FOR STARTERS

- Saturday will be just the fourth meeting between Ohio State and Iowa since 2009 and the first in Iowa City since 2010. Ohio State leads the all-time series 46-14-3 and is 18-6-2 in Iowa City.
- The Buckeyes rank in the top 20 nationally in total offense (second, 571.2 yds./game), total defense (12th, 302.5 yds./game) scoring defense (18th, 18.2 pts./game) and scoring offense (second, 46.2 pts./ game).
- Over the last six games, J.T. Barrett is completing 75 pct. of his passes with 22 TDs and no INTs.
- Billy Price will tie Luke Fickell (1993-96) for the Ohio State record for consecutive starts: 50.
- J.K. Dobbins is averaging 7.6 yards per carry seventh best nationally and has 863 yards.
- Ohio State is 26-1 in road games under Urban Meyer, and 19-1 overall in the month of November.

COLUMBUS, Ohio – Following the thrilling come-from-behind victory in Ohio Stadium Saturday against No. 2 Penn State, Ohio State will take its momentum on the road as it travels to Iowa's Kinnick Stadium for a 3:30 p.m. ET kickoff against the Iowa Hawkeyes on ESPN.

Facing two separate 18-point first-half deficits and a 15-point PSU lead in the fourth quarter, Ohio State was led by senior QB J.T. Barrett, who completed 33-of-39 passes for 328 and four touchdowns — three of which came in the fourth quarter. Barrett completed his final 16 passes — including all 13 in the fourth quarter — and added 95 rushing yards in his school-record total of 423 total yards of offense. WR K.J. Hill caught a career high 12 passes for 102 yards while Johnnie Dixon hauled in two fourth-quarter TDs. TE Marcus Baugh caught the game-winning TD, a 16-yard strike with just 1:48 remaining in the game.

The Buckeyes' defense was stout against one of the nation's most explosive offenses, holding the Nittany Lions to 283 yards of total offense and just 91 on the ground. Ohio State recorded a season-high 13 TFLs and limited Saquon Barkley to just 44 yards on 21 carries.

Ohio State and Iowa haven't played since a 34-24 victory in 2013 that was keyed by a 149-yard effort on the ground from Carols Hyde and 222 yards passing from Braxton Miller. This will be the 65th meeting all time in a series that dates back to 1922. The Buckeyes have won 12 of the 13 meetings since 1992.



REAL QUICK ...

• Urban Meyer has a 44-2 regular season record in Big Ten conference play and the Buckeyes are 21-1 in Big Ten road games since 2012.

 J.T. Barrett needs just 29 yards rushing to pass Florida's Tim Tebow for 23rd in NCAA history in rushing yards among quarterbacks.

- The Buckeyes have given up zero punt return yards thus far in eight
- Ohio State has won the last three meetings over lowa and six of the last seven games that have been played in Iowa City. The Buckeyes won 16 straight in the series between 1963 and 1980.
- RB J.K. Dobbins is on pace to become just the fourth Ohio State freshman to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark.
- Ohio State has at least nine tackles-for-loss in six of eight games this season. Nick Bosa leads the way in that category with 10.0 TFL for minus 38 yards and four sacks for minus 27 yards.
- The Buckeyes' defense is surrendering just 248.8 yards per game over the last six contests (122.8/game rushing, 126.0/game passing). Five of the last six opponents have been held under 300 yards of total
- Ohio State's offense has put up 500 or more yards of total offense in a school-record six consecutive games.
- · Johnnie Dixon is averaging a team-high 25.5 yards per reception and nearly half of his 13 catches have gone for touchdowns (six).

SCOUTING IOWA

lowa is 5-3 on the season and 2-3 in Big Ten play following its 17-10 victory last Saturday over Minnesota. The Hawkeyes used touchdown drives on their opening possessions of both halves and got a fourthguarter field goal from Miguel Recinos.

The Hawkeyes own wins this year over Wyoming, No. 16 Iowa State. North Texas, Illinois and Minnesota with narrow losses to No. 7 Penn State (21-19), No. 21 Michigan State (17-10) and Northwestern (17-10).

Quarterback Nate Stanley has started all eight games this year and is completing 57.5 percent of his passes for 1,703 yards, 17 touchdowns and just four interceptions. His favorite target is Nick Easley, who has 36 catches for 375 yards and four touchdowns. On the ground, senior Akrum Wadley is sixth in the conference with 643 yards and five touchdowns.

