THE OPENING DRIVE

SETTING THE STAGE -- The Big Ten West leading Northwestern Wildcats (5-4, 5-1 Big Ten) will travel to Iowa City this weekend to take on the Iowa Hawkeyes as they continue their 'Quest for the West.' The Wildcats have won four of their last five and enter the contest on a six-game road win streak. The Hawkeyes have lost two in a row, but are 4-1 inside Kinnick Stadium this season.

QUEST FOR THE WEST -- The Wildcats are seeking their first Big Ten West division title in program history and lead the pack thanks to a perfect 3-0 record versus division foes this season. The 'Cats have won nine-straight versus West Division foes and are 12-1 in their last 13 Big Ten contests dating back to last season. Chicago's Big Ten Team can clinch the division Saturday with a win at Iowa and losses by Wisconsin and Purdue or by going 2-1 in its last three games of the regular season.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS -- Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson is on the precipice of setting a trio of Northwestern career passing records. Thorson needs just 13 completions, 31 attempts and 820 passing yards to pass Brett Basanez (2002-05) in all three categories. The Wheaton, Illinois, native has completed 901 of 1,554 passes for 9,761 yards and 55 touchdowns in his career. He is already the program's all-time leader in passing touchdowns.

NO DIRTY LAUNDRY -- Northwestern had zero penalties in its matchup versus No. 3 Notre Dame last Saturday. The Wildcats are the least penalized team in the country with just 26 penalties and 245 penalty yards through nine games. The 'Cats have committed seven fewer penalties and have 30 less penalty yards than Navy, who ranks second in both categories.

HOT STREAK -- After a 1-3 start, the Wildcats have won four of their last five contests, including four-straight in Big Ten conference play. With their win over No. 19/20 Wisconsin on Oct. 27, Northwestern...

...Improved to 5-1 in Big Ten play for the first time since 2000.

...Extended its winning streak versus Big Ten West division foes to nine games.

...Snapped Wisconsin's 16-game winning streak versus Big Ten West division opponents.

...Earned its 12th victory in its last 13 Big Ten contests.

FIRST DOWN

BOWSER'S CASTLE – First-year running back **Isaiah Bowser** had 23 carries for 93 yards versus No. 3 Notre Dame last week, eclipsing the 90-yard mark for the third-straight game. Bowser, who earned his first career start versus the Irish, has carried the ball 81 times over the last three games, marking the third most in the country and the second most among Power-5 running backs during the stretch. His 318 rushing yards over the last three games are the third most among FBS rookie running backs and his 64.0 yards per game this season are the seventh most among Power-5 first-year backs. He is just one of four Big Ten running backs to rush for 100 yards and two touchdowns in a game this season after accomplishing the feat at Rutgers on Oct. 20.

BOWSER, MORE LIKE WOW-SER – First-year running back **Isaiah Bowser** set career highs with 34 carries and 117 yards and scored his third touchdown in the Wildcats' 31-27 victory over Wisconsin. Bowser became the first NU rookie to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games since Justin Jackson rushed for 100 yards in three-straight on two separate occasions in 2014.

TWO TIMES TWO – Senior quarterback **Clayton Thorson** has rushed for two touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. Thorson ranks eighth in NU program history with 24 career rushing touchdowns.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS – **Thorson** completed 16-of-29 passes for 141 yards and a touchdown versus No. 3 Notre Dame last week and now has 9,761 passing yards in his illustrious career. He passed Michigan's Chad Henne (9,715; 2002-05) for seventh on the Big Ten career passing list and needs just 187 yards to pass Purdue's Mark Herrmann (9,946; 1977-80) for sixth.

RARE COMPANY – By surpassing 9,000 career passing yards versus Nebraska on Oct. 1, **Clayton Thorson** joined former Ohio State Buckeye J.T. Barrett as the only other Big Ten player to pass for 9,000 yards and score 20 rushing touchdowns in his career.

