to injury.

► Henderson's PFF defensive grade of 77.0 and run defense grade of 76.2 are both second on the team. Those grades rank 15th and 23rd, respectively, among all Big Ten secondary defenders.

► Henderson competed at Southeastern Louisiana for the last three years and played in 33 career games. He recorded 163 career tackles (93 solo), 12 tackles for loss, two sacks, 13 pass breakups, six interceptions, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. According to PFF, his 12 pressures last year were three more than any other FCS cornerback, while his nine hurries also led all CBs.

► Starting all six games, Jones is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups to go with 25 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, an interception and a QB hurry.

► Jones called Elon home the last four years, playing in 38 games with 27 starts. He finished his Phoenix career with 185 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, nine pass break-ups, three interceptions, five fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 22 punt returns for 185 yards. He was named Third-Team All-CAA in 2021 and 2022 and was a 2019 Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American.

► Collins has played in all six games with one start. He has nine tackles, three quarterback hurries and the first interception of his career, which came against his former school, North Carolina. Bride has appeared in three contests with no stats, while McDonald made his Gopher debut against Michigan with two tackles and a pass breakup. Zolman is waiting to make his debut.

► Selig was teammates with fellow transfers **Corey Crooms Jr.** and **Sean Tyler** at Western Michigan. In five years with the Broncos, Selig recorded 154 tackles (88 solo), 13.0 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and three pass breakups in 45 career games with the Broncos.

► Collins spent five years at North Carolina where he played in 46 games and had 68 tackles (33 solo), 12.0 TFLs, 6.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one PBU.

► Bride was at Georgia Southern the last three years where he played in 30 games with 15 starts and saw nearly 1,200 snaps on defense and special teams. He had 82 tackles, 9.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, two interceptions, 16 pass breakups and a fumble recovery with the Eagles.

► Zolman played the 2022 season at Miami (OH) where he saw action in nine games, making one start. He finished the season with six tackles and an interception.

► Minnesota is the third stop for McDonald after he spent 2022 at Auburn, where he played in two games, and the 2020-21 campaigns at Iowa State, where appearing in 17 games with three starts over two seasons.

KESICH, NUBIN NET BIG HONORS

► **Dragan Kesich** was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week, while **Tyler Nubin** was tabbed B1G Defensive Player of the Week for their performances against Nebraska. It was the first Big Ten player of the week recognition for each player.

► Kesich kicked the game-winning 47-yard field goal with zero time remaining on the clock to break a 10-10 tie and lift Minnesota to a three-point victory. It was his second field goal of the game, as he opened the scoring for the Gophers with a 34-yard field goal in the second quarter. Nubin recorded two interceptions, one in each half. His second interception came with less than a minute left in the game and was returned 14 yards. A few plays later, Kesich kicked the winning field goal. Nubin also added three tackles in the win.

► Kesich was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since **Matthew Trickett** received the honor in November 2022 after making two field goals in a 20-13 win at Nebraska.

► Nubin was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week since **Mariano Sori-Marin** was recognized in December 2020 after making 18 tackles in a 24-17 win at Nebraska. He was the first Minnesota defensive back to earn the honor since **Antoine Winfield Jr.**, did so in November 2019 after recording two interceptions and 11 tackles in a win against Penn State.

► With Kesich and Nubin being honored, this was the first time that Minnesota had two players recognized in the same week by the Big Ten since 2019 when Winfield (defensive player of the week) and **Tanner Morgan** (offensive player of the week) were feted after Minnesota beat Penn State.

► This was also the first time that Minnesota had players win Special Teams Player of the Week and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same week since 2018 when Winfield (defensive) and kicker **Emmit Carpenter** (special teams) earned the awards after a 21-14 home win against Fresno State.

KESICH ADDS FIELD GOALS TO KICKOFF PROWESS

► **Dragan Kesich** spent the last two seasons as the Gophers' kickoff specialist, but has added field goal duties this year with the graduation of **Matthew Trickett**.

► He kicked the first two field goals of his career against Nebraska, including a game-winning 47-yarder as time expired. Kesich followed that up against Eastern Michigan with a 3-for-3 performance on field goals, connecting from 19, 20 and 24 yards. He added two more at North Carolina, hitting from 23 and 45 yards, and another two at Northwestern, including a 50-yarder and a 20-yard make in overtime.

