SETTING THE SCENE

- Purdue heads to Iowa for the 88th meeting between the schools. The Boilermakers lead the series 46-38-3.
- The Boilermakers had their top passing game of the season, throwing for 398 yards at Northwestern.
- Purdue's defense continues to be tough, ranking 19th in the country in scoring defense. The Boilermakers have not allowed an opponent in the end zone more than twice since Sept. 23 against Michigan.
- The Boilermakers have held three straight opponents under 100 yards rushing.
- Purdue is looking for its first win in the series since 2012 when the Boilermakers won on a last-second field goal.
- The Boilermakers are coming off a 23-13 loss at Northwestern last Saturday.
- Iowa is coming off a 38-14 loss at Wisconsin.
- The game is Purdue's eighth scheduled for 3:30 p.m. ET or later this season.
- The game is Purdue's final road game of the season and fourth road game of the last six games.
- The Boilermakers will be televised on the Big Ten Network for the fifth time in the last six weeks.

SERIES HISTORY

- First Meeting:** Oct. 22, 1910 – Iowa won 16-0 in Iowa City
- Last Meeting:** Oct. 15, 2016 – Iowa won 49-25 in West Lafayette
- Noteworthy:** Purdue entered the 2012 game at Iowa with a 3-6 record and needed to win out for a bowl game. The Hawkeyes tied the game at 24 with 3:32 to play and then forced a quick Purdue punt. Iowa marched to Purdue's 35-yard line, where the Boilermakers needed a 4th-and-3 stop. They got the stop and the ball at their own 34 with 16 seconds left. The Boilermakers used two plays to gain 37 yards, which setup a game-winning 46-yard field goal by Paul Griggs as time expired. Purdue won its final three games of the regular season to earn a berth in the Heart of Dallas Bowl.

SURPASSING 2016

- Through 10 games, Purdue has surpassed season totals in numerous categories.
- The Boilermakers have rushed for 1,474 yards this season compared to 1,154 a year ago.
- Purdue has 84 rushing first downs, compared to 78 all of last year.
- Purdue has nine fumble recoveries to last year's four.
- The Boilermakers have scored 33 times in the red zone this year after doing so 28 times last season.
- The Boilermakers have 21 red zone touchdowns to 19 last year.
- Purdue has also surpassed last year's win total and November wins with two games left to play.

P HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM (More on page 14)

- Jeff Brohm was named the 36th head coach of the Boilermakers on Dec. 5, 2016, becoming the first signal caller to lead the Cradle of Quarterbacks in nearly half a century.
- Brohm, who played collegiately at Louisville and for seven seasons in the National Football League, is widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football.

Brohm's Playing Career

- He was a three-year starter at Louisville, playing for the Cardinals from 1989 to 1993.
- He still ranks sixth in program history in touchdown passes (38), seventh in total offense (5,410), eighth in completion percentage (.562), eighth in passing yards (5,451), eighth in passing efficiency (129.97), ninth in passing attempts (715) and ninth in completions (402).
- Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior, and his number 11 became part of Louisville's Ring of Honor in 2006.
- Brohm still has the 11th longest touchdown pass in school with an 80-yard strike to Ralph Dawkins vs. Texas in 1993.
- Brohm threw 20 touchdown passes in 1993, which is tied for 10th most in a single season.
- Brohm played in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers (1994), Washington Redskins (1995-96), San Francisco 49ers (1997-98), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1998), Denver Broncos (1999) and Cleveland Browns (2000).
- In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37-of-58 passes (63.8 percent) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19-of-30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers.
- In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first team All-XFL.



Brohm at Western Kentucky

- Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record (.750 winning percentage), including a 19-5 Conference USA mark (.792), from 2014 to 2016.
- The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016, the school's first back-to-back titles as an FBS member.
- They won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl (49-48 over Central Michigan) and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl (45-35 over Miami, Fla.), as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl (51-31 over Memphis under interim head coach Nick Holt).
- Western Kentucky was ranked No. 24 in the final 2015 Associated Press poll.
- Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons.
- Their starting quarterbacks completed 69.2 percent of their passes and threw 131 touchdowns with merely 25 interceptions.
- Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

More On Brohm

- Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky.
- He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season.
- Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2014.
- A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994.
- He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke.
- Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville, along with his father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07).
- The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

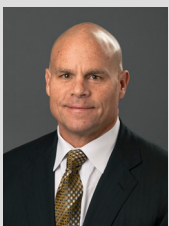

GAME 10 REWIND

- The Boilermakers fell at Northwestern 23-13.
- Elijah Sindelar got the start at quarterback and had career highs in yards, attempts and completions and tied his career high in touchdown passes. He finished 37 for 60 for 376 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.
- T.J. McCollum returned after missing four games due to injury. He was second on the team with 10 tackles, had a sack and led the team with 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Jared Sparks had the best performance by a wide receiver this season. He hauled in a team-season-high 11 catches for 130 yards. Those were both also career highs.
- Purdue did not score on its opening possession, which has spelled doom this season as the Boilermakers fell to 0-6 this year when not scoring on their opening possession.
- The Boilermakers had 11 receivers catch at least one pass, the second most this season.
- Jarrett Burgess hauled in his first career touchdown reception to put the Boilermakers on the board in the third quarter. He also had career highs with five catches for 65 yards.
- The game was Purdue's sixth in a row limiting opponents to two touchdowns or less.

- Purdue has four one possession losses. Those four losses are by 8, 7, 2 and 1 (4.5 per game).
- Purdue has three road losses by a total of 20 points (6.7 per game).