DUAL THREAT – **Thorson** rushed for a pair of scores for the fifth time in his career last week. Northwestern is 15-4 during Thorson's career when he rushes for a touchdown and 11-3 overall when he throws and rushes for at least one touchdown pass. His 14 games with at least one touchdown passing and rushing are tied for the sixth most in the Big Ten since 2000. The last NU player to have back-to-back games with two rushing touchdowns as current Los Angeles Chargers running back Justin Jackson, who scored three times versus Illinois and Pittsburgh to close the 2016 season.

SECOND DOWN

LOCKED IN – Sophomore safety Travis Whillock became the eighth Wildcat to record double-digit tackles in a game this season with his career-high 10 stops versus No. 3 Notre Dame. Whillock, who battled injuries his first two years on campus, set career highs in solo stops (5), assisted tackles (5), pass breakups (1) and tackles for loss (1).

SOMETHING IN THE NUMBER – Sophomore linebacker Blake Gallagher, who wears the same No. 51 made famous by head coach Pat Fitzgerald, recorded eight tackles versus Notre Dame to mark his seventh game with at least eight stops this season. Gallagher leads Northwestern with 86 tackles total and is second in the Big Ten with 9.2 tackles per game. He ranks fourth in the conference with 5.1 solo tackles per game and his five double-digit tackle performances are tied for the most in the league.

IN THE MIDDLE – Northwestern's starting defensive tackle tandem of **seniors Jordan Thompson and Fred Wyatt** combined to make 12 tackles versus No. 3 Notre Dame, both setting career highs with six stops apiece. Wyatt also set a career-high mark with two tackles for loss.

HARTAGE ISLAND – Senior defensive back Montre Hartage had a career-high four pass breakups in the win over Wisconsin, marking the most by any NU player since at least 2000. His four PBU's are tied for the fifth most in a game in the country this season. According to ProFootballFocus, Hartage was targeted 10 times by the Wisconsin offense and surrendered just four catches for 21 yards.

BIG TEN ROAD WARRIORS – Chicago's Big Ten Team™ won its sixth-straight Big Ten road contest with an 18-15 victory at Rutgers. The Wildcats have allowed fewer than 20 points in three of the six contests and are averaging 31.3 points per game offensively during the stretch.

FORMER NO. 1 QUARTERBACK JOINS WILDCATS PROGRAM – Sophomore

quarterback Hunter Johnson, the No. 1-rated quarterback in the Class of 2016 by ESPN, joined the 'Cats as a transfer from Clemson University in June. Johnson, the younger brother of former Wildcat Cole Johnson, appeared in seven games for the Tigers last season. He completed 21-of-27 passes for 234 yards and two touchdowns. The Brownsburg, Indiana, native will sit out the 2018 season due to NCAA transfer rules and will have three years of eligibility remaining beginning in 2019.

Already the second-longest tenured Big Ten head coach at the age of 43, Pat Fitzgerald's 12 seasons at the helm of Northwestern have been spent building upon the tradition he helped establish as a Hall-of-Fame linebacker for the Wildcats in the mid-1990's. Characterized by his motivational skills, enthusiasm and passion for all things Northwestern, Fitzgerald has shaped Chicago's Big Ten Team into one that consistently achieves excellence in all three phases of the student-athlete experience: academics, athletics and community outreach.

Fitzgerald has led the Wildcats to eight bowl appearances in his 12 seasons and has guided the 'Cats to three of their four bowl wins in program history. Most recently, Chicago's Big Ten Team defeated Kentucky in the 2017 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, 24-23, giving Northwestern back-to-back bowl wins for the first time in program history. Northwestern finished the season ranked No. 17 in both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches Poll, as well as the College Football Playoff Poll.

The win over Kentucky capped off an eight-game winning streak for the Wildcats, who finished the 2017 season with 10 wins for the fifth time in program history and third time over the last six seasons. Northwestern has averaged nine victories over the last three seasons (27-12), setting a program record for wins during a three-year span. The previous high was 26 wins from 1903-05.

