- Senior LB Josey Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Week 1. Jewell is a preseason first team All-American by the Associated Press and is named on five national award watch lists: Lott IMPACT, Bednarik, Butkus, Nagurski, and Wuerffel.
- WR Matt VandeBerg has 16 receptions for 243 yards and two TDs in his last two meetings against Iowa State. He has at least one reception on 20 consecutive games played.
- The lowa defense is one of 12 teams that did not allow a touchdown Week 1. The Hawkeyes did not allow Wyoming to reach the red zone in Week 1.
- lowa's linebackers combined for 38 tackles in the season opener (Jewell 14, Niemann 13, Bower 11).
- lowa's offensive line has a combined 122 starts. The Hawkeyes' quarterbacks have one career start.
- lowa is the only FBS team with two players that rushed for 1,000-plus yards in 2016. Senior RB Akrum Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) last season, and senior graduate transfer RB James Butler rushed for 1,336 yards at Nevada in 2016.
- Since Kirk Ferentz's first season in 1999, Iowa has had more AP top-10 finishes than Miami, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, and Tennessee.
- Ferentz's 136 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference tie for sixth (Henry Williams of Minnesota) in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is seven wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.
- Ferentz teams have finished in the Associated Press top-10 on five occasions, and in four of those seasons the Hawkeyes were led by a first-year starter -- Banks in 2002, Nathan Chandler in 2003, Drew Tate in 2004, and C.J. Beathard in 2015.
- Saturday is the third event of the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. Iowa defeated Iowa State's soccer team, 1-0, on Aug. 25. The schools' volleyball teams meet Sept. 8, in Iowa City.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,221 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 634-548-39 (.535). That includes a 398-216-16 (.641) record in home games, a 236-332-23 (.418) record in games away from lowa City, a 320-369-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 281-180-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

JOSEY JEWELL EARNS NATIONAL/CONFERENCE HONOR

LB Josey Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 24-3 win over Wyoming Saturday in Kinnick Stadium. Jewell led Iowa with 14 tackles, including seven solo stops. His totals included two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, and one pass break-up. His QB pressure late in the game led to Iowa's second interception. The sacks and tackles for loss match career bests.

Jewell's effort led an Iowa defense that allowed just three points to Wyoming, as the Cowboy offense totaled just 233 yards total offense and converted just six-of-20 third and fourth-down conversion attempts.

The Big Ten Player of the Week recognition is the first for Jewell. The Hawkeyes had seven different players recognized by the Big Ten in 2016.

A PLEASANT RESOLUTION TO THE CASE OF THE UNKNOWN

QB Nate Stanley is the 14th quarterback to start a game under Kirk Ferentz. Since 1999, both of Kirk Ferentz's Big Ten championships have been with a first-year starting quarterback. Brad Banks led Iowa to a share of the conference title in 2002, and Drew Tate did the same in 2004. In 2015, first-year starter C.J. Beathard was given the keys to the offense and drove Iowa to the Big Ten championship game and Rose Bowl.

Ferentz teams have also finished in the Associated Press top-10 on five occasions, and in four of those seasons the Hawkeyes were led by a first-year starter -- Banks in 2002, Nathan Chandler in 2003, Tate in 2004, and Beathard in 2015.

Stanley threw three touchdown passes in his first career start Week 1. The last quarterback to throw three touchdowns in his first career start was Ricky Stanzi (3, vs. Florida Atlantic in 2008). Since, 1999, the only other quarterback to throw three or more touchdowns in his first career start under Ferentz was Jon Beutjer (4, at Indiana in 2000).

HAWKEYES RETURN NATION'S TOP OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT

Seniors Ike Boettger (LT, LG, RT), Boone Myers (LT, LG), and Sean Welsh (RG, RT); juniors James Daniels (C), Lucas LeGrand (C), and Keegan Render (LG, RG); and sophomore Levi Paulsen (RG) all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016. The Joe Moore Award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and "finishing". It is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

The Hawkeyes were selected over national runner-up Alabama and third-ranked Ohio State. Iowa was selected by a voting committee comprised solely of people who played or coached the offensive line position, including all of the current offensive line coaches at the Division I/FBS level as well as former players, coaches and colleagues of Coach Moore, and select media. Iowa's offense averaged 171.8 rushing yards per game -- averaging 4.5 yards per carry, and more than two yards before contact -- and 325 yards total offense per game.