► Against Michigan, Kesich connected on a career-long 54-yard field goal, which tied for the fifth-longest in program history and is a Huntington Bank Stadium record. It was Minnesota's longest field goal since **Joel Monroe** made a 54-yarder at Iowa on Nov. 10, 2007.

► Kesich is the eighth Minnesota kicker to have multiple 50-yard field goals in a career, and he is the sixth Gophers kicker with multiple 50-yarders in the same season.

► Kesich is 10-of-11 on the year with nine straight makes, which is the longest streak of made field goals since **Emmit Carpenter** made his last 12 of the 2016 season. Kesich's only miss this year was from 54 yards against the Huskers, which was long enough but wide left.

► His 90.9 field goal percentage and 1.67 made field goals per game are both second in the Big Ten and 15th and 20 nationally, respectively. His 10 made field goals are tied for second in the league, while Kesich's 7.3 points per game are fifth among kickers in the conference and seventh overall in the Big Ten.

► A strong-legged lefty, Kesich is 10-of-12 on field goals in his career with his only misses being that 54-yard try against the Huskers and a 53-yard attempt at Iowa in 2021 that was blocked.

► This year, he's 24-of-28 on touchbacks. The 85.71 touchback percentage ranks sixth nationally, while his 64.61 yards per kickoff sit fourth. Opponents only have three kickoff returns this year, tied for fourth nationally.

► Kesich also excelled on kickoffs a year ago. He posted touchbacks on 59 of 71 kickoffs, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois. He led the country with his kickoff average of 64.59 yards in 2022, while his touchback percentage of 83.10 percent was fifth in the FBS and his 59 touchbacks ranked seventh.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

► **Mark Crawford** is in his fourth season as the Gophers' punter. Also the team's holder, he's punted 27 times with an average of 43.3 yards per kick this year. Five have covered 50+ yards (long of 56) and six have been downed inside the 20, while 13 have been fair caught and four have gone for touchbacks.

► Opponents have only returned four of Crawford's punts, a number that is tied for 20th nationally and tied for third in the Big Ten. Those returns have netted just 15 yards, which ranks 28th in the FBS.

► Crawford, who is also the team's holder on kicks, averaged 40.6 yards on his boots last year. Of his 46 punts, 21 were fair caught, 15 landed inside the 20-yard line and only three went for a touchback. He had five punts of 50+ yards.

► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.

► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

► At 29 years old (will turn 30 in December), he's the sixth oldest player in college football, according to a survey of FBS SIDs.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota's time of possession figure of 32:20 ranks 15th in the FBS and second in the B1G. They've won time of possession in five of six games this season.

► Minnesota dominated time of possession last year, averaging 34:32 minutes with the ball. That figure ranked third nationally behind only Air Force (36:33) and Navy (34:38). Michigan was next-closest at 33:48.

► Eight times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game, including four times in 2022. In addition to New Mexico State (44:30, highest in the **P.J. Fleck** era), Minnesota also had it for 42:29 last year at Michigan State, 41:02 against Rutgers and 40:22 versus Northwestern.

► In 77 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 60 times and gone 41-19 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Another trait that has carried over from last year is the lack of penalties. Minnesota is averaging 3.00 penalties and 29.50 penalty yards per game. The penalties per game are second in the Big Ten and third in the FBS, while the yards per game are third in the league and sixth across the country.

► The Gophers have committed four or fewer penalties in all but one game this year and have 36 or fewer penalty yards in five of six contests. The highest total was five penalties for 59 yards at Northwestern.

► Minnesota was among the least penalized teams in the FBS last year, committing 46 penalties for 413 yards.

► The Gophers tied with Oklahoma State for the nation's lead with their 3.54 penalties per game, and Minnesota was third in the FBS and among Power 5 schools with 31.77 penalty yards per contest.

► Minnesota committed four or fewer penalties in 10 of 13 games last year, including a program record zero against Iowa. The Hawkeyes didn't have any penalties either, making it the first FBS game to have no penalties since Oregon at Oregon State in 2018.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► **Sean Tyler** is second among all FBS players in career all-purpose yards (4,349), is seventh in rush yards (3,019) and all-purpose plays (627), ninth in rush attempts (541), 10th in yards per rush (5.6), 13th in touchdowns scored (29), 24th in rushing touchdowns (23), 27th in all-purpose yards per game (92.53), and 35th in rushes per game (11.51).

