Senior LB Josey Jewell is a preseason first team All-American by the Associated Press; he's on the Big Ten Conference Preseason Players to Watch List, and is named on five national award watch lists: Lott Impact, Bednarik, Butkus, Nagurski, and Wuerffel.

Iowa is the only FBS team with two players that rushed for 1,000-plus yards in 2016. Senior RB Akrum Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081), and senior graduate transfer RB James Butler rushed for 1,336 yards at Nevada in 2016.

3

RB Akrum Wadley, who rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264).

4

Iowa's quarterbacks have a combined 13 career pass attempts, and its receiving corps has only one player (Matt VandeBerg) with a career reception as a Hawkeye.

5

Since Ferentz's first season in 1999, Iowa has had more AP top-10 finishes than Miami, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, and Tennessee.

6

Kinnick Stadium's playing surface is new in 2017, and for the first time in the field's 89-year history, a Tigerhawk is featured at midfield.

7

Ferentz teams have finished in the Associated Press top-10 on five occasions, and in four of those seasons the Hawkeyes were led by a first-year starter -- Banks in 2002, Nathan Chandler in 2003, Drew Tate in 2004, and C.J. Beathard in 2015.

8

Iowa's offensive line has a combined 117 starts.

9

Seniors Ike Boettger, Boone Myers, and Sean Welsh; juniors James Daniels, Lucas LeGrand, and Keegan Render, and sophomore Levi Paulsen, all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016.

10

Iowa is 15-3 in season openers since 1999 and 15-1 since 2001. The Hawkeyes average 35.9 ppg in the 14 wins, and 11.3 ppg in the three losses.

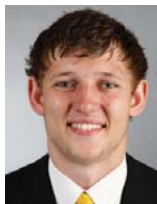

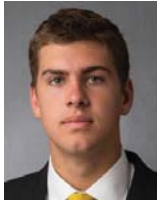

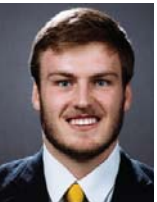

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,220 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 633-548-39 (.535). That includes a 397-216-16 (.641) record in home games, a 236-332-23 (.418) record in games away from Iowa City, a 320-369-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 280-180-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

THE SERIES

Iowa is undefeated in two previous meetings with Wyoming. The Hawkeyes defeated the Cowboys, 21-7, at Kinnick Stadium in 1953, and 20-19 at the 1987 Holiday Bowl in San Diego, California.

LAST MEETING – Dec. 30, 1987 – Holiday Bowl – San Diego, California

Iowa's defense and special teams scored two touchdowns and FB David Hudson scored on a short run in the fourth period to rally the Hawkeyes to a 20-19 triumph over Wyoming in the 10th Holiday Bowl. Merton Hanks deflected a second period punt, the first of his two blocked kicks, and Jay Hess covered it in the end zone for a score. Anthony Wright cut the deficit to 19-13 with a 33 yard interception return. Greg Worker's 52 yard FG attempt was blocked by Hanks with 46 seconds left to preserve the victory. Wright, who had six tackles, was Iowa's game MVP. Wyoming had a 12-0 lead before Hess got the Hawkeyes on the scoreboard, but Iowa still trailed 19-7 at halftime before pitching a shutout in the second half.

RUN AFTER HANDOFF, RUN AFTER CATCH, RETURN FOR SENIOR SEASON

Senior RB Akrum Wadley announced on Jan. 5 he would return to Iowa for his senior season. Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) and all-purpose yards (1,396), and ranked second in receptions (36) in 2016. All three totals were career highs. He scored 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth in the Big Ten, and was named third team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranks 18th in career rushing yards (1,763) and 20th in career scoring (132 points).

He combined for 25 catches, 199 yards receiving, and two receiving touchdowns the final six weeks of 2016. He posted career bests in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72) in Week 8 against Wisconsin, and shared the team lead with five receptions in Week 9 at Penn State (32 yards, TD). He led Iowa with five catches, 52 receiving yards, and scored the team's only touchdown (3-yard reception) against Michigan.

Wadley rushed 22 times for 115 yards against Florida at the 2017 Outback Bowl, exceeding the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in his career. He became the 47th Hawkeye in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season.

1,000-YARD RUSHERS

The Hawkeyes are the only FBS team with two players that rushed for 1,000-plus yards in 2016. Senior RB Akrum Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) and all-purpose yards (1,396), and ranked second in receptions (36) in 2016. All three totals were career highs.

Senior RB James Butler rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior at Nevada in 2016. He added three more receiving touchdowns to go along with 381 receiving yards. He is a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) enters his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is seventh with 135 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 82 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 126-71 (.640) overall mark and a 78-49 (.614) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 135-92 (.595) and an 82-63 (.565) mark in Big Ten games. Through 21 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 147-113 (.565). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's first-year offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ CLOSES ON BIG, HAWKEYE LEGENDS

Kirk Ferentz has 135 overall wins and 82 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 82 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz's 135 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank seventh in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is one victory from equaling Henry Williams of Minnesota, who won 136 games, and eight wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (135, 82) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top seven in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz enters his 19th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

FRESH ARMS, FRESH LEGS

Iowa's quarterbacks have a combined 13 career pass attempts, and its receiving corps has only one player with a career reception as a Hawkeye. That leads to an inexperienced group, but it also means many fresh faces can build on last year's 153.2 passing yards per game. That number that ranked 118th nationally and 13th in the Big Ten.