ENGINEERING THE OFFENSE

- Third-year sophomore **Elijah Sindelar** has started five games at quarterback this season. Sindelar split time with David Blough before Blough was injured against Illinois.
- Sindelar is majoring in electrical engineering with an emphasis in power and energy.
- Only one other starting quarterback in the country is an engineering major - Louisiana true freshman Levi Lewis. Lewis, a civil engineer, has played in and started two games this season for the Ragin' Cajuns.
- Sindelar completed 37 passes at Northwestern. **That is the most passes completed by a Purdue quarterback since** Joey Elliott completed 39 against Michigan State on Nov. 14, 2009.
- Sindelar's 37 completions are tied for the 10th most in a single game in school history.
- His 60 pass attempts are tied for the sixth most in a single game in program history. **He is the first to throw at least 60 passes in a game since** Curtis Painter threw the ball 60 times against Ohio State on Oct. 6, 2007. The last quarterback to have more passing attempts in a game was Kyle Orton against Washington State on Dec. 31, 2001 when he threw the ball 74 times.
- Sindelar passed for 376 yards, the most by a Purdue quarterback since Blough threw for 391 at Minnesota on Nov. 5, 2016.
- Sindelar is the 22nd quarterback in school history with at least one 300-yard passing game.
- His passing total is the 30th best in a single game in school history.
- **Only nine quarterbacks in school history have thrown for more yards in a game:** Drew Brees (nine times), Curtis Painter (five times), Kyle Orton (four times), Jim Everett (three times), Blough (three times), Scott Campbell (twice), Danny Etling (once), Mark Herrmann (once) and Mike Phipps (once).

SPARKING THE OFFENSE

- Redshirt freshman quarterback/receiver **Jared Sparks** is the team's No. 2 quarterback and a starting wide receiver.
- He is the only No. 2 quarterback in the country that is a regular contributor at another position. No other No. 2 QB in the country has started a game at another position this season.
- At Northwestern, in his first true game as the team's No. 2 quarterback, Sparks hauled in a career-high 11 catches for a career-high 130 yards.
- **He is Purdue's first 100-yard receiver since**

DEFENSE MAKING PLAYS

- Purdue's defense is night and day from a year ago.
- Purdue's defense had a pair of goal line stands against Louisville and reigning Heisman Trophy winner, Lamar Jackson.
- The Cardinals had eight trips into the red zone and scored just three touchdowns and three field goals. The field goals were from 23, 30 and 32 yards.
- Louisville had four takeaways in the game, including one returned for a touchdown. On the other three, the defense forced two three-and-outs and came up with a fumble recovery.
- Against Ohio, Purdue stopped the Bobcats three times on the Boilermaker side of the field. Twice the stop led to a punt, while the other was a sack on fourth down.
- Against Michigan, Purdue had a then-season-high four sacks, eight tackles for loss and forced seven three-and-outs. The defense also forced seven punts.

first half and 10 for the game.

- The score was 21-0 before Purdue allowed its second first down.
- The defense picked off two passes and recovered a fumble.
- Only three receivers were able to catch a pass.

»Stout against Michigan

- Entering the Michigan game, the defense had just one sack and eight tackles for loss.
- In the first half against the Wolverines, the defense had three sacks and six tackles for loss. The Boilermakers finished with four sacks and eight tackles for loss.
- The defense also forced an interception and a fumble in the game.
- Michigan had just 131 total yards at the half.
- For the game, 25 of Michigan's 75 offensive plays (33.3 percent) were no gain, loss of yards or a turnover.

»Resilient against Minnesota

- Despite turning the ball over four times in the first half, Purdue's defense kept them in the game trailing just 14-6 at the half.
- All 14 first half Minnesota points were off Purdue turnovers.
- On the other two first-half Purdue turnovers, the defense forced a three-and-out and forced and recovered a fumble.
- For the season, Purdue's defense has forced and recovered three fumbles inside its own 10-yard line.

- The defense held Minnesota to just 1 of 13 on third downs of four or longer.
- The defense gave up just 101 passing yards on 11 of 25 (44.0 percent).
- With the game on the line and Minnesota driving for a tying score, Ja'Whaun Bentley picked off Conor Rhoda on fourth down and returned it 76 yards for a touchdown to seal the game.
- The defense forced three three-and-outs and seven total punts against the Gophers.
- In the second half when Purdue did not turn the ball over, it held Minnesota to 138 yards (82 rush, 56 pass) and three points.

»No Quit at Wisconsin

- After trailing 14-0 midway through the first quarter, the defense clamped down.
- From there, the defense held the Badgers to just three points while forcing a pair of punts and three turnovers.
- The defense also blocked a punt.
- Thanks to the defense, the Boilermakers' average starting field position was their own 40, even after recovering a fumble at Purdue's own 5-yard line.

»Tough at Rutgers

- Rutgers' had just one snap inside Purdue's 30 and none in the red zone. It is the first time since Purdue hosted Southeast Missouri State in 2011 that the Boilermakers held an opponent to zero red zone trips.
- The Scarlet Knights did not have a play on Purdue's side of midfield until about the 10-minute mark of the third quarter.
- The Boilermakers forced nine three-and-outs on 14 drives, a season high.
- The defense forced 12 punts, a season high.
- Purdue's defense held Rutgers to a combined -1 yard of offense in the second and fourth quarters.
- Rutgers had four drives in the fourth quarter (not including its drive that started in the third quarter and carried over into the fourth). Those four drives went for -2, -9, -3 and -4 yards, respectively.
- Of Rutgers 217 total yards of offense, 109 came on two plays. The other 53 plays combined for 108 yards, an average of 2.0 yards per play.

