Dan and Susan Jones Family Head Football Coach Pat Fitzgerald picked up his 100th career victory with the win over Maryland. His 100 career victories are the 25th most by an active FBS coach. All 100 wins have come as the head coach of the Wildcats, which places him seventh on the list of active FBS coaches who have collected their wins at the same school. Fitzgerald is one of eight active coaches to be the all-time winningest coach at their current school and ranks fifth on that list. The 2013 Gator Bowl victory was Fitzgerald's 50th career win, making him NU's all-time winningest coach.



NEW O ON THE BLOCK

Graduate transfer Peyton Ramsey made an impression in his debut, completing 23-of-30 passes for 212 yards, TD, while rushing for 47 yards and a score:

The Wildcats are looking forward to their first trip back to lowa City since beating the Hawkeyes at Kinnick Stadium in 2018. The victory clinched the West Division title for Northwestern and sent the 'Cats to their first Big Ten Championship

game. The Wildcats have won back-to-back games (2016, 2018) at Kinnick and a win on Saturday will match NU's

For the first time since the 2007 season, Northwestern has a new offensive play caller. Mike Bajakian "Jake" was hired as

Northwestern had four separate players score rushing touchdowns for the first time since November 25, 2017 vs. Illinois The 40-point margin of victory is the 'Cats' largest over a Big Ten opponent since 1970, when Northwestern defeated Illinois, 48-0

Northwestern scored 40-plus points against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since November 25, 2017, when the Wildcats

Northwestern's 30 points in the first half were the most scored by the Wildcats since scoring 31 in their 2018 season opener at

Purdue (August 30, 2018). The Wildcats' 27-point lead at the break was their largest margin after one half since leading Bowling

- Peyton Ramsey found seven different receivers that accounted for 23 receptions in Saturday's win over Maryland, with each receiver recording multiple receptions. The last time Northwestern had that many receivers catch two or more passes in a single game was the 2018 Big Ten Championship, when eight different receivers combined for 21 receptions.
- Ramsey is the first Wildcat quarterback to throw for at least 200 yards in his program debut since Dan Persa vs. Vanderbilt (Sept. 4, 2010)
- He is the first NU quarterback to win in his first start since Clayton Thorson vs. Stanford on September 9, 2015.

The Wildcats tallied 537 yards of offense, most yards by a Big Ten team in week one of the 2020 season

DON'T SLEEP ON THE DEFENSE

Northwestern's offense tried to steal the show in the 2020 opener but defensive coordinator Mike Hankwitz's crew still did its thing:

- Northwestern did not surrender a touchdown against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since November 18, 2017, when it shut out Minnesota 39-0
- The Wildcats snagged interceptions on back-to-back Maryland drives in the first quarter. NU last grabbed interceptions on back-to-back drives against Minnesota in the first quarter on Nov. 17, 2018
- Northwestern had three interceptions in the game. The last time NU recorded three interceptions in a game was against Purdue on Aug. 30 2018
- The Wildcats' 16 points off of turnovers were their most since scoring 21 points off turnovers against Utah in the 2018 Holiday Bowl

WE'LL TAKE(AWAY) THAT

Northwestern posted a +4 turnover margin in the opener thanks to interceptions from A.J. Hampton, JR Pace and Coco Azema in addition to rookie Cam Porter recovering a fumble on a kickoff. The Wildcats were perfect on the offensive end and finished the game with zero turnovers of their own. The last time the Wildcats had zero turnovers and forced four-or-more in a game was against Minnesota in 2017, finishing with five takeaways. In the last 20 seasons, Northwestern has only accomplished this feat on eight occasions and only five times in league play.

- CB A.J. Hampton recorded an interception in the first quarter, the second
 of his career. Hampton also recorded an interception in the Wildcats' 2019
 season finale at Illinois on November 30, 2019. The last Wildcat to record an
 interception in back-to-back games was Blake Gallagher in 2019, who did so
 in three consecutive games (Nov. 9-23).
- JR Pace tallied his eighth career interception
- Coco Azema picked up his first interception

WE'LL TAKE(AWAY) THAT CONTINUED...