Away from the gridiron, Fitzgerald's players have achieved at the highest levels in the classroom, last fall placing a record 39 players on the Academic All-Big Ten team en route to posting a program-record 3.14 GPA for the 2015-16 academic year. In 2012, Northwestern collected top national honors in the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the seventh time since 1998. Additionally, Fitzgerald's program ranked second among all FBS programs in the recently released multi-year Academic Progress Rating (APR), posting a score of 992 out of a possible 1,000 in the measure of player retention and eligibility.

NU also goes to great lengths to make a difference in the community. Fitzgerald, his family and his players partake in countless charitable events, impacting the NU and Evanston communities through their participation in Northwestern Dance Marathon, Special Olympics, Misericordia, the NU chapter of Uplifting Athletes, weekly school and children's hospital visits, and dozens of other organizations. Most recently, Fitzgerald was named the honorary coach of the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.

As a player in 1995, Fitzgerald was the leader of a suffocating Wildcats defensive unit that led the nation in scoring defense and anchored NU's storybook run to the Big Ten championship and Rose Bowl. He capped the year by winning both the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards as the nation's top defensive player and also was the Big Ten, Chevrolet and Sports Illustrated-Defensive Player of the Year. Fitzgerald accomplished all of this despite suffering a broken leg in the penultimate regular-season game.

A graduate of Orland Park's (Ill.) Carl Sandburg High School and a 2003 inductee to the Northwestern Athletics Hall of Fame, Fitzgerald resides in Northfield with his wife, Stacy, and three sons, Jack, born in November 2004, Ryan, born in September 2006, and Brendan, born in February 2009.

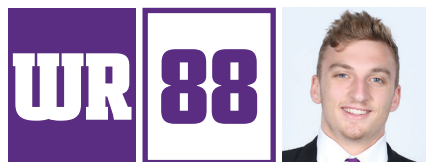

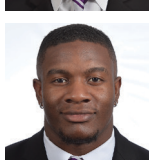

GAME 1 • NORTHWESTERN 31, PURDUE 27 • AUG. 30, 2018

Northwestern opened the 2018 campaign with a Big Ten victory under the lights at Purdue on Thursday, Aug. 30. Sophomore Jeremy Larkin scored two touchdowns and rushed for a career-high 143 yards to lead Northwestern (1-0, 1-0 B1G) to a 31-27 season-opening win over Purdue (0-1, 0-1 B1G) at Ross-Ade Stadium. The victory marks the program's ninth straight win dating back to the 2017 campaign. It is NU's longest win streak since the 1995 season.

Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson finished the game 16-of-26 with 172 yards passing and classmate Flynn Nagel led the team with 58 yards receiving. Fellow quarterback TJ Green went 7-for-11 on the evening for 63 yards through the air. On the defensive side of the ball, senior Nate Hall had a team-leading 10 tackles, including one tackle for loss and one interception on the night.

The Wildcats capitalized on turnovers in the first half of the game as they scored 21 of their 31 first-half points off interceptions. On the opening drive, sophomore JR Pace intercepted Purdue quarterback Elijah Sindelar's pass at the Northwestern 10-yard line. Larkin capped the ensuing drive by rushing for a one-yard touchdown on third down put the 'Cats up early, 7-0. On NU's next possession, junior John Moten IV rushed for a two-yard touchdown with 5:34 to go in the first to increase Northwestern's lead to 14-0.

Purdue responded quickly when Sindelar converted a 32-yard touchdown pass to Rondale Moore at 4:20 to cap off a 60-yard drive and pull the Boilermakers within seven. With 1:20 to go in the first quarter, Moore rushed for a 76-yard touchdown to tie the score at 14 apiece. Two more interceptions in the first half combined with a field goal by sophomore Charlie Kuhbänder would give the Wildcats a lead heading into the locker room that they would hold for the remainder of the game.