»Run-Stopping vs. Nebraska

- The defense allowed just 40 rushing yards on 27 attempts against the Huskers (1.5 average).
- The rushing total was the lowest Purdue has allowed in a game since allowing 39 on 22 attempts against Indiana State in 2013.
- The rushing total is the fewest against a Big Ten opponent since 2004 when the Boilermakers allowed just 18 yards on 17 carries at Penn State.
- **Gelen Robinson** was a huge part of the success as he racked up 5.5 tackles for loss, including 2.0 sacks.

»Backfield-Bound vs. Illinois

- The Boilermakers had season-highs with nine tackles for loss and five sacks against Illinois.
- The five sacks were Purdue's most since last season against Nevada when the Boilermakers also had five. The Boilermakers haven't had more than five in a game since Dec. 26, 2007 when Purdue got to Central Michigan's quarterback six times.
- The nine tackles for loss are the most since having nine at Nebraska last season.
- The last time the Boilermakers had more than nine tackles for loss in a game was last year's

Nevada game when the Boilermakers had 11.

- The Boilermakers allowed just three points after the opening quarter, including none in the second half.
- Purdue has now shut out opponents in 12 quarters this season.

»Field Goal Forcers at Northwestern

- The defense bend, but didn't break at Northwestern, limiting the Wildcats to two touchdowns and three field goals on six red zone trips.
- The Boilermakers allowed just 94 yards on the ground, the fourth time this season the Boilermakers have held an opponent under 100 yards rushing. That's the first time since 2007 the Boilermakers have held four opponents under 100 rushing yards.
- The Boilermakers have made it three straight games holding an opponent under 100 rushing yards, the first time since 2004 against Notre Dame, Ball State and Wisconsin.

INTERCEPTION RETURNS

- Purdue has picked off seven passes and returned them 219 yards through the first 10 games.
- Purdue's interception return yardage already ranks 14th most for a single season in school history.
- The total is just 12 yards shy of climbing into Purdue's all-time top 10.

MCCONNELL TO BROADCASTERS HALL OF FAME

- Joe McConnell, who served as the radio voice of Purdue football from 1994 to 2009, was inducted into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame on Nov. 3.
- McConnell enjoyed a long and distinguished career. Beyond Purdue, his experience included 23 seasons in the National Football League as the voice of the Denver Broncos (1969), Minnesota Vikings (1971-76 and 1985-87), Chicago Bears (1977-84), Indianapolis Colts (1992-94) and Tennessee Oilers (1997-98); seven seasons in the National Basketball Association as the voice of the Phoenix Suns (1970-72) and Indiana Pacers (1972-77); and seven seasons in Major League Baseball as the voice of the Minnesota Twins (1978-79) and Chicago White Sox (1980-84).
- McConnell also spent five seasons (1991-95) as lead voice for the NBA's National Game of the Week. He has broadcast three Super Bowls, the NBA and ABA championships, the NBA All-Star Game and the American League Championship Series.
- Additionally, McConnell broadcast Northwestern football (1988) and Indiana State (1978-79), DePaul (1984-88), Illinois (1987-88), Notre Dame (1987-88) and Northwestern men's basketball (1989-94).

- McConnell was honored with the AP/UPI Play-by-Play Sportscaster of the Year Award five times and was the Indiana Sportscaster of the Year in 2000 and the Illinois Sportscaster of the Year in 1981.
- Upon his retirement as the voice of the Boilermakers, Purdue Athletics named the visiting team radio booth at Ross-Ade Stadium for McConnell.
- McConnell is a 1962 graduate of Franklin College. His broadcasting career began in 1962 at Purdue's campus radio station, WBAA. He served as assistant sports information director at Purdue from 1965 to 1967.

RECOVERING FUMBLES IN PURDUE TERRITORY

- Purdue has recovered nine fumbles this season.
- Three of those nine recoveries have been inside Purdue's 5-yard line, while another was recovered inside the Boilermaker 10.
- Six of Purdue's fumble recoveries have come in Purdue territory and all have been inside the Boilermaker 40-yard line.
- Another fumble occurred at the opponent's 47-yard line.

ROAD SECOND HALVES

- Purdue has allowed just 16 points in road second halves this season.
- The defense did not allow a point in a road second half until Rutgers' second possession of the third quarter.
- The Boilermakers shut out Missouri on the road in week three in the second half.
- At No. 7 Wisconsin, the Boilermakers kept the Badgers off the board in the final 30 minutes.
- At Northwestern, Purdue kept the Wildcats out of the end zone in the second half, but did allow three field goals.
- In road second halves, Purdue has four takeaways with three interceptions and a fumble recovery.

BLOCKING PUNTS

- Purdue, more specifically **Garrett Hudson**, has blocked two punts this season.
- The team blocked punt total is tied for seventh in the country.
- Utah State, Northern Illinois, Arizona State and North Texas have the national lead with four blocked punts this season.
- Hudson has already tied Purdue's single season record with the two blocked punts.
- Nationally, Hudson is one of 17 players with two blocked kicks of any kind. Justin Lawler of SMU leads the way with three.
- Hudson and Maryland's Chandler Burkett are the

only players in the Big Ten with two blocked kicks this season.