► **Chris Autman-Bell** ranks 10th among FBS players in career yards per catch (15.8) and 33rd in receiving yards (1,970).

► **Corey Crooms Jr.** sits 22nd among players in the FBS in career yards per catch (14.9) and 32nd in receiving yards (1,993).

► With 15 career touchdown catches, **Elijah Spencer** ranks 36th among FBS players.

► **Tyler Nubin's** 11 career interceptions are second among active FBS players, while his 0.23 interceptions per game rank 20th.

DUE FOR A MISS

- ▶ Minnesota has been on the end of an unlucky and unlikely streak as opponents have made 25 consecutive field goals dating to last season. That includes all 18 attempts in 2022 and all seven this year.
- ▶ Since the start of last year, only one other team has seen opponents make at least 90 percent of their field goals: Western Kentucky at 92 percent (23-of-25).
- ▶ This season, kickers across the FBS have made 1005-of-1339 field goal tries, a 75.1 percent success rate.
- ▶ Opponent kickers have been a perfect 37-of-37 on extra points, as well, over the same stretch.

FOUR ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

- ▶ Minnesota added four new assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.
- ▶ Former Minnesota defensive lineman **Winston DeLattiboudere III** has returned to his alma mater to serve as the Golden Gophers' defensive line coach and newcomer coordinator. DeLattiboudere III spent the 2022 campaign as defensive line coach for Akron, while before that he worked one season as a graduate assistant at Oregon working with the defensive line. DeLattiboudere III started his coaching career in 2020 as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line at Charlotte.
- ▶ He spent five seasons with Minnesota as a player, including the final four with **P.J. Fleck** as head coach. DeLattiboudere III played in 51 career games with 36 starts, finishing with 83 tackles (43 solo) with 13.5 tackles for loss and five sacks. He earned academic All-Big Ten honors in 2019 as a senior, while also earning the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award and the program's Tony Dungy Award (character and community service) that same year.
- ▶ **Nick Monroe** is coaching the cornerbacks and is the team's co-defensive coordinator. The Minnesota native returns to his home state after seven seasons at Syracuse. He joined the Orange staff in 2016 and served as Syracuse's secondary coach for two seasons before narrowing his focus to the team's safeties and nickelbacks in 2018 and safeties and rovers in 2020, before taking on his role last season of defensive passing game coordinator. His father, Marty, was a GA for the Gophers under head coach **Jim Wacker** in 1994-95.
- ▶ **Nic McKissic-Luke** is the running backs coach. He spent the past three seasons at Northern Illinois, first as running backs/fullbacks coach in 2020, adding run game coordinator and co-special teams coordinator titles in 2021 and then being run game coordinator, running backs coach and the sole special teams coordinator in 2022.
- ▶ **Andrew Sowder** is overseeing the tight ends. He spent the past five seasons as Kent State's offensive coordinator. He also worked with quarterbacks and tight ends during his time with the Golden Flashes.
- ▶ Along with the new coaching additions, after spending last season as the Gophers' tight ends coach, **Greg Harbaugh Jr.** is now co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. He joins **Matt Simon** in the co-offensive coordinator role, which Simon has held, along with wide receivers coach, since the 2020 campaign.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

- ▶ As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their seventh season under **P.J. Fleck**. Fleck entered the year 44-27 overall and 26-26 in the Big Ten. He had the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.620) and conference winning percentage (.500) of any Minnesota coach through his first six seasons. Below is a look at how other yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