Defensively, senior linebacker Josey Jewell is among the nation's

is tops of the conference. On the back end, Joshua Jackson leads the Big Ten with 17 total passes defended (15 PBU, two INT).

lowa ranks 10th in the conference in scoring offense (25.0 points/ game), third in scoring defense (17.4 points/game), 10th in total offense (345.9 yards/game) and eighth in total defense (368.8 yards/game).

2017 OHIO STATE POSITION-BY-POSITION SNAPSHOT

DEFENSIVE LINE

Coach Larry Johnson (4th year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Next to quarterback J.T. Barrett, the defensive line is the heart and soul of this football team. There are as many as 13 different players on their way to lettering this season for this group and there are six players who've started at least five games this season. Depth, experience and talent is clearly abundant for this unit which boasts 100 career starts among a total of seven players. Who are the "Rushmen"? Four DEs who wreak havoc: Tyquan Lewis, Jalyn Holmes, Sam Hubbard and Nick Bosa.

Honorees: Lewis was the Big Ten's defensive lineman of the year last year. Hubbard was a first-team Academic All-American. Bosa and Dre'mont Jones were freshmen All-Americans.

Mid-season All-American: Bosa was named a first-team mid-season All-American by The Sporting News and the All-American, and second team by Sports Illustrated.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Led by the defensive line, Ohio State's defense ranks second nationally with 8.9 TFLs per game. Bosa leads the way – and is T2nd in the Big Ten – with 10.0 TFLs ... Bosa also tops the team in sacks with 4.0. Hubbard (6.5 TFLs) and Lewis (5.0) are next among the D-linemen in TFLs with true freshmen Chase Young challenging with 3.5 ... Lewis now has 20 career sacks and he needs just three more to move into Ohio State's all-time Top 5.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Coach Greg Studrawa (2nd year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Already-graduated C Billy Price, senior LT Jamarco Jones, sophomore LG Michael Jordan and junior RT Isajah Prince are in their second season starting as a unit. Six game starter Branden Bowen suffered a left leg fracture against Maryland and will miss the rest of the season. Demetrius Knox has started the past two games at right guard.

Mid-season All-American: Price, a first-team All-American in 2016 by the AFCA, was named a first-team mid-season All-American by the Associated Press. He is on the Rimington Award watch list.

More Honors: Jones was second-team all-Big Ten last year and Jordan was a freshman All-American.

Starter Stats: Price has started 49 consecutive games. He will tie Luke Fickell vs. lowa for the school record for consecutive starts at 50 ... The Nebraska game was just the second time in Meyer's 74 games as Ohio State coach for an in-season starting line-up change along the offensive line ... The quartet of Price, Jones, Jordan and Prince has now started 21 consecutive games.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... The offensive line has powered the Buckeyes to national rankings of No. 2 in scoring, No. 2 in first downs and No. 2 in total offense, plus No. 11 in passing offense and No. 17 in rushing offense ... The Buckeyes' offense leads the Big Ten in total offense, scoring and passing ... Price, like Pat Elflein last year, has moved to center for his senior season. Elflein was a unanimous All-American and the Rimington Award winner as the nation's outstanding center.

RECEIVERS

Coach Zach Smith (6th year at Ohio State)

Spreading the Wealth: Zone 6, as this unit is referred, just happens to have a core base of six wide receivers, all of whom have caught at least 13 passes and at least two touchdown passes. The unit includes Parris Campbell and K.J. Hill at H-Back and Austin Mack, Binjimen Victor, Terry McLaurin and Johnnie Dixon receiver. A seventh – walk-on C.J. Saunders – has contributed 14 receptions for 196 yards.

Big Play Makers: Those seven wide receivers came into the season with just six combined receptions of 20 or more yards. Eight games into the season the receiving corps has 28 such receptions and the receivers are leading Ohio State to a national ranking of No. 11 with 101 pass plays from scrimmage over 10 yards.