SUCCESS WHILE PUNTING

- Joe Schopper has punted 53 times this season for 2,196 yards, an average of 41.4 yards per kick.
- This year, he has 13 punts of 50+ yards (24.5 percent), while 20 of his punts have been downed inside the 20 (37.7 percent). Thirty-one punts have been caught for a fair catch (58.5 percent).
- At Rutgers, Schopper had two punts go into the end zone for touchbacks, his first two of the season.

- The Boilermakers have played four road games this season - at Missouri, at No. 7 Wisconsin and at Rutgers.
- In those games, the Boilermakers have allowed just 14.3 points per game, including just 16 total points in second halves.
- The Boilermakers have six takeaways in road games with three interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

HOPKINS AND HERDMAN

- Junior Cole Herdman and sophomore Brycen Hopkins entered the season as the top returning Power Five Conference touchdown-catching tight end duo after combining for seven TD grabs in 2016.
- No returning Power Five tight end had more touchdown catches than Hopkins' four last year.
- This season, Herdman and Hopkins have combined for 32 catches for 559 yards and six touchdowns.
- Twelve of Herdman's 13 catches have been for first downs, while 12 of Hopkins' 19 catches have moved the chains. Two of Hopkins' other grabs are for touchdowns on -& goal situations.
- Herdman missed the Nebraska game with an injury.

CREATING TURNOVERS

- Purdue's defense has 16 takeaways through the first 10 games with nine fumble recoveries and seven interceptions.
- The Boilermakers had recovered at least one fumble through the first six games. The last time that happened to start a season was 2002 when the Boilermakers recovered exactly one in each of the first six games.
- Purdue's nine fumble recoveries through six games were more than any other Purdue team since before 1980.

TOTAL DEFENSE UNDER 220 YARDS

- The Purdue defense held Missouri to 203 yards and Rutgers to 217 yards, both on the road.
- The last time the Boilermakers held a team under 220 yards of total offense prior to this season was Sept. 1, 2012 when Purdue limited FCS Eastern Kentucky to 190 total yards.
- In 2011, Purdue held Southeast Missouri to 153 yards and Minnesota to 213 yards. That's the last time the Boilermakers held two opponents in a season under 220 yards.

- The last time Purdue held two FBS opponents under 220 yards of total offense was 2004 when the Boilermakers held Syracuse and Ball State each to 197 yards in back-to-back weeks to open the season.
- The last time Purdue held multiple Power Five conference teams to less than 220 total yards of offense in a season was 2003. That year, Arizona gained just 174 yards, Illinois was held to 191 yards and Penn State had just 204 yards of total offense.
- Prior to this season, the last time Purdue held an opponent under 220 yards in a road game was 2002 at Notre Dame when the Fighting Irish gained just 203 yards.
- Since 1973, the closest Purdue has been to holding multiple opponents under 220 total yards on the road was 1979 when the Boilermakers held Indiana to 220 and Michigan State to 223.

- In Purdue's game against Illinois, the Boilermakers held the Fighting Illini to 250 total yards of offense.
- The last time a Purdue team held three opponents to 250 total yards or less in a season was 2003 when the Boilermakers did so against four teams. That year, Purdue held Wake Forest to 244, Arizona to 174, Illinois to 191 and Penn State to 204.

- David Blough was named one of 20 candidates for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.
- The cut to 20 individuals was made Oct. 11.

BLOUGH NAMED A MANNING STAR OF WEEK

- For his performance against Ohio, **David Blough** was named one of eight Manning Stars of the Week.
- Blough had the highest quarterback rating in the country for the week (minimum of five action plays) with a rating of 99.4.

BLOUGH ADDS NAME TO COMPLETION % CHART

- Blough finished his season completing 102 of 157 passes, a 65.0 percent completion rate.
- The school single season list requires at least 150 attempts to qualify. Blough's 65.0 percent clip ranks third in school history for a single season behind only Mark Herrmann's 1980 season where he completed 65.8 percent and Robert Marve's 2012 season where he completed 65.6 percent of his passes.

CAREER RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS LIST

»Highly-Ranked Foes, Too

- The Boilermakers faced three top-16 teams through the first six games of the season, including two in the top eight.
- The Boilermakers are one of just three teams in the country who faced three top-16 foes through the first 16 games.
- Clemson and Mississippi State are the other two teams to face the difficult feat.

- Clemson faced the No. 13, No. 14 and No. 12 teams, while Mississippi State faced the No. 12, No. 11 and No. 13 teams early in the season.
- Purdue's opponents have been ranked No. 16, No. 8 and No. 7. Brohm is the only head coach in his first year at the new institution in that group.

- Throughout the 2017 season, the Boilermakers are honoring Bob DeMoss, the patriarch of the Cradle of Quarterbacks and a member of the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Game with a helmet sticker and a flag atop section 101 of Ross-Ade Stadium. DeMoss, a former Boilermaker quarterback and head coach, passed away July 23 at age 90.
- DeMoss initially gained fame as a freshman at Purdue in 1945. He helped the Boilermakers win their first four games and move into the national rankings at No. 9. Their next opponent was fourth-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20 in Columbus. Purdue raced to a 28-0 lead and went on to an improbable 35-13 victory before 73,585 fans, the most ever to watch the Boilermakers at that time.
- DeMoss went on to be Purdue's primary quarterback through 1948, passing for 2,759 yards and 23 touchdowns during his career, and then played professionally with the New York Bulldogs in 1949.
- DeMoss subsequently embarked on a 42-year tenure at Purdue as an assistant coach (1950-69), head coach (1970-72) and assistant athletics director (1973-92). Along the way, he recruited and developed many members of the Cradle - Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson - earning fame as a "quarterback architect."
- DeMoss was the last quarterback to coach the Boilermaker until head coach Jeff Brohm.