Northwestern's four turnovers forced are their most in a season opener in the Pat Fitzgerald era, and most in an NU opener since the Wildcats forced five turnovers in a 28-20 victory at Kansas to open the 2003 season on Aug. 30 (a game in which current President of the Washington Football Team, Jason Wright, accounted for all four of the Wildcats' scores, running for 196 yards and four rushing touchdowns on 41 attempts).

GROUND GAME

Northwestern's ground game exploded in the opener as the 'Cats rushed 53 times for 325 yards and four touchdowns. The Wildcats finished with 6.1 yards per carry, its hight yards-per-carry in a Big Ten game since rushing for 6.3 against Ohio State in the Big Ten Championship game on Dec. 1, 2018.

Northwestern had four separate players score rushing touchdowns for the first time since November 25, 2017 vs. Illinois:

Isaiah Bowser scored a 1-yard touchdown run on the Wildcats' first offensive drive of the game, his seventh-career rushing touchdown and first since November 17, 2018 at Minnesota, when he scored twice. He hauled in his first-career receiving touchdown in the third quarter on a 7-yard pass from Peyton Ramsey. He finished with 23 carriers and 70 yards.

Bowser is the first NU player to record a rushing and receiving touchdown in the same game since Riley Lees did so vs. Utah in the 2018 Holiday Bowl (Dec. 31, 2018).

Drake Anderson, who carried the rock 10 times for 103 yards, scored on a 37-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It marked the longest run of Anderson's career and his first touchdown run since September 28, 2019 at Wisconsin. It was the second 100-yard game of his career. **Evan Hull** scored his fifth-career rushing touchdown on a 30-yard run in the fourth quarter. Four of Hull's five career touchdown runs have gone for at least 30 yards.

MAKING IT RAINE

Northwestern's top target in the opener was tight end John Raine. The transfer from FAU finished with a teamhigh five receptions that went for 53 yards. It was the fifth time in Raine's career that he had five -or-more grabs in a game and only the third time he went over the 50-yard mark for receving yards.

LET'S LOOK AT THE LINEBACKERS

Senior linebacker Paddy Fisher has 322 career tackles, the most of any active Big Ten player and currently the third-most of any active FBS player, trailing only Texas Tech's Colin Schooler (338) and West Virginia's Tony Fields II. Since 2006, only two other Wildcats have tallied more career tackles (Chi Chi Ariguzo - 335; Godwin Igwebuike - 324).

Fisher, who was one of two Big Ten linebackers on the league's preseason honors list, had his streak of 100-tackle seasons snapped last season. The Katy, Texas native recorded 113 tackles in 2017, 116 in 2018 and just 89 last time out.

Fellow senior linebacker Blake Gallagher has been in the top two for the Wildcats in tackles in each of the last two seasons and currently has 252 career tackles, the second-most of any active Big Ten player behind Fisher. Gallagher tallied an interception in three consecutive games last season.

CHARLIE AND THE FIELD GOAL FACTORY

Senior kicker Charlie Kuhbander has found himself all over the Northwestern record book. Kuhbander ranks in the top-10 all-time at NU for field goal percentage, field goals made, points kicking, extra points made and extra points percentage.

Kuhbander went 10-for-14 on field goals during the 2019 season with a long of 44 yards that came against UNLV (9/14). He was 6-for-7 at Ryan Field last season. His career long is a 45-yard field goal against Michigan in 2018.

Kuhbander went 3-for-3 on field goals in the opener. Two of his field goals came from 43 yards out, marking the first time in his career that he has connected on multiple field goals from 40-or-more yards out.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Sophomore running back Drake Anderson had a breakout campaign in 2019 as a redshirt first year. Anderson rushed for 634 yards, which is the fourth most by an NU rookie. Drake's father Damien Anderson, NU's second all-time rusher (4,485), tallied 537 yards in his first college season. Drake Anderson posted 4.1 yards per carry and found pay dirt three times. His best game came in the home opener, rushing for a career-high 141 yards on 26 carries.

GILLIKIN IS AS GOOD AS IT GETS

Northwestern long snapper Tyler Gillikin is one of a kind. The fifth-year senior has been Northwestern's starting long snapper since 2017. This fall the Atlanta, Ga., native is balancing Big Ten football and medical school. Gillikin was accepted to NU's Feinberg School of Medicine and has already started classes. He finished his undergraduate career with a 3.9 GPA as a biological sciences major. He is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy (Best football scholar-athlete in the nation) and on the Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List (Best FBS senior long snapper). He is the only Power Five starter currently enrolled in medical school.