Leaders: Fourth-year juniors McLaurin and Campbell were each chosen by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2017 Buckeyes.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... A huge game by K.J. Hill vs. Penn State – a career-high 12 catches for a personal best 102 yards – has propelled Hill to the front of the pack in receptions with 40 for 376 yards. The 12 receptions are tied for 4th in school history ... Mack also had career highs vs. PSU with six receptions for 90 yards ... Campbell is tops with 410 receiving vards with Dixon No. 1 in average per catch - 25.5 - and TDs (6) ... Victor and McLaurin have four TDs apiece ... Receivers have produced five 100-yard receiving games already this season, the most 100-yard receiving games by receivers in coach Urban Meyer's six seasons as coach. Previous high was three in 2015 and 2013 ... Campbell and Saunders vs. UNLV represent the first 100-yard receiving tandem for Ohio State since Ted Ginn and Santonio Holmes did it versus Notre Dame 12 years ago, in 2005.

LINEBACKERS

Coach Billy Davis (1st year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Team captain Chris Worley started vs. Penn State, his first start since the Army game when he injured a foot. He had five tackles, including one TFL, and a pass break-up ... RS freshman Tuf Borland started in Worley's place at MLB against UNLV, Rutgers, Maryland and Nebraska. Jerome Baker leads this unit with 36 tackles to rank second on the team. Baker is the only linebacker to start all eight games. Dante Booker is coming on strong with 20 total tackles,

5.0 TFLs, two sacks and an interception the past four games.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Worley, a team captain, moved to middle linebacker on Day 1 of spring drills after playing on the outside last year ... Borland's 12 total stops versus Army were the most by a freshman linebacker since the 2011 season, when Ryan Shazier, now a starter for the Pittsburgh Steelers, recorded 15 against Penn State ... Current Ohio State linebackers have a total of eight double-digit tackling games combined: Worley leads the way with four: 11 vs. Oklahoma this year and last year he had 10 vs. Clemson, 11 vs. Michigan and 10 vs. Oklahoma. Baker had a career-high 15 vs. Michigan last season and also 13 vs. Wisconsin and 11 vs. Indiana. Borland had 12 vs. Army.

CORNERBACKS

Coach Kerry Coombs (6th year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Coombs is starting two new cornerbacks this year: junior Denzel Ward and sophomore Damon Arnette. Ward has started all eight games and Arnette has started seven. Junior college transfer Kendall Sheffield has also played extensively for the Buckeyes and true freshman Jeffrey Okudah has played 20-or-more defensive snaps in three of the last five games.

Mid-season All-American: Ward was named a first-team Mid-season All-American by CBS Sports and second team by the Associated Press.

Game-Changer: Ward's blocked punt with 11:39 to play and Ohio State trailing Penn State by 15 may have been the play of the game. PSU coach James Franklin thought so. The Buckeyes scored two plays later.

Four First-Round Draft Picks: Ohio State has lost four defensive backs early to the NFL Draft in the last two years with all four first round picks, including a record three cornerbacks in two years. Eli Apple went No. 10 in 2016 to the New York Giants and in this past year's draft Marshon Lattimore went No. 11 overall to the New Orleans Saints and Gareon Conley went No. 24 overall to the Oakland Raiders.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Ward enters the week among the Top 25 defenders in the nation with 10 passes defensed (nine pass break-ups and one interception). He is T3rd in the Big Ten. In his first ever start in the season opener vs. Indiana, Ward had five pass break-ups and a key, fourth-quarter interception ... Arnette recorded his first career interception against UNLV ... Sheffield is fifth on the team in tackles with 27 with Arnette right behind with 26 ... Okudah has played on defense in all eight games this season.

SAFETIES

Coach Greg Schiano (2nd year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Damon Webb leads the team with two interceptions on the season and with three for his career. He is the veteran in the entire secondary: he started 13 games last season alongside Malik Hooker and has a streak of 21 consecutive starts

to his credit. Jordan Fuller has joined Webb in the starting lineup at the other safety spot in all eight games.

1st and 3rd: Fuller and Webb are now first and third, respectively, on the team in tackles with 42 and 35. A career-best nine-tackle effort vs. Penn State has vaulted Fuller into the team lead. Webb had consecutive career-high tackling games with nine stops vs. both Oklahoma and Army.

Notable Notes & Numbers: Still a lot of football to be played, but a non-linebacker has led the Buckeyes in tackles for a season only six times since 1970, with safety C.J. Barnett most-recently leading the team in 2011 with 75 ... Fuller grabbed a tipped pass at the goal line and returned it 40

yards to stop a first-half Indiana drive in Game 1 this season. It was Fuller's first career interception ... Webb leads the team with two INTs this year and had a spectacular third in the end zone wiped out vs. Penn State because of a penalty ... Webb actually had more plays on defense last year than All-American Malik Hooker: 810 to 808 ... Hooker was a unanimous All-American in his one season as a starter last year. He led the nation in "pick-sixes" with three and ranked third nationally with seven interceptions.