JOE TILLER: 1942-2017

- Joe Tiller, one of the most beloved and popular figures in Purdue Athletics history, passed away

- Sept. 30 at the age of 74 in Buffalo, Wyoming.
- Tiller served as the Boilermakers' head football coach from 1997 to 2008. The winningest coach in school history, he posted an 87-62 record, including 53-43 in Big Ten Conference games. Tiller's 149 games coached are the most in Purdue annals.
- Prior to Tiller's hiring in November of 1996, Purdue football had played in a total of five bowl games. In the preceding 15 years, the Boilermakers managed merely a 54-107-5 record.
- Tiller introduced the spread offense to Purdue, featuring three, four, even five wide receivers and forcing defenses to cover the field from sideline to sideline. It was a radical change from the smash-mouth Big Ten style and, in the basketball-crazed state of Indiana, was dubbed affectionately "basketball on grass."
- The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, an average of more than seven wins per season and a Big Ten championship in 2000.
- Tiller coached 53 Purdue players who went on to the National Football League, six All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans.
- Tiller was recognized as the 1997 Big Ten and national Coach of the Year.
- In addition to the Rose Bowl, the Boilermakers played in the 1997 Alamo, 1998 Alamo, 2000 Outback, 2001 Sun, 2002 Sun, 2004 Capital One, 2004 Sun, 2006 Champs Sports and 2007 Motor City bowls.
- Purdue was nationally ranked in the Associated Press poll for 80 weeks - tied for the most under any coach in school history - including a high of No. 5 during the 2004 season.
- Tiller topped Jack Mollenkopf for the most wins by a Purdue coach with his 85th victory - a 32-25 verdict over Central Michigan at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 20, 2008.
- Tiller served as head coach of the East team in the 2015 East-West Shrine Game and earned a 45-27 victory. He played for the West team in 1963 and became just the fifth individual to both play and coach in the Shrine Game.
- From 1983 to 1986, Tiller was assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at Purdue under Leon Burtnett.
- In January of 2008, Tiller was awarded the Order of the Griffin, one of Purdue's highest honors, given to individuals whose commitment to the university goes well beyond the call of duty, and whose strength and vision have greatly benefited the institution. He was appointed head coach emeritus by the board of trustees Nov. 21, 2008.
- Tiller was inducted into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013. Joe Tiller Drive, located immediately north of Ross-Ade Stadium, was named in his honor in 2015.
- Tiller's 18-year head coaching record, including six seasons at Wyoming from 1991 to 1996, was 126-92-1, a .578 winning percentage.



SURE-HANDED HERDMAN

- Junior tight end **Cole Herdman** has caught at least one pass in 26 straight games.

- In that span, he has 60 catches for 699 yards and seven touchdowns.
- He extended the streak in the opener with an 11-yard reception from David Blough in the second quarter against Louisville.
- Against Ohio, Herdman's streak continued with a 62-yard touchdown reception from Blough in the second quarter. It was the longest reception of his career.
- At Missouri, the streak continued when Elijah Sindelar hit him for a 54-yard gain in the second quarter. It was the second longest reception of his career and the longest non-touchdown catch.
- Against Michigan, Herdman caught a 13-yard pass from Elijah Sindelar in the second quarter, which set up a J.D. Dellinger field goal.
- Against Minnesota, he caught a 20-yard touchdown on Purdue's second play of the game to extend his streak.
- At Wisconsin, he extended his streak with 18 seconds left in the half, which helped set up a field goal.
- At Rutgers, he extended the streak on the third play of the game with a six-yard reception.
- After missing the Nebraska game, Herdman came back in a limited role against Illinois and caught a 3-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter from Elijah Sindelar.
- At Northwestern, the streak was extended in the third quarter on a 5-yard completion.
- Herdman has 16 catches this year. His first 11 went for first downs, before he was held two yards short on his reception at Rutgers. In all, 13 of his 16 catches have been for first downs.

LONG DRIVE CONTEST

- The Boilermakers have 27 touchdown drives on the season. Of those 27, 17 have been at least 60 yards.
- Purdue's longest touchdown drive this season is 97 yards, which came against Ohio. The Boilermakers went 9 plays, 97 yards in 4:03 capped by a 1-yard **Tario Fuller** touchdown run.
- At Missouri, Purdue had its second longest touchdown drive of the year, marching 96 yards for the score. That drive was 13 plays, 96 yards in 6:59 capped by a **Richie Worship** 3-yard touchdown run.
- The third longest touchdown drive of the year came against Illinois when the Boilermaker marched 91 yards in 12 plays in 4 minutes and 21 seconds. The drive was capped by a 3-yard touchdown pass from **Elijah Sindelar** to **Cole Herdman**.
- The fourth longest touchdown drive of the year is 87 yards at Missouri. The Boilermakers used seven plays in 2:49 to score, capped by a 36-yard run by **Fuller**.
- The fifth longest touchdown drive this season was 86 yards against Nebraska. Purdue went 86 yards in 12 plays, spanning 3:52, capped by a 5-yard touchdown run by **David Blough**.
- The Boilermakers also had an 84-yard touchdown drive against the Bobcats, which now ranks as the sixth longest drive of the year. That scoring drive was 10 plays, 84 yards in 5:05 capped by a 5-yard pass from **Blough** to **Jackson Anthrop**.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- Nineteen Boilermakers have made their first start for the Old Gold and Black this season, including 10 that came in the season opener against Louisville.
- Senior wide receiver **Anthony Mahoungou** made his first start against Louisville and had four catches for 33 yards, including one that went for a first down.
- Redshirt freshman **Grant Hermanns** made his first collegiate appearance as the starter at left tackle against Louisville. He is Purdue's first freshman - true or redshirt - to start at left tackle in the season opener since Mike Otto in 2003. Otto went on to be drafted by the Tennessee Titans in 2007.
- Junior **Shane Evans**, an immediately eligible transfer from Northern Illinois, started his first collegiate game. Evans, who appeared in 18 games for the Huskies, was the starting left guard against Louisville.
- Graduate transfer **David Steinmetz** is no stranger to starting as he now has 36 collegiate starts. The first 29, though, came at FCS Rhode Island. He started his first FBS game at right tackle against Louisville.
- Junior kicker **Spencer Evans** is an immediately eligible transfer from Baylor. He was their starting kickoff specialist, and started at the same spot for