- ▶ *Last 6 Years (2017-22):* The 44 wins are tied for the second most since 1903-08. The .620 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-65 (.632) and it's tied for the second best since 1944-49. The 26 B1G wins are tied for the most since the program won 27 between 1964-69. The B1G win percentage of .500 is tied for the best since 1968-73 (.544). The four bowl wins in a 6-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2014-19, 2015-20 and 2016-21.
- ▶ *Last 5 Years (2018-22):* The 39 wins are the most since 1903-07 (43). The .661 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-44 (.733). The 24 B1G wins are the most ever in a 5-year span in program history. The B1G win percentage of .558 is the best since 1967-71 (.569). The four bowl wins in a 5-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2015-19.
- ▶ *Last 4 Years (2019-22):* The 32 wins are tied for the most since 1903-06 (41). The .696 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-43 (.727). The 21 B1G wins are the most in any four-year period in school history; no other 4-year span has 20 wins. The B1G win percentage of .618 is best since 1967-70 (.625). The three bowl wins are tied for the most in any 4-year span, along with 2001-04, 2002-05, 2015-18, 2016-19 and 2018-21.
- ▶ *Last 3 Years (2020-22):* The 14 B1G wins are tied for the second most since 1967-69. Only the span from 2019-21 when the team won 16 games is better. The B1G win percentage of .560 is second best since 1967-69 (.714). The only mark better since then was in 2019-21 when Minnesota had a .640 win percentage.
- ▶ *Last 2 Years (2021-22):* The 18 wins are tied for the most since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever Minnesota has won at least 18 games in consecutive years. Fleck is one of two coaches to do it more than once, also doing so in 2018-19. **Henry L. Williams** did it 5 times. The .692 win percentage is tied for the second best mark since 1967-68 (.700). The only mark better since then was in 2019-20 when the Gophers had a .700 win percentage. The 11 B1G wins are tied for the second most behind only 1960-61 (12). The last time Minnesota won at least 11 B1G games in consecutive years was 1967-68. The B1G win percentage of .611 is second best since 1972-73 (.625). The only mark better since then was a .625 win percentage in 2019-20.

9-4 IN BACK-TO-BACK YEARS

- ▶ Minnesota is coming off a 2022 campaign where it finished with a 9-4 record overall, capping it with a 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl.
- ▶ Minnesota reached nine wins in a season for the 11th time in school history and the third time in the past four years under head coach **P.J. Fleck**, something that hadn't happened since 1905. Fleck is just the second Minnesota coach to have at least three seasons with nine or more victories. **Henry L. Williams** had six such seasons from 1900-21, while all other coaches in program history have a combined two nine-win seasons.
- ▶ Combined with a 9-4 record in 2021, the 18 wins over two seasons are tied for the most in Gopher history since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever the team has won at least 18 games in consecutive years.
- ▶ In addition, Minnesota went 5-4 in league play in 2022 after a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021. It's the first time with back-to-back conference seasons over .500 since 1968-69.

THREE DRAFTED IN 2023

- ▶ Minnesota had three players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 14, which is the most draft picks in a four-year span for the Gophers since they also had 14 players picked from 1988-91.
- ▶ Center **John Michael Schmitz** was selected in the second round with the 57th overall pick by the New York Giants. **Jordan Howden**, who started his career as a walk-on at Minnesota, was taken in the fifth round with the 146th pick by the New Orleans Saints, while **Terrell Smith** went a few picks later when the Chicago Bears took him with the 165th pick.
- ▶ The 2023 draft was the fourth straight draft where Minnesota had an offensive and defensive player selected. The last time that happened was 1975-78.
- ▶ Schmitz was the highest Minnesota center to be drafted since 1989 when **Brian Williams** was taken 18th in the first round by the Giants.
- ▶ Schmitz became the third Minnesota center to be drafted in the first two rounds, joining **Williams** and **Clayton Tonnemaker**, who was drafted fourth overall by the Packers in 1950.
- ▶ Schmitz's selection was also notable in that Minnesota has now had offensive lineman taken in consecutive drafts, as **Daniel Faalele** was drafted in 2022 in the fourth round by Baltimore. The last time Minnesota had offensive lineman selected in consecutive drafts was 2001-02.
- ▶ With Schmitz going in the second round, Minnesota has also had a first or second round pick in four straight drafts. The last time that happened was 1942-45.
- ▶ Howden and Smith continued the good fortune of Minnesota defensive backs being drafted, as the Gophers have now had a program-record five defensive backs taken in the last four drafts. Washington took **Benjamin St-Juste** in 2021 and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected **Antoine Winfield Jr.**, in 2020, while the New York Giants took **Chris Williamson** the same year.
- ▶ This was the third time ever that the Gophers had two defensive backs selected in the same draft, also doing so in 2020 and 1985.