GAME 2 • DUKE 21, NORTHWESTERN 7 • SEPT. 8, 2018

Aiming for its second-straight victory over a Power-5 opponent to open the 2018 campaign, Northwestern was unable to stymie Duke in a 21-7 loss at Ryan Field in the Wildcats' home opener pm Sept. 8.

Northwestern finished with 381 yards of total offense, out gaining Duke by 80 yards, but was unable to find the end zone after scoring a touchdown on the opening drive of the contest. The Wildcats' defense held Purdue to 4-of-15 (26.6%) on third down conversion attempts. Northwestern moves to 1-1 (1-0 B1G), while Duke improves to 2-0.

Senior wide receiver Flynn Nagel hauled in a career-high 12 receptions for a career-best 133 receiving yards. Sophomore running back Jeremy Larkineclipsed 100 yards for a third-straight game dating back to last season's Music City Bowl. On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore linebacker Blake Gallagher finished with a career-high 13 tackles, eight of which came in the first half. Junior defensive end Joe Gaziano finished with 4.0 tackles for loss, including two second-half sacks which moved him past Deonte Gibson for eighth in program history with 15.5 career sacks.

The #B1GCats jumped out to an early lead thanks to an 11-play, 79-yard scoring drive which was capped off by a two-yard touchdown run by Larkin. Both defenses exchanged a pair of stops and the first quarter ended with Northwestern holding a 7-0 lead. However, three plays into the second quarter Duke evened it up with a nine-yard touchdown pass from Daniel Jones to T.J. Rahming.

The Blue Devils grabbed the lead with 8:40 remaining in the second quarter with a 52-yard strike from Jones to Johnathan Lloyd. Later in the half, they extended their lead with a seven-yard touchdown from Jones to Davis Koppenhaver to give Duke a 21-7 lead which they would take into the half.

GAME 3 • AKRON 39, NORTHWESTERN 34 • SEPT. 15, 2018

Junior superback Cameron Green posted career numbers with 11 receptions for 125 yards and two touchdowns and senior quarterback Clayton Thorson became the program's all-time leader in career passing touchdowns while also throwing for a career-high 383 yards, but Northwestern (1-2, 1-0 Big Ten) fell, 39-34, to Akron (2-0, 0-0 MAC) under the lights at Ryan Field on Saturday, Sept. 15.

Thorson's touchdown throw at the end of the first half set a school record of 45 passing touchdowns. He finished the game 33-of-52 with 383 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore running back Jeremy Larkin tied his career high with two scores on the night and brought his total for the season up to five. He has scored at least one touchdown in every game this season. On the defensive side of the ball, senior safety Jared McGee and sophomore linebacker Paddy Fisher led the team with eight tackles each, including six solo.

Northwestern struck first when Larkin rushed for a 7-yard touchdown to put the 'Cats up, 7-0, at 6:52 in the first quarter. In the second, Larkin added to NU's lead when he took a direct snap and rushed for a five-yard touchdown to give the 'Cats a 14-0 lead over the Zips. After a touchdown pass from Thorson to junior wide receiver Bennett Skowronek, the Wildcats took a 21-3 advantage into the locker room.

Akron opened the second half with a field goal and a 25-yard touchdown pass from Kato Nelson to Andrew Williams. On fourth and three with just over three minutes left in the third quarter, Thorson's pass was intercepted by Alvin Davis who returned it 97 yards. After a failed two-point conversion, the score stood at 21-19 with 3:14 left to play. The two teams would respond with back-to-back scores, but Akron took advantage of a Thorson fumble, scoring its fourth touchdown of the day. Davis picked up his second pick-six of the game when he intercepted Thorson at the 50-yard line with 7:24 to go. Northwestern would score one final touchdown to pull within five but it would not be enough to match the Zips.