QUARTERBACK

Coach Ryan Day (1st year at Ohio State)

Barrett ... Briefly: J.T. Barrett is 33-5 as an Ohio State starting quarterback and has claimed 33 school (29) and/or Big Ten (4) records, including four Saturday vs. Penn State: game total offense (423), completions (33), consecutive completions (16) and 300-yard passing games (eight) ... Barrett also holds the school record for passing yards (8,547) and Big Ten records for TDs responsible for (130) and touchdown passes (94). Barrett is sixth in Big Ten history with 11,466 total offensive yards; he is tied for 14th in NCAA history in TDs responsible for and 24th in NCAA history in rush yards by a QB (2,919).

JT's 13-for-13 4th Quarter: Barrett was outstanding against an outstanding team last week; Penn State had the nation's No. 1 scoring defense and No. 7 defense against the pass and he completed 33 of 39 passes for 328 yards and four TDs. In the fourth quarter alone, he was 13-for-13 for 170 yards and three touchdowns.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Barrett and the Buckeyes are 11th nationally in passing yards with 326.9 yards per game ... Barrett has the best TD-to-INT ratio in the nation at 25-1 ... he is also T1st nationally with just one interception ... the Buckeye offense is on a current streak of school record numbers: six consecutive games of 500-ormore yards of total offense and six consecutive games of at least 300 yards passing ... Barrett, Dwayne Haskins and Joe Burrow combined to throw for a single game school record 474 yards versus UNLV and they also threw a school-record tying seven touchdown passes to a school record seven different receivers ... Barrett trails only Art Schlichter (36) in wins as a starting quarterback at Ohio State.

RUNNING BACKS

Coach Tony Alford (3rd year at Ohio State)

Briefly: Ohio State is 17th nationally in rushing at 244.4 yards per game and second in the Big
Ten. True freshman J.K. Dobbins has starred in his eight starts: rushing for 863 yards off 113 carries with five touchdowns and a terrific 7.6 yards per carry average that ranks seventh nationally. He is 19th nationally in rushing at 107.9 yards per game. Mike Weber is rounding into form after missing much of the first four games with a hamstring issue first incurred in fall camp. He has 248 yards rushing and five touchdowns. Antonio Williams has 187 yards rushing and three TDs while



averaging 6.2 yards per carry. Demario McCall had a breakout game vs. Rutgers with 103 rushing yards off 11 carries, including a 48-yard touchdown run. He also caught a 35-yard touchdown pass against the Scarlet Knights.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Ohio State running backs have lost just 14 yards rushing all season (212 attempts) ... Dobbins averaged 13.2 yards per carry against Army, with 172 yards off 13 carries. Only one player in school history has topped that yards per carry average with at least 10 attempts in a game: Ron Springs rushed for 151 vards off 10 carries in 1977 vs. Purdue ... Dobbins is only the sixth true freshman to start the first game of season for Ohio State. The others: QB Art Schlichter in 1978; LT Orlando Pace in 1995; LB Andy Katzenmoyer in 1996; RB Maurice Clarett in 2002; and RG Michael Jordan in 2016 ... Last year Weber was just the third Ohio State freshman to crack 1,000 yards rushing (1,096 yards with nine touchdowns) and he was the ninth Buckeye to capture Big Ten freshman of the year honors ... Dobbins has high games of 181 vs. Indiana and 172 against Army. He was named the Big Ten Conference freshman or co-freshman of the week after each of those efforts.

TIGHT END

Coach Kevin Wilson (1st year at Ohio State)

Briefly: 2016 starter and senior Marcus Baugh is leading the way with 15 receptions for 161 yards and three touchdowns, including the gamewinning grab against Penn State of 16 yards with just 1:48 to play in the game. Rashod Berry has six catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns in his first season with game action as a tight end.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Baugh has started 23 times in his career, including in all 13 games last season ... Baugh's game-winning TD reception vs. Penn State moved him into a tie for 10th at Ohio State for TDs by a tight end (six) ... Berry broke four tackles on his second career reception which turned into a 38-yard touchdown reception against UNLV ... Berry, who played tight end as a red-shirt in 2015 but moved to defensive end last year before moving back to tight end this fall, had three catches for 57 yards in the game ...