TALKIN' TRANSFERS

Northwestern had three graduate transfers join the program in the offseason. The Wildcats welcomed punter Derek Adams from Kent State, tight end John Raine from FAU and quarterback Peyton Ramsey from Indiana. All three made significant contributions in the opener.

Adams was a three-year starter at Kent State, twice earning All-MAC honors. Last season for the Golden Flashes, Adams averaged 43.1 yards per punt and placed 20 of his 59 punts inside the 20. His career long is a 77-yard punt he booted against Akron in 2017. The Manheim, Pa., native earned MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week honors four times during his career and left Kent State ranked third all-time in career punting average (41.7).

Ramsey, who graduated in May from Indiana University with a secondary education degree, appeared in 32 games in three seasons for the Hoosiers, making 23 starts. During his time in Bloomington, Ramsey completed 66.5% of his career pass attempts for 6,581 yards and 42 touchdowns, while rushing for 832 yards and 14 touchdowns. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native was named honorable mention All-Big Ten (media) in 2019 after finishing second in the Conference for completion percentage (68%), fourth in yards per attempt (8.2) and fifth in passer rating (147.7).

Raine, who received an undergraduate degree in management this past spring, appeared in 42 games for Florida Atlantic from 2016-19. In each of his four years with the Owls, Raine saw his receiving numbers improve, finishing his career with 56 receptions for 530 yards and seven touchdowns. In 2019 the Miami, Fl. native earned All-Conference USA honorable mention accolades after posting 38 receptions for 343 yards and six touchdowns to help lead the Owls to their second C-USA Championship in three years.

CROWDED QB ROOM

Northwestern has an abundance of experience at the quarterback position in 2020:

TJ Green | Gr. | Leawood, Kan./Rockhurst

Son of NFL great Trent Green ... Has appeared in 13 games off the bench during his NU career ... Suffered a season-ending injury vs. Stanford in the opener (8/31) last season ... 27-for-47 passing with one INT ... one rushing TD.

Hunter Johnson | Jr. | Brownsburg, Ind./Brownsburg/Clemson

Top rated QB in 2017 class by ESPN ... Indiana's Mr. Football in 2016 ... Played in seven games as a true freshman at Clemson, going 21-for-27 passing for 234 yards, two touchdowns and one interception ... Appeared in six games for the 'Cats last season and threw for 432 yards.

Andrew Marty | Jr. | Cincinnati, Ohio/Wyoming

Made his collegiate debut in 2019 vs. Ohio State (10/18) ... Ran in two touchdowns on 52 yards rushing while passing for 95 yards and a score against Minnesota (11/23) ... Logged his first career start, scrambling for 111 yards and two scores along with a passing touchdown to help defeat Illinois (11/30) ... Completed 14-of-22 passes on the season with two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Peyton Ramsey | Gr. | Cincinnati, Ohio/Elder/Indiana

Graduated from Indiana in May ... Has appeared in 31 games ... Threw for 42 touchdowns and 6,581 yards in the three seasons ... Completed 68% of his passes in 2019, which ranked second in IU single-season history ... His 147.7 passing efficiency last season ranked fifth in the Big Ten.

BREAK IT UP

Junior DB Greg Newsome II tied a NU single-game record with a career-high four pass breakups versus Michigan State (Sept. 21, 2019). Newsome finished second in the Big Ten in 2019 with 1.2 passes defended per game.

HIGH PRAISE FOR THE NEWCOMERS

Northwestern's 2020 recruiting class ranked 47th nationally according to 247Sports, tying the 2014 recruiting class as the highest in program history. The 2014 class featured current NFL players Clayton Thorson, Justin Jackson, and Blake Hance. The 2020 class is headlined by local four-star recruit Peter Skoronski (Park Ridge, Ill./ Maine South), who is the fourth-highest ranked recruit in program history. Seven members of the 17-player class enrolled early in January of 2020.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

Last fall, NU placed a Big Ten-best 57 players on the Academic All-Big Ten team. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) released in the fall of 2019, Northwestern Football was one of five Division I programs to earn a 100% mark and became the first program from a Power Five Conference to achieve the accomplishment. The Wildcats have ranked in the Top-2 for GSR among FBS schools for nine consecutive years.