Purdue against Louisville. He also made two extra points, splitting time with **J.D. Dellinger**.

- Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Jackson Anthrop** started at one of the wide receiver positions against Louisville and led the team with seven catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He is the first freshman with two touchdowns in a season opener since Kory Sheets had a pair of scores against Akron in 2005. Sheets' TDs came on a blocked punt and a rush. No freshman receiver has hauled in two touchdown catches in a season opener since pre-1999.
- Sophomore **Tario Fuller** carried the ball eight times for 29 yards against Louisville. He was the team's leading rusher in his first career start.
- Graduate transfer linebacker **T.J. McCollum** has started 30 games at the FBS level, but 25 came before joining the Boilermakers. The transfer from Western Kentucky, who started at UAB, was second on the team with nine tackles in the opener.
- Graduate transfer cornerback **Josh Okonye** appeared in 37 collegiate games at Wake Forest, but his first start came against Louisville. He finished with nine tackles, including the team's only tackle for loss.
- Junior college transfer safety **T.J. Jallow** made his first start against Louisville. He finished with six tackles.
- Junior defensive tackle **Keiwan Jones** made his first start against Ohio and finished with two tackles.
- Junior offensive lineman **Eric Swingler** made his first career start at Missouri. He was officially a tight end.
- Junior wide receiver **Isaac Zico** made his first career start against Michigan. He did not record any stats.
- Junior wide receiver **Terry Wright** made his first career start against Michigan. He led the team with four catches for 64 yards and also had one rush for six yards.
- Freshman linebacker **Derrick Barnes** made his first career start against Wisconsin. He did not record any stats.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback/receiver **Jared Sparks** made his first start at receiver at Rutgers and finished with one catch for 22 yards and two rushes for 22 yards.
- Sophomore running back **Richie Worship** made his first start at Rutgers and finished with five carries for 51 yards. He also had one catch for 10 yards.
- Junior wide receiver **Jarrett Burgess** made his first career start against Illinois. He finished with three catches for 43 yards, including Purdue's longest reception of the day - a 36 yarder.
- Senior cornerback **Kamal Hardy** made his first career start against Illinois. He finished with two tackles.

SEASON ODDS AND ENDS

- **Jackson Anthrop** had two touchdown catches in the season opener against Louisville to become the first freshman in school history with multiple receiving TDs in a season opener (freshman became eligible to play varsity in 1972).
- **Ja'Whaun Bentley** forced two fumbles in the season opener, one of just four players in the country to do so in week one.
- Transfer kicker **Spencer Evans** had seven touchbacks against Ohio matching Purdue's total for all of 2016. Evans has 30 touchbacks through the first nine games.

- No returning FBS tight end had more touchdown catches last season than **Brycen Hopkins**, who had four. Hopkins has three through nine games this season.
- Purdue's schedule is tied for the sixth toughest in terms of bowl teams from last year. The Boilermakers face nine teams that played in a bowl last season.
- The Boilermakers had thrown at least one touchdown pass in 22 straight games before the streak was snapped at Wisconsin. The last time Purdue had not thrown one prior to that was Oct. 17, 2015, when the Boilermakers fell at Wisconsin 24-7.
- **David Blough** is 37 for 55 for 430 yards on first downs this season.
- Purdue's defense had shut out opponents for three straight quarters - two to end the Missouri game and the first quarter of the Michigan game.
- During the three quarter shutout span, the defense forced two interceptions, two sacks, four tackles for loss and allowed just 165 yards.
- Purdue had four turnovers against Minnesota and won. It's the first time with at least four turnovers in a conference win since 2000 vs. Ohio State.
- Purdue had not allowed a point in a second half on the road through the first two away games. Rutgers ended the streak with a touchdown in the third quarter, but the Boilermakers then shut out the Scarlet Knights in the fourth quarter.
- The last time Purdue had three AP top-16 opponents in its first six games of a season was 2008, Joe Tiller's final season. Purdue faced that this season.
- The 1984 season saw Purdue face No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 5 Miami (Fla.) and No. 2 Ohio State in the first six weeks. Purdue was 2-1 in that span.
- Purdue also faced three top-16 teams in the opening six weeks seven other times.
- In 1953 and 1960, the Boilermakers faced four top-16 teams in the first six weeks.
- At Northwestern, Sindelar was 14-26 for 11 yards in the first half. In the second half, he was 23-24 for 265 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

FIRST DEFENSIVE DRIVE SUCCESS

- Purdue had gotten a defensive stop on its first drive in every game this season until the Wisconsin game. Rutgers and Nebraska also scored on their first drives.
- Against Louisville, the defense gave up 52 yards before forcing and recovering a fumble.
- Against Ohio, Purdue allowed 18 yards before a punt.
- At Missouri, the defense forced a three-and-out after giving up just nine yards.
- Against Michigan, the defense gave up just 11 yards and forced a punt.
- Against Minnesota, the defense forced a three-and-out, allowing just one yard.
- Against Illinois, the defense didn't give up a yard as it forced a three-and-out.
- Against Northwestern, the Wildcats gained three yards in three plays before punting.