GAME 4 • #14 MICHIGAN 20, NORTHWESTERN 17 • SEPT. 29, 2018

Northwestern (1-3, 1-1 Big Ten) led No. 14/15 Michigan (4-1, 2-0 Big Ten) all the way into the fourth quarter, but the Wildcats fell, 20-17, on Saturday, Sept. 29 in front of a sold-out crowd at Ryan Field.

Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson scored his 19th rushing touchdown of his career — the third most by a quarterback in program history. He finished the game 16-of-27 passing for 174 yards. Junior running back John Moten IV scored his second touchdown of the season and the fourth of his career, posting 36 yards on a season-high 13 rushing attempts. On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore linebacker Blake Gallagher led the team with a season-high 12 total tackles, including six solo.

The 'Cats scored on their first three possessions of the game to take a commanding lead. Northwestern held Michigan to just 21 yards of total offense in the first quarter, marking the lowest total for the Wolverines in an opening quarter this season. The Wildcats would hold a lead late into the fourth quarter until Michigan took its first lead of the game with just over four minutes to play.

On the first drive of the game, Thorson rushed for a one-yard touchdown to give Northwestern an early, 7-0, lead at 10:18 in the first quarter. On Northwestern's second possession, sophomore kicker Charlie Kuhbander completed the 10-play, 37-yard drive with a career-long 45-yard field goal to put the 'Cats up 10-0 with 9:04 left to play in the first. Moten rushed for a three-yard touchdown at 12:56 in the second quarter, increasing the Wildcats' lead to 17-0.

Michigan got on the board in the second when Karan Higdon rushed for a four-yard touchdown to complete a seven-play, 79-yard scoring drive. On its first possession of the third quarter, U-M pulled within seven when Quinn Nordin converted a 23-yard field goal. Michigan scored one more touchdown with 4:06 left to play in the game to give Michigan a three-point advantage that it would hold for the remainder of the game.

GAME 5 • NORTHWESTERN 29, #20 MICHIGAN STATE 20 • OCT. 6, 2018

Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson threw for three touchdowns and rushed for one more to lead Northwestern (2-3, 2-1 Big Ten) to its third straight win over No. 20 Michigan State (3-2, 1-1 Big Ten) at Spartan Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The victory marked the first win over a ranked opponent since the Wildcats defeated then No. 16 Michigan State on Oct. 28 of last season. The victory also gave Dan and Susan Jones Family Head Football Coach Pat Fitzgerald his 50th career Big Ten victory as the 'Cats improved to 2-0 on the road in 2018.

Michigan State opened the scoring when an interception by Khari Willis gave the Spartans the ball at the NU 49-yard line. Matt Coghlin completed a nine-play, 30-yard scoring drive with a 27-yard field goal with 59 seconds left in the first quarter to put Michigan State up, 3-0. Northwestern responded on the following drive when Thorson completed a 77-yard touchdown pass to McGowan with 18 seconds left to play in the first to give the 'Cats a 7-3 lead on their longest play from scrimmage this season. Thorson kept the momentum going when, after a seven-yard pass to Nagel, he completed a 34-yard touchdown to Jefferson at 13:58 in the second quarter, pulling Northwestern ahead, 14-3.

After a Michigan State field goal, the Spartans cut Northwestern's lead to two when Felton Davis rushed for a 48-yard touchdown at 7:18 in the third quarter. Brian Lewerke threw a three-yard touchdown pass to Davis with 4:08 left in the third quarter, making it 19-14 in favor of MSU.

Northwestern retook the lead when Thorson threw a 21-yard throw to Green who scored his third TD of 2018 with 15 seconds left in the third quarter. The Wildcats went for the two-point conversion and successfully converted when Thorson completed a pass to Solomon Vault, giving Northwestern a lead that it would hold to close out the game.

GAME 6: NORTHWESTERN 34, NEBRASKA 31 (OT) • OCT. 13, 2018

Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson and senior wide receiver Flynn Nagel posted career numbers in Northwestern's come-from-behind overtime, 34-31, victory over Nebraska at Homecoming at Ryan Field on Saturday, Oct. 13, giving the 'Cats their second straight overtime win over the Cornhuskers.