CELEBRATING THE 'CATS

The 2020 season marks notable anniversaries for two of the best seasons in program history. It is the 25th anniversary since the Wildcats captivated the country by upsetting Notre Dame in the 1995 season opener before going undefeated in Big Ten play, winning the conference championship and earning a berth to the 1996 Rose Bowl. This season also marks 20 years since Northwestern won a share of the 2000 Big Ten championship with a 6-2 Big Ten record. The Wildcats were led by running back Damien Anderson, father of current Wildcat running back Drake Anderson. Current running backs coach Louis Ayeni was a member of the 2000 team.

THIS SEASON LOOKS DIFFERENT

This will be Northwestern's first 8-game season since 1943, where the Wildcats went 6-2 overall and 5-1 in conference play. The Wildcats have had 19 8-game seasons, 11 of which they have earned a winning record. NU has been named as Co-Big Ten Champions on three occasions in those 19 seasons, most recently 1936 where it went 7-1 overall and 6-0 in Big Ten play.

LT Peter Skoronski, DB Rod Heard II and S Brandon Joseph each made their first-career starts. They are the first Northwestern rookies to start in a season opener since Rashawn Slater (RT), Paddy Fisher (MLB) and Samdup Miller did so on September 2, 2017 in a win over Nevada ... Slater declared for the 2021 NFL Draft this past August ... 

Already the second-longest tenured Big Ten head coach at the age of 45, Pat Fitzgerald's 14 seasons at the helm of Northwestern have been spent building upon the tradition he helped establish as a Hall-of-Fame linebacker for the Wildcats in the mid-1990's. Characterized by his motivational skills, enthusiasm and passion for all things Northwestern, Fitzgerald has shaped Chicago's Big Ten Team into one that consistently achieves excellence in all three phases of the student-athlete experience: academics, athletics and community outreach.

Fitzgerald has built the Wildcats' program into a consistent winner. The 2018 Wildcats claimed the program's first-ever Big Ten West Division title and berth in the Big Ten Championship game with a program-tying eight Big Ten wins. Fitzgerald was named the consensus Big Ten Head Coach of the Year and a finalist for the 2018 Dodd Trophy.

Fitzgerald has led the Wildcats to nine bowl appearances in his 14 seasons and has guided the 'Cats to four of their five bowl wins in program history. Most recently in postseason play, Chicago's Big Ten Team mounted a dramatic come-from-behind victory over No. 17 Utah in the 2018 Holiday Bowl by scoring a bowl record 28 points in the third quarter to claim their third-straight bowl win for the first time in program history.

Away from the gridiron, Fitzgerald's players have achieved at the highest levels in the classroom, last fall placing a Big Ten-best 57 players on the Academic All-Big Ten team. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) released in the fall of 2019, Northwestern Football was one of five Division I programs to earn a 100% mark and became the first program from a Power Five Conference to achieve the accomplishment. The Wildcats have ranked in the Top-two for GSR among FBS schools for nine consecutive years.

NU also goes to great lengths to make a difference in the community. Fitzgerald, his family and his players partake in countless charitable events, impacting the NU and Evanston communities through their participation in Northwestern Dance Marathon, Special Olympics, Misericordia, the NU chapter of Uplifting Athletes, weekly school and children's hospital visits, and dozens of other organizations. Fitzgerald was named the honorary coach of the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.

As a player in 1995, Fitzgerald was the leader of a suffocating Wildcats defensive unit that led the nation in scoring defense and anchored NU's storybook run to the Big Ten championship and Rose Bowl. He capped the year by winning both the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards as the nation's top defensive player and also was the Big Ten, Chevrolet and Sports Illustrated-Defensive Player of the Year. Fitzgerald accomplished all of this despite suffering a broken leg in the penultimate regular-season game.

A graduate of Orland Park's (III.) Carl Sandburg High School and a 2003 inductee to the Northwestern Athletics Hall of Fame, Fitzgerald resides in Northfield with his wife, Stacy, and three sons, Jack, born in November 2004, Ryan, born in September 2006, and Brendan, born in February 2009.