TROPHY GAMES

The Hawkeyes have four trophy games on the schedule in 2017. Iowa defends the Cy-Hawk trophy Saturday at Iowa State, the Floyd of Rosedale trophy against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium on Oct. 28, and the Heroes Trophy on Nov. 24 at Nebraska. Iowa will try to regain possession of the Heartland Trophy at Wisconsin on Nov. 11.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) enters his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is tied for sixth with 136 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 82 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 127-71 (.641) overall mark and a 78-49 (.614) Big
 Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the
 conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a
 second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 136-92 (.596) and an 82-63 (.565) mark in Big Ten games. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 148-113 (.567). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
 Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's first-year offensive cordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ CLOSES ON B1G, HAWKEYE LEGENDS

Kirk Ferentz has 136 overall wins and 82 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 82 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz's 136 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference tie for sixth (Henry Williams of Minnesota) in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is seven wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (136, 82) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top seven in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

IOWA/IOWA STATE NOTES

- Iowa has won its last two games played in Ames.
- Kirk Ferentz has been lowa's head football coach since 1999. The Cyclones have had four head coaches during that time. Ferentz was 3-5 all-time against Dan McCarney (1999-2006), 1-1 against Gene Chizik (2007-08), and 4-3 against Paul Rhoads (2009-15). He is 1-0 in his only meeting against Matt Campbell.
- Saturday is the third event of the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. Iowa defeated Iowa State's soccer team, 1-0, on Aug. 25. The schools' volleyball teams meet Sept. 8, in Iowa City. The Cy-Hawk Series is tied, 6-6-1, in its 13 year history.
- Iowa has 57 native Iowans on its roster. Iowa State has 47. Forty-seven percent of Iowa's roster is from in-state, compared to 31 percent of Iowa State's roster.
- Iowa's two-deep features 23 Iowa natives, including 11 starters. Iowa State has 10 native Iowans on its depth chart, including six starters.

THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the 65th meeting in the series. lowa holds a 42-22 advantage in the series that began with a 16-8 ISU win in 1894. The Hawkeyes are 18-8 all-time in games played in Ames. lowa has won two straight at Jack Trice Stadium.

The teams did not meet between 1935 and 1976. Iowa holds a 26-14 advantage since the series resumed in 1977. Here are the results:

The Cy-Hawk Series is in its 14th season in 2017-18, being sponsored for the seventh time by Iowa Corn.

lowa captured the inaugural Cy-Hawk Series in 2004-05 (13-8), and won again in 2006-07 (13-8), 2008-09 (21-4), 2010-11 (15-11), and 2012-13 (17-9).

lowa State won the competition in 2005-06 (13-8), 2007-08 (18-9), 2009-10 (16-11), 2011-12 (17-11), 2013-14 (14-11), and 2014-15 (15-11).

The series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, one point is awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA.

A commemorative Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

IOWA CORN CY-HAWK TROPHY

lowa Corn is the sponsor of the Cy-Hawk Series and the annual football game between the two schools.

Iowa and Iowa State played for the Cy-Hawk Trophy from the time the series resumed in 1977, with the Hawkeyes holding a 26-14 advantage in those games. That original Cy-Hawk Trophy was donated to the series by the Des Moines Athletic Club. The Cy-Hawk Trophy currently resides in Iowa City as a result of Iowa's 42-3 victory last season.

Saturday's game is the third event in the 12th annual lowa Corn Cy-Hawk series. Iowa won the first event on the soccer pitch, 1-0. The volleyball teams meet Sept. 8 in Iowa City. The all-time Cy-Hawk Series is tied, 6-6-1. Iowa won the event, 19-7, in 2016-17.

IOWA VS. THE BIG 12

lowa holds an all-time record of 57-34 (.626) against current members of the Big 12 Conference, having met all but Baylor and West Virginia at least once. Iowa State is the only Big 12 opponent on the Hawkeye schedule this season.

LAST MEETING - Sept. 10, 2016 (Iowa City, Iowa)

lowa scored 14 points in each of the first three quarters to post a convincing 42-3 victory over Iowa State at Kinnick Stadium and retain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The 39-point victory and Iowa's 42 points were the largest margin of victory and the Hawkeyes' most points scored in the series since a 63-20 Iowa win in 1997.

Five different players scored Iowa's six touchdowns -- Akrum Wadley (2), George Kittle, LeShun Daniels, C.J. Beathard, and Matt VandeBerg.

lowa jumped out to a 14-0 advantage after Beathard touchdown passes of nine and 26 yards to Kittle and Wadley, respectively.

The Hawkeyes added a pair of second-quarter touchdowns on a VandeBerg 12-yard scoring reception and a Beathard 1-yard plunge.

lowa's third quarter touchdowns were scored by Wadley (3-yard run) and Daniels (43-yard run).

Beathard finished the contest completing 19of-28 passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing).

Daniels rushed for a game-best 112 yards and one touchdown on 15 attempts.

VandeBerg had a game and career-high 129 yards receiving with one touchdown on seven catches.

Defensively, linebacker Josey Jewell led the Hawkeyes with nine tackles. Defensive tackle Jaleel Johnson had seven tackles, including two sacks. Linebacker Ben Niemann had three tackles and intercepted the first pass of his career in the third quarter, which resulted in an lowa touchdown two plays later.

The Hawkeye defense limited Iowa State to 16 first downs, 291 yards of total offense, and 3-of-15 on third downs.

1,000-YARD RUSHERS

The Hawkeyes are the only FBS team with two players that rushed for 1,000-plus yards in 2016. Senior RB Akrum Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081)) in 2016, and senior RB James Butler rushed for 1,336 yards as a junior at Nevada in 2016.

Wadley rushed for 116 yards in Iowa's season opener. Butler rushed for 47 yards in his Hawkeye debut.

WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT

Senior RB Akrum Wadley has 116 yards rushing in 2017. He rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, and with another 1,000-yard campaign he could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001). Wadley ranks 17th in career rushing yards (1,879).

BRIAN FERENTZ NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2011-15. He joined the lowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, lowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

Iowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland coaches the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was Iowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and Iowa's guarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, Iowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

GRADUATE NEWCOMERS

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively. Butler rushed 10 times for 47 yards in the season opener. He rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior in 2016, and was a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. The senior has one year of eligibility remaining. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells did not play Week 1. He played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wiegers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

VANDEBERG RETURNS FOR 5th YEAR

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg missed Iowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury.

On Dec. 21, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

VandeBerg has 108 career receptions, tying Travis Watkins for 17th in program history. He has 1,321 career receiving yards, 27th in program history.

RUN AFTER HANDOFF, RUN AFTER CATCH, RETURN FOR SENIOR SEASON

Senior RB Akrum Wadley announced on Jan. 5 he would return to lowa for his senior season. Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) and all-purpose yards (1,396), and ranked second in receptions (36) in 2016. All three totals were career highs. He scored 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth in the Big Ten, and was named third team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranks 17th in career rushing yards (1,879) and 20th in career scoring (132 points).

He combined for 25 catches, 199 yards receiving, and two receiving touchdowns the final six weeks of 2016. He posted career bests in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72) in Week 8 against Wisconsin, and shared the team lead with five receptions in Week 9 at Penn State (32 yards, TD). He led Iowa with five catches, 52 receiving yards, and scored the team's only touchdown (3-yard reception) against Michigan.

Wadley rushed 22 times for 115 yards against Florida at the 2017 Outback Bowl, exceeding the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in his career. He became the 47th Hawkeye in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season.

GRADUATE STUDENT-ATHLETES

Eight Hawkeyes completed their undergraduate degrees prior to the 2017 season. Seniors OL Ike Boettger, DL Daniel Gaffey, FB Drake Kulick, WR Matt VandeBerg, and TE Jon Wisnieski, and junior DL Parker Hesse all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Senior RB James Butler and junior WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches
 polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion
 of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished
 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten,
 only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 312 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 55-37 (.598) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has
 had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season
 and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk
 Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served
 as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

BLACK FRIDAY

lowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the seventh consecutive season. The teams have split the last six meetings on Black Friday. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference. This season, for the first time since the rivalry was resumed, the game will kickoff at 3 p.m. (CT) and be televised on FS1.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Cole Croston, a free agent signed by the New England Patriots following the 2017 NFL draft, made the team's 53-man roster, meaning the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz' 18 completed seasons. Croston split time at both tackles positions for the Hawkeyes in 2016.

Austin Blythe, a four-year lowa starter and seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, was the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was lowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was lowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was lowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for lowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

lowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

lowa's 2017 roster of 122 players includes 57 players from the state of Iowa. The roster includes 21 players from Illinois; nine from Wisconsin; six from Michigan; four from Maryland; three from Florida, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Texas; two from Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, and Ohio; and one from Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010;
 DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former
 DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve
 roster.
- Entering the 2017 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Six senior members of Iowa's 2016 team are on NFL opening day rosters, including, QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle and DB Greg Mabin.

GAME RECAP

lowa scored the final 24 points in a 24-3 season-opening victory over Wyoming in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 all-time against the Cowboys.

Wyoming scored the first points of the game on a Cooper Rothe 49-yard field goal. The Cowboys forced four Hawkeye turnovers, however the field goal was the only points of the day the lowa defense surrendered.

lowa closed the half with touchdown passes of two and 27 yards from QB Nate Stanley to TE Noah Fant.

Stanley threw his third touchdown in the third period, connecting with WR Nick Easley on a 45-yard strike to extend lowa's advantage to 21-3. Easley finished the game with a game-best 77 catches on four receptions.

Miguel Recinos split the uprights from 44 yards in the fourth quarter.

Stanley's three touchdown passes are the most by a Hawkeye in a season opener since Drew Tate had six against Montana in 2006. The sophomore signal caller finished the contest completing 8-of-15 passes for 125 yards.

RB Akrum Wadley rushed 24 times for a game-high 116 yards. The senior tailback topped the 100-yard rushing plateau for the 10th time in his career. Wadley is the second player in the Kirk Ferentz era to rush for 100-plus yards in back-to-back season openers (Fred Russell, 2002-03).

lowa's defense held Wyoming to 233 total yards, including 59 yards rushing, sacked quarterback Josh Allen seven times, and intercepted him twice. CB Josh Jackson and DL Brady Reiff each recorded their first career interceptions in the fourth quarter. Wyoming did not run a single play in the red zone and was just six of 20 on third and fourth down conversion attempts.

lowa's linebacking trio of Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower combined for 38 tackles. Niemann's 13 stops are a career high, while Jewell had a game-best 14 tackles, including two sacks, and Bower had 11. Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

lowa used nine first-time starters in the season opener, six on offense and three on defense.