Baugh made a key block to spring J.K. Dobbins on his 52-yard touchdown run against Army that broke the game open and he was also cited by coaches for his key block that enabled Johnnie Dixon to score his 39-yard touchdown against Rutgers.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Meyer/Coombs

In Brief: Liam McCullough is in his second season as a long snapper and Sean Nuernberger is in his second year handling all placements. Nuernberger was the team's kicker in 2014 but red-shirted last season. Drue Chrisman is a red-shirt freshman in his first season as the team's punter.

Notable Notes & Numbers ... Parris Campbell doesn't have enough returns to qualify for the national rankings (he needs 1.2 per game; he has nine returns), but he does boast a kickoff return average of 36.6 yards per return with a long of 82 ... Chrisman has been solid in place of talented Australian punter Cam Johnston by averaging 42.7 yards per punt. Chrisman was terrific vs. Oklahoma: a 45.8 yard average off four punts with all four landing inside the 15, at the 13, 11, 9 and 8 yard lines ... The Buckeyes are 11th nationally in net punting at 41.8 yards per punt ... Ohio State is the only school in the country to not allow a punt return this season ... Nuernberger is 25-for-35 in his career in field goals. He has also smashed the Big Ten Conference record for consecutive extra points with 151, including all 45 this year with his most important kick giving Ohio State its first lead against Penn State at 39-38.



J.T. BARRETT ... WOW!

Senior QB J.T. Barrett had perhaps his finest allaround performance last Saturday vs. No. 2 Penn State, accounting for a school record 423 yards of total offense (328 passing, 95 rushing). Consider these other numbers:

- He completed each of his final 16 passes to finish the game, including a 13-for-13 performance in the fourth quarter for 170 yards and three touchdowns.
- With his 14-yard strike to Terry McLaurin in the second quarter, Barrett passed Drew Brees and became the Big Ten's all-time leader in TD passes. He enters Saturday's game with 94 in his 44-game career.
- Barrett's 33 completions against the Nittany Lions is a single-game Ohio State record.
- With eight 300-yard passing performances in his career, Barrett is tied with Joe Germaine for most in program history.

AND THAT DEFENSE!

Against the nation's leader in all-purpose yards, Ohio State's defense held Saquon Barkley to just 44 yards on the ground. In the second half, he carried the ball 14 times for minus-3 yards. Aside from a 36-yard TD run in the second quarter, Barkley rushed for just eight yards on his other 20 attempts. A total of 12 different Buckeyes helped record a season-high 13 tackles-for-loss. Ohio State currently ranks No. 2 nationally with 8.9 TFL/game.

BARRETT IS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Quarterback J.T. Barrett is the Big Ten's offensive player of the week after leading Ohio State from 18-points down – twice – against Penn State and directing a fourth quarterback comeback win for the ages. Barrett completed a school-record 33 of 39 passes for 328 yards and four touchdowns, plus rushed for 95 yards for another school record 423 yards of offense. He now has a Big Ten record 94 career TD passes, with three of them thrown in the fourth quarter when he was 13-for-13 passing for 170 yards. He enters the lowa game with an active streak of 16 consecutive completions.

FOR THOSE WHO WERE THERE...

Barrett is now 3rd nationally in pass efficiency, 5th in completion percentage, 2nd and 3rd in points responsible for per game and total points responsible for, respectively, tied for 3rd in TD passes and 1st in TD-to-INT ratio (25-1). What was written and said about Barrett after the win:

David Briggs, The Blade: "Most of all, this will go down as the day Barrett – who until now had never been fully embraced by fans – became a true Ohio State legend, not to mention the frontrunner for the Heisman Trophy."

Pete Thamel, Yahoo: "He ... essentially executed two two-minute drives in the game's final five minutes to bring Ohio State all the way back from an 18-point deficit to win the game."

Urban Meyer: "I've never had a kid play perfect, but damn he was close tonight. I can count four drops off the top of my head and two penalties that kept him from big completions."

Chuck Culpepper, Washington Post: "That senior quarterback, J.T. Barrett, caused some numbers that looked as if from some dumb daydream. ... He completed his last 16 passes. He completed all 13 of his fourth-quarter passes, with accuracy that could make you gasp if you wanted."