SCORIGAMI

- ▶ Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results this season for Minnesota football.
- ▶ *Minnesota 13, Nebraska 10.* Partial scorigami. It's the second such score in program history and the first Gopher victory.
- ▶ *Minnesota 25, Eastern Michigan 6.* No scorigami. It's the second such score in program history as the Gophers defeated North Dakota by that score to open the 1925 season.
- ▶ *North Carolina 31, Minnesota 13.* No scorigami. It's the second such score in program history as the Gophers also lost by this score to Iowa in 2012.
- ▶ *Northwestern 37, Minnesota 34.* Partial scorigami. It's the second such score in program history and the first Gopher defeat.
- ▶ *Minnesota 35, Louisiana 24.* No scorigami. It's the third such score in program history, all Minnesota wins. The last was a victory over Middle Tennessee in 2014.
- ▶ *Michigan 52, Minnesota 10.* No scorigami. It's the third such score in program history and the second loss. The other defeat came to Ohio State in 2010.

P.J. FLECK

HEAD COACH // SEVENTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 77-52 and is 47-30 at Minnesota.

In six years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck and Henry L. Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 4-0 in bowl games, and his four bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach (Glen Mason was 3-4 in bowl games at Minnesota).

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached five All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), nine Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, John Michael Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 327 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota once again post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9 in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which is had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center John Michael Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Mohamed Ibrahim paced the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West

division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad,

as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or red-shirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and host an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.

FLOYD OF ROSEDALE

Minnesota vs. Iowa

The states of Minnesota and Iowa battle it out every year in college football when their teams face each other in one of the most emotional rivalries in the country. The winner of the game earns the right to keep the bronze statue of a pig called "Floyd of Rosedale."

The year was 1935, and emotions were running hot heading into the Minnesota-Iowa game. Bernie Bierman's Gophers were 5-0, and Ossie Solem's Hawkeyes were 4-0-1. Iowa had recently been reinstated to eligibility following a suspension for slush-fund violations, a suspension that had been ardently supported by a Minnesota representative. To make matters worse, Iowa fans still remembered the contest from the year before, when Minnesota players had roughed up Hawkeye star Ozzie Simmons so badly that he had to leave the game because of injuries.

The game in 1935 was at Iowa, and the host-state had not forgotten either of the incidents. Iowa Governor Clyde Herring incited the fans and joined in the bitter feelings toward the state to the north and its football squad by saying, "If the officials stand for any rough tactics like Minnesota used last year, I'm sure the crowd won't."

Greatly alarmed, Minnesota's Governor Floyd Olson tried to cool the hot heads of fans on both sides of the border with his telegraphed answer to Herring. "Minnesota folks are excited over your statement about Iowa crowds lynching the Minnesota football team. I have assured them you are law abiding gentlemen and are only trying to get our goat...I will bet you a Minnesota prize hog against an Iowa prize hog that Minnesota wins."

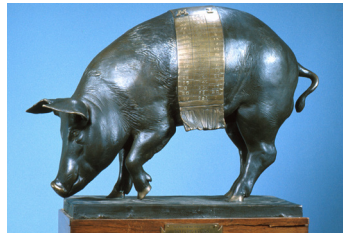
The diplomatic tactic eased the tension, and the game was a hard-fought, but cleanly played, 13-6 Minnesota victory. More importantly, no mob of angry fans got involved in any postgame, extracurricular activity. The Golden Gophers brought home "Floyd of Rosedale," an award-winning prize pig which had been donated by Allen Loomis, the owner of Rosedale Farms near Fort Dodge, Iowa, and named after the Minnesota governor.

A few days later, Governor Herring collected Floyd and personally walked him into Governor Olson's carpeted office. About the same time, news surfaced that an Iowa fan had sworn out a warrant charging Herring with gambling.

Governor Olson later offered Floyd up as the grand prize in a state-wide essay-writing contest, which was won by 14-year old Robert Jones. Jones later sold the hog to the U of M. A year later, the University sold Floyd to J.B. Gjerdrum, a breeder who lived near Mabel, Minn., on the Iowa-Minnesota border, for "about \$50" according to Gjerdrum. Sadly, in a death most unbecoming a figure of such stature, Floyd passed on to that great pigpen in the sky. As Gjerdrum noted, "We had him about a year. There was hog cholera around...One day he just leaned up against a straw pile and died."

The spirit of good sportsmanship embodied by Floyd lives on in the form of a 15 1/2-inch high, 21-inch long bronze statue of the prize hog. The sculpture was commissioned by Governor Olson and created by Charles Brioschi, a St. Paul artist.

Every year since 1935, these two border-state rivals have fought for the right to pen the bronze pig in their own trophy case. Every college football season, Minnesota and Iowa fight for "Floyd of Rosedale," a symbol of how interstate tension can be averted through athletic competition.