FIRST OFFENSIVE DRIVE SUCCESS

- Purdue has scored on its opening drive of the game four times this season.
- Against Ohio, Purdue went 56 yards in seven plays before making a 36-yard field goal.
- At Missouri, Purdue went 75 yards in 11 plays on its opening drive to score a touchdown.
- Against Minnesota, Purdue needed just two plays to go 37 yards and score a touchdown.



- Against Illinois, Purdue went seven plays, 68 yards for a touchdown on its opening drive.
- The six games in which Purdue did not score on its opening drive are Purdue's six losses.

SECOND QUARTER SUCCESS

- Through 10 games, Purdue has dominated the second quarters.
- The Boilermakers are outscoring their opposition 81-43 in second quarters this season.
- Against Louisville, Purdue outscored the Cardinals 7-3 in the second quarter.
- Against Ohio, Purdue outscored the Bobcats 24-0.
- At Missouri, Purdue outscored the Tigers 14-3 in the second quarter.
- Against Michigan, Purdue outscored the Wolverines 10-7 in the second quarter and gave up their first second quarter touchdown of the season.
- Purdue had its worst second quarter of the season against Minnesota, losing the quarter battle 7-0.
- Purdue and Wisconsin both scored three points in the second quarter.
- Purdue outscored Rutgers 3-0 in the second quarter and limited the Scarlet Knights to 12 total yards in the quarter.
- The Boilermakers outscored Nebraska 14-3 in the second quarter and held the Huskers to zero rushing yards on six attempts in the quarter.
- Purdue outscored Illinois 6-3 in the second quarter to take the lead for good.
- Northwestern flipped the script and outscored Purdue 14-0 in the second quarter of the Wildcats' 10-point win.
- Second quarter success is a staple of Jeff Brohm teams. In his fourth season as a collegiate head coach, Brohm teams score an average of 13.4 points per second quarter. That ranks No. 1 of any active head coach in the country since 2014.

THE CAPTAINS

- The Boilermakers voted on captains in the team's first meeting of fall camp. Six individuals were chosen with three on offense and three on defense.
- The offensive captains are junior center **Kirk Barron**, junior quarterback **David Blough** and senior wide receiver **Gregory Phillips**.
- The defensive captains are senior linebacker **Ja'Whaun Bentley**, senior linebacker **Danny Ezechukwu** and senior cornerback **Da'Wan Hunte**.
- Barron, Blough, Ezechukwu, Hunte are Phillips were selected for the first time in their career.
- Bentley has been voted a captain three years in a row. He is the first three-time captain in program history.

THREE-TIME CAPTAINS

- Bentley is Purdue's first three-time captain in school history. The feat is not only rare to Purdue, it is scarce in college football.
- Just six current athletes in FBS are a three-time captain, including Bentley.

FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The football performance complex, which is located adjacent to the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center, was completed in August of 2017.
- The three-level structure – amassing 112,000 square feet – includes a locker room, team meeting room, position group meeting rooms, player development room, weight room, sports medicine and hydrotherapy area, nutrition station, and coaches' and support staff offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby showcasing the Boilermakers' history and tradition.
- The state-of-the-art complex has significantly enhanced the football student-athlete experience. In addition to the first-class amenities, having all of them located in one facility results in more efficient use of the student-athletes' time. Previously, football-related facilities were housed in multiple buildings.
- A \$65 million project, the football performance complex was designed by Populous, while construction was managed by the Hunt Construction Group. The groundbreaking ceremony took place April 15, 2016 – with 11 Purdue Super Bowl champions in attendance – and construction took 16 months. The facility was dedicated Sept. 8, 2017.

EARLY LEADS

- Purdue scored first in the first three games this season, before Michigan snapped the streak. The Boilermakers then scored first against Minnesota.
- The Boilermakers had the halftime lead in the first four games this year, before Minnesota took a 14-6 lead into the half. Wisconsin led 17-6 at the half and Rutgers led 7-3 at the half.
- For the first time this season, the Boilermakers did not hold a lead against Wisconsin at any point in the game. Then, Purdue also never led at Rutgers.
- Against Nebraska, the Boilermakers took their first lead with 12:30 to play in the second quarter. Purdue held the lead until 14 seconds left in the game.
- Purdue never trailed against Illinois. The Fighting Illini tied Purdue at 7 and 10, before the Boilermakers scored the game's final 19 points.
- The Boilermakers never led against Northwestern.

LEGENDS RACE

- On Sept. 23, the first Purdue Football Legends Race took place.
- The Legends Race features likenesses of four Boilermaker greats – quarterbacks Drew Brees and Bob Griese, halfback Leroy Keyes, and defensive back Rod Woodson – and will occur at the end of the first quarter of all home games.
- Keyes came from behind to win in the inaugural race before Brees won during the Minnesota game. Rod Woodson won the race during the Nebraska game. Brees won the race in the Illinois game.

BROHM TEAM SUPERLATIVES

- Through eight games at Purdue, the Boilermakers have set some of Jeff Brohm's head coaching bests.