Thorson finished the game with a bevy of career highs, including 41 completions, 64 attempts, and 455 passing yards. Nagel tallied a team-leading 12 receptions for 220 yards, — the third-highest single-game receiving total in program history and the most since 1980. Sophomore defensive lineman Samdup Miller recorded a career high and team-leading tackles 14 tackles, including six solo and sophomore defensive back JR Pace recorded two interceptions — the fourth and fifth of his career — when he picked off Adrian Martinez's pass in the endzone in the third and again in overtime.

Nebraska would take an early lead in the game with an opening-drive touchdown score. Northwestern scored for the first time in the second quarter when Thorson threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to Nagel down the sideline to tie the score at seven. A forced fumble by junior defensive back Trae Young allowed sophomore defensive end Earnest Brown IV to recover the ball and rush for a 16-yard return at 3:01 in the first half to give the 'Cats a 14-7 advantage. Nebraska responded with a touchdown of its own to close out the first half. A missed extra point attempt gave the Wildcats a one-point lead heading into the locker room.

Nebraska would take a 14-point lead to open the second half. Both teams would exchange scores back-and-forth but, after being down by 10, Northwestern tied the game with 12 seconds left thanks to a five-yard touchdown pass from Thorson to Jefferson, forcing overtime. After an interception by Pace to give the 'Cats back the ball, sophomore placekicker Drew Luckenbaugh — making his first collegiate start in place of the injured Charlie Kuhbänder — drilled a 37-yard field goal to deliver the Northwestern victory.

GAME 7 • NORTHWESTERN 18, RUTGERS 15 • OCT. 20, 2018

First-year running back Isaiah Bowser posted career numbers with two touchdown scores, leading Northwestern (4-3, 4-1 Big Ten) to an 18-15 victory over Rutgers (1-7, 0-5 Big Ten) on Saturday afternoon at HighPoint.com Stadium, extending the Wildcats' road winning streak to six games.

Senior wide receiver Flynn Nagel continued his strong performance from last week with a team-leading eight receptions for 71 yards in the game. Sophomore wide receiver Riley Lees caught a career-long 29-yard pass, besting his previous career-long of 25 against Michigan State last season.

After the Northwestern defense forced a three-and-out on Rutgers' opening drive, the Wildcats opened the scoring on their first possession of the game. After a series of completions from Thorson to Nagel and junior wide receiver Bennett Skowronek for nine yards and seven yards, respectively, followed by rushes by Bowser, the 'Cats had the ball on the Rutgers 20-yard line. Four plays later, Bowser rushed for a three-yard touchdown run – the first of his career – to give Northwestern an early 7-0 lead at 9:46 in the first quarter.

With just under 13 minutes left in the game, the Wildcats went for it on fourth down and one. Thorson successfully completed the quarterback sneak, rushing for four yards up the middle to the 50-yard line. Two plays later, Thorson threw a 29-yard pass to Lees down the sideline to move the 'Cats up to the Rutgers 21-yard line. Then, on the same drive, the Wildcats opted to go for it again on fourth down and four. Thorson completed a 10-yard pass to Nagel to get the first down and put the ball on the Rutgers five-yard line. Bowser rushed for a five-yard touchdown with 8:12 left to play. Thorson completed a pass to Nagel for the two-point conversion, giving the 'Cats an 18-15 advantage that it would hold for the remainder of the game.

GAME 8 • NORTHWESTERN 31, #20 WISCONSIN 17 • OCT. 27, 2018

The Northwestern defense forced three fumbles and held Wisconsin to just seven second-half points while senior quarterback Clayton Thorson tied his career high with two rushing touchdowns to propel Northwestern (5-3, 5-1 Big Ten) to a 31-17 win over No. 20 Wisconsin (5-3, 3-2 Big Ten) at Ryan Field on Oct. 27, extending the Wildcats' winning streak to four games.