Sophomore Nathan Stanley was the only Hawkeye quarterback not named C.J. Beathard to attempt a pass in 2016. Stanley was 5-for-9 passing for 62 yards in seven games. He was the first true freshman to play quarterback since Drew Tate in 2003.

Junior Tyler Wieggers was Iowa's No. 2 quarterback in 2015, but sat behind Beathard and Stanley in 2016. He did not see any action last year, but was 3-for-4 passing for 32 yards in four appearances in 2015.

The Hawkeye quarterbacks will benefit from the return of senior WR Matt VandeBerg, who was granted a fifth-year medical redshirt after missing the final nine games in 2016 with an injury. VandeBerg led the Hawkeyes in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-285-3) before his injury. He is the only wide receiver on the team with a career reception at the University of Iowa. Senior Akrum Wadley, Iowa's starting running back, is Iowa's top returning receiver. Wadley had a career-best 36 receptions for 315 yards in 2016, both ranked second on the team.

Junior wide receiver Matt Quarells also joins the rotation. The graduate transfer from New Mexico had 13 career receptions and 203 yards receiving in two seasons with the Lobos.

A PLEASANT RESOLUTION TO THE CASE OF THE UNKNOWN

Iowa's quarterback position has a combined 11 NCAA football appearances (Nathan Stanley appeared in seven games in 2016, Tyler Wieggers appeared in four games in 2015). Neither player has a career start. Iowa is one of eight schools entering 2017 with zero career starts at the quarterback position. The 11 combined appearances tie for the sixth fewest in FBS.

No matter who lines up under center, that person will be a first-year starter. The good news is that since 1999, both of Kirk Ferentz's Big Ten championships have been with a first-year starting quarterback. Brad Banks led Iowa to a share of the conference title in 2002, and Drew Tate did the same in 2004. In 2015, first-year starter C.J. Beathard was given the keys to the offense and drove Iowa to the Big Ten championship game and Rose Bowl.

Ferentz teams have also finished in the Associated Press top-10 on five occasions, and in four of those seasons the Hawkeyes were led by a first-year starter -- Banks in 2002, Nathan Chandler in 2003, Tate in 2004, and Beathard in 2015.

WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT

Senior RB Akrum Wadley, who rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001).

GRADUATE NEWCOMERS

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively. Butler rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior in 2016. He added three more receiving touchdowns to go along with 381 receiving yards. He is a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. The senior has one year of eligibility remaining. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

HAWKEYES RETURN NATION'S TOP OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT

Seniors Ike Boettger (LT, LG, RT), Boone Myers (LT, LG), and Sean Welsh (RG, RT); juniors James Daniels (C), Lucas LeGrand (C), and Keegan Render (LG, RG); and sophomore Levi Paulsen (RG) all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016. The Joe Moore Award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and "finishing". It is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

The Hawkeyes were selected over national runner-up Alabama and third-ranked Ohio State. Iowa was selected by a voting committee comprised solely of people who played or coached the offensive line position, including all of the current offensive line coaches at the Division I/FBS level as well as former players, coaches and colleagues of Coach Moore, and select media. Iowa's offense averaged 171.8 rushing yards per game -- averaging 4.5 yards per carry, and more than two yards before contact -- and 325 yards total offense per game.

BRIAN FERENTZ NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2011-15. He joined the Iowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, Iowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

Iowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland will coach the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was Iowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and Iowa's quarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, Iowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wieggers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2017. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, enters his sixth year on staff and first as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 10th year on the Iowa staff, his third coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13 before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

Iowa has posted a 6-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. The following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

VANDEBERG RETURNS FOR 5TH YEAR

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg missed Iowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury.

On Dec. 21, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

VandeBerg has 106 career receptions, tying Quinn Early for 19th in program history. He has 1,302 career receiving yards, 27th in program history.

CENTER STAGE

Kinnick Stadium's playing surface is new in 2017, and for the first time in the field's 89-year history, a Tigerhawk is featured at midfield. The stadium surface featured a block "I" at midfield from 1972-80, but that university logo was removed when a new surface was installed prior to the 1981 season. Midfield has been without a logo since.

The new playing surface is the first of the three-phase Kinnick Edge project, which will see the entire north end zone stands replaced following the 2017 season. Visit kinnickedge.org for more information.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Since the start of the 2003 season, Iowa has 113 wins, a total that ranks 24th-best in the nation.
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 312 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had eight individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 54-37 (.593) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, enters its 14th season in 2017.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