- Purdue allowed just eight first downs at Rutgers, the second best effort by a Brohm coached team behind only North Texas' seven first downs against Brohm's Western Kentucky team last year.
- Purdue allowed just 10 first downs at Missouri, which was tied for the second best effort by a Brohm team. Now, it is tied for third.
- The Boilermakers allowed just 203 yards at Missouri, which is the third best effort by a Brohm



team and best against a Power Five team.

- Purdue allowed just 217 yards at Rutgers which is the fourth best effort by a Brohm coached team and the second best against a Power Five team.
- Danny Ezechukwu had a 34-yard fumble return against Louisville, which is the third longest fumble return by an individual under Brohm.
- Jackson Anthrop's two touchdown receptions against Louisville are the 24th time an individual under Brohm has caught at least as many touchdowns in a single game.
- T.J. McCollum's 12 tackles against Minnesota are tied for the sixth most by an individual under Brohm.
- Ja'Whaun Bentley's 76-yard interception return for a touchdown against Minnesota is the fifth-longest interception return by a player under Brohm.
- Spencer Evans hit a 49-yard field goal at Wisconsin. That is the third longest made field goal by a Brohm-coached kicker.
- Purdue rushed for 279 yards at Rutgers. That is the third highest rushing total by a Brohm coached team and the highest by one of his Purdue teams.
- Rutgers passed for just 87 yards against Purdue. That is the second fewest yards a team has thrown for against a Brohm squad.
- Nebraska rushed for just 40 yards against Purdue. That is the second fewest yards an opponent has rushed for against a Brohm coached team.

PAIR OF TOUCHDOWN PASSES, PAIR OF QBS

- **Elijah Sindelar** and **David Blough** both threw two touchdown passes against Louisville.
- The Boilermakers have not achieved that feat in a game since 1998 when the Boilermakers beat Indiana 52-7 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Drew Brees was 20 for 33 for 237 yards, four touchdowns and an interception before David Edgerton came in and completed 3 of 4 passes for 37 yards and two scores.
- Against Ohio, Sindelar had one touchdown pass, while Blough had three.
- At Missouri, Blough and Sindelar both threw for a touchdown.
- Purdue was the only team in the country to have a pair of quarterbacks throw at least one touchdown pass in each of the first three games of the season.
- The streak ended against Michigan as Sindelar threw a touchdown, while Blough did not.
- Against Minnesota, Blough and Sindelar both had one touchdown pass.
- At Rutgers, Blough had a touchdown pass, while Sindelar did not.
- Against Nebraska, Blough played the entire game and had a touchdown pass.
- Against Illinois, Sindelar came in after Blough was injured and threw one touchdown pass.
- Sindelar had two touchdown passes at Northwestern.

MORE TD PASSES THAN INCOMPLETIONS

- **David Blough** was 11-13 for 235 yards and three touchdowns against Ohio.
- He is the first Purdue quarterback to throw more touchdown passes than incompletions in a game (minimum 10 attempts) since Kyle Orton went 23 for 26 for 329 yards and five touchdowns against Ball State on Sept. 11, 2004.
- **Elijah Sindelar** was 2-for-2 with a touchdown against Illinois, though he did not have enough attempts to qualify.

REMEMBER THE ALAMO

- Purdue celebrates the 20th anniversary of the 1997 Alamo Bowl championship team this year.
- Under first-year head coach Joe Tiller, the Boilermakers finished with a 9-3 record (6-2 in the Big Ten Conference – tied for second place), including a 33-20 victory over No. 24 Oklahoma State in the Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, and ranked No. 15 in the final Associated Press national poll. For a program that finished 3-8 in 1996, the six-game turnaround was the second-best in the country and in school history.
- After losing at Toledo in the season opener, Purdue reeled off six straight wins. The dream season started with a 28-17 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 13, which broke an 11-year losing streak to the Fighting Irish.
- The Boilermakers led the Big Ten in passing offense (285.2 yard per game) and total offense (a school-record 459.2 yards per game at that time).
- Tiller was named national coach of the year by both Football News and Kickoff magazines, Region 3 Coach of the Year (Big Ten, Mid-American Conference and Conference USA) by the American Football Coaches Association, and the Big Ten Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

BLOUGH PERFORMANCE OVATION-WORTHY

- Junior quarterback David Blough has put up impressive numbers on the field, but his biggest ovation may have come at the Big Ten Football Media Luncheon in Chicago over the summer.
- Blough was selected by the conference as the student-athlete keynote speaker for the luncheon and was given five minutes to talk about his platform as a student-athlete.
- Blough received a standing ovation after delivering a message about football teaching life. He mentioned how football challenges individuals to rise above adversity and work with the diversity within their communities or locker rooms.
- Blough also touched on his service trips to South Africa where he and teammates have worked at an orphanage.

BLOUGH'S SUMMER WITH THE MANNINGS

- Junior quarterback David Blough spent time this summer working at the Manning Passing Academy in Thibodaux, Louisiana. He was selected by a panel that included Archie Manning.
- At the camp, which was in its 22nd year, counselors worked extensively with the younger campers, from 1-on-1 instruction to teaching technique and fundamentals, to various other drills.
- Blough was among more than 25 other college quarterbacks, including Lamar Jackson of Louisville.
- In evening meetings, Blough and the other college quarterbacks were able to pick the Mannings' brains on everything from game preparation, film study, technique and more.

30-PLUS POINT ROAD WINS SINCE 1967

- The Boilermakers boast 10 road wins by 30-plus points in the last 50 seasons and 26 in school history. Six of them came before 1900.

- Blough made the cut to the final 20, which was announced Oct. 11.