Northwestern remains in first place in the Big Ten West Division with its first 5-1 start in Big Ten play since 2000. The win over the Badgers gave Northwestern its 12th victory in the last 13 Big Ten contests and its second win over a ranked opponent in the 2018 campaign.

On Northwestern's opening drive, Thorson's pass was intercepted by Evan Bondoc at the NU 29-yard line. Alec Ingold rushed for a four-yard touchdown at 8:04 in the first quarter to complete a five-play, 29-yard scoring drive, giving Wisconsin an early 7-0 lead. Northwestern responded on its following possession when Thorson rushed for a one-yard run up the middle with 2:21 left in the first quarter to cap off a 75-yard scoring drive and tie the score at seven.

With just under seven minutes to play in the second, Jonathan Taylor fumbled the ball that was then recovered by junior cornerback Trae Williams for his first fumble recovery of the season at the Wisconsin 15-yard line. Thorson picked up his second score of the day with a five-yard TD run with 3:44 left to play in the first half, giving the 'Cats a 14-7 advantage. Wisconsin pulled within four on their next possession as Rafael Gaglianone ended a nine-play, 50-yard scoring drive when he converted a 36-yard field goal at 2:39 in the second quarter.

On its second possession of the second half, Thorson completed a 24-yard touchdown pass to McGowan who bobbled the ball but managed to get his foot down at the back of the end zone at 6:23 in the third quarter to extend Northwestern's lead to 21-10. In the third quarter, sophomore kicker Charlie Kuhbander delivered a 26-yard field goal at 2:39 to give the 'Cats a 14-point lead.

GAME 9 • #3 NOTRE DAME 31, NORTHWESTERN 21 • NOV. 3, 2018

Senior quarterback Clayton Thorson rushed for two touchdowns and threw for one more, but Northwestern (5-4, 5-1 Big Ten) fell, 31-21, to No. 3 Notre Dame (9-0) in front of a sellout crowd under the lights at Ryan Field.

Thorson rushed for two touchdowns in a game for the fifth time. First-year running back Isaiah Bowser led the Wildcats with 23 attempts for 93 yards and sophomore wide receiver Riley Lees caught his first touchdown of the season. Sophomore Travis Whillock led the team with a career-high 10 tackles, including five solo.

On Notre Dame's second possession of the game, Dexter Williams completed a 14-play, 79-yard scoring drive with a one-yard touchdown run to put the Irish up 7-0.

Shortly after, a 10-yard pass from Thorson to senior wide receiver Flynn Nagel gave the 'Cats the ball on their own 41-yard line. On the drive, Northwestern elected to go for it on fourth-down-and-five. Junior wide receiver Bennett Skowronek made a one-handed seven-yard catch over his shoulder to get the first down for the 'Cats. Four plays later, Thorson rushed for a one-yard touchdown up the middle to tie the score at seven with 8:04 in the second quarter.

On Notre Dame's first possession of the second half, Ian Book completed a 20-yard touchdown pass to Miles Boykin to cap off an 11-play, 80-yard scoring drive and give the Irish a 14-7 advantage. Book completed a 47-yard touchdown pass to Michael Young with 2:33 left in the third quarter. At the start of the fourth quarter, Yoon converted a 43-yard field goal at 13:05 to give the Irish a 17-point lead.

NU responded on its following possession when Thorson threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to Lees at 11:16 to pull Northwestern within 10. Cornerback Cameron Ruiz blocked the punt, giving Northwestern the ball at the Notre Dame 17-yard line. On fourth-down-and-one, Thorson rushed for his second one-yard touchdown of the day with 7:05 left in the game, cutting the deficit to three. Notre Dame extended its lead to 10 and secured the victory when Book rushed for a 23-yard touchdown, completing a 10-play, 89-yard scoring drive for the Irish.