Bill Landis, Cleveland.com: "Barrett came into the day hovering around the Heisman Trophy conversation. It's arguable that he left Ohio Stadium as the favorite."

J.T. CLIMBS THE CHARTS

J.T. Barrett is 23rd in NCAA history for career rushing yards by a quarterback. He needs 28 yards to pass Florida Heisman Trophy winner Tim Tebow, who had 2,947 in 2006-2009.

Barrett also entered the top five all-time in Big Ten history for total yards. Last Saturday, he passed Antwan Randal-El, who had 11,364 yards from 1998 through 2001 for Indiana, for the fifth spot. Barrett has 11,466 in his 44-game career.

MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Three Ohio State Buckeyes have been selected to various mid-season All-American football teams:

- Graduated center Billy Price was named to the Associated Press midseason All-America team;
- Junior cornerback Denzel Ward was named to the CBS Sports first-team and to the Associated Press second midseason All-America team; and
- Sophomore defensive end Nick Bosa was named to the first teams as chosen by The All-American and The Sporting News, and to Sports Illustrated's second team.

IN THE LAST SIX

In Ohio State's current six-game winning streak, J.T. Barrett has been the catalyst behind an offense that is averaging 50.8 points and 604.0 yards/game. Barrett also:

- Is completing 75.0 percent of his passes (132-176) for 1,679 yards, 22 touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- Has a QB efficiency rating of 196.38.
- Rushed for 327 yards (54.5 yards/game) on 56 attempts with four touchdowns.
- · Is responsible for 26 touchdowns.

DEFENSE HAS BEEN REALLY GOOD

Ohio State's defense has allowed less than 100 yards rushing in each of the last three contests and in its most recent outing, limited Penn State to just 64 total yards on 19 plays in the fourth quarter to help overcome a 15-point deficit.

Some other numbers:

- Ohio State has 12 or more TFLs in three of the last six contests. It currently ranks second nationally with 8.9 TFL per game (71 for minus 258 yards).
- Twelve different players accounted for the 13 TFLs last Saturday against Penn State.
- Over the final two drives of the fourth quarter, the Buckeyes' defense limited Penn State to minus nine yards on seven plays, forcing three negative yardage rushing plays and three incompletions.

REGARDING COMEBACKS

Ohio State overcame two separate 18-point deficits last Saturday versus No. 2 Penn State, its largest comeback since trailing Minnesota 31-0 in the first half of a game in 1989 (Ohio State won the contest, 41-37). It was also the largest deficit overcome by an Urban Meyer-coached team. The previous largest deficit overcome was against No. 1 Alabama in the 2015 Sugar Bowl when the Buckeyes trailed 21-6 in the second quarter and won 42-35.

MORE NUGGETS FROM PENN STATE

- The attendance of 109,302 marked the second-largest crowd in Ohio Stadium history.
- The Buckeyes eclipsed the 500-yard mark of total offense for the sixth-consecutive game, extending the longest streak in program history.
- Meyer's teams are now 47-4 in games in which it has more than one week to prepare.
- K.J. Hill caught a career-high 12 passes for a career-high 102 yards while Austin Mack also caught a career-high six passes for a career-best 90 yards. The 12 receptions by Hill tied for the fourth-most in a single game in program history and marked the most since Corey Brown caught 12 passes against Michigan State in 2012.

THE IOWA SERIES

Ohio State and Iowa are meeting for the 65th time on Saturday with Ohio State officially holding a 46-14-3 lead in the series. It will be the Buckeyes' first trip to Kinnick Stadium since 2010. The two teams also met in 2009, a 27-24 overtime victory that secured Ohio State's trip to the Rose Bowl. Overall, Ohio State owns a 18-6-2 record in games at Iowa City.

500TH BIG TEN WIN

Ohio State's win over Nebraska was the 500th in Big Ten Conference play for Ohio State. The Buckeyes are in their 105th season of Big Ten play and have an all-time record of 500-173-24 for a winning pct. of .734. The 500 wins is tied for most in conference history. Michigan won its 500th Big Ten game on the same day Ohio State won its 500th ... about five hours earlier with a win over Indiana.

DOBBINS' IMPRESSIVE START

With 863 yards in eight games, J.K. Dobbins is on pace to become just the fourth freshman in program history to rush for 1,000 yards. Maurice Clarett owns the freshman rushing record with 1,237 yards in 2002. Dobbins' 13.2 yards per carry average against Army was the second highest in single-game school history, eclipsed only by Ron Springs, who had 10 carries for 151 yards vs. Purdue in 1977.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Members of the Ohio State football team combined for the highest spring term grade point average in eight years with a 2.92 overall average for the semester. This is the third consecutive semester, and fourth out of the past five, that the football team's overall term grade point average had improved.

A total of 44 players had a spring semester grade point average of 3.00 or above with three players - Billy Price, Jordan Fuller and Liam McCullough - earning perfect, 4.00 GPAs. Both Price and McCullough were Big Ten Distinguished Scholars

(Fuller wasn't eligible as a true freshman).

SCORING MACHINES

Urban Meyer's teams have averaged 38.4 points per game over the duration of his 16-year, 202-game head coaching career. Only one other coach who coached the last 15 seasons has had teams score more than Meyer's teams over this time: former Oklahoma head coch Bob Stoops.

Three Ohio State defensive backs - Gareon Conley, Marshon Lattimore and Malik Hooker - were selected in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft to tie the mark for most at the position in one draft and set records over two drafts with four defensive backs chosen in the first round and three cornerbacks taken.

No program has developed four first-round defensive backs over two seasons or had three cornerbacks taken until Ohio State did so this year and last, when Eli Apple was selected No. 10 by the New York Giants.

This year's trio has also given Ohio State eight first round draft picks over the past two seasons, breaking the school record of seven combined from the 2006 and 2007 NFL Drafts.

He has coached the Buckeyes to a national championship in 2014 – the program's eighth – by winning the first College Football Playoff (CFP), to a repeat appearance in the CFP in 2017, to five consecutive Big Ten conference divisional titles and a Big Ten crown in 2014, to a 44-2 record in Big Ten games and to a 17-5 record versus ranked teams.

He has done this by developing and overseeing a program culture that requires accountability, promotes respect, prepares young men for life after football and develops football skill sets and talents at an unsurpassed rate: his program has produced 33 NFL draft picks the last five years, including 10 first-round picks and record numbers of draft picks through the second, third and fourth rounds of the 2016 NFL Draft.

And his team members are getting it done in the classroom, as well. Ohio State Buckeyes have earned four academic All-American honorees the past three years, one National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete award and the team is coming off its finest academic semester under Meyer last fall with record numbers of students with 3.0 (or above) grade point averages for the semester and cumulatively.

These first 15 years as a head coach for Meyer, featuring three national championships and a record of 165 wins against just 29 losses for an .850 winning percentage, have been full of accomplishment, achievement and success for which few can compare.

- Meyer is the third-winningest coach in the history of college football (at least 10 years at an FBS school), trailing only Knute Rockne and Frank Leahy;
- Meyer's .850 winning percentage is No. 1 among all active coaches with at least five years of experience at an FBS school;
- He set the major college record with 165 wins through his first 15 seasons as a head coach;
- Meyer's 2015 Buckeye senior class was the first Power 5 school to win 50 games over a four-year run (2012-15);
- Meyer is the only modern day coach to win national championships coaching in two
 different conferences and, with championships in 2006 and 2008 at Florida and 2014
 at Ohio State, he is one of only two coaches to win national titles at two different
 schools:
- He is the first coach in modern history since 1937 when the NCAA began keeping records – to win at least 13 games in consecutive years (in 2008 and 2009), three times (2006-08-09) and four times (2006-08-09 at Florida and 2014 at Ohio State);
- Meyer is the only coach in major college history to have four different winning streaks
 of at least 20 games (20 with Utah/Florida; 22 at Florida; 25 with Florida and Ohio
 State; and 23 at Ohio State). Only eight other coaches have had even two winning
 streaks of at least 20 games;
- Meyer won more games his first 10 years 104 than all but three coaches in college football history; and
- Meyer reached 100 wins faster than all but one coach Bud Wilkinson in the last 57 years and faster than all but five coaches all-time.

Making the Great State of Ohio Proud

Born in Toledo, raised in Ashtabula and with degrees from Cincinnati and Ohio State, Urban Meyer made it clear from the day he took the Ohio State position - Nov. 28, 2011 - what his intentions are: "We're going to make the great state of Ohio proud with everything we do."

With "a statewide approval rating roughly equal to that of free ice cream" wrote David Briggs of The Blade in 2016, Meyer has, indeed, made Ohio proud of his Buckeyes.
